Continued commitment of \$538M for Agile Combat Employment to build the right mix of capabilities to defend against current and future threats

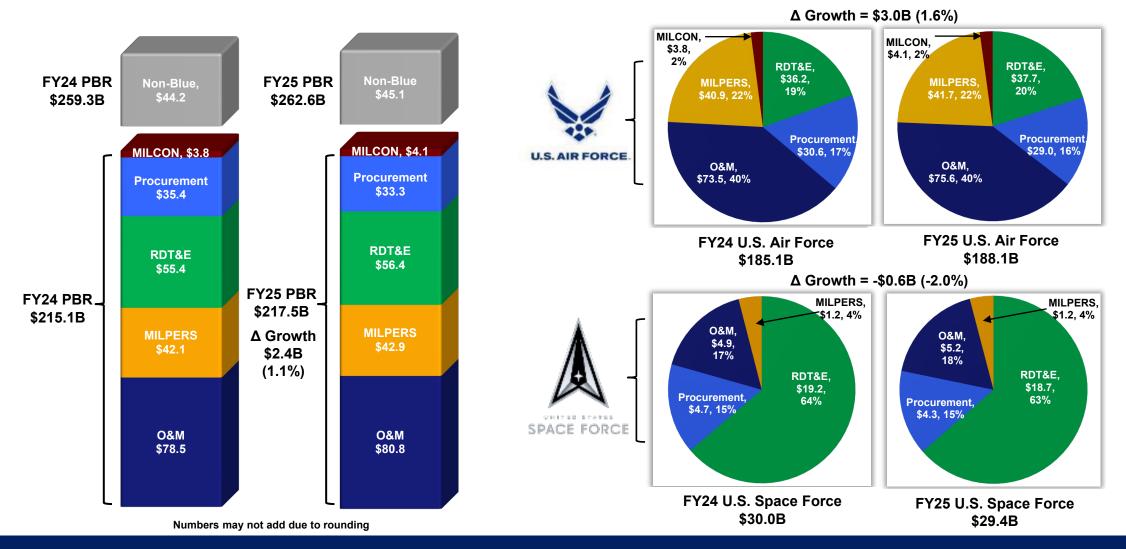

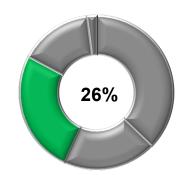

- Funds Nuclear Enterprise Modernization:
 - Provides \$3.7B for Sentinel to continue Engineering and Manufacturing Development (EMD)
 - Provides \$2.7B to B-21 to continue EMD
 - Provides \$623M for LRSO to continue design, development, integration and test
- Adds \$815M for NGAD development and test of air vehicle and mission systems
- Adds **\$243M** for ABMS to deliver software, digital infrastructure and aerial network capabilities
- Adds \$165M to continue CCA development, prototyping, and integration activities

- Adds **\$111M** to increase Space Domain Awareness systems on-orbit/ground-based capabilities
- Provides \$2.1B to Next-Gen OPIR-Ground/Polar/GEO in support of SV test, integration, and delivery
- Provides \$1.7B to Space Technology Development & Prototyping to support Tranche 1 3 development activities

- Provides \$5.9B to procure 42 F-35A 5th Gen fighters
- Provides **\$3.1B** to procure **15** KC-46A for continued tanker recapitalization
- Provides **\$1.8B** to procure **18** F-15EX replacing end of service life F-15 C/D models
- Adds **\$353M** for B-21 to support low-rate initial production (LRIP)
- Adds \$233M to start procurement of 7 T-7A Advanced Pilot Trainers to replace the T-38
- Funds critical munitions and replenishes stockpiles
 - Continues implementation of the multi-year procurement strategy to achieve synergies in production for JASSM-ER, AMRAAM, and LRASM
 - Provides \$825M to continue JASSM-ER production at 550 missiles
 - Adds \$166M to increase LRASM procurement quantities to 115 missiles
 - Adds **\$131M** to increase AARGM-ER procurement quantities to **128** missiles

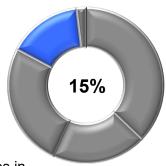

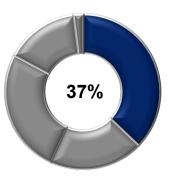

Department of the Air Force:

- Funds an additional \$251M for Civilian Pay raise and compensation
- Facilities Sustainment, Restoration, & Modernization (FSRM) funded at \$4.8B, including \$300M for unaccompanied dormitory projects and \$50M for Child Development Center projects
- Continues to support family programs, funding **\$419M** for Child and Youth Programs
- Prioritizes \$380M for Violence Protection & Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Programs



U.S. Air Force Highlights:

- Adds \$872M to resource 87% of weapon systems sustainment (WSS) requirements, sustaining 111 aircraft, ground, and cyber weapon systems
- Increases flying hour program to \$9.2B & 1.1M Total Force flying hours
- Increases Airlift funding by \$509M to support U.S. Transportation Command operational requirements
- Provides \$400M for Agile Combat Employment to set the theater, provide agile communication, and develop mission-ready Airmen

U.S. Space Force Highlights:

- Resources 81% WSS requirements sustaining 52 weapons systems
- Grows Defensive Cyber Operations by \$42M to improve real-time cyber defense of critical space-based capabilities
- Provides \$114M to enhance Operational Test & Training Infrastructure (OTTI) readiness capabilities
- Dedicates \$29M towards Spaceport of the Future infrastructure initiatives

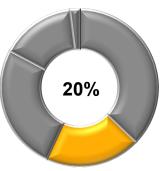

- Improves quality of life for Airmen and Guardians:
 - 4.5% pay raise (+**\$756M**)
 - 4.2% BAH raise (+**\$228M**)
 - 3.4% BAS raise (+**\$38M**)
- Funds \$1.6B for ~136K PCS moves
- Adds \$40M to increase the income eligibility threshold for Basic Needs Allowance from 150 percent to 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Guidelines



U.S. Air Force Highlights:

- Funds **\$1.1B** in bonuses & retention programs for **118K** critical positions
- Includes \$327M for aviation and \$21M for cyber retention programs
- Funds **\$91M** in Initial Enlistment recruiting bonuses
- Funds \$10M in Enlisted College Repayment program

U.S. Space Force Highlights:

- Funds **\$25M** in Selective Retention Bonuses & Initial Enlistment Bonus
- Includes an additional \$5.7M for Assignment Incentive Pay

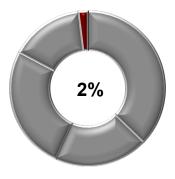

- Includes \$110M for 1 European Deterrence Initiative (EDI) project &
 \$228M for 2 Indo-Pacific projects
- Adds \$158M for new Dormitory at JB Langley-Eustis & Barracks/Dorms for the Medical Education & Training Campus at JBSA-Fort Sam Houston
- Adds \$40M for a new Child Development Center at Mountain Home AFB
- Resources \$222M in MFH enhancements and \$326M in MFH O&M to include:
 - Military Housing Privatization Initiative Restructures at JBSA-Lackland & JB Elmendorf-Richardson
 - Improvement Projects for 51 housing units at Yokota Air Base
 - New Construction Replacement Projects at Ramstein Air Base
