SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL

(U) [redacted] of Holy Land Emergency Liaison Program (HELP). HELP incorporated in the District of Columbia September, 1949, primarily to assist Arab refugees. Reliable source advises that Israeli officials in U. S. regard [redacted] as propagating the "Arab line". Other sources regard [redacted] as objective in his lectures and writings although on occasions somewhat pro-Arab and anti-Zionist. Luncheon in honor of [redacted] sponsored by National Press Club on [redacted] 1950, at Washington, D. C.

Material furnished by Source T-1, of unknown reliability, which concerned activities of the Arab League and upon which instant investigation was predicated, revealed that under date of December 2, 1950, [redacted] informed [redacted] of "HELP", Washington, D. C., of his regrets for not having been able to keep an appointment with [redacted] while in Washington.

[redacted] praised [redacted] for aiding refugees and fighting the "Jewish influence in the American administration" through "HELP".

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The records of the Recorder of Deeds for the District of Columbia reflect that the Holy Land Emergency Liaison Program" (HELP) was incorporated in the District of Columbia on September 16, 1949, primarily to alleviate the Arab refugee problem in the Near East. Persons executing the certificate of corporation were listed as [redacted]

[redacted] and name was not listed.

According to an article appearing in the Washington Post under date of September 12, 1949, the Holy Land Emergency Liaison Program, known as "HELP", had been formed to rally American support for relief in the Near East. KERMIT ROOSEVELT, Author and Lecturer, was listed as a member of the Executive Board of the organization. According to the article, members of the organization's Executive Board estimated that 800,000 Arab refugees needed immediate aid and that there was "no concern how or why the Arab refugees came into being".

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Source T-2, of unknown reliability, described [redacted] as having manifested a pro-Arab attitude, but also as having been a severe critic of the Arabs. T-2 stated that during [redacted] 1948, [redacted] served as [redacted] on the Committee for Justice and Peace in the Holy Land. The source explained that this organization was created as the result of an idea of approximately six or seven prominent citizens. Their common idea was that the American public was being led completely and blindly by pro-Zionists and further that the Arab nations would be subjugated by pro-Zionist groups in this country.

Source T-3, of unknown reliability, described [redacted] as having been engaged in writing and lecturing endeavors primarily relating to the Arab-Jewish situation in the Middle East. According to T-3, [redacted] point of view was usually pro-Arab and somewhat anti-Zionist.

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Source T-4, of unknown reliability, considered [redacted] to maintain a most objective attitude but sometimes having a pro-Arab rather than a pro-Zionist leaning.

[redacted] was similarly described by T-5, of unknown reliability.

(U) According to T-6, of known reliability, Israeli officials in the United States have regarded [redacted] as propagating the "Arab line" and as being anti-Zionist. ~~JK~~

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Through Source T-7, of known reliability, it was determined that on [redacted] 1950, a luncheon was held at the National Press Club in Washington, D. C., honoring [redacted] of the League of Arab States. According to Source T-7, the luncheon was sponsored by the National Press Club and was probably attended by four hundred members and guests.

Reurlet 7/16/51 advising you feel [redacted] should be interviewed but suggesting the advisability of first interviewing [redacted]. You point out that if [redacted] were first interviewed the Bureau would be in a stronger position to interview [redacted] since the latter would be in a less advantageous position with respect to attributing to [redacted] any questionable material in the documents forming the basis for our inquiries.

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While the Bureau is in accord with your conclusion in this respect, it is felt that the interview with [redacted] should no longer be delayed for the following reasons:

1. Investigation has disclosed that [redacted] left the United States [redacted] for Europe indicating that he expected to be abroad [redacted] months (see Bulet to New York 2/8/51). The necessity for bringing this case to a logical conclusion as expeditiously as possible has been noted previously.

2. [redacted] identity as the original source of the information in the questioned documents was furnished to the Bureau on a confidential basis by representatives of the Anti-Defamation League (ADL). [redacted] of the ADL pointed out to your office that if it were known that [redacted] was furnishing information to [redacted] which eventually reached the ADL his life would be in great danger (see New York report 3/2/51, page 12). As long as there is a possibility of bringing this inquiry to a conclusion to the satisfaction of the Department of State without approaching [redacted] the Bureau wishes to avoid being placed in a position wherein we can be accused of endangering [redacted] life in the event his role as informant is discovered by the Arabs.

3. Investigation has indicated that much of the information in the basic documents is probably unauthentic. The ADL has attributed to [redacted] certain statements and claims concerning the documents and information therein which have been proven to be false. It is felt that if at the outset of an interview [redacted] reasserts these statements and claims, they can be refuted, thereby placing him at a disadvantage.

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4. If an interview with [redacted] does not produce the expected results, the Bureau will consider a recommendation that [redacted] be interviewed after appropriate contacts with the ADL at the Seat of Government.

In view of the above, you are authorized to proceed with an interview of [redacted] without first interviewing [redacted]. Before the interview is undertaken, however, it will be necessary that the following outstanding leads are covered:

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1. You should advise the Bureau of the results of your efforts to secure from New York City cable companies copies of press cables sent by [redacted] to [redacted] while in New York City during the period [redacted] 1950, through [redacted] 1951. If these are obtained, it should be determined whether the cables contain information similar to that appearing in the material forming the basis for our inquiries. This lead was first set forth in Bulet 2/8/51 to the New York Office and was again referred to in Bulet 3/31/51 to the New York Office.

2. The photograph of [redacted] which was furnished in Bulet 6/4/51 to New York, should be exhibited to Detective [redacted] of the New York City Police Department to establish positively whether [redacted] was the individual whom [redacted] on [redacted] 1950, just prior to [redacted] reported departure from the United States.

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As soon as the above leads have been covered, you should immediately advise the Bureau by teletype of the results attained. Upon receipt of your teletype,

Assistant Director L. B. Nichols will advise appropriate officials of the Anti-Defamation League in Washington that the Bureau contemplates an interview with [redacted]. You must be prepared to undertake this interview the same day the ADL is advised of this fact. It is felt that this procedure is necessary since [redacted] apparently works closely with the ADL and the latter organization may advise him of the contemplated interview before it is conducted unless we move rapidly.

The interview of [redacted] should be assigned to two mature and experienced Agents who are thoroughly familiar with captioned case. These Agents should familiarize themselves with the documents involved in the inquiry in order that questions may be propounded based upon the contents of the documents. It should be remembered that [redacted] of the ADL advised the Bureau that some people close to the ADL are [redacted]

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[redacted] For this reason, the Agents interviewing [redacted] should thoroughly explore the possibility that the documents which he has been furnishing are based upon a smattering of truth but have been expanded in context in order that a larger sum may be claimed by [redacted].

You will recall that the Bureau has been advised the [redacted] in

[redacted]. You will further recall that the FBI Laboratory and G-2 have been unable to establish that the notes are in fact based upon any known [redacted]

[redacted]. The notes have been exhibited to two informants of the Washington Field Office, one of whom expressed the opinion that they were spurious. G-2 has advised that the notes are not Arabic. The FBI Laboratory has commented upon the repetition of certain symbols in the notes indicating that if authentic the notes appear to represent lists of items. The Laboratory has also noted that the material is not of sufficient length to cover the purported cables allegedly prepared from them.

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[redacted] the Near East Section of the Library of Congress, who is [redacted] [redacted] was requested to examine the alleged

[redacted] to establish whether they may represent symbols of Arabic or Islamic origin. [redacted] could not identify the notes as being composed of any Near Eastern language. He offered the opinion that they were not of Semitic origin since the notes, if at all legible, appear to have been written in a manner to read from left to right across the page while most Semitic languages read from right to left.

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In view of the ADL's statement to the effect that [redacted] these purported [redacted] [redacted] it is suggested that during the interview the notes be exhibited to him and he be asked to [redacted] them. In the event he appears able to [redacted] them, the material which he produces should be compared against the documents among the material forming the basis for our inquiry to establish whether there is a similarity. It is further suggested that in the event he appears able to [redacted] [redacted] that he be questioned specifically as to the different meanings which he must necessarily attribute to symbols which are similar in appearance.

In the event Detective [redacted] verifies [redacted] departure from the United States on [redacted] 1950, [redacted] should be thoroughly questioned regarding the reports he furnished covering [redacted] in this country subsequent to [redacted] 1950.

It is suggested that during the interview with [redacted] an effort be made to explore one phase of this case which has not previously been mentioned specifically. New York let 2/23/51 forwarded to the Bureau six enclosures consisting of additional ADL material received directly from the New York Office of the ADL. One of the enclosures consisted of a document dated January 18, 1951, and captioned "Appraisal of [redacted]". At the top of page 2, the document states in part, "I am sure that he (referring to [redacted]) is still in a position where he can be of real assistance to us because his relations with the Arabs continue of the closest. He telephoned a fond farewell to [redacted] just before leaving." This suggests the possibility that [redacted] in securing information for sale to the ADL [redacted]

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Therefore, it is suggested that during the interview with [redacted] an effort be made to explore this possibility.

The outstanding leads set forth heretofore should be covered immediately. Thereafter, you should continue in accordance with the outlined procedure, advising the Bureau of the results by teletype. At that time, the ADL in Washington will be orally advised that we contemplate interviewing [redacted]. The same day that this is done you will be informed and the interview with [redacted] should be undertaken immediately.

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The Bureau is desirous of receiving a teletype summary of the interview with [redacted] and a report setting forth complete details of the results immediately thereafter.

The report of SA Francis J. Gallant dated 7/19/51 at New York City sets forth on page 7 information attributed to Confidential Informant T-4 indicating that [redacted] was an [redacted] [redacted] prior to 1941. For your information, it may be noted that the Bureau is approaching British authorities in an effort to verify this statement. If it is true, it is felt that there is a possibility [redacted] may be in violation of the provisions of the Internal Security Act of 1950 requiring registration by individuals having knowledge of the intelligence operations of a foreign government.

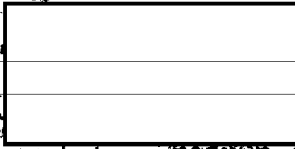

1. The following report submitted by a confidential and reliable informant:

"The Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith continues to go through a financial crisis. Salaries are being cut and personnel reduced. Various members of the staff contemplate leaving the organization and their jobs which formerly they tended to regard as permanent.

"Among the causes that effect the League so adversely, the following seems to be considered the most important:

a. "The establishment of the Israel Nation makes many Jews in this country believe that there is no longer any need for an organization of the type of the League;

b. "Even if there was a need for the work the League does, there is too much duplication with various other organizations doing the same thing. Attempts to effect a merger remained without results, for the directors of the several League-like groups would not risk to lose their privileged positions - the thing that would inevitably occur in case of a merger.

"Apart from this the not too great state of business is blamed for the present difficulties of the League. The businessmen are no longer as lavish as they used to be."

On November 5, 1951, [redacted] called at this Bureau accompanied by [redacted] who is also associated with the Anti-Defamation League of B'Nai B'rith. These two gentlemen on that occasion delivered some additional material of the same nature as that previously provided. I am also enclosing a set of photostatic copies of this additional material. This second set has also been clipped together and the first item therein is a copy of an alleged passage from [redacted] to [redacted] dated November 2, 1951.

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When this latter material was delivered, [redacted] stated that the material which the Anti-Defamation League has been channelling to this Bureau in the past is now believed by the officials of the League to be absolutely unreliable. [redacted] stated that for this reason he felt that he owed an apology to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

You will recall that the League has been receiving material of the type forming the basis for our inquiries from one [redacted] who purportedly works for the Arab League, through [redacted] of New York City. Without naming either [redacted] or [redacted] stated that he had talked with "the informant" regarding certain inconsistencies in the material which first aroused the suspicions of Anti-Defamation League officials. With respect to these inconsistencies, [redacted] pointed out that on one occasion where the informant reported that the head of the Arab League made certain statements at a meeting on a definite date, he, [redacted] was able to prove that the head of the Arab League was confined to a hospital on that date. On another occasion where the informant quoted one [redacted] as having made certain definite statements at a meeting, [redacted] was able to show that [redacted] had departed from the United States aboard the S.S. "Queen Mary" on the day before the meeting reportedly took place.

