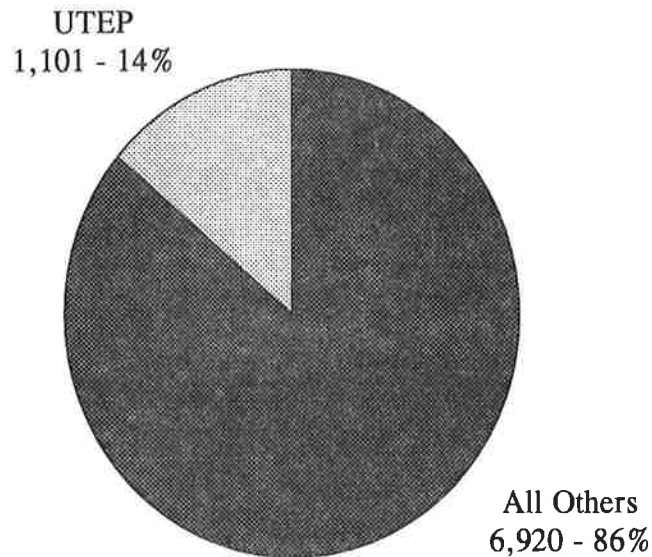

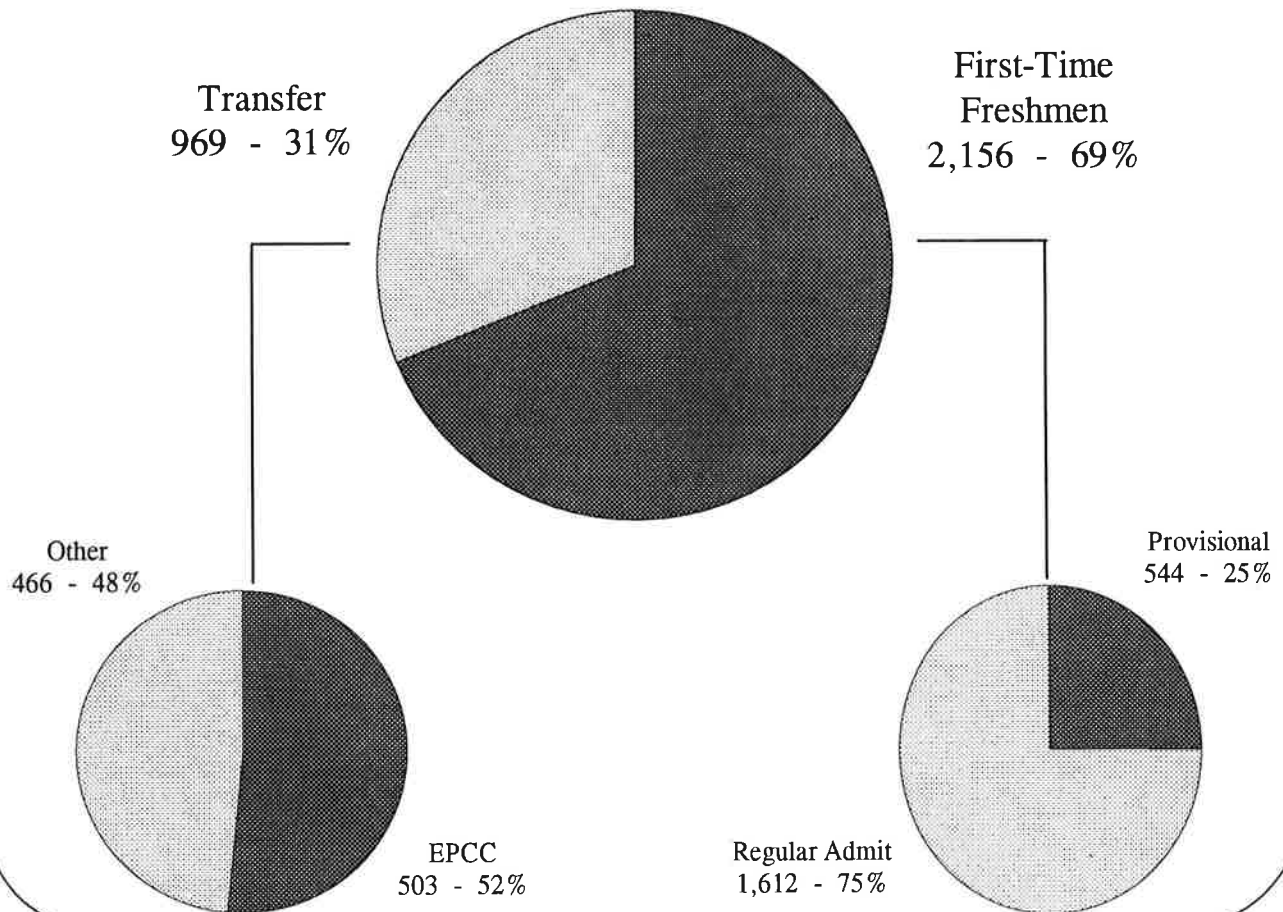

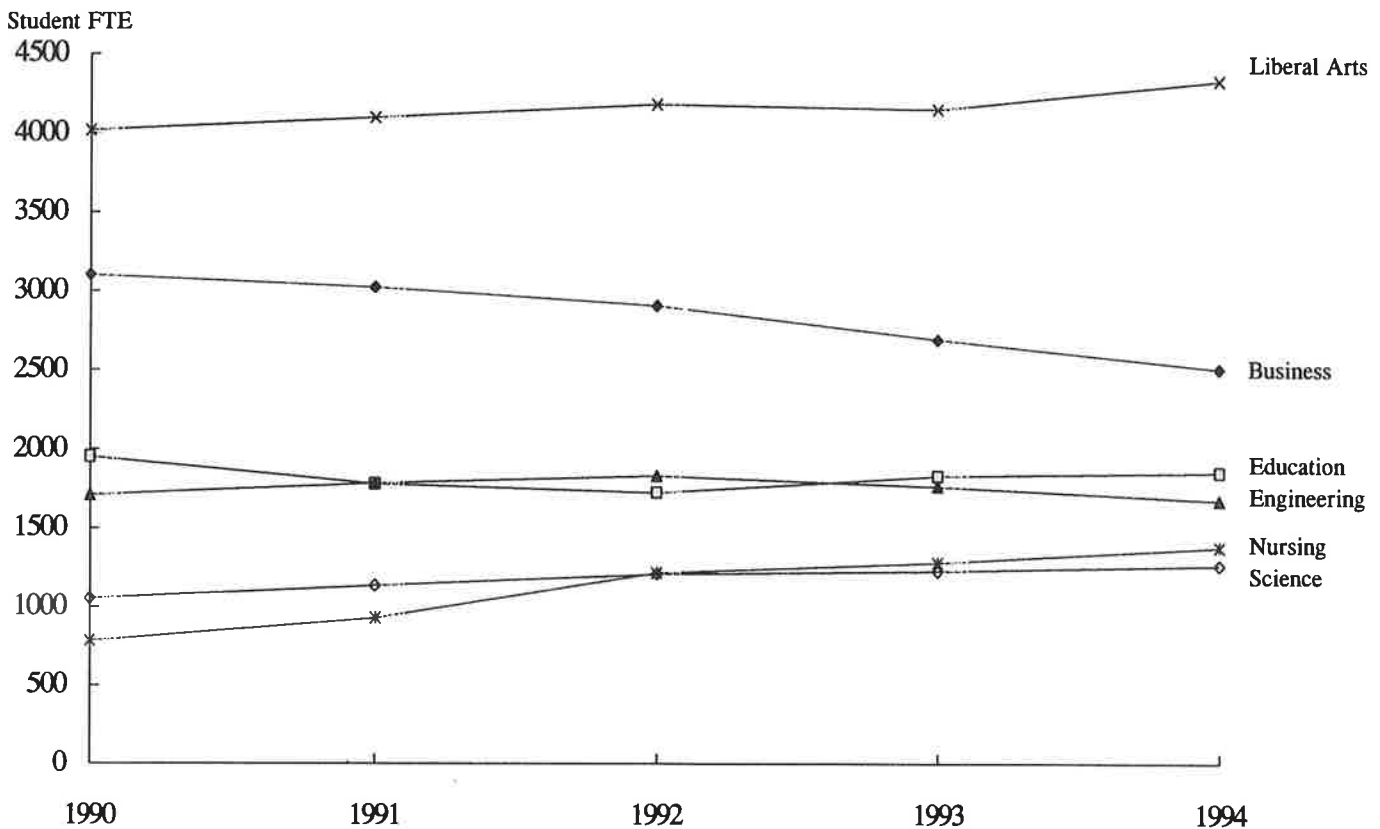

