SUMMARY

Period 1 - 31 December 1953

- (1) This battalion continued the development of defensive positions of the right battalion, right regimental sector. Improvement of camp site was continued.
- (2) A routine day consisted of work on the Main Battle Position by all hands of the letter and weapons companies. The Main Battle Position was manned on a 24 hour basis with one-third (1/3) of the personnel.
- (3) Training was conducted with one (1) of the three (3) rifle companies training each day. Thus, in a seven (7) day week each company trained two (2) eight (8) hour days, in addition to time utilized by company commanders and time devoted to organized athletics. Weapons company trained simultaneously with the rifle companies and accomplised the same amount of training. H&S Company trained four (4) hours each week in basic infantry subjects, in addition to on-the-job training conducted in each section. Officers and Staff Non-Commissioned Officers Schools were conducted twice weekly. On 10 December 1953 all training was discontinued on order of the Regimental Commander to allow maximum effort to be expended on completing the Main Battle Position. Thirty-nine (39) selected enlisted personnel were assigned to such Division Schools as NCO School, Mine Warfare School and Machine Gun School. It is considered that valuable on-the-job training resulted from the construction and improvements of fortifications carried out on the Main Battle Position.

Schedule for Replacement Firing for 13Dec53

Regimental Training Memorandum 12-53

Special Regulations No. 385-310-1, Sections I, II, III, VI and VII

- 1. In accordance with the provisions of reference (a) small arms firing and familiarization firing of automatic weapons will be conducted on 13 December 1953 at Range D-7.
- 2. Reference (b) will serve to compliment existing regulations for Range precedure and safety precautions,
- 3. The Battalion Medical Officer is directed to provide one (1) ambulance, 1/4 ton, 4X4, with one (1) corpsman in attendance at the range at all times during the scheduled excercise. The Communications Officer is directed to provide one (1) 1/4 ton, 4X4, with TCS radio, to permit direct radio remmunications to Base Camb. This will be on station and guarded throughout the excercise. These vehicles will report to the parade ground in accordance with the schedule of movement.
- 4. All firing will be in accordance with the following provisions.
 - a. All replacements will zero their respective TO weapons.
- b. Only those replacements who will be BAR men or assistant BAR men will fire the BAR.
- c. Each company will furnish an appropriate number of B4R's for their replacements to fire.
- d. Only those replacements who will be machine gunners will fire the
- e. All replacements will be instructed in the causes of stoppages and procedure for immediate action for both the BAR and Machine Gun.
- f. Demonstration teams will be organized and instructed prior to arrival at the range.
- g. Companies will provide one (1) qualified NCO to ceach the replacements in the familiarization firing.
- h. The HMG Platoon of Weapons Company will provide the required Machine guns and MG instructors.
 - i. Ammunition allowance is as follows:
- The following schedule will govern movement to and from the range. 13Doc53 0715 - All personnel involved will muster at the Parade Ground with their equipment.
 - 0730 Embarkation aboard trucks will commence and trucks will be dispatched to the range.
 - 1600 Secure from firing, return to Battalian Area.
- Companies concerned will issue assault rations for the noon meal. Hot coffee will be provided at the range by the general mess.
- 7. The uniform for firing will be utilities, field boots, field jacket, cartridge belt (with first aid bouch & canteen) utility caps, and helmets (brown side out).

Officers and Staff NCO School Schedule

1. HISSION

- a. In accordance with reference (a) enclosures (1) and (2) are published for compliance.
- b. Training will place emphasis on tactics and techniques applicable to plateon size units. Training in basic ground warfare subjects will be continued to insure proficiency levels commensurate with the mission of the battalion. In addition, increased emphasis will be placed upon the training of the supporting weapons of the company and battalion.

TRAINING PLANS

- a. Training will be conducted on the basis of a six and a half $(6\frac{1}{2})$ day week and an eight (8) hour day during the period 2-31 January, 1954.
- b. Each company, with the exception of H&S Company, will receive a minimum of two days training per week in addition to the allocation of Sunday afternoon to organized athletics.
- c. H&S Company will conduct training four (4) hours per week in basic infantry subjects in addition to the prescribed specialist and "on the job" training. Sunday afternoon will be utilized for organized athletics.
- d. Intelligence personnel will receive training as prescribed by reference (b)
- e. Communications Personnel will be trained as directed by the Battalion Communic tions Officer.
- f. The training of the Naval Gunfire Liaison Team will be conducted by the Battalion Naval Gunfire Lisison Officer in accordance with schedule published by seperate order.
- Officer and Staff NCO Schools will be conducted as listed in enclosure (2).

3. TRAINING LIDS

- a. Training Manuals listed as references in the training schedules are available on request from the S-3 office.
- b. All films and graphic aids which are relevant and obtainable will be provided by the S-3 office as available.
- c. Instructors are directed to comply with pertinent parts of FM 21-8 (Military Training Aids) and FM 21-5 (Military Training) in preparing instruction.

- d. It is expected that this battalion will receive ammunition for field firing during the month of January. The date, time of firing and logistical data will be published when plans are coordinated and approved.