[redacted] said that the informant explained the inconsistencies by claiming that the records of the Arab League were loosely kept, dates in these records were meaningless, and [redacted] was actually still in the United States, his passport having been utilized by some other individual to leave the country. According to [redacted] the informant insisted adamantly that his reports were correct.

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[redacted] explained that the D'Kat D'ith had paid the informant \$2300.00 for reports which the latter had submitted during the past year. He expressed the belief that the D'Kat D'ith Organization had been fraudulently duped by the informant. He expressed the desire that the Federal Bureau of Investigation interview the informant and ascertain from him the motivation for his dealings with the Anti-Defamation League.

In this connection [redacted] was advised that the situation which he called to the attention of this Bureau did not appear to present a federal violation over which this Bureau has investigative jurisdiction. Our usual procedure in a matter of this type would be to present the question to the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice for advice as to whether there has been a violation of a federal statute over which we have investigative jurisdiction. You will recall, however, that we raised the question with you last February whether certain of the Anti-Defamation League material should be made available to Assistant United States Attorney [redacted] of Washington, D. C. At that time you pointed out that investigation had indicated that much of the material might be spurious and that in view of its unqualified state, you were of the opinion that the material should not receive further dissemination. Since this entire investigation has been conducted as a special inquiry at the request of the Department of State, this Bureau does not contemplate raising the question of a possible federal violation with the Criminal Division unless specifically requested by your Department.

On November 10, 1951, agents of the New York Office of this Bureau conducted an interview with [redacted] [redacted] established the nature of his dealings with [redacted] pointing out that he had paid the latter on an irregular basis about \$50.00 a week. During the interview, [redacted] indicated that he had some reservations regarding the authenticity of certain of the information provided by [redacted]. He added that when [redacted] was questioned regarding particular items, he was of those very vague in his answers. [redacted] pointed out that [redacted] had returned to the United States during approximately the latter part of September, 1951, but departed again for a trip abroad on about November 8, 1951. During this several-week period, [redacted] was paid \$150.00 a week for expenses. [redacted] allegedly spent about \$75.00 of this amount to pay individuals who supplied him information.

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The complete results of the interview with [redacted] will be furnished to you in the near future in report form. Incidentally, if there are any other phases of this inquiry which you feel are deserving of investigative attention, it would be appreciated if you would advise this Bureau in order that the matter may be brought to a logical conclusion at the earliest possible date.

The above data are forwarded for your confidential information and such consideration as you deem appropriate.

Reur tel 11-19-51 requesting any additional documents, which have been furnished recently to the Bureau by the Anti-Defamation League.

There are attached two sets of photostatic copies of such additional documents. There are also attached two copies of a communication which the Bureau has addressed to the Department of State under even date. This latter communication fully explains the circumstances under which the additional material was received from the Anti-Defamation League.

Your attention is directed to the information in the letter to the State Department to the effect that Anti-Defamation League officials now believe that the material which has formed the basis for investigation in captioned matter is absolutely unreliable. In view of this, you will note that the Bureau has requested the State Department for instructions as to what further investigation is desired in this case.

The State Department was advised that a report setting forth the details regarding your interview with [redacted] on November 19, last would be provided in the near future. You are instructed to submit such a report immediately. Since the Anti-Defamation League documents are now believed by the League, itself, to be unreliable, it is not felt that a further interview with [redacted] regarding the documents is warranted.

Your attention is called to the fact that Bulets 8-9-51 and 10-23-51 pointed to the possible liability of [redacted] to register under the Internal Security Act of 1950. It was suggested that you endeavor to develop during your interview with [redacted] information with regard to this possibility. It is expected that this will be done. To facilitate presentation of this particular question to the Criminal Division, Department of Justice, you are instructed to incorporate in a report captioned with [redacted] name all information available reflecting upon

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his possible liability to register under the Internal Security Act of 1950. It will be recalled that in the course of the interview with [redacted] he indicated that [redacted] aka [redacted] had left the United States and was believed to have gone to Paris, possibly to attend the United Nations Sessions there.

The records of Immigration and Naturalization Service were checked but no record was found indicating that [redacted] had left the United States. It was noted, however, that the following information appeared in the immigration files concerning [redacted] which may be of interest to the Bureau. It was indicated that [redacted] returned to the United States via TWA plane on [redacted] 51. It was also reflected that he made an affidavit at the U.S. Embassy in Cairo on [redacted] 51 directed to the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Washington, D.C. [redacted] in this affidavit, stated:

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"I, [redacted] hereby apply for extension of my permit to re-enter the United States. I left the United States on [redacted] 1951 and since leaving the United States I have visited [redacted] and have lived in [redacted]. I request the extension of my Re-Entry Permit for the following reasons: I am a [redacted] covering events in the Middle East for the [redacted] (Conn.) and also the [redacted] Washington, D.C., while I [redacted] for [redacted] (Department of State, Magazine Branch, New York, N.Y.). Upon termination of my assignment in [redacted] I will return immediately to the United States. My address abroad to which the extended permit to re-enter the United States should be sent is as follows: [redacted] care of [redacted]"

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The above is furnished the Bureau in the event the Bureau desires to advise the State Department as to [redacted] connections in the event they do not already have this information. It is contemplated that the stop notices will be maintained on [redacted] pending conclusion of this investigation due to the possibility that a request may be made to interview [redacted] sometime in the near future upon his return to the U.S. since [redacted] seems to be quite certain that [redacted] departed the United States.

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Bureau will advise if any further investigation should be conducted in this case concerning [redacted]. This office is presently

It will also be noted here that in the course of this interview
with [redacted] time did not permit the interview to reach the
point where he could be questioned concerning any association or


[redacted] interviewed and advised that information re Arab League activities received by him from [redacted] aka [redacted] who was turned over to him by the ADL. [redacted] furnished information supplied him orally by [redacted] to [redacted] of the Arab League. [redacted] also obtained information from [redacted] to UN official and [redacted] UN official, according to [redacted] and ADL did not consider information supplied by [redacted] as authentic. [redacted] in addition to furnishing information to [redacted] during late 1950, also supplied information during September and October, 1951. [redacted] reported to have left US in early November, 1951.

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DETAILS: AT NEW YORK, NEW YORK:

On November 19, 1951, [redacted] was interviewed in the New York Office by the writer and SA [redacted]. At the outset of this interview, concerning the documents which formed the basis of this investigation, [redacted] advised that he was aware of the interest of the Government in the information contained in these documents. He stated that he knew that the documents had been turned over to the State Department and the Federal Bureau of In-

investigation.

[redacted] advised that he is presently engaged as a free lance [redacted] and over the past three years has been employed from time to time by the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE. [redacted] stated that he has been paid on a weekly fee basis. [redacted] advised also that he maintains an office at [redacted] which formerly was utilized by him when he was operating the research organization, [redacted]

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[redacted] stated that approximately one and a half years ago the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE turned over to him a man by the name of [redacted] who was also known as [redacted] during the period of their association, made available to [redacted] numerous documents during the period November and December, 1950. [redacted] was turned over to [redacted] for the specific purpose of handling this matter pertaining to the documents.

The bulk of the material contained in these documents concerned information relating to the activities of the Arab League and its officials at the United Nations, which was in session at that time in New York. The documents also contained information concerning the activities of the Arabs in the United States.

It was [redacted] understanding that these documents consisted of information which had been obtained by [redacted] from one [redacted] who was [redacted], who is [redacted] of the Arab League.

[redacted] stated that during his contact with [redacted] he paid [redacted] on an irregular basis of \$50.00 per week. [redacted] stated that [redacted] generally obtained his information orally from [redacted] and made notations in Arabic. At the time when [redacted] would turn this information over to [redacted] they would usually meet somewhere and proceed to [redacted] office at [redacted] where [redacted] would dictate to [redacted] in French, and at the same time [redacted] would type the material out in English, as [redacted] dictated. [redacted] advised that he was able to speak French fluently.

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It was [redacted] recollection that at no time during his contact with [redacted] did the latter make available original documents. He stated that the above-outlined procedure was followed by [redacted] in making available information.

[redacted] advised that all the documents which he prepared were furnished by him only to the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE.

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[redacted] advised that it was the feeling of the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE that the information contained in these documents was of an explosive nature and sufficiently doubtful so that it was felt that this information should be furnished to Government agencies for any action deemed advisable by the Government in checking out the authenticity of the material. [redacted] further advised that in preparing the documents he made no changes in the information as furnished by [redacted] other than to correct misspellings and typewritten errors in his typing.

According to [redacted] in addition to supplying information obtained from [redacted] also on occasions, made available is own writeups on Arab activities in the United Nations and also the results of interviews he conducted of various Arab officials.

[redacted] identified the document dated December 6, 1950, which is a report concerning [redacted] activities on Saturday, December 2. [redacted] advised that this report related to [redacted] activities in Washington and was a report prepared by [redacted] believed [redacted] had accompanied [redacted] to Washington and prepared this report after the completion of [redacted] s Washington visit.

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[redacted] stated that [redacted] recently returned to the United States during September, 1951 and that he had again contacted [redacted] and made available information concerning Arab matters. [redacted] advised that as of the previous occasion, he prepared documents and furnished them to the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE, which he believed were in turn furnished to the Government in Washington.

During this recent visit of [redacted] in September, 1951, [redacted] was advised by [redacted] that he had obtained the majority of his information from [redacted] whom [redacted] identified as [redacted] in the United States and also a member of the Saudi Arabian Delegation to the United Nations. [redacted] also received information from one [redacted] whom [redacted] identified as an employee of the Egyptian Mission to the United Nations.

[redacted] advised that [redacted] during the period of his recent contact with [redacted] which covered several weeks, [redacted] was paid \$150.00 per week for his expenses. [redacted] has stated to [redacted] that \$75.00 of this amount was to be paid to other individuals supplying him with information.

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[redacted] advised that [redacted] departed from the United States very suddenly about the first week in November, 1951.

[redacted] during his contact with [redacted] determined that he resided at [redacted] in a furnished room. [redacted] has visited [redacted] at this address when he attempted to contact him.

During the interview with [redacted] he reviewed several of the documents among the material forming the basis of this investigation and advised that this material, which related to the activities of [redacted] and the Arab League at the UN was obtained in its entirety from [redacted] who in turn had received this information usually orally from [redacted]

In the course of the interview with [redacted] he commented that he had personally met with [redacted] on the occasion of one of his visits to the United Nations. This contact with [redacted] did not concern the material being furnished to [redacted] by [redacted] and he did not make any effort to ascertain the relationship existing between [redacted]

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[redacted] advised that he and officials of the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE doubted the authenticity of some of the information furnished by [redacted] and on the occasion of his recent return to the United States [redacted] was interviewed by [redacted] and [redacted] officials of the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE. [redacted] stated that [redacted] was questioned carefully concerning his information and at times was very vague and somewhat non-committal in his answers. He did, however, state that he had correctly reported information that [redacted] had remained in the United States after his alleged actual departure with [redacted] party in December, 1950.

In the course of the interview with [redacted] the name of [redacted] was mentioned and he stated that he had known [redacted]

for about three years and had seen him only on two or three occasions. He believed that [redacted] was acquainted with [redacted] but was unable to elaborate upon the relationship between them.

[redacted] remarked that he had heard it rumored that [redacted] was employed by the French Government; however, he did not know in what capacity. He identified [redacted] as having been formerly employed by the New York Times as a [redacted] and as a result of this experience had numerous sources of information and contacts among personalities from the Middle East. [redacted] also believed that [redacted] had at one time been connected with the American Jewish Committee.

