

FINDING OF PUBLIC NUISANCE AND ORDER FOR ABATEMENT

NOW on this 16th day of August 2018, the County Commission of Boone County, Missouri met in regular session and entered the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order for abatement of nuisance:

Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law

The County Commission finds as fact and concludes as a matter of law the following:

- 1. The Boone County Code of Health Regulations (the "Code") are officially noticed and are made a part of the record in this proceeding.
- 2. The City of Columbia/Boone County Health Department administrative record is made a part of the record in this proceeding and incorporated herein by reference. In addition, any live testimony of the official(s) of the department and other interested persons are made a part of the record in this proceeding.
- 3. A public nuisance exists described as follows: growth of weeds in excess of twelve inches high and a derelict, unlicensed, dismantled and inoperable white 4-door vehicle on the premises.
- 4. The location of the public nuisance is as follows: 2510 E. Oakbrook Drive A+B, Lot 22, Morris Subdivision 2 a/k/a parcel# 12-415-20-02-018.00 01, Section 20, Township 49, Range 12 as shown in deed book 2988 page 0026, Boone County.
- 5. The specific violation of the Code is: growth of weeds in excess of twelve inches high in violation of section 6.7 of the Code and a derelict, unlicensed, dismantled and inoperable white 4-door vehicle in violation of section 6.9 of the Code.
- 6. The Health Director's designated Health Official made the above determination of the existence of the public nuisance at the above location. Notice of that determination and the requirement for abatement was given in accordance with section 6.10.1 of the Code on the 22nd day of July to the property owner.
- 7. The above described public nuisance was not abated. As required by section 6.10.2 of the Code, the property owner was given notice of the hearing conducted this date before the Boone County Commission for an order to abate the above nuisance at government expense with the cost and expense thereof to be charged against the above described property as a special tax bill and added to the real estate taxes for said property for the current year.
- 8. No credible evidence has been presented at the hearing to demonstrate that no public nuisance exists or that abatement has been performed or is unnecessary; accordingly, in accordance with section 6.10.2 of the Code and section 67.402, RSMo, the County

Commission finds and determines from the credible evidence presented that a public nuisance exists at the above location which requires abatement and that the parties responsible for abating such nuisance have failed to do so as required by the Health Director or Official's original order referred to above.

Order For Abatement Chargeable As a Special Assessment To The Property

Based upon the foregoing, the County Commission hereby orders abatement of the above described public nuisance at public expense and the Health Director is hereby authorized and directed to carry out this order.

It is further ordered and directed that the Health Director submit a bill for the cost and expense of abatement to the County Clerk for attachment to this order and that the County Clerk submit a certified copy of this order and such bill to the County Collector for inclusion as a special assessment on the real property tax bill for the above described property for the current year in accordance with section 67.402, RSMo.

You are herewith notified that a hearing will be held before the County Commission on Thursday, August 16, 2018 at 1:30 p.m. in the County Commission Chambers at the Boone County Government Center, 801 E. Walnut Street, Columbia, Missouri. The purpose of this hearing will be to determine whether a violation exists. If the County Commission determines that a violation exists, it will order the violation to be abated.

If the nuisance is not removed as ordered, any property contributing to the nuisance is deemed forfeited, and the County Commission may have the nuisance seized, removed, and abated. All costs of seizure, removal, and abatement, plus administrative fees, will be assessed against the property in a tax bill. If the above nuisance condition has been corrected prior to the hearing, you do not have to appear for the hearing.



IN CONSIDERATION of the parties performance of the respective obligations contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. *Contract Documents* - This agreement shall consist of this Purchase Agreement for a **2018 Broce RCT350**, County of Boone Request for Bid bid number **31-03JUL18** in its entirety including the Introduction and General Conditions of Bidding, Primary Specifications, Response Presentation and Review, the un-executed bid Response Form, Standard Terms and Conditions, as well as the Contractor's bid response dated **July 03, 2018**, executed by **Stephen Berg**, on behalf of the Contractor. All such documents shall constitute the contract documents which are incorporated herein by reference. Service or product data, specification and literature submitted with bid response may be permanently maintained in the County Purchasing Office bid file for this bid if not attached.

