In response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, enclosed is a processed copy of Bates Stamped documents, FBI(18-cv-154)-6536 through FBI(18-cv-154)-7035. The enclosed documents represent the fifteenth interim release of information responsive to your request.

The FBI conducted email searches for any email communication between Peter Strzok and Lisa Page. This search located both official government records and non-record personal communications between these two individuals.

The FBI reviewed 500 pages of these emails. While conducting this review, the FBI individually analyzed the emails to determine whether they pertained to official government business constituting records under the FOIA or whether they consisted of purely personal communications between the two individuals. As a result of the FBI's review, it determined 83 pages were non-record, personal communications not subject to the FOIA; and 417 pages consisted of responsive FBI records.

As previously indicated, document(s) were located which originated with, or contained information concerning another agency (ies). We are consulting with the other agency (ies) and are awaiting their response. Our office has processed all other information currently in our possession. The FBI will correspond with you regarding those documents when the consultation is completed.

To minimize costs to both you and the FBI, duplicate copies of the same document were not processed.

EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

Dear Director Comey:

According to news reports, the FBI investigation into Secretary Clinton's mishandling of classified information has expanded and now involves potential public corruption, including a "possible intersection of Clinton Foundation donations, [and] the dispensation of State Department contracts and whether regular processes were followed." In addition, news reports indicate that 100 special agents have been tasked to the investigation, with as many as 50 more agents on temporary assignment in support of the investigation. It has been reported that these agents were asked to sign non-disclosure agreements.2

However, the Department of Justice (Department) policies and regulations already prescribe rules for Department components—including the FBI—related to the release of information in ongoing civil and criminal cases. In fact, Department components cite those rules when refusing to provide information about ongoing investigations. Accordingly, it is unclear why enforcement of existing policies and procedures would be insufficient, and thus unclear why a separate non-disclosure agreement is needed. Agencies generally require non-disclosure agreements in the aftermath of personnel actions such as those that result in settlement. However, requiring agents to sign specific non-disclosure agreements in order to simply do their jobs and conduct a particular federal investigation appears to be a very different, and unusual procedure.

In any case, non-disclosure agreements employed by the federal government must comply with certain federal laws. As you are aware, the "anti-gag" rider prohibits federal funds

from being used to enforce any government non-disclosure policy, form, or agreement that runs afoul of a whistleblower's right to speak with Congress.³ In 2012, President Obama signed into law the Whistleblower Protection Enhancement Act (WPEA), which codified this language.⁴ A version of this rider had been included in every appropriations act since 1988, but it was inadvertently removed for FY 2014, without the intent of narrowing the provision's application.⁵

During that gap, the Department justified the FBI's use of a non-disclosure agreement that would have violated the rider by citing to the FBI's exemption from the WPEA.⁶ However, the rider was restored for FY 2015 and again included in the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2016.⁷ Further, that Act prohibits an agency from paying the salary of any government employee that interferes with another government employee's right to blow the whistle through lawful channels.⁸ These provisions apply government-wide.

As such, any non-disclosure agreement, including those discussed in the news reports cited above, may not impose illegal restrictions on the right of government employees to make good faith disclosures of potential wrongdoing. In this case, the appearance of conflicts of interest or undue influence will be likely if political appointees at the Justice Department are involved in prosecutorial decisions related to former Secretary Clinton or her senior aides. Accordingly, in order for the public to have confidence in the integrity of the process, it is even more critical in this instance that employees know that they have the right to report any misconduct in the handling of the case, regardless of any special non-disclosure agreement.

If non-disclosure agreements are being used, they must conform with existing Department policies and regulations, and federal law. As such, it is imperative that the Committee review the text of any non-disclosure agreements in order to assess their compliance with federal whistleblowing law.

Accordingly, please answer the following:

- 1. Are agents working on the investigation into Secretary Clinton's email server, the potential mishandling of classified information and related matters ("Clinton investigation"), required to sign non-disclosure agreements? If so, who decided to impose that requirement and why?
- 2. Please provide a copy of the non-disclosure agreement FBI agents were required to sign.
- 3. Did any agents refuse to sign or raise objections to the agreement? And were any of them prevented from working on the Clinton investigation as a result?