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In connection with [redacted] was confronted with the documents setting forth information concerning [redacted] [redacted] stated that the document entitled, "Activities of [redacted]" dated [redacted] 1950 had been prepared by information supplied by [redacted].

Concerning the document dated [redacted] 1951, entitled, "[redacted]" [redacted] advised that he had prepared this document himself. [redacted] also advised that he had prepared a document dated January 18, 1951 which set forth information concerning [redacted] for the use of the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE.

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Concerning the document entitled, "[redacted] in the United States," dated [redacted] 1951, this was information which had been supplied to him by [redacted].

[redacted] advised that in connection with the material furnished by [redacted] he had conducted limited inquiries at the United Nations merely to determine if certain individuals mentioned by [redacted] actually existed and were identical with people referred to by [redacted] in his information. Other than this, [redacted] conducted no investigation in order to authenticate the information furnished him by [redacted].

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[redacted] advised that [redacted] was a newspaper man assigned to the United Nations and accredited to the United Nations representing the French newspaper published in Cairo called the "Le Progres Egyptien." [redacted] advised that he has verified [redacted] employment with this publication both at the United Nations and in Paris when he was recently on a trip to Europe.

[redacted] was shown a photograph of [redacted] also known as [redacted] and also a photograph of [redacted] and he identified these photographs as identical with his contact [redacted] and [redacted] whom he identified as [redacted] to [redacted] of the Arab League.

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The Directory of Personnel of the United Nations reflects that one [redacted] is listed as an Alternate Representative of the Saudi Arabian Delegation to the UN. He resides at [redacted] New York City.

It also reflected that one [redacted] is assigned as a Press Attache to the Egyptian Delegation to the United Nations.

The interview with [redacted] as set forth in this report, was not complete and did not cover in detail the various documents forming the basis of this investigation. In the course of attempting to arrange for this interview, [redacted] advised that he had been [redacted]

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In the course of the interview with [redacted] he advised that he could not devote much more time to this matter on this particular day of the interview because he had to [redacted] on the same day in order to have [redacted] stated that he would be most willing to continue the interview sometime in the future after his release from the hospital. He expected to remain in the hospital and would be convalescing for the next several weeks.

Concerning [redacted] reference is made to New York letter to the Bureau, 12/7/51, wherein it was set forth that an attempt was made to determine when [redacted] departed the United States; however, the records do not reflect, at the Immigration and Naturalization Service, [redacted] departure from the United States.

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Since it is possible that prior to the closing of this investigation [redacted] might be interviewed, look-out notices against [redacted] are being maintained since [redacted] is quite certain that [redacted] left the country, possibly to attend UN meetings in Paris, France.



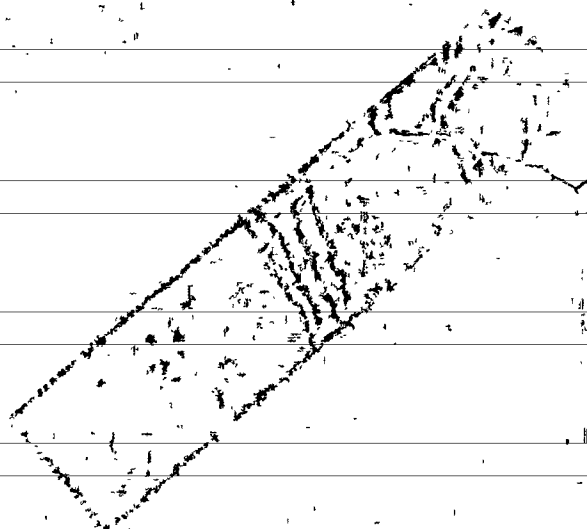



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San Francisco letter, May 11, 1956, reflects information concerning [redacted] attorney at law, [redacted] San Francisco, California, who is a lifetime member of the Board of Managers of the California Society of the Sons of the American Revolution and is identical with the subject of a San Francisco teletype to SA [redacted], 12/31/46, captioned AALC - [redacted], Special Inquiry. The information reads as follows:

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"On May 4, 1956 SA [redacted] came to the San Francisco office and gave the following information:

"On May 24, 25, and 26, 1954, SA [redacted] was a witness in Washington, D.C., before the House Congressional Committee. On August 8, 1954, in a radio broadcast over the W.C. network, Committee member [redacted] (Ohio) made statements concerning [redacted] which [redacted] considered libelous.

[redacted] therefore filed suit against the National Broadcasting Company, Incorporated, Civil No. 33936, in the U. S. District Court, San Francisco.

SA [redacted] said that there has been no threat, or indication of harm,but, he said, in the event that someone else, that line should occur, he would expect the AIA to have an interest in the case and to present the matter to the grand jury, based on 18 U.S.C. 1503 and/or 18 U.S.C. 1505 which pertain to influencing or injuring a witness before a Congressional committee or a party to a Federal Court action.

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"Since [redacted] was not making a complaint the United States Attorney is not being advised of the above facts."

New York lt. to Bureau 11/28/41 re "ANTI DEFAMATION LEAGUE" transmitted the original of a report dated 11/11/41, of Confidential Informant [redacted] which relates to the ANTI DEFAMATION LEAGUE and ARNOLD FORSTER. The report reads as follows:

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"November 11, 1941.

"ANTI DEFAMATION LEAGUE
ARNOLD FORSTER

"Referring to previous reports on the ANTI DEFAMATION LEAGUE, its undercover activities, etc. the following information is submitted:

"On Thursday night October 30, 1941 at Madison Square Garden in New York on the occasion of an AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE rally at which Wheeler, Cudahy and Lindbergh spoke there was a slight commotion in the center aisle, near the press section which few spectators noticed. A detective (later identified by me as Lieut. [redacted] of the 2nd Squad) took a photographer outside for questioning after this photographer and a man with him had behaved in a rather provocative manner towards America First sympathizers inside the Garden. The photographer wore a regulation Police Press Card (shield type) in his hat and the man with him was noticed by me to be ARNOLD FORSTER whom I had met at the Fritz Kuhn trial in November 1939 and who had introduced himself to me as an undercover man for the Anti-Defamation League at that time. In 1939 FORSTER, a lawyer had offices at 270 Broadway (Worth 2-1303) and lived at 66 Fort Washington Avenue.

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"In the lobby of Madison Square Garden Detective Lieutenant [redacted] turned the photographer over for questioning to Detective [redacted] (not sure of spelling of name) of the Criminal Alien Squad. The photographer gave his name as [redacted] of [redacted] Jersey City, N.J. He admitted that the Police Card which he carried was not his. The card was a regular reporters police card made out in the name of the New York Post (it was one of the so-called 'desk spares' that is cards where the first line usually containing the name of the reporter is left blank so that the city desk can use it for emergency assignments) and was duly signed by [redacted] of the Post. [redacted] under questioning

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"admitted that he had 'borrowed' the card for this evening and professed to be totally unconcerned when Detective [redacted] informed him of the serious consequences of fraudulent use of a Police Card.

"At this point FORSTER interefered and started arguing with [redacted] so that the latter proceeded to establish FORSTER's identity. FORSTER now has law offices at 19 West 44th Street (Murray Hill 2-0649) and lives at 1881 Morris Avenue, The Bronx (Tremont 2-3113). - FORSTER became quite abusive and admitted that he was with [redacted]. FORSTER admitted that he had given the Police Card to [redacted] but flatly refused to say how or through whom he had secured it.

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"The Police Card was confiscated by Detective [redacted] and turned over to the Police Department and eventually reached the desk of First Deputy Police Commissioner John Seery who is chairman of the Mayor's Committee on Press Cards.

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"In the meantime I learned through [redacted] albas [redacted] that FORSTER is a cousin of [redacted] and is still employed as an undercover man by the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE. - Also that FORSTER is the undercover liaison man to THE HOUR (see reports) for the ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE who did not want to be openly connected with a propaganda organ which was Communist-run. Incidentally during the questioning at the Garden FORSTER and [redacted] first claimed to be reporters for THE HOUR!

"Three days after the above incident the following item appeared in Winchell's column of Monday November 3rd: 'That's going to be quite a shake-up in the Alien Squad of the Police Dept. after the election...because so many are not so Americanishy...'

"On Monday November 3rd I learned pretty definitely that this item had been planted in Winchell's column by [redacted] and FORSTER. [redacted] had been in trouble before (months ago) with the Alien Squad and had been investigated and questioned by [redacted]. At that time in order to divert attention he had raised a hue and cry about alleged Christian Front sympathies- and even membership- of [redacted] and other detectives of the Alien Squad and through the publicity man

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"of the NON-SECTARIAN ANTI-NAZI LEAGUE TO CHAMPION HUMAN RIGHTS one [redacted] of State Senator Kleinfeld of Brooklyn) who now calls himself [redacted] had launched stories to that effect in various columns. As regards the November 3rd item in Winchell's column the latter's [redacted] admitted to me 'off the record' that the item had been supplied from an ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE source.- I also learned on that day that on Friday October 31st the ANTI DEFAMATION LEAGUE had brought 'tremendous pressure to bear on Commissioner Seery and the Mayor's Committee on Press Cards to drop the FORSTER incident of the preceding night.' My informant is [redacted] of the Alien Squad who added that Seery flatly refused and told the (unnamed) intermediary that the Mayor's Committee at the recommendation of the Alien Squad was proceeding with a full-fledged investigation and would take drastic action in the case of the misuse of the Post's press card. Promptly thereafter the Winchell item against the Alien Squad appeared.

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"On Tuesday November 4th [redacted] phoned me and asked me if I could intercede for FORSTER with the Mayor's Committee because he knew that I had some influence with this Committee and acted as their consultant. I declined to intercede on the grounds that my advisory capacity to the Committee was limited to foreign correspondents and foreigners and that the misuse of the Post press card was a purely domestic incident. [redacted] then offered to 'make it worth my while' if I got FORSTER off.

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"The whole incident is typical of some of the objectionable methods - and also of the influence- of the ANTI DEFAMATION LEAGUE: the system of Police Cards is usually so fool-proof that no reporter or editor would dare risk his job by giving a card or lending a card to an unauthorized person.

In this instance the Alien Squad found on November 3rd that the card in question had been obtained for FORSTER by [redacted] a reporter of the Post who

San Francisco letter, May 11, 1956, reflects information concerning [redacted] attorney at law, 1115 Hobart Building, San Francisco, California, who is a lifetime member of the Board of Managers of the California Society of the Sons of the American Revolution and is identical with the subject of a San Francisco teletype to the Bureau, 12/31/46, captioned [redacted] Special Inquiry. The information reads as follows:

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"On May 4, 1956 [redacted] came to the San Francisco Office and gave the following information:

"On May 24, 25, and 26, 1954, [redacted] was a witness in Washington, D.C., before the Rees Congressional Committee. On August 8, 1954, in a radio broadcast over the NBC network, Committee member [redacted] (Ohio) made statements concerning [redacted] which [redacted] considered libelous.

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[redacted] therefore filed suit against the National Broadcasting Company, Incorporated, Civil No. 33968, in the U. S. District Court, San Francisco.

[redacted] further advised that, in a recently published book, 'Cross Currents,' by BENJAMIN R. EPSTEIN and ARNOLD FOSTER, the same libel was repeated.

[redacted] stated he has caused notices of depositions to be served May 4, 1956 and filed in the above case [redacted] vs. National Broadcasting Company, Inc. as follows, affecting officers of the Anti-Defamation League (ADL), B'nai B'rith:

MATUSOW stated that he made this retraction verbally at the home of a television program sponsor, name not given, in the presence of VICTOR REISEL, newspaper columnist. On the following day, MATUSOW went to the law office of Mr. FORSTER somewhere on Fifth Avenue, NYC, and executed a retraction in the form of an affidavit. He stated that Mr. FORSTER offered him payment for this affidavit and at first MATUSOW refused. In his testimony, MATUSOW quoted FORSTER as stating, 'Well, look, the sponsor.....is a big contributor and we want to make him feel that he is getting something, and if we didn't pay you, well.....' MATUSOW stated at this point he accepted a payment of \$50."