2. *Purchase* - The County agrees to purchase from the Vendor and the Vendor agrees to supply the County with one (1) **2018 Broce RCT350**

3. **Delivery** - Vendor agrees to deliver equipment as set forth in the bid documents and within 90 days after receipt of order. Delivery shall be to Boone County Road & Bridge, Attn: Greg Edington, 5551 Tom Bass Road, Columbia, MO 65201, FOB - Destination. Units shall be delivered with Bill of Sale and Manufacturer's Statement of Origin. The vendor pays and bears the freight charges.

4. **Billing and Payment** - All billing shall be invoiced to the Boone County Road & Bridge Department and billings may only include the prices listed in the vendor's bid response. No additional fees for paper work processing, labor, or taxes shall be included as additional charges in excess of the charges in the Vendor's bid response to the specifications. The County agrees to pay all invoices within thirty days of receipt. In the event of a billing dispute, the County reserves the right to withhold payment on the disputed amount; in the event the billing dispute is resolved in favor of the Vendor, the County agrees to pay interest at a rate of 9% per annum on disputed amounts withheld commencing from the last date that payment was due.

5. *Binding Effect* - This agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their successors and assigns for so long as this agreement remains in full force and effect.

6. *Termination* - This agreement may be terminated by the County upon thirty days advance written notice for any of the following reasons or under any of the following circumstances:

- a. County may terminate this agreement due to material breach of any term or condition of this agreement, or

- 2.2. ACCEPTABLE MODELS Superior Broom DT80J; Broce Broom RJT 350; Or pre-approved equal.
- 2.2.1. **Quantity** 1 each (Note: Vendor will be bidding on one (1) machine.)
- 2.3. MINIMUM TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS
- 2.3.1. **Operating Weight**: A minimum of 4,500 lb. and heaviest configuration shall not exceed 6,000 lbs. Including ROPS/FOPS enclosed cab.
- 2.3.2. Engine: Rear mounted for better visibility. Minimum 276 cubic inch (4.5 liter), 74 HP diesel at 2400/2500 RPM. Diesel engine to be equipped with replaceable wet-type forged steel cylinder liners and forged dynamically balanced crankshaft constructed of heat-treated high carbon steel. Air cleaner to be dual element dry-type with pre-cleaner at cab height, 12-volt system, 95 amp. And 950 CCA battery. Alternator, ignition key start and variable speed governor. Fuel tank to be 27 gallons minimum and have interior rust-inhibiting coating. Engine shall be completely covered with hinged, solid metal, lockable cover.
- 2.3.3. **Transmission**: Shall be fully hydrostatic, with speeds infinitely variable to 34 35 MPH. A 10micron suction filter will provide oil to the hydrostatic pump. Hydrostatic transmission shall be a closed loop, variable speed direct engine pump, with a fixed displacement motor coupled with a two-speed manual transmission, to provide gradeability up to 45 degrees and neutral position for towing. Closed loop cooling is enhanced by a hot oil shuttle built into the motor and the case drain in the hydrostatic pump, returned to the tank through the oil cooler. Dave Dunford, our Radio Consultant, recommends award to Telecom Product Profiles, LLC of Watertown, South Dakota for offering the lowest and best proposal response per the attached evaluation report. Contract award is \$22,550.

Invoice will be paid from department 2706 – Radio Network Improvements, account 91300 – Machinery & Equipment. \$504,194 was budgeted.

County of Boone -- MO RFP 29-15JUN18 Review, Evaluation, and Recommendation

Prepared 7-11-2018 by David O. Dunford, Radio Consultant

This document was prepared following the issuance, receipt and subsequent request for clarifications and BAFO for procurement of an equipment shelter to be used in conjunction with the Boone County Joint Communications radio network development at the new BCB site. An RFP was generated seeking proposals to furnish, deliver, and set a prefabricated cementitious equipment shelter by qualified vendors. The shelter was expected to be a surplus unit from the wireless/cellular industry and would include typical hardware and features of interest to County.