- 5. During your tenure, in how many investigations have FBI agents been required to sign a non-disclosure agreement? Were any such non-disclosure agreements the same as the ones reportedly required in the Clinton investigation? Please provide a representative sample of such a non-disclosure agreement.
- 6. Does the FBI have a general policy on the use of non-disclosure agreements? If so, please provide a copy of the policy.

Agencies Battle Over What Is 'Top Secret' in Hillary Clinton's Emails

WASHINGTON — Some of the nation's intelligence agencies raised alarms last spring as the State Department began releasing emails from <u>Hillary Clinton</u>'s private server, saying that a number of the messages contained information that should be classified "top secret."

The diplomats saw things differently and pushed back at the spies.

In the months since, a battle has played out between the State Department and the intelligence agencies — as well as Congress — over what information on Mrs. Clinton's private server was classified and what was the routine business of American diplomacy, according to government officials and letters obtained by The New York Times.

At the center of that argument, the officials said, is a "top secret" program of the <u>Central Intelligence Agency</u> that is anything but secret. It is the agency's long effort to track and kill suspected terrorists overseas with armed drones, which has been the subject of international debates, numerous newspaper articles, television

The emails are included in seven distinct chains that comprise forwarded messages and replies, and in most cases involved discussions of the C.I.A. drone program, government officials said.

At a <u>Democratic presidential debate</u> in New Hampshire on Thursday night, Mrs. Clinton dismissed the issue, as she has in the past. She said the government was overzealously classifying information after the fact, citing as evidence the State Department's <u>finding</u> that two emails sent to Colin L. Powell's private email account and 10 others sent to the personal accounts of aides to Condoleezza Rice when each served as secretary of state should now be classified years after the fact. It is against the law to have classified information outside a secure government account.

"This just beggars the imagination," Mrs. Clinton said, going on to argue that the issue was merely an extension of Republican criticism over the attack against the American mission and C.I.A. annex in Benghazi, Libya, in 2012.

It remains unknown what exactly the 22 emails contain, given their classification as "top secret," but the officials described them generally, on the condition of anonymity. The officials included people familiar with or involved in the handling of the emails in government agencies and in Congress.

Spokesmen and women for the State Department, the C.I.A. and the intelligence agencies' inspector general declined to comment on the content of the emails.

Security Designations

Some of the emails include material classified at the highest levels, known as Top Secret/S.A.P., according to a letter sent to the Senate on Jan. 14 by the inspector general of the nation's intelligence agencies, I. Charles McCullough III. That designation refers to "special access programs," which are among the government's most closely guarded secrets.

Several officials said that at least one of the emails contained oblique references to C.I.A. operatives. One of the messages has been given a designation of "HCS-O"—indicating that the information was derived from human intelligence sources—a detail that was <u>first reported by Fox News</u>. The officials said that none of the emails mention specific names of C.I.A. officers or the spy agency's sources.

The government officials said that discussions in an email thread about a New York Times article — the officials did not say which article — contained sensitive information about the intelligence surrounding the C.I.A.'s drone activities, particularly in Pakistan.

The officials said that at least one of the 22 emails came from Richard C. Holbrooke, who as the administration's special envoy for Afghanistan and Pakistan would have been intimately involved in dealing with

Mrs. Clinton's use of a private email server while secretary of state was first disclosed in March, and since then the State Department has slowly released 33,000 emails that Mrs. Clinton and her aides determined were work-related. None of the emails sent through Mrs. Clinton's server were marked as classified, the officials said, and most were written by her aides and forwarded to her. That is also true of the emails forwarded to Mr. Powell and Ms. Rice, which until now have been in the department's unclassified archives.

The handling of classified information on Mrs. Clinton's server is now the subject of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as well as the State Department's security and intelligence bureaus. According to the law and security procedures Mrs. Clinton agreed to follow when she became secretary, such material should not even have been sent over the State Department's official but unclassified state gov server.