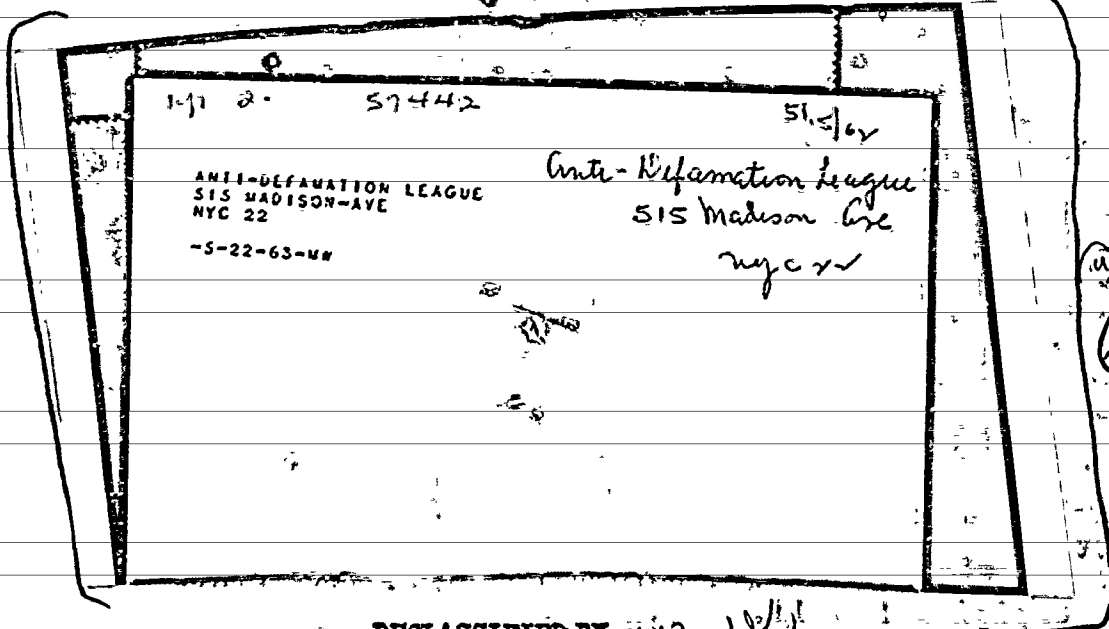

[redacted] advised that he is a member of the Conservative Party and works very hard to keep his party as clean as possible by getting rid of bigots and etc.

HE advised that recently through the Herald Tribune, the Anti Defamation League has begun a 'smear' campaign against the Conservative Party. He stated that this is done by indicating that the party is backed by the John Birch Society and that both are anti-Semitic and anti-Negro.

[redacted] stated that one reason for this is because his party [redacted] age [redacted], has gained a considerable amount of support and is now a 'threat'. [redacted] advised that [redacted] has been interviewed by reporters re the charges and he himself has challenged the Herald Tribune to debate the matter on television. He stated that though he is anti-Zionist he is not anti-Semitic and does not believe the John Birch Society is. He noted that he believes a lot in the latter and pending a complete check into their background, he might even join them.

[redacted] advised that he wanted the Anti Defamation League to be investigated.

[redacted] was advised that this was a political problem which is common in the political game, and that his party would have to find means of expressing their viewpoints to the public. He was advised that a record would be made at the NYO but no investigation could be conducted by the FBI unless ordered by the USA or higher government officials.

They are beginning to display a much greater understanding of how to present their arguments to the various levels of the American public (church groups, new left, lower middle class, etc.); and any successes are certain to increase their confidence and, hence, their activity.

The situation, however, is by no means hopeless if the proper action is taken immediately. One thing is certain, the threat on the campuses and in the churches can no longer be ignored but must be confronted directly. Otherwise, we will lose by default because the Arabs are making rapid gains in several areas.

No President mentioned The University of California at Berkeley may have a chapter. No indication given in program. [redacted] may be the [redacted] of the U.S.C. chapter at Berkeley.

Colorado

50 to 60 Arab Students in all of Colorado. There are about 40 students at the University of Colorado at Boulder. Boulder is about 25 miles northwest of Denver off Interstate Route 25. The others are distributed at Colorado State at Greeley which is about 50 miles north of Denver also off Interstate Route 25. There are some others at Colorado A & M at Fort Collins which is about 50 miles northwest of Denver. A small chapter exists at the University of Denver in Denver itself. Denver is the largest city and capital of Colorado.. Other Arab students are distributed at Colorado College located in Pueblo which is about 100 miles south of Denver. There are two Arab students at Adams State Teachers College which is located at Almosa which is just over the border in Colorado from New Mexico. One is from the oil rich state of Kuwait. The source of information on Colorado came from an American student who is here at the conference with his roommate from Adams State Teachers College who is from Kuwait. This student has sympathies on both sides of the spectrum. This student said that at Adams State College he knew of two Jewish students from the Denver area. This student is the son of a Presbyterian minister. He tells me that his father is working on a Ph. D. at Columbia University this summer.

SUBJECT Movie, The Battle of Algiers

The featured film presentation of the 18th Annual Conference of The Organization of Arab Students being held on the campus of the Ohio State University is the Italian film classic, The Battle of Algiers.

The film is a story of how the F.L.N. won independence for the nation of Algeria through a revolutionary conflict lasting from 1954 through 1962. To me, it is a very beautiful piece of propoganda. The reason that The Organization of Arab Students has presented it at their convention is the reasoning, that they the Arabs can use the same methods that the F.L.N. employed in defeating the French in Algeria in defeating the Zionist movement in Israel, and thereby free Israel, and make Israel an Arab nation.

It was very interesting to observe that most all of the Leftist and Students for a Democratic Society of the Ohio State University chapter of S.D.S. were at the showing of the Battle of Algiers at the World Theater last evening. Most all of the Arab delegates to the convention were present at the movie. I might also add, that [redacted] the [redacted] of the 34 Black Students at The Ohio State University was also present for the movie. [redacted] told me afterwards, that the Israelis had certain legitimate demands in Israel, but also, that the Arabs had certain demands also. [redacted] further told me that if the Arabs had to achieve these demands by revolutionary means, that the Arabs had every right to get these demands. One other student besides [redacted] that I saw at the movie was [redacted] last known address, somewhere on [redacted]. This young man has been involved in the activities of The Students for a Democratic Society and other Leftist student causes. He has also been employed by CAMACO, and was arrested in a school disturbance on the West Side of Columbus. At one time, [redacted] seemed to be very sympathetic to the State of Israel. He is supposed to have spent six months on an Israeli "Kibbutz." By way of additional information on [redacted] he was indicted by the Franklin County Grand Jury along with 33 other black students on a variety of charges in connection with the takeover of the Administration Building on the O.S.U. campus in April of 1968, but most or all of the charges were dropped. He is awaiting Federal Grand Jury action in Cleveland on draft evasion charges.

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Since this was a propoganda film, the same parallels were present in the film as to what we are doing today in Viet-Nam. The thinking of the audience is that we are making the same mistakes in Viet-Nam that the French made in Viet-Nam as well as in Algeria. The Arab delegates to this convention think that we are going to suffer a very great defeat in Viet-Nam.

I checked with the manager of the World Theater, and he said that the arrangements were made with either somebody connected with the O.A.S. or the Arab-American Club at the Ohio State University. The owner of the theater was never contacted. -Buckeye-

(7) Continued. He also says that for the exception of Algeria, the only fighting experience of the Arabs has been limited to the fighting of the Jews.

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Part II. Personal Impressions of the Banquet

Part of the time, I felt that [redacted] was praising Zionism. He seemed to be pointing out where the Zionists had their strong points. It was some of these remarks that caused some of the delegates to get up and walk out on his speech. One delegate remarked to me that he had never heard such a mixed up speech.

I was sitting at the table with the group from the Buffalo Campus of the State University of New York System, and the Syracuse University Chapter. I told them that I was representing the local press here in Columbus. They gave me the admonishment to be sure to give them the right impression in the Columbus Citizen Journal, the newspaper that I stated that I was writing this up for.

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Our friend, [redacted] was there again at the banquet, this time dressed in a shirt and tie. I had not seen [redacted] since the sessions on Saturday. By the way, [redacted] was last reported to be employed by Chemical Abstracts over on the River Road here in Columbus.

At the table where I was sitting, the same old line about press bias came up. Most all of the delegates seem to feel that the press in this country was the worse problem that the Arab student in the United States has to face in order to get his point of view across. The leader of the O.A.S. at Syracuse University mentioned to me that he felt that the Christian Science Monitor was going over to the Zionist point of view. He said that he felt earlier this year, that the Christian Science Monitor was pretty much impartial, and presented a fair Arab point of view, but he says that this position has changed. It was the feeling of this leader, that Jerusalem should be an international city, neither ruled by Arabs or Jews, but by an international commission. He mentioned that of late that the Christian Science Monitor felt that Jerusalem should be turned over to the Jews since the Jews fought for Jerusalem in the Six Day War in 1967.

This delegate did make one suggestion for me. He said that I should read both The New York Times and the Christian Science Monitor together. He and some other delegates seated at my table mentioned that if I wanted to get good equal and even coverage of the Middle Eastern situation, that I should read four newspapers. The four newspapers that I should read are The New York Times, The Christian Science Monitor, The Manchester Guardian and LaMonde.

Also at the table where I was sitting, were representatives of the Socialist-Trosky organization. This group had quite a display of literature outside of the sessions at the Conference Theater of the Ohio Union.

SUBJECT Dr. A. L. Tibawi

Dr. A. L. Tibawi, a historian from the London University was the main speaker at the banquet of the Organization of Arab Students held in the West Ballroom of the Ohio Union on the campus of The Ohio State University at 6:00 P. M. on Monday Evening, August 25, 1969. About 200 to 250 people were in attendance at this banquet. Dr. Tibawi has a Doctor of Literature Degree in addition to his Ph. D. in Middle Eastern History. He has written quite extensively on the Arab position in both Europe and in this country.

Other speakers introduced from the speakers platform in addition to Tibawi included the cultural representatives from the embassies of Iraq, Iran. Ministers were present from the embassies of Tunisia, Algeria, Syria, Lebanon, and Yemen. Saudi Arabia sent a woman cultural minister. Mr. James Batal who spoke over the weekend was also ~~XXXX~~ introduced. [redacted] who seems to be the chief propogandist for the Organization of Arab Students in this country was absent. I did see him yesterday morning in the cafeteria of the Ohio Union.

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The Main Points of Dr. Tibawi'S Presentation:

(1) The Arabs started the resistance after the Balfour Declaration. He says they are going to keep up the resistance, and that they are on the second front.

(2) Why can't both sides share Palestine? This is a position that he held to for a long time. He says at the beginning, that the Arabs were willing to let the Jews share Palestine with the Arabs, but that the Jews didn't want to share with the Arabs, that they wanted outright title to Palestine. Tibawi maintains that the Arabs actually have title to Palestine because they were there long before the Jews came along.

(3) He says that the Balfour Declaration has the Palestinian borders extending clear to Syria and Egypt.

(4) You must have mutual co-existence if you want to have peace. He says that the Zionists in Israel today don't want to have peace.

(5) Modern Warfare is the just the way warfare is used. He mentioned right after this point, and I don't know where it fits in that Zionism is not good for Israel.

(6) He talked about Arab miscalculation. He was using the figures of 10,000 frontline and 40,000 second line troops in the War of Liberation in 1948 then says that the Israelis actually threw in 300,000 troops at the Arabs.