Responsive proposals were received from two qualified vendors offering a total of five different shelters. A review of those proposals led County to issue a request for clarification and BAFO (Best And Final Offer) to the two Offerors which in turn led to responses from both parties, each focused on a single shelter. In the request for clarification and BAFO, County focused on the following areas for consideration:

- 1. County requested a 'newer' shelter, nominally 10-15 years old
- 2. County agreed to consider floorplans in alternate layout to the original RFP
- 3. County requested detailed photos of proposed shelter(s)
- 4. Nominal shelter size was expanded to allow more variations/options
- 5. County requested explanation of warranty re: A/C units vs entire shelter

Both Offerors were attentive to County's request for additional information and details about the proposed shelters. Below is a summary of those two BAFO submittals.

County has purchased two shelters from Cellsite Solutions who initially offered four shelters for consideration on this RFP and then a single shelter on their BAFO. Cellsite's proposed shelter is a 2001 model made by Fibrebond, a known quality manufacturer. It was originally sold to Nextel for one of their network sites. The layout of the shelter would be acceptable for its application at the BCB site. There were plenty of photos to permit a good evaluation of the general condition of the interior and exterior of the shelter, which appeared quite good. The proposed shelter measures 11' W x 20' L which is quite acceptable for its application. Cellsite provided a good, clear explanation of their position on providing warranty on the A/C units, and no warranty is offered. Their price for the shelter was quoted at \$26,200.00.

Telecom Product Profiles is also a known telecom hardware broker and offered a single shelter on their initial response and a (different) single shelter on their BAFO. Telecom's proposed shelter is a 2007 model made by Cellixion, also a known quality manufacturer. Sabre Industries, County's radio tower vendor, has purchased the Cellixion plant and produces their shelters there. This shelter was originally sold to U.S. Cellular for one of their network sites. The layout of this shelter would be acceptable for its application at the BCB site. There were plenty of photos plus a complete set of construction drawings

to allow a good evaluation of the general condition of the interior and exterior of the shelter plus details of the furnished equipment and hardware. The proposed shelter measures 11'-3" W x 19'-4" L which is quite acceptable for its application. As with Cellsite, Telecom did not offer a warranty on the shelter or the A/C units. One feature of interest is that this shelter was designed for a 150 mph wind rating plus a heavier 'dead load' rating for the floor and roof. The price quoted was \$22,550.00

Both Offerors are to be commended for taking the time to develop and submit comprehensive documentation packages. Requested information was clear and direct.

It is my opinion that either shelter would serve County's needs and that either Offeror would be a qualified, capable vendor to County. However, the Telecom shelter offers three clear benefits to County. First, it is six years newer than the proposed Cellsite structure. This age difference means little to the structure, but may indicate that the A/C units and related electrical equipment are in better condition on the Telecom shelter. Second, the Telecom structure is rated for much higher wind and dead load withstand capacity. This is significant to County because this shelter will house site linking equipment which would qualify this site as 'system critical'. Third, the Telecom shelter is lower in cost by \$3,650.00.

Based on these considerations, it is my recommendation that County proceed to contract with Telecom for their proposed shelter.

A. Desired nominal size is 12' in width (short walls) and 20' in length (long walls).

B. Nominal 8' to 9' interior height is desired.

C. Contractor is encouraged to offer alternate similar sized shelters that may be suitable for County.

3.2.3. Construction

Shelter should be of cement-based rigid panel or cast assembly style. Metal or wood frame construction shelters are unacceptable. The shelter should have the following provisions:

3.2.6. Shelter Equipment

- B. Nominal 120/240 VAC single phase electrical service panel
- C. Typical complement of interior overhead lighting
- D. Typical complement of overhead raceway components and hardware

3.2.7. Delivery and Placement

3.4. Contract Terms and Conditions:

3.4.1. The successful Offeror is prohibited from assigning, transferring, conveying, subletting, or otherwise disposing of this agreement or its rights, title or interest therein, or its power to execute such agreement to any other person, company or corporation without the prior consent and approval in writing by the County.

