I remember the socially distanced street parties for VE Day, mine included houses decorated with Union Jacks and bingo, which was shouted down the street by a fellow neighbour with a microphone.

Charities, food bank pop-ups, and mass money collections for certain people are commonplace. As well as supporting those who have decided to form side businesses to help with money deficits. The switch from mass-commercialism to small businesses has skyrocketed because we know that they need it more. They show their thanks in kind – for example, I love that Forum Books packs a handwritten thank you postcard and a free bookmark with every order.

Speaking of bookshops, Cogito Books in Hexham was awarded the title of Northern Independent Bookshop of the year. It won due to becoming 'more important to its local community than ever, encouraging customers to talk on the phone, wrapping orders with notes from booksellers and often delivering them to far-flung locations' according to the awards committee. The concept of a community can not only be rewarding for individuals but businesses also.

Therefore, if we look after and nurture our communities, they will return it with mutual respect.

The term community is also flexible. For some people, their community can just be their street where they don't engage with the wider area. For me, for example, it stretches from my village Dunston to Newcastle. In recent months I've also explored the wonders of the wider Tyne Valley area and found that all areas have something to appreciate.

So, whether you are a newcomer or have been in an area for your whole life, reach out. Strike a conversation with your neighbours more often, take part in local events, or even take up a new hobby and join a group. There will be someone, somewhere who shares an interest with you. Suddenly, you are no longer alone and that sense of belonging is worthwhile.

The benefits are twofold. You will feel happier for doing good deeds and for gaining a friend or two, while they will feel the same. We all grow together.

The community will be looked after and more appealing to newcomers too. Boosts to personal happiness and the economy will follow. We make fundamental steps to fixing issues within our society, all the while respecting people's personal space.

In simple terms, it's nice to see something so positive come out of such a terrible ordeal.

Sometimes it feels like we are always at each other's throats, especially when you scroll down social media. But that's not necessarily the case. Even when the world is at its absolute worst there will always be something that uplifts our spirits. Good and bad are two sides of the same coin.

And although it sounds corny, we are indeed stronger together.

The point of this article is to highlight parts of the community which we love and how immersing yourself in your area can be a wonderful thing. It's not all doom and gloom. For Remembrance Sunday and Easter I've seen handknitted poppies and bunnies tied to railings across the town. I've heard Jade's Jukebox do karaoke for Mother's Day and saw the whole street come out to sway along to My Girl by the Temptations. I've watched a mass money collection be raised for an elderly woman who was assaulted in an attempted robbery, and organisations came together to fit better security for her.

We are blessed to have our community. We have heroes among us; we even look in the mirror at them sometimes. Take this time to reflect on the good things that have happened in our community, and maybe even share a few.



Trolls to me have always represented FUN! Like those little characters that roll out of the rocks in the Frozen films or the ones with the florescent hair who like to dance to Justin Timberlake. Regardless, they are harmless. Recently (and I now realise naively) I shared a link on a local forum offering a free class to support mothers with Sex Education through a programme created following my decade in the Secondary PSHE classroom. I was not prepared for what ensued.

'You with the sad eyes Don't be discouraged Oh I realise It's hard to take courage.'

The intention in offering a female only class was never to exclude men but to honour women's completely different lived experience, especially as sexual beings. The content was specifically tailored to meet the needs, complexities and anxieties of being female but as these things can so often go, someone/thing is misunderstood, taken out of context and the people pounce! Although utterly flabbergasted by the response, I met the mob with deep compassion, leaned deeply into Theodore Roosevelt's Man in the Arena speech "it's not the critic that counts," cracked open the gluten free biscuits and watched the allegations fly.

'In a world full of people You can lose sight of it all And the darkness inside you Can make you feel so small.'

For now it seems, exists another type of troll though these ones are more akin to the children's fables of old. You know the type that like to hide under bridges, grab your ankles and pull you under - except now they hide behind their iPhone, grab your attention in the comments section and pull you under. Ironically these type of ankle accosters are completely protected facing zero consequences due to the anonymity the internet provides. "Never complain, never explain," say the House of Windsor and whilst that is bloody good advice, it still hurt. I know this is not a reflection of how we live, so why is it ok to do it online? When did posting in a local forum become like entering the colosseum?

'But I see your True Colours Shining through I see your true colours And that's why I love you.'

Still I feel slightly shaky writing this, all too aware of the comments section lingering underneath the cyber publication of this piece. What if it all flares up again? Even now as I type someone is commenting on my choice of clothing (my LOVELY green wooly jumper gifted by my mother for Christmas) as an example of how I would never "get laid." Studies by Stanford University (2017) state anyone has the potential to become a troll and if a discussion begins with a "troll comment," then it is twice as likely to be trolled by other participants later on, compared to a discussion that does not start with a troll comment. The more troll comments in the dialogue, the more likely future participants will also troll the discussion. Those initial words set a strong lasting precedent. What we say or don't say really does matter.