At the same time, the officials said, some of the classifications being sought for the emails fall into a gray area between public knowledge and secrecy. In such instances, the original source of the information — and thus the level of its classification — can be disputed, and has been vigorously at times, they said. Other emails have been the subject of rigorous debate over what constitutes a secret and what the nation's diplomats can say about intelligence matters as they grapple with international crises.

"While the secretary of state has a duty to protect classified information, as all of us do in a position of trust, here she did not have the benefit of six-plus months of interagency classification reviews," said Representative Adam B. Schiff of California, the top Democrat on the House Intelligence Committee. "The same information said by people in two different positions may receive two opposite classification determinations." Though the State Department accepted the C.I.A. s classification of the 22 emails, it has also sought to challenge accusations that it was negligent in handling secrets.

During the review, the State Department has rebutted claims by at least one intelligence agency that information in some of the emails ought to remain classified.

Some of those include the emails that led Mr. McCullough's office to refer the matter to the Justice Department last summer, prompting the F.B.I.'s investigation. Mr. McCullough made the referral based on an assessment that four of 40 emails that it sampled early on in the process contained "top secret" information.

Now, after months of review, only one of those four turned out to be classified at that level. (The State Department counts that email among the 22 of last week.) A second of the four emails has been downgraded to "confidential," the lowest level of classification. The third was released last fall.

Different Sources

The fourth involved an email sent by Kurt M. Campbell, the assistant secretary of state for Asian affairs, shortly after a North Korean ballistic missile test in July 2009. The email has not yet been made public, even in redacted form, but the State Department has challenged an assertion from the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency, which gathers data through satellite images, that the email included information that came from a highly classified program.

In a letter this past Dec. 15 to Senator Bob Corker, the Tennessee Republican who is chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, a State Department official said that the information could not have been based on N.G.A.'s intelligence because Mr. Campbell did not receive any classified intelligence briefings for what was a new job for him until a few days after the North Korean test.

More broadly, the memo stated, diplomats working at the State Department or in embassies around the world

constantly receive and pass on information from unclassified sources — so-called parallel reporting — that can involve highly classified matters. That can make it difficult to determine with confidence whether information in any single email came from a classified source.

"When policy officials obtain information from open sources, "think tanks," experts, foreign government officials, or others, the fact that some of the information may also have been available through intelligence channels does not mean that the information is necessarily classified," the department's assistant secretary for legislative affairs, Julia Frifield, wrote in the December letter to Mr. Corker.

Another email whose classification has been disputed was dated April 20, 2011, and was among those that prompted members of Congress and Mr. McCullough's office to begin a review of the State Department's release of the emails by court order under the Freedom of Information Act.

It was from Timmy T. Davis, an officer in the State Department's Operations Center, and it conveyed to Mrs. Clinton's senior staff security concerns in Libya during the war against the country's leader. Col. Muammar el-Qaddafi.

At the time, J. Christopher Stevens, the future ambassador to the country, was secretly traveling there as an envoy to the opposition leadership and had telephoned the Ops Center, as it is known, to advise it about his situation on the ground.

Mr. Davis sent his message, marked "S.B.U.," or "sensitive but unclassified" to two of Mrs. Clinton's closest aides, Huma Abedin and Jacob J. Sullivan, as well as to Alice G. Wells, an executive assistant to Mrs. Clinton who is now the ambassador to Jordan

At issue were two sentences in the email referring to reports by Africon, the American military command for Africa, describing the movement of Colonel Qaddafi's forces near the city of Ajdabiya. In a letter on Nov. 24 last year, Ms. Frifield detailed how the information in the email differed significantly from the suspected intelligence source and could well have been based on public briefings given the day before by NATO's military about the course of the war.

"The conclusion that the information in the email was drawn from that intelligence product is unsubstantiated and on its face wrong, given the differences between the information in the email and the information in the product," Ms. Frifield wrote.

Even in the case of the drone program, so much information about the strikes has filtered into public view that the C.I.A. did not object to every allusion to it, allowing at least vague references in the emails that the State Department has released so far.

