INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This investigation was initiated upon receipt of a Request for Investigation (0272-04-CID001) from HQ USACIDC, Fort Belvoir, VA 22060-5506 (FBVA), which reflected that on 9 Jun 04, during a review of the MG port by the Detainee Assessment Task Force (DATF), USACIDC, FBVA, it was discovered there were allegations of detainee abuse by members of the 519th Military Intelligence Battalion, Ft Bragg, NC (FBNC) 28310. The incidents allegedly took place in Nov 03, after several soldiers from 519th MI Bn were injured or killed during a mortar attack at the Abu Ghraib Prison (AGP), Abu Ghraib, Iraq.

Investigation established the offense of detainee abuse did not occur as alleged by members of the 229th Military Police Company, Virginia Beach, VA.

I am a National Guard soldier with the Mobilization Training Center (MTC), Fort Pickett, VA and became attached to the 229th Military Police Company, Virginia Beach, VA prior to deploying. I was stationed in Iraq from Aug 03 -Apr 04 and was assigned to the Abu Ghraib Prison. As a military police (MP) soldier I performed normal duties as a MP and was also assigned as a member of the Internal Response Force (IRF). As an IRF member I would respond to all hostilities within the compound in the capacity of a first responder. For example if mortars hit a certain area of the compound we would be the first responders and would secure the area and would perform basis first aid. Sometime in Sep 03, I think towards the end of the month after 21 Sep 03 there was a mortar attack on the compound of Abu Ghraib. The Military Intelligence (MI) personnel were located in a command tent located in Camp Vigilance, one of the mortars hit there and I believe killed three MI soldiers and injured approximately 10-13 MI soldiers. After the mortar attack my IRF team was called to assist the Quick Response Force (QRF) who were located outside of the gate of the compound that was on the north wall, there was only one gate on the compound at the time and this was around 2200-2300. My team, consisting of three E-5 and one E-4, arrived at the gate and QRF was escorting a white pick up truck that contained two Iraqi public civilians, a male and a female. The truck came in through the gate and my team went from the gate to a small field located off to the left of the gate and the QRF soldiers put the two Iraqi on the ground. The QRF soldiers tied both Iraqis hands with zip ties, I recall that the male had his hands tied behind his back and I don't remember where the female hands were tied. The QRF soldiers put a towel over both Iraqi's head to obstruct their vision but was not tied down in anyway nor was it a hood. At this time the Iraqis were turned over to the IRF teams. My team was instructed to watch over the male Iraqi and informed that MI soldiers were en-route. The other IRF team, consisting of four soldiers, was instructed to watch the female Iraqi. I approached the Iraqi male in order to have a physical description of him. I noticed that he appeared very sacred, however, he had not suffered any injuries that I could see but I only looked at his face. I then re-positioned the towel on his head and positioned myself directly behind the male Iraqi approximately 2-3 feet. My other team members formed a half moon around the male Iraqi with two soldiers to my right and one to my left. After approximately 10-15 minutes passed MI soldiers arrived in a Humvee. There appeared to be about 8 MI soldiers. One of the MI soldiers walked between myself and the IRF soldier to my left and walked directly up to the male Iraqi and struck him on the back of the head with a closed right handed fist. The Iraqi male fell over to his side and then the MI soldier proceeded to yell in English to the male Iraqi, stating to get up and asked if he liked killing his people. The MI soldier then re-positioned the towel on the Iraqis head and continued yelling at him from the Iraqi male's left front side. The MI soldier then manhandled the Iraqi by grabbing him by the scruff of his shirt at his shoulders and forced him to his knees. The MI soldier then pushed him to the ground and continued to bring the Iraqi back to his knees. It appeared to me that the Iraqi was somewhat unconscious because he kept falling over to his side and showed no resistance or ability to get himself to his knees when instructed to do so by the MI soldier. I then called for Lt Officer-in-charge of the IRF teams. Lt. ame over and asked the MI soldier what he was doing and who he was. The MI soldier responded I know what I am doing and I am a professional and refused to tell his name or any other identifying information. Lt ulso stated to the MI soldier that he did not even know if they were guilty or not referring to their possible participation in the mortar attack and stated they could be just normal citizens. SFC ho was the NCOIC of the IRF teams also overheard this conversation. A second MI soldier came over to take control of the Iraqi male and he approached him and put his one of his arms around the Iraqi's neck from



Shortly after the individuals were detained and secured with in the BCCF, a Military Intelligence (MI) screening team responded. One of the MI solider, who was visibly emotional, grabbed the male by his collar and started to push him towards the MI HMMWV. During which time the MI solider yelled sporadically at the male. Before the MI solider placed the male into the HMMWV he was ordered to relinquish custody of the male detainee to another MI solider (See Sworn Statement for details).