(7) Admitted that the Arabs were at a disadvantage in the year 1967 Six Day War. He says that this was due to the fact that the Arabs did not use tactical advantages in the war to the best. He cited the fact that Arab airpower was very poor. He said that the fighting quality of the average Arab fighter was great, but that the quality of the Arab officer was what hurt the Arab cause. He said that the Arab student in the United States should remember this fact when he returns to his native country.

SUBJECT Conclusion, Open Symposium, Palestine and the World, Sunday Evening, August 23, 1969

The program lists the participants as Dr. I. Faruki, Mr. James Batal, head of the Arab Information Office, Miami, Florida, Dr. Colin D. Edwards, Journalist from the University of California at Berkeley, Dr. A. Kaci, United Nations mission representative from Algeria, and Dr. A. Iqbal, University of Chicago. 70 people were in attendance.

Mr. Batal open this part of the session with the statement that the Miami Herald and the Miami News, both owned by the Knight newspaper chain were both very pro-Zionist in their reporting until two months ago. He says that in the last two months, this has changed. He mentions that in the last month, the Miami News has not carried one article which could be interpreted as being pro-Zionist. Mr. Batal also points out that in the Miami and South Florida area, there are 48 Temples, Synagogues, and Jewish Community Centers putting across the message of Zionism. He also says that Miami can be considered the second Tel Aviv.

Mr. Rashin Husayn from the Palestine Liberation Front Office in New York substituted for one of the other speakers that was to appear at this session. Mr. Husayn states that there has to be a total confrontation with Israel on all fronts, Propoganda, Economic, Cultural, Scientific, and Educational wise. He states that when you have achieved all of this, then you are getting somewhere. He says that the Jews living in this country don't really have a true picture of what the Zionists are doing to the Jews and the Arabs in the State of Israel.

Mr. Kaci states that in the Third World, and he refers to the independence of Algeria and Libya from French rule, that in the main part, that the Algerians would use the Arabs to solve the Palestinian situation. He also says that Palestine would be liberated by force and political organization against Zionism. At this point, he feels that the United Nations is not in favor of the Arabs. This doesn't jive with some of the other statements that I have heard at this conference.

Mr. Batal says that the Arabs are struggling to reach the Christian Churches in the United States. One method of suggested approach that was given was to suggest to Arab students living and studying in the United States was to go down the Yellow Pages of the Telephone book. Mr. Batal said that was the approach that he used in covering Florida, Mississippi, and Alabama. He said that the Arab student should make an attempt to speak to as many church groups as they could.

Mr. Husayn said that he hoped that the United States would not get involved in a war with Russia.

Mr. Edwards or I should say Dr. Edwards said that the Arabs should exploit the public relations angle. Try to get on Radio and Television talk shows. Mr. Edwards mentions the Statesman as the leading journal of the New Left in Great Britain. Edwards said that the Look article on El Fatah was pretty good.

A [redacted] from the audience said that outside of the Arab World that Arab students should work with other political groups on the colonial nature of Israel, and will bring the support of the Arab World to their cause.

SUBJECT Dr. Rashid Husayn, New York Palestine Liberation Front, Palestine & Conquerors

Started out his presentation with describing an incident of how the Israeli Army destroyed a house in 30 minutes. Dr. Husayn says that this has been going on for the last 21 years.

He says that Palestine has been invaded, but not conquered, or I should say the other way around, Palestine has been conquered but invaded. He has listed four ways that the Arabs have been dealt with in the invaded parts of Israel:

(1) That the Israelis have punished the Arabs who have dared to stay in their homes. Not raders. Wanted to be witnesses to what was going on, have land and homes! He said that the Arabs were demoralized by the Israelis. In the last 21 years, nobody could imagine how the Arabs had been persecuted by the Jews who claim they have been persecuted for the last 2,000 years. He presented other stories of how the Israeli Army destroyed whole villages and towns.

(2) In 1948-1949, the Israeli Army occupied villages by force, where they fought for villages, the Arabs were driven out. He mentioned how in the 1956 Sinai Campaign that the Israeli Army just assimilated 17 villages. Presented incidents of what happened after the Curfew was imposed. Talked about wholesale murders that were ordered by Israeli Army officers. He also mentioned that the author of Babi Yar denounced what the Jews were doing in Israel to the Arab population.

(3) Military Government was imposed by the Jews upon the Arab inhabitants. They could send the Arabs anywhere they felt like sending them to live. Up to the 1960's they (the Israelis) prevented the Arabs from traveling wherever they wanted to travel. They had to have the permission from the Israeli military government. Told the story about the student who couldn't take his final examinations at the Hebrew University who had to travel to Germany in order to take his exam. It seems rather funny that this student would go to Germany to take this exam.

The speaker went on to mention that nobody seem to care about the Jews during the Hitler regime. Now he says that the same situation exists with the Arabs, that the Jews don't care anything about the Arabs.. He maintains that the Jews in the United States and elsewhere to allow this kind of thing to go on.

Talked about the confiscation of land. Said that the land be returned to the Israeli peasants and taken away from Arab land owners. The speaker says that the "Kibbutz" in Israel is the center of "Socialism" in Israel. He says that the Arabs know more about agriculture than the Israelis. He made the charge that all of the agricultural advances that the Israelis have made has been with the aid of capital from the United States.

In the field of Education, he charges that Arabs can't get the books in order to advance themselves. He charges that the Jews will not let the Arabs read the great literature so that they can get ahead.

Batal has a good story on this incident "[redacted] lost his composure and ended up calling Batal a liar" supposedly [redacted] apologized.

Incident 4. Grace Lutheran Church
He asked them if he could speak there- then they asked him to cancel, from this he claims injustice to Arabs in Miami.

Incident 5 Radio Program "Roundtable"
Topic: The Importance of the Arab World to Our Country, the USA."
Florida open forum.

Incident: Mort lucoff Jan. 14 1969 paper reporter-typical American reporter who dislikes Arab world. Men like him affects stream of American Life by preventing American Citizens from presenting the other side to the American people.

(9) Continued. At this point, I would say that Dr. Colin Edwards and []
[] of the Columbus Chapter of the Organization for Arab
Students are the leaders of the conference. No demonstrations on the part of
Jewish students or groups has taken place yet. Dr. Edwards makes the observation
of equating The American involvement with Israel with the war in Viet-Nam. He
pictures the United States as an imperialist power in both areas. Dr. Edwards
seconded the suggestion of Mr. Colucci that I mentioned earlier. He says that if
you can't get into the big metropolitan newspapers, then start at the local level.
Another Arab delegate also from the Ohio State University chapter mentioned that
the Arab students at The Ohio State University were taking out full page ads in
the Lantern which is the daily newspaper of the Ohio State University.

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(5) Edwards said that a Radio Station named KBFA did put on his Arab program, but got threats from Zionist groups. I just checked with WOSU radio here at the campus and I find out that the correct call letters for the station is KPFA and it is located at Berkeley. This station may be the campus station for the University of California. Edwards also related an incident of how [redacted] who is a or was a reporter for the London Times reported from the West Bank of the Jordan River and the threats that the London Times received from advertisers.

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(6) How do you get free press in the United States? This was the next point that Edwards brought up. He says that the Western Press is prejudice to the Arab cause in Great Britain. He says that because of press prejudice in Great Britain and the United States towards the Arab position, that the Western World is ignorant of what is going on in the Middle East. Edwards says that when the Jews arrived in Israel, that the United Nations reported that the Jews brought more technology to Israel. Edwards maintains that because of press bias on behalf of the Arab cause, that we here in the United States are ignorant of Palestinian History.

(7) The New York Times is the one organization that seems to control the press in this country according to Edwards. Edwards doesn't say so, but he implies that The New York Times is the tool that the Zionists use in this country to control the news that people in this country to control the news that the people in the United States read. He says that this press censorship lies with the advertisers that the various newspapers, radio stations and television stations and magazines in this country have to rely on. He says another words, that the advertisers determine the news content of the press media in the United States. Edwards seems to make it clear that any article that appears in The New York Times is detrimental to the Arab cause, and that this helps the Zionist cause. He says that this even exists in the Book Section of The New York Times. Edwards maintains that The New York Times assigns pro-Zionist journalists to review books in the Book Review Section of the Sunday edition of The New York Times.

(8) [redacted] Columbus, Ohio 43224 Telephone [redacted] made some remarks on how the Arab student could improve their public relations image at the local level, and in particular the Columbus, Ohio area. His suggestion was that the Arab students at The Ohio State University should get American friends to go over the Arab students letters with the idea of improving the English content of the letters. He said that in this way, that the Arab students could present their point of view to the readers of Columbus's two daily newspapers, The Columbus Dispatch, and The Columbus Citizen Journal. He said that it had already been tried, and that three or four letters had already been published. I learned from another source that [redacted] was a class-mate of his in college in Montreal. I knew [redacted] as working with Civil Rights groups in Columbus, but I also find out he is a "Snuck" and that he works with the Arabs at Ohio State. He has alot of Jewish friends in Columbus, and is seen out at the Columbus Jewish Center, and does participate in the work of the Columbus Jewish Center Gallery Players.

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(9) Other comments and observations: Praised Rabbi [redacted] and The American Council on Judiasm. Says that Rabbi [redacted] is doing a great job to get the Arab point of view across to the American people as to what is going on in Israel and the Middle East. Edwards also says that many Rabbis in the United States are criticizing the position that the Israeli government is taking on craming Zionism down the throats of the Jewish people in Israel.

SUBJECT The Press and Public Opinion In the Western World, First Session, August 23, 1969

Dr. Colin D. Edwards, Journalist, University of California, Berkeley, California. The first Session of the 18th Annual Conference of the Organization of Arab Students in The United States and Canada was held in the Conference Room of the Ohio Union on the campus of The OhioState University, Columbus, Ohio 43210. Around 100 people were in attendance at the Saturday August 23, 1969 session which started at 9:00 A. M. in the morning.

Background on Dr. Colin Edwards:

Dr. Colin Edwards says that he is a Welch man. He was introduced as being a British free lance writer, and radio producer. He has written for newspapers in Canada, Australia, New Zealand. He was Australian correspondent at The United Nations from 1947 to 1949. From 1949 to 1952, he reported from various parts of Asia to the newspapers in the United States and Canada.

The Main Points of Dr. Edwards Presentation:

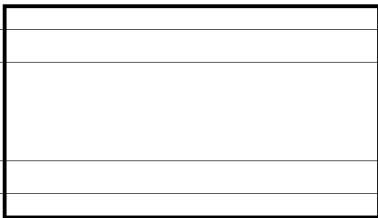
- (1) This whole idea of Arab-Israeli and Neo Sematism and Racism is a mental illness, and is going to hurt Arab-Israeli relations.
- (2) Edwards says that in the main, and he refers to the Arab people in the main in Palestine welcomed the Jews who were persecuted by Hitler during World War II when they immigrated to Palestine after World War II and those that came during the war. Edwards says that the mistake was made by the Zionist Israeli Government after Israel achieved her independence from British rule. He feels that it is the Israeli government, and not the Israeli people as a whole who have created the problem for the Jewish people living in Israel. In this respect, he blames the Western powers that put the idea of an Israeli homeland over as another source of trouble. He also says that the Israeli Government has the Jewish people living in Israel headed towards a very tragic course as far as Arab-Israeli relationships are concerned.
- (3) Edwards says that with Palestine, that we have a state that is neither Arab nor Jewish. Edwards maintains that this dual status for Israel will also face the Jews later on. In making this point, he maintains that the Arabs are an easy going people, that is the Palestinian Arabs. Edwards maintains that the Jewish leaders are trying to feist Zionism on the masses of the Jewish people living in Israel.
- (4) Edwards says that the Western press is very prejudice towards the Arabs in Great Britain. Edwards related that he couldn't get any articles printed by any of the papers in London. Edwards also says that this was true also in Canada. Edwards then mentioned that he tried to get coverage on the radio in Canada. He said that the Canadian Broadcasting Company, as well as two American networks in Canada wouldn't give him any coverage. He said the same condition existed in England. He said that the British Broadcasting Company wouldn't give him any time. Edwards next approached the three major networks in the United States, Columbia Broadcasting Company, National Broadcasting Company, and The American Broadcasting Company for time. They wouldn't give it to him he claims because they received threats from their advertisers.