'So don't be afraid to let them show Your true colours True colours are beautiful, Like a rainbow.' Don't get me wrong local group forums have brought us many a wonderful thing. A sense of community, help finding lost animals and crucially the ability to promote and support local businesses. An invaluable source of connection especially giving the events of the last year. Although it has also brought us other things too whether its garden gnomes or roundabouts why do the comments so easily descend into dictio diarrhorea? When did it all get so polarised out there?

'Show me a smile then, Don't be unhappy, can't remember When I last saw you laughing'

It's ok to believe something, and stand on one side, but what's even more important than being "right" or "wrong" is to understand why someone feels the way they do, and why someone believes what they believe. People are smart, capable of thinking/examining information so just because somebody disagrees with you does not mean they are stupid, should be shut down or at worst cancelled (take note Silicon Valley). More than ever we need to respect and understand one another especially online were context can't be so readily shared. Had you just met someone in the street would you say all those things to their face? Likely not.

'If this world makes you crazy And you've taken all you can bear You call me up Because you know I'll be there'

I've had time to reflect, reminded of my time spent travelling Israel in 2012 lucky to have supper with a local man sharing insights on the tension and troubles in the West Bank. He said something that night which has stayed with me ever since "when people don't know how to connect with love they connect with pain, as that's better than no connection at all." To be seen, heard, loved and understood is what the trolls crave (it's actually what we all crave) they are just asking for it in all the worst ways!

'True Colours
True colours are shining through
I see your true colours
And that's why I love you.'

So if you ever find yourself on local forum witnessing something/someone that you don't like and are tempted say anything ranging from slightly unkind to darn right abusive, remember you have a choice. What you choose to do really does matter. That said, a wise man once wore a T Shirt that read "why be sexist, racist, homophobic or transphobic when you could just be quiet."

'We are so pleased to get back to some meaningful activity in the good company of likeminded people' said one member. 'Archery is a great way to get some fresh air and gentle exercise whilst making new friends and experiencing new challenges.'

It seems that there is finally light at the end of a very dark and long tunnel. The resurgence of nature with spring brings with it the return of some welcome normality. I use the word "normal" lightly here, as I think things will not be as they used to be, rather a new normal will emerge. As we feel the bustle of life and activity around, we also see the effects of - what I call, "resocialisation"

Whether you are returning to school, going back into the workplace, coming out of furlough, venturing into shops, pubs, restaurants, gyms, sports clubs, or a long-awaited uniting of family and friends, this resocialisation is bringing with it its own sense of apprehension and for some, anxiety. As excited as we all are to have theses things back, I am seeing clients who are struggling to manage their anxiety as well as worklife-home balance due to the new demands, and sense of overwhelm these activities are triggering.

It is no surprise we are seeing an increase in work related stress and illness. With redundancies happening all the time, more and more companies seem to be operating on skeleton staff. Pressure is high, budgets are tight and there seems to be a palpable air of tension within most organisations. There is a big call to action asking for companies to engage in wellbeing services for their staff. Big corporations, with larger budgets, have successfully implemented a range of workplace wellbeing services, leaving the smaller companies struggling to keep up. Cost effective steps to implement workplace wellbeing strategies can be introduced effectively without costing too much money.

Do you remember the Kit-Kat advert tag line- "Have a break, have a Kit-Kat"? as a Holistic Therapist I would not advocate the Kit-Kat, but I absolutely advocate the "Have a break". In fact, I regularly recommend that clients take a minimum of three 5-minute breaks a day. Regardless of whether you are a student preparing for exams, working from home, or working at the office, making sure you step away from your desk regularly through the day. I often work with clients who are in "head -down" mode, not moving from their desk for up to 5 hours at a time, not even for something to drink or a visit to the washroom.

Research shows that sitting in the same position for an extended period, causes strain within the musculoskeletal system causing ligaments and other structures to compensate for poor posture. This causes more wear and tear, increasing inflammation resulting in discomfort and pain throughout the body. Taking a break will not only help mitigate symptoms arising from physical stress but will create headspace to manage emotional responses such as irritability, erratic thoughts, a sense of overwhelm which are often felt as a result of the lack of movement. Instilling a habit where individuals understand the importance of stepping away from their desk when they feel the pressure increasing, can be invaluable. Stepping away gives their body a physical break and a mental break from the stress and helps them re-charge for the rest of the day.