In late October 2009, as she prepared for a trip to Pakistan, Mrs. Clinton asked her aides for good answers to questions she might expect while in the country about Blackwater, the private security company that Pakistanis had long suspected was secretly operating inside the country.

Ms. Abedin responded by email that the aides were working on an "answer sheet" for the tough questions she might get on the thorniest issues about American-Pakistani relations — including Blackwater, the security of Pakistani's nuclear arsenal, and drones.

"You will have tonite or tomorrow am." Ms. Abedin wrote.

McDade-Murtha Amendment: Ethical Standards for Justice Department Attorneys

Summary

The McDade-Murtha Amendment, 28 U.S.C. 530B, requires federal prosecutors to follow state and federal rules of professional responsibility in effect in the states where they conduct their activities. It also continues in place the sixty year old directive that federal prosecutors follow the ethics rules promulgated by the states in which they are licensed to practice. Proponents claim the change will confirm that federal prosecutors must follow the same ethical rules as other lawyers and will enhance the prospect of some protection against wayward federal prosecutors. Opponents charge that it will implicitly undermine the Attorney General's authority to preempt state laws that conflict with federal law enforcement interests and that in doing so it will jeopardize the use of undercover techniques against terrorists, drug kingpins and child predators because of possible interpretations of the so-called no contact rule.

Under the no contact rule, accepted in virtually every American jurisdiction, a lawyer in representing a client may "not communicate about the subject of the representation with a person the lawyer knows to be represented by another lawyer in the matter, unless the lawyer has the consent of the other lawyer or is authorized by law to do so." The rule was designed to prevent lawyers from taking unfair advantage of their untutored opponents.

The Justice Department is troubled by judicial interpretations of the rule that indicate that it may apply: (1) in criminal cases prior to arrest or indictment; (2) to federal prosecutors whose only contact is through informants, cooperative witnesses, undercover agents, or federal investigators; (3) even though the represented client initiated the contact; or (4) to contacts with the employees or agents of an organizational target of a federal administrative and civil investigation. The courts have thus far repudiated the efforts of the Department to craft an exception for federal prosecutors administratively.

Similar concerns stimulated by rules covering the disclosure of exculpatory evidence to the grand jury and the use of grand jury subpoenas against attorneys seem to have been eased by internal guidelines and more favorable jurisprudence. At its heart, the debate involves defining the ethical bounds within which Department of Justice attorneys must operate and deciding to whom that task should be assigned.



Attorney General Loretta Lynch met with former President Bill Clinton for a half-hour on her government airplane at the Phoenix airport on Tuesday, an Arizona news station is reporting.

The unannounced meeting, which comes as Lynch's Justice Department is investigating the handling of classified information on Hillary Clinton's private email server, came to light only when Phoenix's ABC15 TV station asked Lynch about it during a press conference.

The Obama appointee told the TV station that she and Clinton did not discuss the investigation or any other government business. Instead, she says they talked about Clinton's grandchildren and golf.

"I did see President Clinton at the Phoenix airport," she told ABC15.

"As I was leaving and he spoke to myself and my husband on the plane. Our conversation was a great deal about his grandchildren. It was primarily social and about our travels. He mentioned the golf he played in Phoenix."

ABC15 reported that the meeting on board Lynch's plane lasted about 30 minutes. The FBI is conducting the email server investigation. Investigators are said to be near the end of their investigation. FBI director James Comey will make a recommendation to Lynch on whether to press charges against Clinton or any of her aides at the end of its probe.

As his wife is under federal investigation for her use of a private email server, former President Bill Clinton met privately with U.S. Attorney General Loretta Lynch at the Phoenix Airport Monday evening in what both sides say was an unplanned encounter.

An aide to Bill Clinton confirmed to CBS News that the meeting wasn't planned in advance: Clinton realized she would be on the same tarmac at the same time and wanted to say hello, adding that it's a courtesy Clinton "always extends" to public officials.

The meeting comes as former secretary of State Hillary Clinton is still under investigation for her email practices—and also came the day before House Republicans released a report criticizing the Obama administration's response to the 2012 Benghazi attacks.