Professor Tabawi spoke at the banquet, many young Arabs walked out in protest against the conservative nature of his remarks. The young Arabs at this conference, many of whom did walk out on Tabawi, feel that Al Fatah and the other guerilla organizations are the vanguard of Arab nationalism and the Arab hope.

RECOMMENDATIONS - The attached article from the Near East Report indicates that the American Israel Public Affairs Committee had somebody on the inside of the Organization of Arab Students who covered the convention. In my opinion, this is the only way in which they could have gathered the information reflected in this report. I think it is most important, in light of the difficulties we had covering this meeting, to insure that we had someone on the inside of this organization for the next year's convention. It is my opinion that this person should be on the inside of the national New York organization since it is apparent that the local chapters do not have a full understanding of national policy or activities. Qualified personnel for this work can be recruited from organizations like HIAS, which have many Jewish refugees who speak Arabic and who could be employed to get on the inside of one of the larger chapters such as that at Columbia University. By joining and becoming active in a large New York chapter, this person could be privy to important national OAS information.

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In the interim, I spoke to [redacted] in Birmingham and confirmed with her the fact that the American who calls himself [redacted] is really [redacted] and the Arab associate is [redacted] a small, dark, Egyptian Arab. [redacted] started the program on WA-TV about a year ago. At the time it was started, the station sent around notices to all organizations, including Jewish organizations to say it would begin its program. It runs a half hour each Sunday afternoon. The two tried unsuccessfully to bring their program to Atlanta. They call themselves the Committee for Better American Relations in the Middle East and through this organization apparently try to raise money.

The two never showed up for the meeting with [redacted]. However, at the August 28th General Assembly meeting of the convention, [redacted] who is usually a cool, casual person, said he was ready to assassinate four leading Jewish contributors to Israel living in this country. The muscles in his neck tightened, according to my reliable account, when he said this, as if it were a perfectly natural thought for him to express. I think this information may be of interest to our official friends, and I believe that the activities of [redacted] deserve further watching.

CONTACTS - [redacted] gave me the names of two friends who are particularly conversant on Arab propaganda efforts in this country and on Arab guerilla activities with respect to student organizations here: [redacted] instructor formerly at John Hopkins and now at Northern Illinois; [redacted] a Lebanese at Wisconsin State in Oshkosh. Both are friends of [redacted] and they are working on a book on the Palestine Liberation Front. [redacted] stressed that we should get an academic person to contact [redacted] for information and this person can feel free to mention [redacted] name. [redacted] himself will be in contact with [redacted] is neutral and academic on the issues of the Middle East and Israel.

OAS PROGRAM AND DISSENSION - It is the OAS strategy for the coming year that the tension should be devoted to campuses and particularly the new left for recruitment for service with guerilla organizations both here and abroad after the Viet Nam War is over. The feeling is that these groups would respond to appeals to sympathy and justice with regard to Arab refugees. Roth paraphrased a quotation used in these sessions: we can work even on Jewish kids, because of their sense of justice, and we can play on their sympathy. The strategy for reaching campuses and the new left is to set up booths at various campuses with literature and well-informed Arab speakers to tell of his personal sufferings in Palestine.

There seem to be sharp divisions within the organized Arab community in this country. [redacted] of New York gave a speech at one of the sessions in which he stressed the fact that ideology is not important. It is important just to unite, fight, win, and act justly in victory. Others present argued that ideology was necessary so that they can have a plan for when they do win the struggle. [redacted] fears that ideology will cause unnecessary divisiveness within the Arab camp.

In addition to discussions as to whether ideology is important or unimportant, there seems to be a very sharp division between the old and new guard within the Arab camps. The attached reports indicate that when

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logical focus for new left activities would be the humanitarian aspects of the Middle East conflict: Focusing the sympathy of the liberal American population, particularly the younger group, on the plight of Arab refugees. During the week of the convention [redacted] met with a group of fifteen (15) young Jewish students, many of whom have relatives and friends in Israel, and discussed the Middle East Crisis with them. Almost all were without sympathy for Israel in any way. They indicated that they will not support Israel and will work for Al Fatah soon as long as discrimination against Arabs in Israel persists. They feel that Israel has misrepresented occupation policy to the world. Israeli government has discriminated against Arab students in its schools; it has used fertile Arab lands to make kibbutzim for defense purposes, not arid regions as reported in the newspapers. These were serious students, and graduate students. Among them were [redacted] and [redacted] [redacted] the last from Shaker Heights, Cleveland.

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FUND-RAISING - An exhibit of Arab tapestries, art work, and Al Fatah posters were on display near the registration table of the convention. There were three (3) tapestries being sold at \$20.00 each, the proceeds to go to the OAS. In addition, there were many posters, one of which I have included in the packet of materials to be sent separately to [redacted] which was sold at a much lower cost. Aside from this, the money collected at the convention will be used to support the national. [redacted] told my wife that the registration fee for the convention had been raised to \$7.00 in order to increase the revenue of OAS. Other ways that local chapters raised money are described in one of the memos prepared by [redacted].

PROPAGANDA - At the convention, a mountain of Arab propaganda published by a variety of Arab organizations was distributed. Under separate cover I am sending a complete packet of this material to both [redacted].

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[redacted] - [redacted] reported to me that at the August 26th evening session he met two men who were working together in producing a radio program on Station WATV in Birmingham, Alabama. One was an American in appearance who identified him as [redacted] and his friend was a Christian Arab. According to their own account, they travel all over this country and to Arab countries propagandizing. This year they made three trips to the Middle East, and they just returned from Egypt. They said at Birmingham they raised money from Rabbis and from influential Jews. They also say that their activities down South are aimed at discouraging Jews from contributing to Israel. The Christian Arab mentioned that if you murder American Jews who contribute from Israel, you will inhibit other American Jews from so contributing. [redacted] seemed very influential at the conference and had many friends. [redacted] got into an argument or discussion with [redacted] who seemed much more close-minded than his friend, and [redacted] explained his position on wanting to see justice for the Arab refugees in the creation of an independent Arab state. At this point, [redacted] said he wanted to meet [redacted] tomorrow to tape [redacted] statement. [redacted] asked why and [redacted] said to prove that the Israeli government lies. On my advice, [redacted] prepared to meet with [redacted] the following day at 11:00 a.m. and to try to get more information from him. [redacted] also tried to get [redacted] who lived in Israel for a time, to tell him how much Israeli soldiers are paid.

Ohio State University regulations made it possible for OAS to keep their meeting closed. [redacted] at the OAS News Bureau, part of the OSU Department of News and Information, informed me that the only campus meeting that need be opened to the public is a meeting of the Board of Trustees. The Press and University observers may be barred from any meeting on campus. In fact, in the past SDS had conventions at OSU at which they were able to bar school newspaper reporters and campus observers from several sessions. b6 b7C

The attached press clippings (17, 18, and 16) constitute the only local press coverage of the convention. [redacted] with the use of a press card from one of the local newspapers, was able to interview [redacted] the OAS [redacted] Chairman, on two occasions. The summary of these interviews are attached (12 and 13). In addition, my wife was able to interview [redacted] OAS National [redacted] on the following pretense. She called [redacted] after hearing the [redacted] broadcast on television which indicated that the meeting was opened. She told [redacted] that when she tried to enter a meeting, she was barred and told that the meetings were closed. She posed as a Canadian divorcee and assumed an alias for which she had proper identification. Her interview with [redacted] (items 19) is attached.

NEW LEFT - At the Ohio Union, near the registration table for the convention, there was a literature table ran by a group calling themselves "Youth for Socialism". Members of the group described themselves as socialists Trotskyites. They had on display, for sale, a great deal of pro-Arab socialist literature. Among these publications were Zionism and the Arab Revolution, published by the Young Socialist Alliance, New York, and Burning Issues of the Mid-East Crisis by Peter Buch. The individuals manning the table refused to disclose their identities. One girl said she was from Wayne State. The socialist table remained for the entire duration of the session and the students at the socialist table talked freely with and mingled with the Arabs participating in the convention. At the beginning of the convention, this literature table was very near a table set up by the Arabs, described below, which was used to sell posters and tapestries to raise money for OAS. After the first or second day the table was moved away from the Arab table. At different times during the convention, non-students were seen manning this literature table. These non-students were described by observers as possibly being wives of Arab delegates of the convention. b6 b7C

We learned from [redacted] that the Youth for Socialism group had no connection with the Organization of Arab Students. This group, according to [redacted] asked OSU to permit them to sell literature whenever there is any convention at the Union. The organization holding the convention can ask them to leave. OAS did not so ask them.

One final word on the new left. At several discussions following presentations during the convention, the use of the new left by Arab organizations functioning in this country was discussed. Many Arab delegates expressed the opinion that soon the Viet Nam War would be resolved, problems of the draft would disappear, and new left groups, particularly SDS, would be looking for new areas of involvement in order to keep their support. 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SUBJECT: Organization of Arab Students Convention - August 23-29, 1969

Attached (for [redacted] only) are reports of the August 23rd and August 24th sessions of the convention (items 1-9). These were prepared by "Eve" and "Buckeye". Also attached (items 10, 11, and 14) are general analyses of the convention by "Buckeye" and "Adam". The analysis by "Adam" was prepared on the basis of numerous conversations during the weekend sessions with Arab students from all parts of the country, and a rather extensive background in knowledge of the Middle East Crisis. Items 12, 13, and 19 are reports of meetings between national officers of the OAS and [redacted] here, and [redacted] [redacted] met with [redacted] of the OAS convention and chairman of the OAS News Editorial Board, and [redacted] met with [redacted], the national Vice-President of the OAS.

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COVERAGE - The sessions, beginning August 25, 1969, were almost impossible to cover properly. They were closed sessions and were conducted almost entirely in Arabic. The decision to close the sessions seems to have been made by the national organization without the knowledge or consent of the local chapter. On several occasions, local officers told our people that all sessions would be opened and that we need only register for the sessions beginning on August 25th. In fact, Sallah Mahmoud, the OSU OAS President, on "Tom Gliebler Reports" on Channel 10-TV, 10:00 - 12:00 a.m., August 26, 1969, announced on television that these sessions were opened to the public.

In fact, only those Arab students who had been a member of a local OAS chapter for at least a year and were recommended by their chapters for entrance into the convention were permitted to register. In addition, non-Arab students must have had five Arab students recommend them to join a local chapter. These rules were strictly enforced with regard to Arab and non-Arab students alike. Arab students were checked each time they wanted to enter a session for proper identification. Arabic speaking wives of delegates to the convention were not permitted to enter certain sessions. "Jezebelle", formerly a member of a Pennsylvania OAS chapter, was not permitted to enter despite the fact she spoke fluent Arabic, and threw around the names of OAS members from her chapter. "Jezebelle" tells me that it is relatively easy to obtain the proper accreditation once one is a member of the local chapter. Some time during the year a list is passed around at a chapter meeting and anyone wishing to attend the annual convention may sign the list and credentials, at least in the past, were issued without too much trouble. The Arab students at the registration desk told several of our people, some of whom spoke Arabic and were in fact Arabic Jews, that requirements for admission were much, much stricter this year than they had been in the past.

Group Will Host 500 Arab Students

The Arab-American Association at Ohio State University will host about 500 Arab students and immigrants for seven days, beginning Saturday at the Ohio Union.