Studies have shown that taking regular breaks can: -

- Increase productivity. While taking breaks might sound counterintuitive when it comes to boosting productivity, it's one of the best ways to do so. Individuals gain focus and energy after stepping away from their desks. A lunch break can help prevent an unproductive, mid-afternoon slumps.
- Boost creativity. Taking a break can a fresh perspective on challenging projects. It is hard for individuals to develop new ideas or solutions when they have been looking at the same thing all day. A break gives the brain a change of scenery allowing for different synapses to be stimulating, this will certainly help get those creative juices flowing.
- Boost motivation. Overwhelm drains our passion for the work we are engaged in.
- Improve task satisfaction. Stress reduces our feelgood hormones resulting in less joy and satisfaction with the task at hand, resulting in a loss of engagement.

Changing the work mindset around taking breaks is important. Last year, across the globe, we saw individuals working longer and harder. They replaced their commute to work with logging on early to get through their workload, forgetting that the logging on early should be followed with finishing early. Life became a jumbled mess of all work with small bits of life and home thrown in here and there.

We are not designed to work under high stress levels for the length of time we do. We need short, regular breaks, through the day to help us reset and recharge, as without these we will be seeing an increase in physical and mental health related problems.

If I have managed to convince you to start the practice of having a few short breaks during the day, here are a few things you could try: go for a brisk walk up and down the road or along the corridor, stetch your body, climb a flight of stairs, rehydrate with a glass of water, make a cuppa and practice mindfully sipping it without the distraction of a gadget, get outdoors and soak up some sunshine, practicing simply sitting and listening to the sounds of nature around you, try some relaxing breathing techniques or meditation. Whatever you chose to do, know that these short breaks during the day will go a long way to improving your health and wellbeing.







Economics does not have to be Rocket Science.

The topic of economics is often shrouded in mystery and arcane terms like GDP, marginal utility, money velocity and many other terms that make the people on the street roll their eyes and completely ignore the subject. So in this article we will be looking at the origin of the word economy, we will be looking at how and why the so-called economics profession has evolved and why, in my opinion, economics should be looked at more from a practical or real-world point of view.

According to Wikipedia: "the English words 'economy' and 'economics' can be traced back to the Greek word οἰκονόμος ("household management"). So when we leave our parents' homes to make our way in the world we are creating our own economy. We need to earn an income through work, we will be paying rent for our shelter, we will be paying utility bills, buying all the basic necessities, paying for transport etc...

So simply put, managing our household, is our economy. Keeping track of our monthly outgoings and income is how we arrive at a budget and ideally if we would like to keep our household in order, we need to try and keep our budget at least balanced. Unfortunately 'young economies' will run a deficit or will have larger outgoings than income and will have to resort to borrowing the deficit, be it via credit cards or loans. Eventually these 'young economies' mature and increase their income via promotion at work and frugality and will even be able to start saving a surplus income. Ideally by the time we reach retirement age our household or economy will have been managed well enough whereby we can live a comfortable life with almost no debts left to pay off and preferably a balanced budget.

This concept of economy or household management can be applied not only to our own households but to all kinds of other institutions like businesses, government, schools, universities etc... It is here, or in institutions outside the family household, that we have seen the concept of economics and good "house-keeping" be abused. I would say that government or the state has exploited and twisted the concept of economics. A whole profession of Economics has evolved with the patronage of the banking and government establishment in order to justify the twisting original definition of the Greek term.

We will now look at how the Economics profession have divided the concept of economics in order to justify actions that would never make sense or produce favourable long term outcomes for our own household economies. The main driver of this division was John Maynard Keynes who is considered the founder of modern-day macroeconomics. With his magnum opus The General Theory of Employment, Interest and Money in 1936, Keynes created, in my opinion, the division between the original concept of household management or microeconomics and the concept of the state running a nation's economy or macroeconomics.

With the advent of the Great Depression in the 1930s, the stage was set for the general public accepting a bigger role for the state in the economy as economists like Keynes and others pointed to the economics collapse of the 1930s, that created huge unemployment and misery, as a consequence of a free-market that we could not trust. The followers of Keynes and Keynes himself did not point to the fact that the roaring 1920s were triggered by the manipulation of interest rates by the U.S. Federal Reserve (Fed) via the New York Fed in order to keep the British pound pegged to the pre-World War I exchange rate to the U.S. dollar. As the Fed kept interest rates artificially low to help sterling, it triggered a real estate and stock market boom in the 1920s that led to the Wall Street crash of 1929. So by interfering in the free-market price of money or interest rate the governments of the US and the UK, via their central banks, actually helped plant the seeds of the Great Depression.

