SSR Center provides comprehensive services for all people and families that have been victims of sexual and /or domestic violence in the City of Martinsville, Henry and Patrick Counties. Services are available 24 hours per day through the CONTACT accredited hotline. The hotline is available for anyone who needs a compassionate ear to listen, needs to access Piedmont Community Services crisis counselors, or would like referrals to the community based team. The community based team provides services to help people overcome victimization by sexual assault or domestic violence, education and training to the community, and assistance accessing other community resources.

Service Overview

The mission of ANCHOR is to provide a new chance for youth in our community. ANCHOR Services provide comprehensive care and individualized treatment to assist youth and their families in achieving optimal health and well-being.

- **Group Home & Shelter Care:** These facilities are for young men, 12-17 years old. The ANCHOR Group Home is a long-term program (up to 6-months) for court-involved youth. The ANCHOR Shelter Care program is a short-term program (up to 90 days). Both programs are less restrictive placements for youth than secure detention and the only such programs in our area.
- Outreach/Surveillance & GPS: Monitoring services provided to the courts for juveniles that need extra attention to stay at home and in the community instead of a detention facility.
- Seven Challenges Program: Evidence-Based, comprehensive counseling program for adolescents that incorporates work on alcohol and other drug problems. It helps clients to evaluate their lives, consider changes they wish to make, and then succeed in implementing the desired changes. It supports them in taking power over their own lives.
- **Brief Challenges Program:** based on Seven Challenges, it serves three functions 1) provides an assessment of drug or co-occurring problems 2) provides an intervention for drug problems 3) provides support in responding to external pressures for abstinence.
- Aggression Replacement Training (A.R.T.): a research-based, proven-effective approach for working with challenging youth by teaching new abilities Skillstreaming, Anger Control Training and Moral Reasoning Training to help clients form new prosocial behaviors, control their emotional responses, and mature in their moral reasoning.

ANCHOR COMMISSION

- Transitional Day Program (TDP): a cooperative agreement with Henry County Public Schools to educate students whose behavior is interfering with his/her learning and they need a more structured classroom environment. The aim of the program is to work with them and return them to a traditional school classroom setting.
- Co-Parenting: Two Parents, Two Homes: A four-hour Parenting Education class that is approved by the VA Supreme Court and ANCHOR is currently the only local provider approved for Parenting Education and listed on the VA Supreme Court website www.vacourts.gov. It gives parents the tools to manage custody situations amicably and communicate with their child while maintaining a positive relationship.
- **Lee Ford Camp:** a 17-acre camp with a 1.5-acre lake, picnic areas with tables, a lodge, two bunkhouses, small cabin, and a climbing/rappelling tower.

Criteria

- For ANCHOR Services, call or email our office for eligibility criteria.
- For the TDP program the student must attend Henry County Public Schools.
- Co-Parenting class is for adults usually court referred for custody situations.
- Lee Ford Camp is open to any member of the community and surrounding areas.

Eligibility

Services are eligible to those who live or work within Martinsville-Henry County.

Cost

- Court involved youth are covered in our programs at no cost to the individual.
- If youth are not court-involved, private pay is available for most services and we do have limited scholarships for some services.
- Co-Parenting class fee is \$40 per person private pay, we do have very limited scholarships.
- TDP Students are part of the Henry County Public Schools and must be referred through HCPS.
- Lee Ford Camp –\$100 donation for day use and \$150 per day/night for overnight events. Use of the camp is free to any non-profit or civic group that will do maintenance or work at the camp.

Bassett Historical Center provides a series of genealogy classes twice per year (must register as a limited number of spaces is available), tours, programs, etc. for free. Open to the public.

The mission of the Bassett Historical Center is to preserve history, both local and family history, and to offer researchers adequate space in which to work. We educate the public as to the many treasures in and of this particular area. We preserve these valuable records, manuscripts, family and historical memorabilia, making them accessible to the public and preserving them for future generations.

Service Overview

Boys & Girls Clubs of the Blue Ridge (BGCBR) provides outof-school time enrichment programs, homework help and tutoring, teen mentoring, community outreach, service projects, and career/college readiness programs for youth ages 3-22 years old. BGCBR operates after-school programs Monday – Friday and an 8-week, full-day Summer Adventure Camp.

We employ 37 Youth Development Professionals (YDPs) who provide youth with social, emotional, physical, academic, and experiential learning activities each day along with monthly Parent Engagement programs. BGCBR has 5 Club Sites: Clearview Early Learning Center Pre-K Club, Patrick Henry Club, Albert Harris Club, Sanville Club, and the Teen Club. BGCBR provides YDPs and additional support for other community out-of-school time teen programs including the New College Institute STAGS 1262 FIRST Robotics Team, High School Show Choirs, High School Theater Groups, and Scouts. BGCBR has approximately 400 Club members enrolled in after-school and summer programs. Each year, BGCBR serves an additional 1460 students in community-based targeted outreach initiatives.