Once arriving the vehicle was searched and the two in custody were taken over to the visitor tent where we responded and watched over the two. A few minutes later at approx 0030, 21 Sep 03, a HMMWV pulled up with approx 10 soldiers and came over to us. The first soldier, wearing a desert camo flak jacket, came up to the male prisoner and began screaming at him telling him "eyes down" and asking "what the fuck are you looking at?" He then grabbed him by the back of the head and pushed it down into the dirt. 1LT told him that was unnecessary and the soldier looked at him and told him that "he was the professional at this and that he knew what he was doing." 1LT said that doesn't look too professional. I then said that I had never been taught that when I went through interrogator school. At this point another soldier (a very large, stocky soldier) came over and started yelling at him to get up. He grabbed him and yanked him up off the ground and secured his arms and began walking him back towards the vehicle. He continued screaming and forcefully moving him towards the truck. As he passed me I told him to "at east and calm down." He continued past me to the back of the truck. Once reaching the back of the truck he began striking the prisoner in the back of the head

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

and back. He continued screaming at him to get into the truck. The soldier then forcefully slammed the prisoner into the bed of the truck. Once the prisoner was in the bed of the truck he was struck a few more times and told to put a mask on. When the prisoner turned towards the back of the truck it appeared that he was bleeding from the lip but I was unsure due to the poor lighting. At this point I asked the NCOIC what unit he was from and he told me the 519th MI. I then realized that there were soldiers from the unit that had been attacked. At this point the vehicle left and the IRF secured back to our living area. After arriving back in our area 1LT was called by MAJ and asked that both he and I respond to the TOC. Once arriving, we were introduced to 1SG who is the 1SG of the MI group. He told us that this had never happened and that he had been doing these operations for 14 months in Afghanistan and Iraq. He continued to apologize and remind us that he had people that were wounded and everyone was upset. MAJ

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very upset over the incident. We explained to them that during our many years of law enforcement that you never send a suspect back to a group of officers that were directly affected by an incident because you don't know what they might do and that this case was exactly the same. We were told by the 1SG that they would handle it and we advised that we were going to forward statements of the incident as well. MAJ advised that he would forward that paperwork to the BNCDR so that action could be taken. 1LT

and I then responded back to the IRF barracks where we advised the team to complete statements of the incident and we advised them of what the 1SG had told us.

sclearing the remaining cells in search of a hand grenade. This CPT had come upstairs and pulled out an individual nicknamed and held him by the throat screaming at him. He was then taken into another cell where he was questioned and screamed at some more. This detainee was an informant and this was staged to make it appear that he was not assisting us with identifying the detainee that had the hand grenade. After interrogating the detainee the CPT went back downstairs and pulled out another detainee. I was not in a position to see anything; I could only here lots of screaming from the CPT, detainee and other soldiers. After a short time I moved into a position to look downstairs and observed that the detainee was naked and handcuffed lying on 10.64 the floor. SPC was downstairs and later provided details that the CPT was hitting and kicking the detainee. He asked what he should do and I told him to write a sworn statement if he felt the actions were inappropriate.

The unknown military soldier then placed his hands on the male suspects neck and, with force, shoved the suspects neck and head towards the suspects feet and ground while yelling "eyes down". 1LT was standing close by and told the soldier that his actions were not necessary. The soldier approached 1LT 104,064

that he was "with Military Intelligence" and that "He was a trained professional." hen replied "well that didn't look too professional to me". The

soldier heard 1LT eply and walked off.

A few minutes later another unknown soldier was told to get the male suspect and put him in the back of the HUMVEE. That soldier walked over, grabbed the male suspects arms and began to yank up, yelling "Get the fuck up". The soldier continued to yank and pull in an upward manner on the suspect's arms for approximately fifteen seconds until the suspect got to his feet. want to make the following statement under oath:

I would like to make the following statement to help clarify a statement I made earlier. It was not until after I left the CID office that I remembered this incident. It was the night of the gun incident at the hard site. We had just about finished up, and they called for a dog for a search in one of the cells. I responded up to the second floor, I heard a bunch of yelling coming out of either the first or second cell on the left side. I do not know who the people were, but there were two guys standing on the back along the wall. I said I was there for the search they said it was in the cell to they pointed to the cell next door. I went to that cell there was a bunch of yelling going on in the cell and my dog started going ape shit. There were three people standing up and a fourth person sitting on the floor in the corner. The people standing up were yelling at the detainee in the corner. I could not make out what was being said because of everyone yelling and my dog barking. I remember one of the males saying to the detainee, if the detainee did not provided the information the guy was asking about, then he would have me let me my dog go on him. This was the first time I heard of this, and the guy did not say anything prior to me about this. So at this point they were yelling and screaming at this guy behind me and asked him about what was going on. We do not some more. I turned and saw SGT use our dogs for interrogation purposes. The two males and the female were coming out of the cell, and my dog went to enter the cell, I pulled my dog back, gained control and exited the cell. Then I heard someone say, "Get that dog out of here". Just as I got the dog and myself out of there the two guys and the female went back into the cell and started yelling at this guy some more. I am standing at the door with the dog and the dog jumped into the room and he took a snap at the girl that was in the room. She kind of winced when he went at her. I asked her if the dog had bit her, and she said no, I asked her to come out and I would look at her arm. She came out and I looked at her arm and it was ok. There were no marks on her arm from the dog, and there were no tears in her clothes from the dog. At that point she went back inside the room, and I looked at

and told him I was leaving because this is not what my dog is trained for. Just as I was leaving, and I walked away, one of the males said, "Where is the dog", and I just kept walking.

Q. Describe the three people in the cell?

A. One of them was about 6'2" or 6'3", black hair, medium to slender build, white male. The two males were wearing civilian clothes. The second male, I could not really describe him. The female I think was wearing glasses, long dark hair, shoulder length or a little past, maybe 5'5" to 5'8". She was not a soldier; I think she was an interpreter. And she was wearing Desert Camo top.

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
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



I have reviewed all three statements (they are now attached to this email) 473-04 CID 023-67329 It is NOT clear if these soldiers are talking about one incident or not and 0473-04 CID 023-67329 not clear if the CPT was an MI CPT or not either. I do not know and cannot speak for the Taguba team and neither can the detainee task force as to their accuracy that one of these 7 CPT's is the CPT as described above.

As such, request the following action be accomplished by Ft Bragg:

- 1. Initiate an ROI on the allegations of detainee abuse by the 519th MI BN.
- 2. Forward a lead to VA Beach (current location of the above three soldiers) and have them interviewed. Determine from them the details of the incident which they describe 519th MI Bn abusing detainees. Determine if the CPT they describe is an MI CPT or not. Show the previously sent photographs of the CPT's to determine if they recognize any of them as the CPT abusing a detainee.

If the CPT is identified, and not as belonging to the 519th MI Bn, request separate sworn statements be obtained, detailing this information. Request this headquarters be notified and provided those statements for forwarding to the appropriate CID office for further investigation.

If the CPT is identified as assigned with the 519th MI or involved in the same incident as the 519th MI Bn, request that information be integrated/added into a status report of the ROI of Ft Bragg.





MP Says Prison's Top Intelligence Officer Saw Dead Detainee

By Jackie Spinner, Washington Post Staff Writer

BAGHDAD, June 24 -- The company commander of the U.S. soldiers charged with abusing detainees at Abu Ghraib prison testified Thursday that the top military intelligence commander at the prison was present the night a detainee died during an interrogation and that efforts were made to conceal the details of the detainee's death.

Capt. Donald J. Reese, commander of the 372nd Military Police Company, said he was summoned one night in November to a shower room in a cellblock at the prison, where he discovered the body of a bloodied detainee on the floor. A group of intelligence personnel was standing around the body, discussing what to do, and Col. Thomas M. Pappas, commander of military intelligence at the prison, was among them, Reese said.

Reese said an Army colonel named Jordan sent a soldier to the prison mess hall for ice to preserve the body overnight. Lt. Col. Steven L. Jordan was head of the interrogation center at the prison, but it was unclear whether he was the officer to whom Reese referred.

No medics were called, Reese said, and the detainee's identification was never recorded.

Reese testified that he heard Pappas say at one point, "I'm not going down for this alone."

An autopsy the next day determined that the man's death was caused by a blood clot resulting from a blow to the head, and the body subsequently was hooked up to an intravenous drip, as if the detainee was still alive, and taken out of the prison, Reese recalled. There is no known record of what happened to the body after that.

Reese's testimony came during the first day of an investigative hearing for Spec. Sabrina Harman, one of seven Army reservists from the 372nd charged with abusing detainees at the prison late last year.