"Actually, while I was landing at the airport, I did see President Clinton at the Phoenix airport as I was leaving, and he spoke to myself and my husband on the plane," she said. "Our conversation was a great deal about his grandchildren. It was primarily social and about our travels. He mentioned the golf he played in Phoenix, and he mentioned travels he'd had in West Virginia."

"There was no discussion of any matter pending for the department or any matter pending for any other body," Lynch added. "There was no discussion of Benghazi, no discussion of the State Department emails, by way of example."

Asked further whether there was any "impropriety" to meeting with Clinton while the email investigation is ongoing, Lynch replied merely that the case is being handled by "career investigators and career agents."

"My agency is involved in a matter looking at State Department policies and issues," she said. "It's being handled by career investigators and career agents. It will always follow the facts and the law and do the same independent and thorough investigation that they've done in all."

Lynch to Remove Herself From Decision Over Clinton Emails, Official Says

Attorney General Loretta E. Lynch plans to announce on Friday that she will accept whatever recommendation career prosecutors and the <u>F.B.I.</u> director make about whether to bring charges related to <u>Hillary Clinton's personal email server</u>, a Justice Department official said. Her decision removes the possibility that a political appointee will overrule investigators in the case.

The Justice Department had been moving toward such an arrangement for months — officials said in April that it was being considered — but <u>a private meeting between</u> Ms. Lynch and former President Bill Clinton this week set off a political furor and made the decision all but inevitable.

Republicans said the meeting, which took place at the Phoenix airport, had compromised the independence of the investigation as the F.B.I. was winding it down. Some called for Ms. Lynch to recuse herself, but she did not take herself off the case — one that could influence a presidential election.

Ms. Lynch plans to discuss the matter at a conference in Aspen, Colo., on Friday. The Justice Department declined to comment. The official who confirmed the discussion did so on the condition of anonymity because the internal decision-making process is normally kept confidential.

The F.B.I. is investigating whether Mrs. Clinton, her aides or anyone else broke the law by setting up a private email server for her to use as secretary of state. <u>Internal investigators</u> have concluded that the server was used to send classified information, and Republicans have seized on the matter to question Mrs. Clinton's judgment.

For the Justice Department, the central question is whether the conduct met the legal standard for the crime of mishandling classified information.

Ms. Lynch said that the meeting with Mr. Clinton was unplanned, largely social and did not touch on

"He did come over and say hello, and speak to my husband and myself, and talk about his grandchildren and his travels and things like that," Ms. Lynch said at a news conference in Los Angeles on Wednesday, where she was promoting community policing. "That was the extent of that. And no discussions were held into any cases or things like that."

That did not mollify Republican lawmakers, who said the meeting raised questions about the integrity of the government's investigation.

"In light of the apparent conflicts of interest, I have called repeatedly on Attorney General Lynch to appoint a special counsel to ensure the investigation is as far from politics as possible," Senator John Cornyn, Republican of Texas and a member of the Judiciary Committee, said in a statement on Thursday.

The meeting created an awkward situation for Ms. Lynch, a veteran prosecutor who was nominated from outside Washington's normal political circles. In her confirmation, her allies repeatedly sought to contrast her with her predecessor, Eric H. Holder Jr., an outspoken liberal voice in the administration who clashed frequently with Republicans who accused him of politicizing the office.

Ms. Lynch has said she wants to handle the Clinton investigation

Is Hillary Clinton Telling the Truth About Emails?

By Lauren Carroll and Jon Greenberg

Saturday's news that Hillary Clinton spent more than three hours speaking with the FBI bled into the Sunday news shows, with Clinton again saying she did not send or receive material marked classified through the private email server she used while secretary of state.

"Let me just repeat what I have repeated for many months now," Clinton told NBC's Chuck Todd in a phone interview following her interview with investigators. "I never received nor sent any material that was marked classified."

The line has been part of Clinton's defense since at least last August. Back then, PolitiFact hesitated to rate Clinton's claim because of the fluidity of events and the ongoing investigation.