3.4.2. Offeror must clearly state any restrictions or deviations from these specifications. Insurance Requirements: The Contractor shall not commence work under this contract until they have obtained all insurance required under this paragraph and such insurance has been approved by the County, nor shall the Contractor allow any subcontractor to commence work on their subcontract until all similar insurance required of subcontractor has been so obtained and approved. All policies shall be in amounts, form and companies satisfactory to the County which must carry an A-6 or better rating as listed in the A.M. Best or equivalent rating guide. Insurance limits indicated below may be lowered at the discretion of the County.

3.5.2. Employers Liability and Workers Compensation Insurance - The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this contract, **Employers Liability and Workers Compensation Insurance** for all of their employees employed at the site of work, and in case any work is sublet, the Contractor shall require the subcontractor similarly to provide Workers Compensation Insurance for all of the latter's employees unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Contractor. Workers Compensation coverage shall meet Missouri statutory limits or provide evidence of monopolistic state coverage. 3.5.8. Nothing in these requirements shall be construed as a waiver of any governmental immunity of the County, its officials nor any of its employees in the course of their official duties.

3.5.9. Failure to maintain the required insurance in force may be cause for contract termination. In the event the Agency/Service fails to maintain and keep in force the required insurance or to obtain coverage from its subcontractors, the County shall have the right to cancel and terminate the contract without notice.



TAX COLLECTION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this \cancel{Magust} , $20\cancel{8}$, by and between the **City of Columbia, Missouri**, a municipal corporation, hereinafter called the "City" and Boone County, Missouri, through the Boone County Commission, hereinafter called the "County", and Tom Schauwecker, Boone County Assessor, hereinafter called the "Assessor", Taylor W. Burks, Boone County Clerk, hereinafter called the "Clerk", and Brian McCollum, Boone County Collector of Revenue, hereinafter called the "Collector";

WHEREAS, the City and County are empowered, under Article VI, Section 16 of the Missouri Constitution, and RSMo Sections 50.332 and 70.220, to enter into certain cooperative agreements for collection of property taxes; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto believe it to be mutually advantageous for the County to assess, prepare and collect property taxes for the City for an agreed compensation;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

I

The County by and through the County Assessor agrees to perform the assessment function of determining the fair market value and true assessed value of all real and personal property located within the City boundaries.

II

The County agrees to create, on behalf of the City, tax billing amounts relating to all real and personal property located within the City boundaries including surtax on businesses located within the boundaries of the City. Such billing amounts are to be included and identified separately on tax bills generated on taxable property within the boundaries of the City, and shall include property taxes relating to the City of Columbia, Missouri.

The Columbia Special Business District has not extended a tax levy since 2011 and the parties agree that the collection of any Columbia Special Business District levies in the future is beyond the scope of this Agreement.

IV

The County, by and through the County Collector, hereby agrees to bill and collect, on behalf of the City, all monies due and owing the City for taxable property within the boundaries of the City *except* monies due and owing that relate to Special Assessments.

V

The County agrees that the City shall have access, during reasonable times and under the supervision of the Clerk or Collector, whichever is appropriate, to all data relating to the City taxes accumulated under the tax collection and processing system.

VI

The Collector agrees to remit to the City the receipts due the City at the same time the Collector remits other receipts similarly collected on behalf of other cities within the County; provided, however, that there shall be a remittance to the City at least once per month at which time the Collector shall provide a Statement of Monthly Collections and Distributions Report. The parties agree any monies received by the Collector on behalf of the former Columbia Library District for tax levies prior to January 1, 2018, shall be remitted to the new, unified Columbia and Boone County Library District pursuant to RSMo Section 182.291.