There was another School of Economics led by economists like Friederich Hayek and Ludwig von Mises that argued that the economy and the markets should be allowed to function freely and that the state should not be involved in the economy. This is the Austrian School of Economics view, they believe that markets, which is basically people voluntarily dealing with each other throughout the economy, are better at determining what the price of goods, services and labour should be. Their argument is, for example: how can a dozen or so bureaucrats in White Hall know what is best for the local economy of Tyneside? So ever since the Great Depression, there has been a big debate in the economics world about free-markets and Keynesian state run economics. The Keynesian School has had the upper hand and put the macro economy in the hands of ever more big government and interference in the free-market.

So we have had nearly one century of almost a continuous growth in the size of government in the economy as government interference and spending has surged in order to make sure the the free-market is reigned in. Prior to World War I government spending was rarely more than 10% of GDP (Gross National Product) while now it approaches almost 50% and has temporarily, with the pandemic gone way over that level in the last 12 months or so. Unfortunately the Keynesians don't thing the state or government need to follow the original tenets of economy or good housekeeping like balancing the books or even running a surplus. Keynesians don't care much that governments run endless budget deficits and that the national debt keeps growing and is never paid off.

One should not be fooled into thinking that Conservatives and Labour are any different when it comes to the macro economy. We are, of course, led to believe that the Tories believe in free-markets and small government and that Labour believe in a more Keynesian or Socialist path for the economy. I would argue, though, that this political game is no more than a distraction to keep the general public or taxpayers under a heavy weight of debt and taxation that only helps perpetuate Keynesian Big Government and the bankers' profits. It is the bankers, after all, who make huge fees from the ever growing issuance of debt that keeps the state involved in the economy.

Is there then any hope for a freer and fairer economy in which government acts as a referee or arbiter of the rule of law and does not interfere in people's everyday life or economy? The good news is that there is, and it is called the free-market economy in which the size of government is kept to a minimum, taxation is low, regulation and red tape is a great deal less and people are left alone to run their household. The government is also expected to run a tidy ship of state with a balanced book and very little debt. It is up to each one of us to decide whether we want to live at the expense of government (really our fellow men and women) or whether we would like to make our own way in the world. The choice is yours: Keynes or the Austrian School?










Spring is always a positive time of year for wildlife enthusiasts. Somehow the fresh growth and returning birds gives a sense that all is well. Of course, the problems of climate change, global pandemics and the like are still looming large but for a while the small oases of wild flowers or the skylark singing overhead takes you away from these worries for a moment or two.


Woodlands are particularly evocative of spring. Large bobbing heads of wood anemone, mostly white but sometimes tinted with purple, carpet woodland floors. The slowly straightening heads of bluebells cover the ground under the first emerging tree leaves. These unfurling leaves are a reminder that soon the tree canopy will close over leaving the woodland floor in relative gloom. Elsewhere wild garlic springs up, leaving the air heavy with its powerful aroma and soon it will add its clusters of white flowers. On sunny banks sprays of primroses add their lemon yellows to the mix. Other more diminutive flowers are a bit more tricky to see like the tiny green cubic blooms of moschatel or the subtle yellow golden saxifrage in damper places.

Overhead a song thrush repeats its refrain a few times before trying another and great tits shout out tee-cher monotonously. Chiff-chaffs and willow warblers sing their own very different songs while by sight they are virtually indistinguishable. Many birds remain unseen yet their songs stake out their piece of real estate, few though are as shrill and loud as the tiny wren that lurks mostly out of sight. Above the trees buzzards circle, screeching their call every so often.

At the bottom of the steep sided wooded valley the burn trickles over rocks and fallen branches, casualties of the winter storms. A pair of grey wagtails patrol the water looking out for a place of refuge to make a nest. Perhaps an otter hides out of sight, holed up in a space left by a fallen tree but it doesn't show itself, preferring dusk when the chance of meeting a person or wayward dog diminishes.

The woodland trees themselves, that cling precariously to the steep slopes, are slowly emerging from their winter rest: the ash probably the last to show its leaves and the oak only a little ahead. Tiny birch leaves are now sprouting and the hazel catkins have been replaced by tiny but growing fresh green leaves. A patch of blackthorn is a blaze of white flowers but is beginning to fade, it's short show of blossom nearly over for another year; and yet an early orange tip butterfly finds some nectar on which to feed. The male has such striking orange ended white wings while the female lacks this splash of colour. Soon speckled woods and later more specialist woodland species will take over but for now it's the early butterflies that reign.

So where was I to see all this variety of wildlife? Not some exotic location or secret location well out in the wilds. This was Whittle Dene at Ovingham, one of our largest remaining areas of ancient woodland; sadly a habitat that is relatively rare now in Northumberland. It was a lovely walk, and I am rather lucky that I could be here as part of my job at Northumberland Wildlife Trust, the weather isn't always so kind and like every job sometimes I don't leave the computer. Days like this, though, make it all seem worthwhile!




The Gallery in the Mill Mining Art in Allendale