Boys & Girls Clubs of America is an internationally recognized federation of 5000 individual Club sites and strong ties to corporate partners as well as state and national alliances that support youth mentoring and out-of-school time activities. The mission of the Boys & Girls Club is to provide all young people, especially those who need us most, reach their full potential as productive, caring, and responsible members of society. - There is a weekly cost for a full-day Summer Camp, which includes all meals, snacks, activity fees, swimming lessons, transportation to field trips, materials, and supplies. The weekly cost for Summer Camp is posted on our website and social media pages after March 31st and varies from year to year.
- Registration for Summer Camp and the after-school program begins after Spring Break each year. Applications can be found on our website, at Club site locations, and at our main office location.
- Financial assistance: The BGCBR administrative team works with families individually to address any financial needs. BGCBR Administration Staff and Board do their best to provide accessible and affordable out-of-school and summer programs for youth and their caregivers through our fundraising efforts. Each Club member is expected to participate in annual fundraising activities to ensure that we continue to provide accessible, affordable, equitable, inclusive, safe, engaging, and FUN programs.

The Martinsville Henry County SPCA is a nonprofit organization that is located in Martinsville, Virginia. We are dedicated to serving animals and people by engaging the hearts, hands, and minds of the community. We aim to preserve the relationships of families and their pets through improving animal living conditions, increasing immunity via Wellness Clinics, reducing overpopulation through spay/neuter efforts, and re-homing animals when needed.

- Animal Services (Need-Based): The SPCA maintains a food bank of cat and dog food to assist people experiencing difficult situations. This enables community members to retain their beloved pets. We may discount the cost of spay/neuter to address breeding and/or behavioral concerns for families with unaltered animals.
- Youth Development: The SPCA hosts 2-3 Summer Camps each year for children. These are week-long learning events that teach children how to care for and safely interact with animals. We work with Animal Control, PetSense, and trainers as guest speakers to round out this education for the children.
- Louise R. Lester Spay & Neuter Clinic: The SPCA opened the Louise R. Lester Spay & Neuter Clinic which focuses on decreasing pet population and increasing immunity in our area. The clinic offers services to the public for residents to have their animals vaccinated, dewormed, and spayed/neutered at lower costs. Giving access to the public to the Louise R. Lester Spay & Neuter Clinic will increase the immunity of the community as a whole and reduce the changes of domestic animals spreading zoonotic diseases such as rabies or intestinal parasites.
- **Recovery Assistance:** The SPCA offers the opportunity for those receiving assistance from the Salvation Army, Citizens Against Family Violence, and Red Cross to safely house their pets for 30 days. People who are homeless, recovering from house fires, starting over from abusive relationships, etc., can progress towards safety knowing that their pet will be safe. If they cannot reclaim the animal after 30 days, we will work with them to either place the animal up for adoption or extend the hold as needed.
- **Dog Park:** Thanks to a generous sponsorship from a community member, the SPCA renovated our public access dog park. The area now features a small dog park and a large dog park with fresh canine agility equipment. The park is open to the public during daylight hours.

- The Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) Team is there to help you to live in your home and community. We want to help you reach your goals while coping with your mental health needs. ACT stays in regular contact and offer services for you in your home and community; from a team that includes a doctor, nurses, counselors, and peer providers. ACT helps your recovery, and helps you to stay in your home and community, gives you freedom, and confidence.
- The Community Recovery Program (CRP) will assist individuals by providing vocational services, assistance with job searches, and referrals to community resources that can lead to competitive employment and becoming productive members of the community. Interested individuals must have a desire to obtain or maintain employment or to volunteer for individuals who are disabled. Must be 18 years of age or older. Medicaid is accepted, but there is no cost for individuals who do not have insurance.
- **Early Intervention** provides supports and services to families with infants and toddlers from birth up to their third birthday who are not developing as expected or who have a medical condition that can delay normal development.
- **Healthy Families** home visitors support expectant and new parents as they establish nurturing parent-child relationships, develop positive parenting skills, provide safe homes, learn to support healthy child development, and learn about community resources.
- Intellectual Disabilities and/or Developmental Delays Case Management is a support system that assists individuals with diagnosed intellectual disabilities and/or developmental delays to plan and coordinate services. ID/DD Case Managers have specific knowledge about development and local resources for children and adolescents between the ages of 3 and 17, and adults 18 and older.

- Mental Health Case Management (MHCM) is a service to help you set goals and to provide support. MHCM can be provided for youth up to 18, and adults 18 and older. MHCM services can help if your mental health needs cause problems with your relationships, work or school, ability to access food, shelter, medical care, and/or ability to complete daily living activities such as hygiene, making and shopping for food, or money management.
- Outpatient Services is a place to talk about things that are bothering you and learn new skills to help you when you are struggling with behavioral health (mental health and substance use) problems to recover and have a better life. Services are one on one, and sometimes in groups or with family members.
- **Peer Recovery Center and Support Services** operates an evidenced based service model to help you develop and work towards your personal recovery goals.
- **Psychosocial Rehab (PSR/Horizon's)** operates in a day support setting. Services are designed to reduce psychiatric hospitalizations and promote recovery.
- Substance Use Disorders Case Management (SUDCM) helps you and your family to get treatment for alcohol and drug use, and can also help with medical, mental health, social, educational, and vocational services and other supports essential to meeting basic needs.
- **Substance Use Disorder Groups** help you to learn skills and ways to reduce the effects of drug and/or alcohol use. Members in SUD programs receive education about stopping the cycle of addiction, improving recovery skills, and preventing relapse. Group counseling gives you the chance to talk about the experience of putting these new skills to use.
