Dear Parents,

The voluntary contributions for the year 2017 are outlined in this letter.

School Council has agreed not to change the voluntary contributions for 2017, despite cost increases over the past twelve months. Once again to keep costs to an acceptable minimum, all requisites will be purchased in bulk as in 2016. The voluntary levy is detailed on the following page.

The school aims to provide the very best educational program that our community can sustain. The voluntary levy, we ask of our community, enables us to spread the load across all families to provide the most that we can afford. The levy we ask for is well below that of secondary colleges, pre-schools and most other primary schools in our area.

We know and understand that not all parents will be able to fund the whole amount at one time. With this in mind, we offer an instalment plan.

Fundraising too is aimed at spreading the load and also to minimise the workload that fundraising inevitably causes. We would much prefer that parents work with their children in classroom learning programs, rather than spending their time raising funds for school programs. That is why we have a fundraising levy and a reduced fundraising program.

School Council has endorsed the following policy regarding students who leave the school during the year. A sliding scale of refund will be made on voluntary contributions of 0.6 for Term 1, 0.4 for Term 2 and 0.3 for Term 3, as a result of students transferring to another primary school. No refund will be given for Term 4 transfers. The contributions to the Library and Maintenance Trusts are not refundable, as the tax deduction will have already been claimed.

Payment for school books can be made from Thursday, 1st December, 2016, during school hours.

Parents who pay 2017 Student Requisites/Book List in full by <u>Tuesday 31st January</u>, <u>2017</u>, will have their student's names entered into a Draw for refund of books for one student (\$185.00).

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Understanding Parent Payment Categories

What does the legislation say?

The Education and Training Reform Act (2006) provides for free instruction in the standard curriculum program to all students in government schools. The Act also empowers school councils to charge fees to parents for goods and services provided by the school to a child.

In the Act, a 'Parent' includes a guardian and every person who has parental responsibility for a child including parental responsibility under the Commonwealth Family Law Act 1975 and any person with whom a child normally or regularly resides.

What do schools pay for as part of 'free instruction'?



Free instruction is the teaching staff, administration and the provision of facilities in connection with the instruction of the standard curriculum program, including reasonable adjustments for students with disabilities.

The standard curriculum for Years F-10 means implementation of the Victorian Curriculum F-10.

The standard curriculum for senior secondary schools means a program that enables a student to be awarded a VCE or VCAL qualification.