It will be the association's 18th annual convention, and emphasis will be on the continuing Arab-Israeli conflict and on Arab students' problems in Western nations.

A SYMPOSIUM featuring authorities on the Middle Eastern crisis will open the convention at 9 a.m. Saturday. The public is invited. There will be a banquet at 6 p.m. Saturday in the union.

Dr. C. D. Edwards, of the University of California at

Berkeley, Dr. I. Al'Faruqi, of Temple University in Philadelphia, and Dr. James Batal, an American-born Lebanese with the Arab League in Florida, will be principal speakers at the symposium.

REGULAR BUSINESS sessions of the convention will begin at 9 a.m. Monday in the union and continue through next Friday.

Most of those attending are expected to be students, but there will also be numbers of American residents born in the Middle East, a spokesman said. Many will be staying in OSU's Drackett Tower dormitory.

INCREASED understanding between Americans and Arabs as well as improved relations between the two cultures are the reasons for the convention.

There are about 40 Arab students at OSU. Most expect to return to their native countries when their studies are completed.

Arab Student Claims U.S. Media Present Biased Mideast Reporting

The American news media "show the Arab as the bad guy," says Slimane Cherif.

Cherif and the group he heads, the Organization of Arab Students in the U.S. and Canada, met Saturday and Sunday at the Ohio Union on the Ohio State University campus to seek what they can do about the Arab image.

ALTHOUGH part of the problem is caused by cultural differences, Cherif, a 25-year-old Algerian and graduate student in physics at the University of Michigan, attributed the bulk of the "misunderstanding" to the Zionist influence on the press.

In other words, he said, "money."

Cherif quoted a British freelancer who spoke to the group Saturday as saying that the "people controlling the media put up barriers to build an anti-Arab bias in reporting.

"NEWS IS suppressed," he said. "And people lose their jobs if they report favorably to the Arab side of the Palestinian question."

As for what his group can do about it, Cherif said letters to the editor protesting biased coverage have not done any good, so the students can now only concentrate on "everyday relations with people. Tell individuals, and groups how we see it."

But he stressed the 200

members attending the 18th annual convention are students first. "We came here to get an education," he said. "Politics come after studies."

CHERIF SAID the problem in Palestine is not one of religion, but of politics: Zionism does not belong.

"They claim Palestine on the fact that they lived there 4,000 years ago," he said. "I prefer the human problem concerning the people being kicked out," he added.

Although he did not wish to discuss Egypt's Nasser, Cherif described the young Arab militants who have been making forays into Palestine as "people who have taken matters on themselves. They feel they'll be turned out

otherwise," he said, adding the militants plan to return to Palestine if it takes 4,000 years.

FOLLOWING a two-day symposium on the barriers in the spread of information about the Arab side of the Mideast conflict, the five-day regular convention opens.

Speakers at the symposium included California journalist C. D. Edwards of Berkeley, Calif.; Dr. A. Kaci, U.N. Algerian Mission; Dr. I. Al-Faruqi of Temple University; and Dr. A. Iqbal of the University of Chicago.

The five-day convention starting Monday will feature normal convention activities, election of officers and business reports but will also highlight the exploration of the Palestine conflict with such topics as Arab resistance to the British, role of the student, and history of Palestine.

On the subject of fund-raising and finances, [redacted] was very closed-mouthed. He said that OAS cannot raise money for Fatah because of U.S. Government restrictions. Furthermore, he said that it is difficult for young Arabs working in this country to raise money for Arab causes because of the pressure of a Zionist business community which will cause them to lose their jobs.

SUBJECT: Meeting with Ibrahim Kamel

Subject was very nice, intelligent, and a sensitive fellow. I told him I was interested in helping the Arab cause and expressed some indignation of the fact that the meetings of the convention were closed, although they were advertised as being opened public meetings. He apologized for any inconvenience this misunderstanding might have caused me and we spent nearly two hours discussing the OAS and problems of Arab propaganda in this country. With him was a friend whose first name was [REDACTED] and who is in the Aero-Space Department at the University of Oklahoma.

[REDACTED] stated that the goal of the OAS is to educate Arabs living in this country to maintain their Arab identity and not to abandon the cause of relatives in the Middle East. Both [REDACTED] stated that they were no longer concerned with getting favorable publicity for the Arab cause in this country because they felt that the newspapers and the businesses advertising in these newspapers would prevent the expression of anything but pro-Zionist's point of view.

With respect to the New-Left, [REDACTED] stated that neither officially or unofficially is OAS allied with SDS. He stated that membership of SDS is primarily Jewish and that working with such a leadership would be futile.

When I asked whether the support of conservative elements in the South could be obtained, [REDACTED] said that this would be unfavorable because Southerners are anti-Semitic and Arabs are Semites, and because in the Southern Bible belt the Southerners regard Arabs as Sons of Ishmael or outcasts. Another problem is that once Arabs begin to work down South and try to gain support from the Southerners, they will forget their goal and become Americanized.

With respect to Al Fatah, both [REDACTED] said that this terrorism movement is the real hope of the Arab people. He said that young Arab members of OAS believe in the action of Al Fatah rather than in trying to sell the just and humanistic cause of the Arabs to the American public. [REDACTED] said that many of the Arabs in this country donate time and money to Al Fatah. Young Arabs here feel that only Al Fatah can provide the morale builder to keep Arab students from becoming to Americanized.

Yet with all this, and despite his own frequent references to "lack of political maturity" and "lust for power" on the part of "certain" Arab states, Hussein cannot understand why the world views the Arabs as "irresponsible and unstable."

The inside cover lauds the book for giving the Arab side of the war, instead of the "Israeli point of view." But ironically, it is from just such a collection of Arab confessions—which can only be described as unintentional self-satire—that one can best understand what Israel has had to contend with for 20 years.

legations to embassies—a formal expression of the steady improvement in commercial and political ties since the 1967 war.

Arab reaction was swift and angry: Sudan and Syria severed relations with Rumania; Iraq and Egypt recalled their ambassadors, Rumania sharply rejected Arab protest as "interference in internal affairs", and called the upgrading of relations "a normal sovereign prerogative."

Rumania is the only East European country which refused to comply with the Kremlin's order for severance of relations with Israel after the June war. Rumania's friendship with Israel has been a symbol of her ambition to evolve a foreign policy independent of Moscow.

One-Sided—Once Again

On Aug. 25, the UN Security Council voted unanimously to condemn Israel's Aug. 11 attack on terrorist bases in Lebanon. The condemnation came one day after terrorists fired rockets into Jerusalem—the first time since the 1967 war.

The resolution deplors "actions of military reprisal and other grave violations of the cease-fire" but makes no specific mention of the terrorism which provoked Israel's response.

U.S. Ambassador Charles W. Yost conceded that the resolution "does not deal in as balanced a fashion as we would have wished with the cycle of provocation and reprisal."

Israel Ambassador Yosef Tekoah, who denounced the resolution as another example of the UN's "double standard," put it bluntly: "Stop armed attacks against us and there will be tranquility."

OAS leans left

The Organization of Arab Students (OAS); meeting in Columbus, Ohio

last week, voted to support the "Palestinian Freedom Fighters" and urged all Arab governments to do the same.

The resolutions also called on Arab states to renounce the Nov. 22, 1967 UN resolution, extend diplomatic recognition to East Germany and grant full rights for all national and religious minorities in the Arab world "as a matter of equal principle to our position on justice in Palestine."

These resolutions, along with numerous others condemning racism, imperialism, the Shah of Iran, Haile Selassie, Rumania, Rhodesia, South Africa, Biafra, Portugal, the Greek junta, Russian intervention in Czechoslovakia, emigration of Eastern European Jews to Israel, and all backers of Israel, and supporting the Viet Cong, Nigeria, all "people's liberation struggles," students' rights throughout the world, and all those who condemn Israel, are nothing new for the 1,000-member organization which represents some 6,000 Arabs studying on U.S. campuses. A virtually identical set of resolutions was passed last year and the same sort of declarations might well have come from any number of New Left student groups in this country.

There were ideological splits. Conspicuous was a small minority on the extreme left who loudly preached Franz Fanon's notion of "violence purifying the nation" and insisted on political indoctrination prior to a war of liberation.

Speakers were more conservative than the students. The principal speaker, Dr. A. L. Tibawi of the University of London, was denounced from the floor as "reactionary" and "old-fashioned." Several students likened him to an Arab "Uncle Tom" for his failure to press for a "liberation war" and for his emphasis on education. More welcome were several speakers who denounced the Western press as "Zion-

ist-controlled" and decried the "Zionist conspiracy" in America "to suppress the truth."

In recent years, leftist Arab students have become increasingly critical of Arab regimes. However, representatives of Algeria, Egypt, Jordan, Libya, Lebanon and the Arab League attended the convention.

Dr. Kamal Abdul Magd, Egypt's cultural counselor in Washington, indicated that Arab governments are concerned about the anti-establishment posture of OAS. He attributed the organization's radicalism to the mood of the American campus and expressed confidence that the students would "get more moderate and pragmatic and have closer touch with reality" when they returned home.

Terrorism from the Right

Leftist regimes are not immune to terrorism.

Bombs exploded in several public places in the Sudanese capital Khartoum in the last few weeks. The leftist junta called the bombings "a serious phenomenon alien to the Sudanese people" and warned that it will strike "with an iron fist" against its enemies.

Watching Each Other

The Soviet fleet carried out maneuvers off the Egyptian and Syrian coasts in the past fortnight. Soviet Mediterranean strength has increased to 62 vessels, according to official NATO count.

U.S. analysts see no correlation between Soviet political and naval activity in the Mediterranean, Secretary of State William P. Rogers said on Aug. 20. He added that the United States and NATO watch Soviet movements closely and that NATO will react appropriately if the area's security is threatened.

Last, but not least, mention should be made of the use of Leftist Student Groups. Several of the Socialist Worker-Trosky Party members were present from other campuses. The Students for a Democratic Society peddle the Arab point of view also. The Socialist Worker Trosky Student Organization seemed to be from Wayne State University and they had a large display of pamphlets and books for sale at a booth set up outside of the sessions. These students seemed to mingle pretty freely with the Arab student delegates.

I don't feel that the Organization of Arab Students is too strong. The incident at the banquet on Monday Evening, August 24, 1969 has lead me to make this assumption. I feel that if they walk out on one of their chief spokesmen, and Dr. Tibawi is supposed to be that, than the O.A. S. is as strong an organization as they claim to be in this country.

SUBJECT Impressions and Personal Observations of the Convention

This convention has been a great propoganda vehicle. This convention has served as the big propoganda weapon that all of the Arab students studying in the United States can fall back on at this time. This is a very significant time to have the convention in the weeks before the Jewish Rosh Hashonah and Yom Kippur celebrations. The Arab students are all united around the burning of the Al Aqsa Mosque burning which took place in Jerusalem last week. The general theme of this gathering seems to be the idea of forcing all of the Jews and their Jewish Zionists friends into the sea.

The incident at the Al Aqsa Mosque seems to be the catalyst for this gathering. That is the event that you hear in conversation when you go down to the Cafeteria and hear the Arab student delegates talking. They all blame the Israelis and the Zionist Israeli Government for the fire at Al Aqsa, which in fact it turned out was the work of a 28 year old Australian ranch hand who is a member of the fundamentalist Church of God sect. This young Australian could give no reason for setting of the fire.

No mention has been made of the execution of the spies in Iraq who are supposed to have been spying for Israel and the United States. I have not asked any of the Arab student delegates what they thought of on what is going on in Iraq, but I would imagine that they would approve 100% of the executions.

There is great resentment being expressed here at the convention for the Nixon Administration's decision to go ahead and send the 50 Phantom Jet planes to Israel. The Arab delegates say that this is just going to make the arms race even more furious in the Middle East. None of the delegates want to see the United States and Russia go to war over Israel or any other issue in the Middle East. The Arab delegates defended the policy of Russia supplying Egypt with MIG-21 jet fighters. They claim that these fighters will be the hedge against the Phantoms that Israel will be receiving from the United States.