Eleven months later, we wanted to take a fresh look.

Classified after the fact

The public became aware that Clinton used a private email server in March 2015. Eventually, Clinton turned over about 30,000 work-related emails to the State Department for public release.

The State Department redacted about 2,000 of those emails before releasing them, saying they contain classified information — including some that have been withheld entirely because they contain "top secret" information.

Clinton's statement focuses on a much narrower and potentially misleading point — that Clinton sent or received material she knew was classified because it was marked.

None of the emails the State Department redacted, or any other emails made public, contained classification markings at the time they were sent, government officials said.

The possibility remains, however, that that she sent or received classified information that was inappropriately left unlabeled — or that Clinton, as head of the department, failed to recognize and deal with information that should have been classified.

Further, because Clinton used a private server, we only have Clinton's word that she turned over all relevant email. It's possible there are emails with classified information on them that she deleted or did not turn over.

Danielle Brian, executive director of the Project on Government Oversight, said Clinton is carefully picking her words.

"On the one hand, I believe that sentence is likely accurate," said Danielle Brian, executive director of the Project on Government Oversight, told PolitiFact. "But I also believe that it is so carefully crafted as to avoid a more important question, which is whether there was information in her email that should have been marked classified."

The plot only gets more complicated.

While we know officials retroactively classified portions of emails on Clinton's private server, we do not yet know if any of those emails contained classified information when they first landed in Clinton's server. It's possible that emails that were not marked classified contained classified information.

There's also some disagreement between the State Department and the intelligence community over what was or should have been treated as classified. Government agencies regularly disagree over what should be classified or not, and transparency advocates say the government regularly over-classifies.

Clinton's specific phrasing — that she never sent or received material "marked classified" — is likely a critical point for investigators, as it's relevant to the question of Clinton's intent and whether she knowingly mishandled material.

In that sense, Steven Aftergood, director of the Project on Government Secrecy at the Federation of American Scientists, said Clinton's claim might not be misleading.

But it's also true, Aftergood said, "that statement alone does not answer all possible questions about the matter."

Overall, Clinton is focusing on a technical aspect of the government chain of classification, that information contained within her private email server wasn't "marked" classified. There is no evidence Clinton knowingly sent or received classified information.

But the government classification system is complicated, and Clinton fails to acknowledge that classified information could have moved through her email server without a proper label. Part of the problem is Clinton's private server itself, because only she and her team know what was in the emails she deleted.

We rate the claim Half True.

Clinton, the Russian 'reset'

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"I can assure you that I'm not very close to Hillary Clinton. I think she's disqualified herself from commander in chief by her cavaller attitude towards our nation's secrecy laws," Cotton said. Russia long has had a military presence in the semi-autonomous Georgian regions of South Ossetia and Abkhazia, two areas that enjoyed substantial autonomy from Georgia.

in 1991, Georgian forces occupied the South Ossetian capital, but resistance by Russian-backed fighters led to a stalemate. In 1992, all parties agreed to a ceasefire, which included a Russian-led peacekeeping force. There was a similar pattern of hostilities in Abkhazia that resulted in a similar solution. The presence of peacekeepers and international monitors worked for about a decade.

Calm unravelled in 2004 with the election of a more nationalist leader in Georgia. There was aggression on both sides. Violence grew and on Aug. 7, 2008, after Russian-backed rebels in South Ossetia shelled ethnically Georgian villages, the Georgian government sent in its army to take control of the region. Russia responded militarily, successfully pushing back Georgian troops from both South Ossetia and Abkhazia.

Clashes continued for a week, drawing in portions of Georgia beyond the two breakaway regions, until France helped broker a peace deal. Open conflict ended Aug. 12, 2008. Russia then recognized South Ossetia and Abkhazia as sovereign nations, though most other countries have not taken that step.

Jump forward to March 2009 to pick up the other point in Cotton's statement.

Newly elected President Barack Obama had campaigned that he would put relations with Russia on a less confrontational footing. Most of his focus was on scaling back the nuclear arsenals of both nations.