VII

The City shall fix its ad valorem property tax rates, as provided in RSMo Section 67.110, not later than September first for entry in the tax books. If the City should fail to comply with RSMo Section 67.110, then no tax rate other than the rate, if any, necessary to pay the interest and principal on any outstanding bonds shall be certified for that year and the Collector will neither bill nor collect City taxes for that year either current or delinquent. However, the Collector will continue to collect and disburse prior year taxes under this agreement. A new agreement will have to be entered into by all parties to resume collecting current taxes.

VIII

The parties agree that the Collector shall have the responsibility for collection of all current and delinquent real and personal property taxes, including penalties, interest, and fees. Such collection of taxes, penalties, interest, and fees shall be conducted in accordance with applicable

law(s). The City shall provide to the County Clerk and County Collector all Ordinances, as applicable, relating to penalties and interest on delinquent taxes at the time of execution of this Contract and to provide the County Clerk with any changes to such Ordinances or any new Ordinances related to the same by September 1 of the tax year in which such changes shall take effect. The collection of late charges by the Collector, however, is conditioned upon such charges being consistent with other taxing entities.

IX

The parties agree to the following: The Collector shall withhold a sum equal to one percent (1%) of all taxes, penalties and fees collected by the Collector on behalf of the City as compensation for the bill creation and collections services herein provided by the County and said sum shall be deposited by the Collector in the Boone County general revenue fund. As required by RSMo Sections 137.720.1 and 137.750, the Collector further shall withhold one-half of one percent (1/2%) of all ad valorem property taxes collected by the Collector on behalf of the City to fund the costs and expenses incurred in assessing real and personal property. As further required by RSMo Sections 137.720.3 and Section 137.750the Collector further shall withhold each calendar year an additional one-eighth of one percent (1/8%) of all ad valorem property taxes collected by the Collector on behalf of the City, provided that for each calendar year, if the total amount of ad valorem property taxes, so further withheld by the Collector from the political subdivisions in Boone County, Missouri under Section 137.720.3 RSMo shall exceed One Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00), the Collector shall pay to the City once during each calendar year such proportionate amount so further withheld the previous calendar year, plus interest, if any, on such sums received on behalf of the City and other political subdivisions in excess of the aforementioned statutory limits. All sums withheld by the Collector, as required by RSMo Sections 137.720 and 137.750, RSMo, shall be deposited by the Collector in the Boone County Assessment Fund. All amounts withheld by the Collector shall be withheld proportionately from each separate property tax. The Collector shall then remit to the City the balance collected after the applicable amounts have been withheld from each separate property tax. The Collector shall provide the City a written itemization showing the balance remitted for each separate property tax. If the General Assembly changes the percentages or caps set out in this paragraph, then the Collector shall collect those amounts authorized by the General Assembly and shall notify the City of such changes in writing; thereafter, this Agreement shall be considered amended so as to reflect the new amounts authorized by statute.

Х

The City further agrees that the penalty authorized by RSMo Section 52.290, as amended, for delinquent taxes shall be retained by the County and distributed as provided in RSMo Section 52.290.

XI

The City further agrees that all fees of conducting any tax sale pursuant to Chapter 140 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri shall be retained by the County.

XII

The City further agrees that the County shall be authorized to compromise and abate taxes owed to the City in the same manner as it authorized by the Revised Statutes of Missouri to compromise and abate other taxes.

XIII

The City shall provide to the County Clerk and the County Assessor a certified copy of any ordinance or order altering the boundaries of the City including but not limited to ordinances annexing or de-annexing any lot or lots of real estate, within 30 days of the adoption of the same and prior to October 1 of each year. The City shall provide beginning and ending address range data for properties located within the City for all boundary changes of the City.