During investigations of alleged abuse at Abu Ghraib, statements by other witnesses have described the death of the detainee, and the corpse appears in photographs documenting abuse at the prison. But no testimony or evidence had previously indicated Pappas was in the shower room on the night the detainee died.

During an earlier hearing for another soldier in the 372nd, Spec. Jason A. Kenner testified that a Navy SEAL team and officers from other government agencies -- referred to as OGA, a common designation for CIA operatives -- brought the detainee in alive with a bag over his head. Kenner said he later saw that the man had been severely beaten on his face.

Intelligence officers took the detainee to a shower room used for interrogations, Kenner said, and shackled him to a wall. "About an hour later, he died on them," Kenner testified. "They decided to put him on ice. There was a battle between [OGA] and MI [military intelligence] as to who was going to take care of the body. A couple days later, he was finally disposed of."

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Harman appears in two photograms that military prosecutors are using a dence against her, including one in which she is smann and giving the thumbs-up with the corpse in the shower room.

The Army has accused her of taking photographs of a pyramid of naked detainees and photographing and videotaping detainees who were ordered to strip and masturbate in front of other prisoners and soldiers, according to her charge sheet. She is also charged with jumping on several prisoners as they lay in a pile; with writing "rapeist" on a prisoner's leg; and with attaching wires to a prisoner's hands while he stood on a box with his head covered. She told him he would be electrocuted if he fell off the box, the documents allege.

A former pizza shop assistant manager from Alexandria, Harman, 26, told The Washington Post last month that members of her military police unit took direction from Army military intelligence officers, Central Intelligence Agency operatives and civilian contractors who conducted interrogations at the prison.

She was not called to testify on Thursday, but Reese said military intelligence clearly controlled the cellblock where Harman and other members of her military police platoon worked the night shift.

"My MPs, they were directed by the MI people for what they wanted and how they wanted it," he said.

Earlier this week, a U.S. Army judge accepted a request by attorneys of three other soldiers charged in the Abu Ghraib case to question the top commanders in Iraq and their subordinates. The judge issued the rulings at pretrial hearings for Sgt. Javal S. Davis, Cpl. Charles A. Graner Jr. and Staff Sgt. Ivan L. "Chip" Frederick.

Spec. Jeremy C. Sivits, the first soldier to face a court-martial, pleaded guilty last month and was sentenced to a year in prison.

Defense witnesses testified that Harman was a good soldier, quiet and well liked by the Iraqis she encountered when the 372nd was based in Hilla, south of Baghdad, before being transferred to the prison.

"She was very friendly," Sgt. 1st Class Shannon Snider testified at the Article 32 hearing, the military equivalent of a preliminary hearing to determine whether there is enough evidence to convene a court-martial. "Anytime we were out on the streets in al-Hilla, people would ask, 'Where's Sabrina? Where's Sabrina?"

Reese said he never had a problem with Harman. "She did a good job," he said. "I never witnessed anything hostile. I never saw any show of force."

Harman's hearing was held in a small courtroom at Camp Victory, a U.S. Army base near Baghdad International Airport. Harman, petite with her brown hair pulled back into a tight bun, listened quietly as the charges against her were read. When the investigating officer asked her a question, she answered, "Yes, sir," barely above a whisper. Throughout the hearing, she scribbled notes on a white legal pad. Graner and Spec. Megan Ambuhl, also charged with abuse, sat in a corner at the back of the courtroom.

Two other soldiers testified that they saw detainees being abused but only one reported it to a superior. Both said Harman was present the nights they saw detainees being mistreated.

Spec. Matthew Wisdom, a military policeman, said he saw Frederick strike a detainee in the chest.

I do not know and cannot speak for the Taguba team and neither can the detainee task force as to their accuracy that one of these 7 CPT's is the CPT as described above.

As such, request the following action be accomplished by Ft Bragg:

- Initiate an ROI on the allegations of detainee abuse by the 519th MI BN.
- 2. Forward a lead to VA Beach (current location of the above three soldiers) and have them interviewed. Determine from them the details of the incident which they describe 519th MI Bn abusing detainees. Determine if the CPT they describe is an MI CPT or not. Show the previously sent photographs of the CPT's to determine if they recognize any of them as the CPT abusing a detainee.

If the CPT is identified, and not as belonging to the 519th MI Bn, request separate sworn statements be obtained, detailing this information. Request

this headquarters be notified and provided those statements for forwarding to the appropriate CID office for further investigation.

If the CPT is identified as assigned with the 519th MI or involved in the same incident as the 519th MI Bn, request that information be integrated/added into a status report of the ROI of Ft Bragg.