As part of that initiative, on March 6, 2009, in Geneva, Switzerland, then-Secretary of State Clinton gave her Russian counterpart Sergei Lavrov a red button. The button was supposed to have word "reset" written on it in Russian. But the Americans got it wrong — the word translated to "overcharged."

So Cotton has the basics of the story largely correct though he's cutting off the edges of the story. Russian troops did participate in military activities on Georgian soil, but troops were already in place as part of a brokered settlement. The Russians didn't necessarily initiate hostilities.

And while Cotton said the Americans hit the "reset" button "a few months" after the Russian invasion, the reality is it took place almost six months after the week-long conflict had ended.

Susan Allen, director of the Center for Peacemaking Process at George Mason University, calls Russia's action an invasion because in early August 2008, no one considered South Ossetia to be an

independent country.

But Allen told us that beyond that legal definition, the details muddy the picture. Georgia made the first large military move. On top of that, Russian soldiers were already on the ground in South Ossetia.

"Russia had had a longstanding role as part of a peacekeeping force separating the Georgians and South Ossetians," Allen said. "Yes, Russia invaded Georgia, and, yes, there is a lot more to the story."

FBI Says Hillary Clinton Claim on Reading Emails Was False

The FBI investigation into Hillary Clinton's email uncovered evidence that her spokesman gave reporters false information in 2015 about the process lawyers used to sort personal emails prior to deletion.

Clinton press secretary Nick Merrill previously told TIME that her attorneys had individually read every email to determine if it was a government document or personal correspondence. "Every one of the more than 60,000 emails were read. Period," Merrill wrote in one email to a TIME reporter dated March 14, 2015.

The FBI concluded that this claim was false. "The lawyers doing the sorting for Secretary Clinton in 2014 did not individually read the content of all of her e-mails," said FBI Director James Comey in a statement on Tuesday. "Instead, they relied on header information and used search terms to try to find all work-related e-mails among the reportedly more than 60,000 total e-mails remaining on Secretary Clinton's personal system in 2014."

The process for sorting the emails was questioned because keyword searches are widely seen as an imprecise tool for deciding if an email qualifies as a federal record under the law.

After the announcement, Merrill told TIME the campaign was still digesting the FBI claims. "No one misled you," Merrill wrote in an email on July 5. "We heard Comey's statement for the first time when you did today, so we're trying to figure it all out too."

Merrill's previous claim that all the emails were read came in response to a TIME magazine cover story, <u>The Clinton Way</u>, by David von Drehle. That story reported, based on a fact-sheet distributed by Clinton's lawyers, that the process for sorting the emails used several methods, like keyword searches, but did not include reading each individual email.

After publication, Merrill objected to the story. "I apologize if the fact sheet wasn't clear enough, but to be crystal clear now, on the record, as Secretary Clinton's Press Secretary and the person whose job it is to be the authorized representative to the media, I'm telling you that your piece was factually inaccurate, that the fact sheet was providing examples of the process used by the reviewers to double and triple check they were capturing everything," Merrill wrote in an email. "This was not in lieu of reading them all, it was in addition to reading them all. We did not mean to imply otherwise."

After receiving this complaint, TIME requested an interview with Clinton's lawyers, which was denied. In addition to Merrill's on-the-record statement, a senior Clinton adviser, who was granted anonymity to describe the email-sorting process in greater depth, repeatedly told TIME in an interview that her lawyers had read all of the documents prior to deleting them.

TIME published a second story explaining Merrill's objections, which included an on-therecord quote from him stating that all emails were read and apologizing for the confusion caused by the fact sheet.

By not requiring staff or lawyers to read the emails, Clinton may have deleted work-related emails that should be archived under the Federal Records Act. Comey said July 5 that the FBI uncovered several thousand work-related emails that were not handed over to the State Department by Clinton's legal team, and he speculated that some of those emails may have been deleted after being marked "personal" by Clinton's lawyers. "We found no evidence that any of the additional work-related e-mails were intentionally deleted in an effort to conceal them," Comey said.