XIV

The parties hereto mutually agree that the term of this agreement begins upon acceptance by all parties and ends February 28, 2019, provided, however, that any party may terminate this agreement within sixty (60) days by serving upon all other parties to the agreement written notice of its intention to terminate the agreement. The parties hereto mutually agree that this contract will be automatically renewed on March 1, 2019, and will continue to renew on March 1 of each subsequent year unless any party serves written notice of termination no less than ninety (90) days prior to the renewal date. Upon termination of this Agreement, the County shall be absolved of all responsibility for collection of taxes for that tax year and for future tax years. The County shall continue to be responsible for the collection of delinquent taxes from all years covered by this Agreement.

XV

The City agrees that failure to comply with statutory provisions relating to the setting of tax levies shall relieve the County of responsibilities under this Agreement.

Pursuant to the provisions of RSMo Section 137.073.7, no tax rate shall be extended on the tax rolls unless the City has complied with the tax rate certification process through the State Auditor's office.

BOONE COUNTY ROAD & BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT/REPAIR COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT APPLICATION ENTITIES¹

WHEREAS, County has, in Commission Order 249-2011, adopted updated policies regarding the distribution of certain road sales tax and property tax revenues, the terms and conditions of which are incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, City is an "Application Entity" as described in the aforementioned Commission Order; and

WHEREAS, City has been classified as an Application Entity that will receive an annual amount as described in Commission Order 609-2012, the terms and conditions of which are incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, County is willing to enter into a cooperative agreement with the City for the improvement and/or repair of City's road system under certain terms and conditions; and

WHEREAS, the parties are empowered to enter into cooperative agreement(s) for the purposes herein stated pursuant to section 70.220 and section 229.040 RSMo.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual undertakings and agreements herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

 PURPOSE. The purpose of this Agreement is to effectuate the Application-Based Funding from the County to the City as contemplated in County's policies on distributing road sales tax revenue and road property tax revenues. The terms and conditions of Commission Order 249-2011& 609-2012 are incorporated into this agreement by reference.

2. COUNTY AGREEMENTS:

 a. County will pay to the City the sum of Ten Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-Two Dollars and Fifty-Five cents (\$10,792.55) as determined by the formula for Year 6 of the 6-year cycle as described in the aforementioned Commission Order

- 4. PAYMENTS IN EXCESS OF LEGAL OBLIGATIONS. City represents that the payments from County to City contemplated herein are in excess of any legal obligations imposed on County by virtue of applicable Missouri law, including RSMo §137.556 and the ballot language presented to voters authorizing the current Road & Bridge Sales Tax Levy under RSMo §67.547.
- TIMING OF PAYMENTS. The payments from County to City contemplated herein will occur one time per year, near the beginning of the fourth quarter of the calendar year, and after receipt of the fully executed annual agreement.
- 6. **REPORTING.** City shall file a written report with County, at least annually, detailing the road and bridge improvement projects funded in whole or in part with the funding received herein, as well as provide a summary of any planned, future projects that are anticipated to be funded with current or future funding from the County. Said reports shall be in sufficient detail so as to allow County to document what specific portions of any City project were funded or are contemplated to be funded with funds received from the County.
- 7. **ASSIGNMENT.** Neither party may assign or transfer any of its rights or obligations under this Agreement to any other person or entity without the prior, written consent of the other party.
- SOLE BENEFIT OF PARTIES. This Agreement is for the sole benefit of City and County. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to confer any rights or remedies on any third party.
- RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES. Nothing herein shall be deemed or construed by the parties hereto, nor by any third party, as creating the relationship of principal and agent, or of partnership, or of joint venture, between the parties hereto.
- 10. **TERM.** This Agreement shall be in effect from its execution until January 1 of the following calendar year.
- 11. **TERMINATION.** Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice directed to the other party.
- 12. **NONAPPROPRIATION**. The payments from County contemplated herein are conditioned upon there being a sufficient, unencumbered fund balance budgeted for that purpose. The County's obligations hereunder shall not in anyway be construed to be a