The overall idea that I have observed from this convention is that the Arab student studying in the United States is trying to find a means of communication in order to present his side of the Arab-Israeli dispute. He wants to point out just where Zionism is the root of all of the trouble in the Middle East. He blames Jewish groups and organizations in the United States and elsewhere for backing the Zionist movement in Israel and the as they say, the Zionist Government of Israel. The Arab student delegates at this convention seem to feel that the Israeli government is controlled by Zionists from within Israel, and from Zionists in the United States and elsewhere.

[redacted] the journalist from The University of BY California at Berkeley seems to have been hired by the O.A.S. in this country to be their chief propogandist. He has pointed out as I have mentioned in some of the other reports that I have written, that widespread use of the Television media is going to have to be used in this country by the Arab student in order to present his point of view. Of course, our friend [redacted] from right here in Columbus mentions that the Arab student here at The Ohio State University should utilize his American student friends in order to refine the English in letters going to the Letters to the Editor.

Tuesday morning was a closed session when each of last year's officers gave their report. Ali stated that most reports were accepted as were, although a few were changed by suggestions from the floor.

The convention continued through Wednesday. Thursday was election day. Four committees are elected by the General Assembly which concern themselves only with the convention. They are: a Constitutional Committee, a Financial Committee, a Student Activities Committee, and a Political Committee. The Political Committee has four subcommittees: (1) Arab World, (2) West Europe, (3) East Europe, (4) Third World.

It took four hours for the election of the seven officers because there were 19 people running and each got up and introduced himself, told what his intentions were, etc. and had the floor for about 10 minutes.

I asked if most students stayed for the whole week or most came & went, and he said most couldn't stay for the whole week.

Subject: OAS Convention

I met this afternoon with [redacted] of the OAS Convention. He reported that they had a very successful convention with over 200 students from all over the United States and Canada attending. New officers were elected for the coming year; 7 of them--President, Vice-President, Editorial Board Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, and two persons who act as a liason for all the chapters nationally. The officers are elected for a term of one year. They will not decide until later where next year's convention will be held, but he said it would probably be in one of the southern states, maybe Texas.

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I asked about the table outside the convention room which contained socialist materials. [redacted] said that this had no connection with their convention; that this organization asked to sell their literature at almost all conventions held at the Ohio Union. He said they could have protested it, but did not.

When I asked about Al Fatah, he said that there was no real relationship between them, that the OAS was merely letting them sell their literature there. He said their two main publications are a montly "Free Palestine" published in Washington D. C. and "The Palestinian Revolution" published in Detroit, Michigan.

He knew of the American Professors for Peace in the Middle East and said that there is a national organization of Arab professors, but he did not know the name of it. He said it is very loosely organized, but will become moreso, and the first meeting was held last year in Washington D. C.

He then went over with me each session during the symposium on Saturday and Sunday, and the convention Monday through Wednesday. He didn't tell me much more than the printed schedule. I asked him about the session I attended on Tuesday, and he explained that this was what each day was--speakers, followed by either panel discussions or discussion from the floor. He said that the speaker which I heard and several others were attacked on what they had to say in the following discussions.

I was told that I could attend the 2:30 session for the speaker only, then would have to leave when the discussion started. [] told me it would probably not be worth my while to cover sessions all week because most of them are in Arabic. He said that in the past most of the sessions were held in English because a lot of the Arabs' wives attended and could not understand Arabic. But then there has been a great debate that it should be in their native tongue. He said that even the session I could attend, I would only be able to hear the speaker and then I would have to leave when they have the following discussions and talk about "concrete" things. He suggested that I come back on Friday and meet with him, when he would go over the schedule with me and explain what happened at each session.

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In the course of the conversation I asked if the OAS supports or is supported by or is connected with any other student organizations. He answered no, that it is an independent organization. I also asked about issues such as the boycott of goods going into Israel, etc. He answered only that this organization was made up of students and that they were not concerned with such things.

The 2:30 session was Dr. S. Naji from Ohio State University speaking on "The Role of the Students." It was a dull general talk on students in general, not Arab students in particular. The only specific things he said about Arab students was that no one could live alone in the world today and that each one should try to work harder to get along and have good relationships with the people around them. Also he urged that they specialize in their field of study.

Subject: Coverage of OAS Convention

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On August 26 I went to the Ohio Union to cover the OAS convention. When I approached the registration desk, I told them that I was a reporter representing the Spectator newspaper and asked if I should register or if I could just attend. One of the men at the registration desk got up and left. He came back with two men in suits, evidently officers in the organization. I explained to them who I represented and they asked me a few questions about the Spectator. One of them then said that the would answer any of my questions and explain which sessions I could attend, etc. I met with the who was very nice and courteous. He explained that the morning session was closed but that if I would meet him back there at 2 p.m., he would explain some things and answer my questions before the 2:30 p.m. session. I met him at 2 and asked questions and he gave me the following information:

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The name of the organization is the Organization of Arab Students of United States and Canada. This is the eighteenth annual convention of this non-profit organization. Each year the convention is held in a different major city, so it has not been held in the same place twice. Members of the organization number over 10,000 and make up 100 chapters. Chapters are organized by universities; Ohio has only the chapter at O.S.U. while Boston alone has 5 chapters. National headquarters is located in New York City. Only Arabs can be members of the national organization, but local chapters can accept other members. The main goal of the organization is to improve Arab-American relations. Some of their activities include Arabian Knights dinners and dances, and lecture tours where speakers are sent all over the country to universities. There were a lot of different pamphlets, posters, literature of all kinds on display. I asked where this was printed, if it was at the national headquarters. It is printed by individual chapters then distributed to all other chapters. The chapters are self-supporting, except for a few weak ones which are helped by the national office. Fund-raising is done mostly with dinners and dances with an admission fee.

4. On many campuses there are rules against discriminating on the basis of race, etc. Therefore it is illegal for the O.A.S. to require its membership to be of Arab descent.

In these places pro-Israeli forces could join and take over the machinery of the organization, its funds, etc. and at the same time dismantle it as a base for the dissemination of propaganda.

5. Concentrate on getting Arabic speaking Jews into the national machinery of the O.A.S. At the recent convention, for example, we had difficulty finding anyone who could attend and understand the arabic sessions where finances, policy, etc. were discussed. This is a crucial factor in combatting the students.

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III

3. The Churches, also, will be inundated with propaganda. The students will begin to offer their services as speakers and to coordinate their efforts through better organization.
4. The problem is that in several cities their efforts have been successful and at the convention the technique was discussed at the national level. The two most discussed examples were Wayne State U. and Seattle, Washington.

Recommendations:

1. Try to determine at the national level a policy to deal with campus situations such as "Free Palestine Week", Arab students' violence in response to pro-Israeli activity (violence and disruption can also be expected to increase sharply in some areas as Arab confidence increases) as well as having centers to which troubled campuses can turn for quick and massive assistance in the way of counter-propaganda and more professional assistance in organizing a response.
2. Do not write-off or lose through default the black power movement. We cannot allow Israel to become in their eyes another Rhodesia or South Africa or to let them picture the Jew in Israel as a carbon copy of the Jews that the blacks in America come in contact with. Here much could be added by emphasizing the Oriental Jews in Israel and what has been done for them as well as Israel's aid to black Africa.
3. Make a concerted effort to find more "even-handed" professors to teach the courses on Israel or Judaism.

They are beginning to realize that success and not ideology should guide them.

2. The Arab students' campaign on the campuses this year will be extremely successful.

a. They must have received a great deal of professional advice in the preparation of printed propaganda. The emphasis will be off of the lengthy, boring manuscripts of the past; the new look is chic and mod. I saw a new collection of posters, seals (like Christmas and Easter Seals), and pins that most students would probably purchase to decorate their rooms without even noticing the "message" until later or if it is the message that is sought. Fatch is subtly included in the list of all the national liberation movements (i.e. the viet cong, the black panthers, rhodesia, etc.). The arabs are learning that Fatch need not be pushed obviously, but success will be theirs if it is just included in the list. Many of the posters did in fact, de-emphasize Fatch in a swirl of psychedelic color and new left rhetoric and cliches (popular ones).

b. I was amazed at the number of Arab professors that are to be found teaching in American colleges. Many of them are experts in "sensitive fields" such as Middle Eastern Affairs. At the U. of Cincinnati the course on Israel was taught by a Palestinian Arab;; at Temple U. a religious philosophy course which is in part devoted to Judaism is taught by a whose statements include such gems as, "The Jews were never slaves in Egypt" or "The only real hope for the Jews is Islam (Islamic rule)".

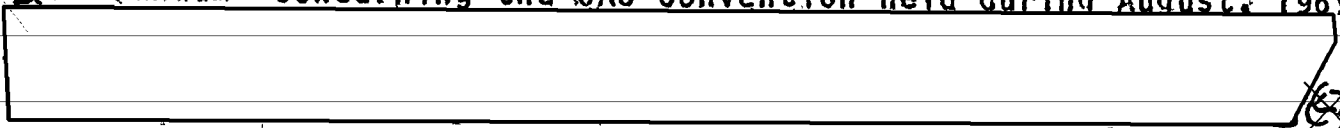

(C) Enclosed for the Bureau are 2 Xerox copies of "a memorandum" concerning the OAS Convention held during August, 1969.



After a review of this "memorandum" by the NYO, it is felt the information contained therein in no way adds to the information furnished by Bureau confidential informants who attended the OAS Annual Convention in August, 1969. Further, it is believed the information previously submitted by Bureau sources was of higher intelligence value to this Bureau, and perhaps was furnished from a more objective position.

Apart from the biased approach evident in this memorandum, it is believed it very possibly represents a violation of the Foreign Agents Registration Act, as amended. This report shows investigation conducted by ADL, using code name sources, pretexts such as local news reporters, etc. Also, on page 5 under recommendations, future investigation is proposed, such as the recruiting of Jewish refugees from organizations such as HIAS (Hebrew Immigrant Aide Society) to infiltrate the OAS in NYC. Of course, there is no evidence to indicate this information is compiled on behalf of a foreign principal, however, it is felt incredible to assume it is not furnished to an official of the Government of Israel, due to the extreme close ties between ADL and Israel as reported by [redacted]. Further, meaning of the statement "I think this information may be of interest to our official friends..." on page 4, is probably subject to definition.

A.D.L. Prevents Dr. Berger From Speaking

N.Y. - Jan. 28. - Dr. Elmer Berger, head of Jewish Alternatives to Zionism, an American anti-Zionist organization, was refused permission to speak at a seminar on the Middle East in Cheyenne, Wyoming, because of pressures brought to bear by the Anti-Defamation League. Displaying a well-known Zionist tactic, the ADL refused to participate in the seminar if Dr. Berger were allowed to speak. Since Dr. Berger is so well known on a national scale for his long work opposing American Zionism, it is not curious that the ADL chose to respond the way it did. It is a rule of the Zionist handbook that debates should be avoided, especially when the opponent is as articulate a man as Dr. Berger. This continued prostitution of both the American constitution and the ideals of religious Judaism by the Anti-Defamation League marks a new low for the Zionists, who have stooped to whatever levels they must to succeed. The text of the letter which withdrew the invitation to Dr. Berger is produced below.

Dear Dr. Berger:

Much has been happening to our conference plans since we wrote you on December 21st. In our attempts to find speakers who would represent the Israeli viewpoint, we have found that the Anti-Defamation League has advised all its members that they cannot participate in our program as now proposed. This in itself has created a difficult situation but, even more to our chagrin, the Cheyenne Jewish community has indicated that they will not attend a gathering which is disapproved by the Anti-Defamation League. Because we are a community service organization, it would distress us greatly to alienate this segment of Cheyenne's society.