At the time of the disclosure of the private email server, public records experts described the process employed by Clinton's legal team as imperfect. "I would question why lawyers for Secretary Clinton would use keyword searching, a method known to be fraught with limitations, to determine which of the emails with a non-gov address pertained to government business," said Jason R. Baron, a former lawyer at the National Archives and Records Administration who is now an attorney in the Washington office of Drinker Biddle & Reath. "Any and all State Department activities—not just communications involving the keywords Benghazi or Libya—would potentially make an email a federal record. Given the high stakes involved, I would have imagined staff could have simply conducted a manual review of every document. Using keywords as a shortcut unfortunately leaves the process open to being second-guessed."

James Comey's Rebuke of Hillary Clinton Fits a 3-Decade Pattern

Credit Cliff Owen/Associated Press WASHINGTON — For 15 minutes on Tuesday morning, as the political world held its breath, the <u>F.B.I.</u> director. James B. Comey, laid out in clinical detail how the Democratic candidate for president had missed her private email account.

He did not announce until the very end of his statement that he was recommending that <u>History Clinton</u>, who could be his boss if she is elected in November, should not be subject to criminal charges.

To those who know Mr. Comey, it was a classic performance. Throughout his three decades as a law enforcement official, Mr. Comey, 55, has refused to sky away from thomy issues, often clashing with White House and Justice Department officials about some of the most high profile national security matters.

In 2004, when Mr. Comey was the deputy attorney general, he was at the center of a dramatic dispute within the George W. Bush administration when he refused to reauthorize a secret National Security Agency wiretapping program put into place after the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks.

Mr. Comey believed parts of the warrantless wiretapping program may have been illegal. The rift led to a showdown at the Washington hospital room of Attorney General John Ashcroft, as two of Mr. Bush's top aides, Andrew H. Card Jr. and Alberto R. Gonzales, pressured Mr. Ashcroft to sign the order. Mr. Comey met the next day with the president about the episode, and he and more than a dozen other officials threatened to resign over what they saw as a usurpation of power by White House officials

Mr. Comey's testimony about the episode before a Senate committee in 2007 was the stuff of a Hollywood film, as he described racing to the hospital in an F.B.I. car with sirens blaring to try to get to the attorney general's room before Mr. Card and Mr. Gonzales could reach Mr. Asheroff. In his Congressional testimony, Mr. Comey described the events as "the most difficult of my professional career."

"I was angry," Mr. Comey told the committee. "I had just witnessed an effort to take advantage of a very sick man, who did not have the powers of the attorney general because they had been transferred to me. I thought he had conducted himself in a way that demonstrated a strength I had never seen before, but still I thought it was improper."

President Obama appointed Mr. Comey in 2013 to be the F.B.I. director, but Mr. Comey has not shied away from clashing with Mr. Obama's administration. Last October, Mr. Comey gave a speech that said additional scrutiny and criticism of police officers in the wake of highly publicized episodes of police brutality may have led to an increase in violent crime in some cities because officers become less aggressive.

"I've been told by a senior police leader who urged his force to remember that their political leadership has no tolerance for a viral video," Mr. Comey said in a speech at the University of Chicago Law School in October, adding that many leaders and officers to whom he had spoken said they were afraid to address the issue publicly.

"Lives are saved when those potential killers are confronted by a police officer, a strong police presence and actual, honestto-goodness, up-close, "what are you guys doing on this corner at 1 o'clock in the morning" policing," Mr. Comey said. "We need to be careful it doesn't drift away from us in the age of viral videos, or there will be profound consequences."

The speech angered senior White House officials who contended that Mr. Conney had no evidence to back up his claims and that he was undermining their criminal justice reform efforts. Just days after the speech, Mr. Comey met with Mr. Obama in the Oval Office to discuss their views, but he has continued to voice his opinion on the topic — even as White House officials have maintained there is little to back his views.

Mr. Comey has also pushed a rehictant White House to be more aggressive in helping law enforcement and intelligence agencies on the issue of encryption, despite the fervent opposition of many tech companies that have made it harder for the agencies to legally obtain the communications of terrorists, criminals and foreign agents.
