Additionally, the bill removes existing 14 limits on what factors can be considered in setting a civil 15 penalty for solid waste disposal violations. 16 BACKGROUND STATEMENT 17 SUBMITTED BY THE AGENCY 18 Currently the civil penalty level in this solid waste 19 program is a maximum of five hundred dollars per day. In some 20 cases this amount would not discourage more significant 21 violations where the costs of disposal or proper operation of 22 disposal facilities alone may equal or exceed this level. 23 addition, violations that contaminate or could potentially 24 contaminate water resources warrant greater penalties. 25 limitation on factors to be considered in setting the amount 26 of the penalty is removed. This permits the department to 27 consider other factors, such as the cost which would have been 28 required to avoid the violation. Consideration of the 29 toxicity and severity alone ignore the circumstances of the 30 violation. Consideration of other circumstances may tend to 31 increase or decrease the likely fine depending upon the facts 32 of the case.