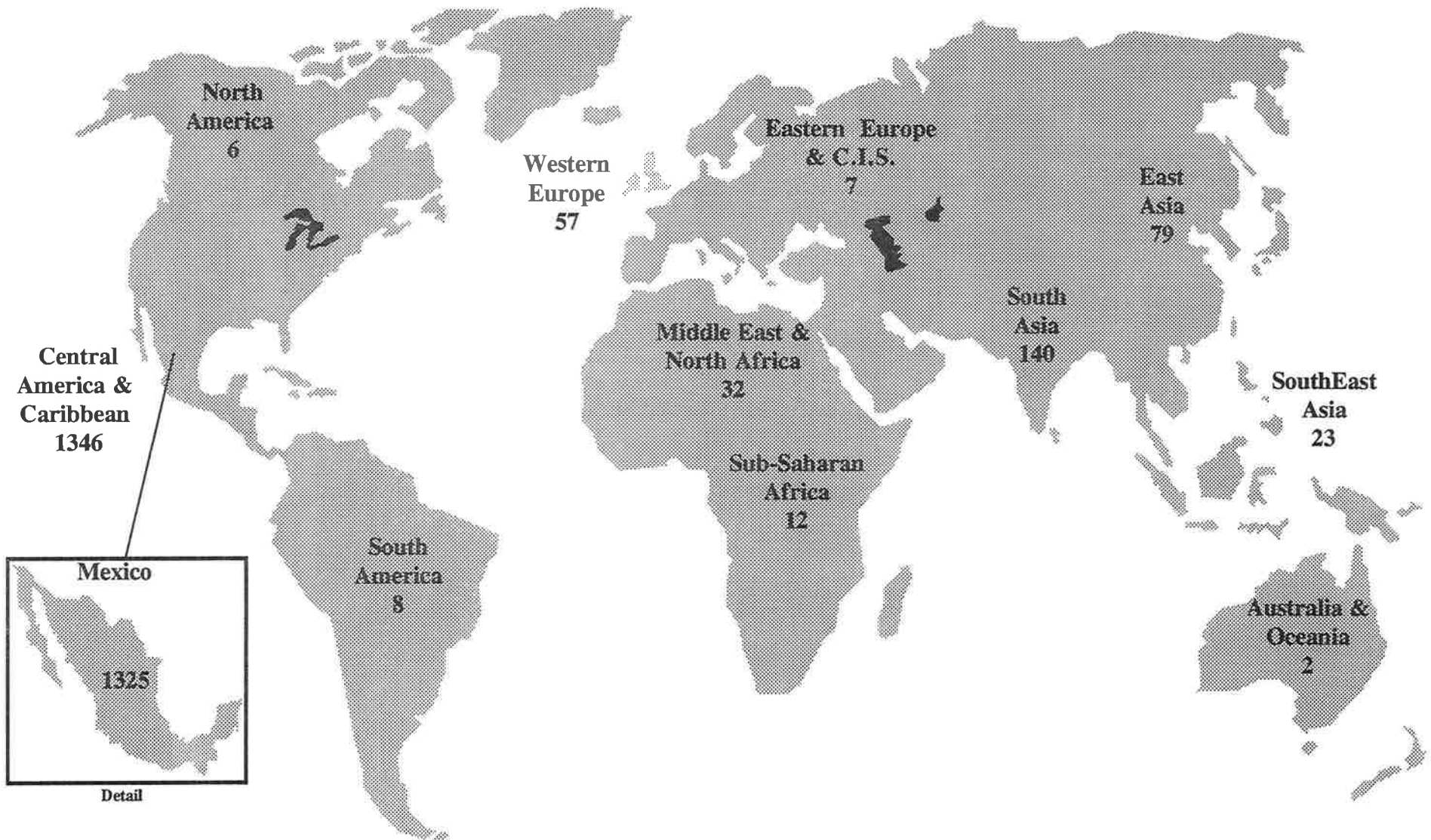

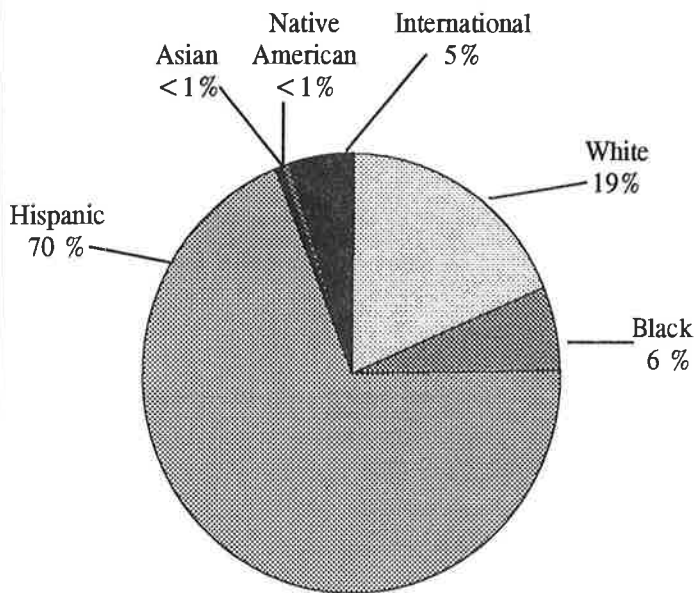

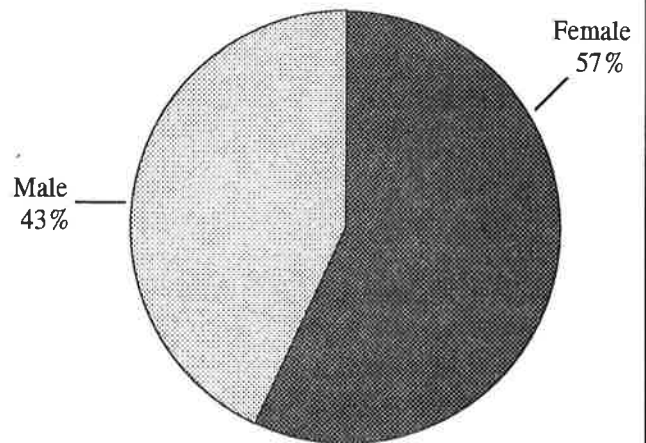

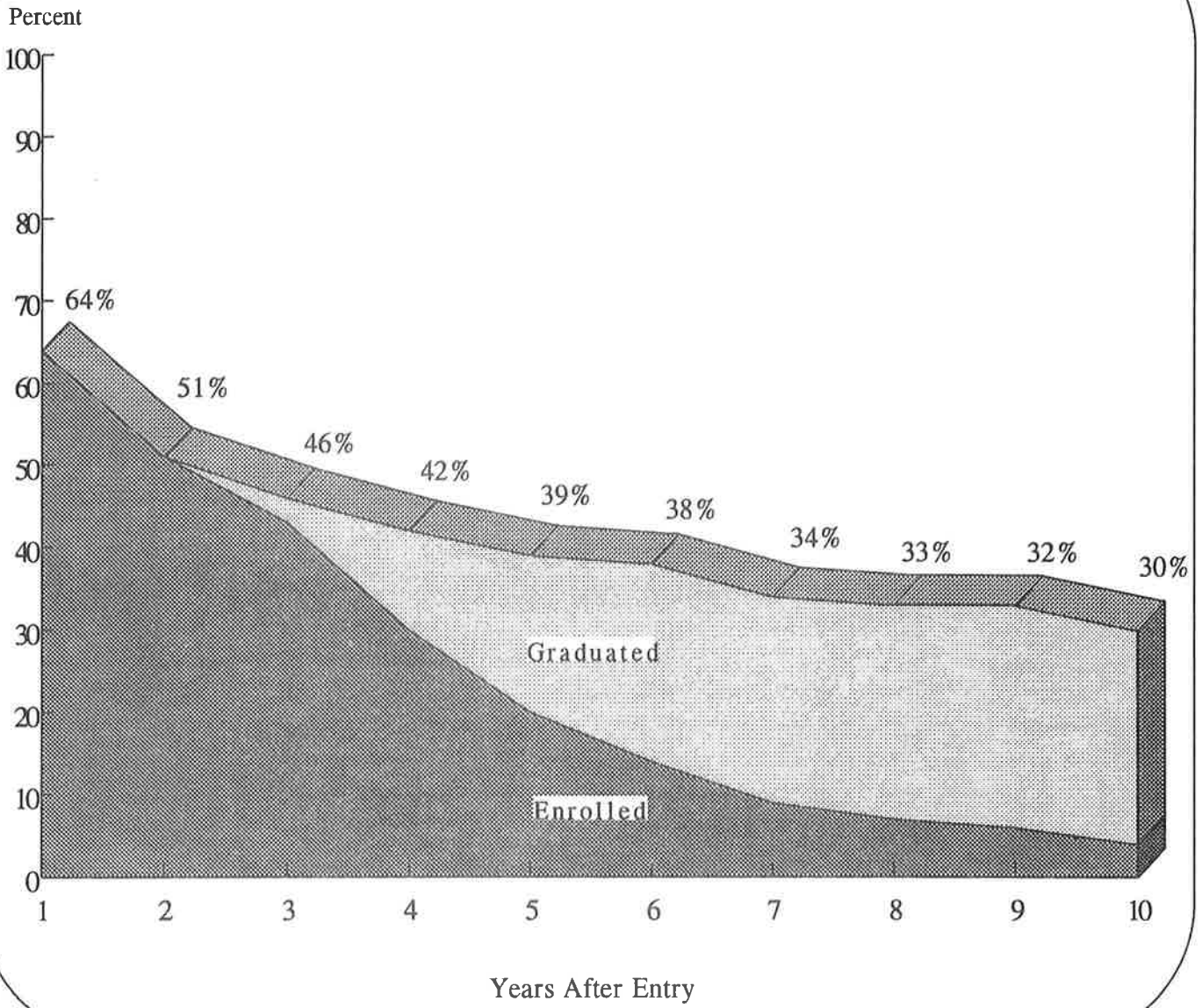

## Highlights of UTEP College Experience Survey Spring 1994

### Overall

In Spring 1994, 2,135 UTEP students were asked to complete a questionnaire about their experiences in college. Respondents included 16% freshmen, 17% sophomores, 22% juniors, 33% seniors, and 12% graduate students. 51% were female and 49% male. 60% said they were most comfortable speaking in English, 11% in Spanish, and 27% said "both".

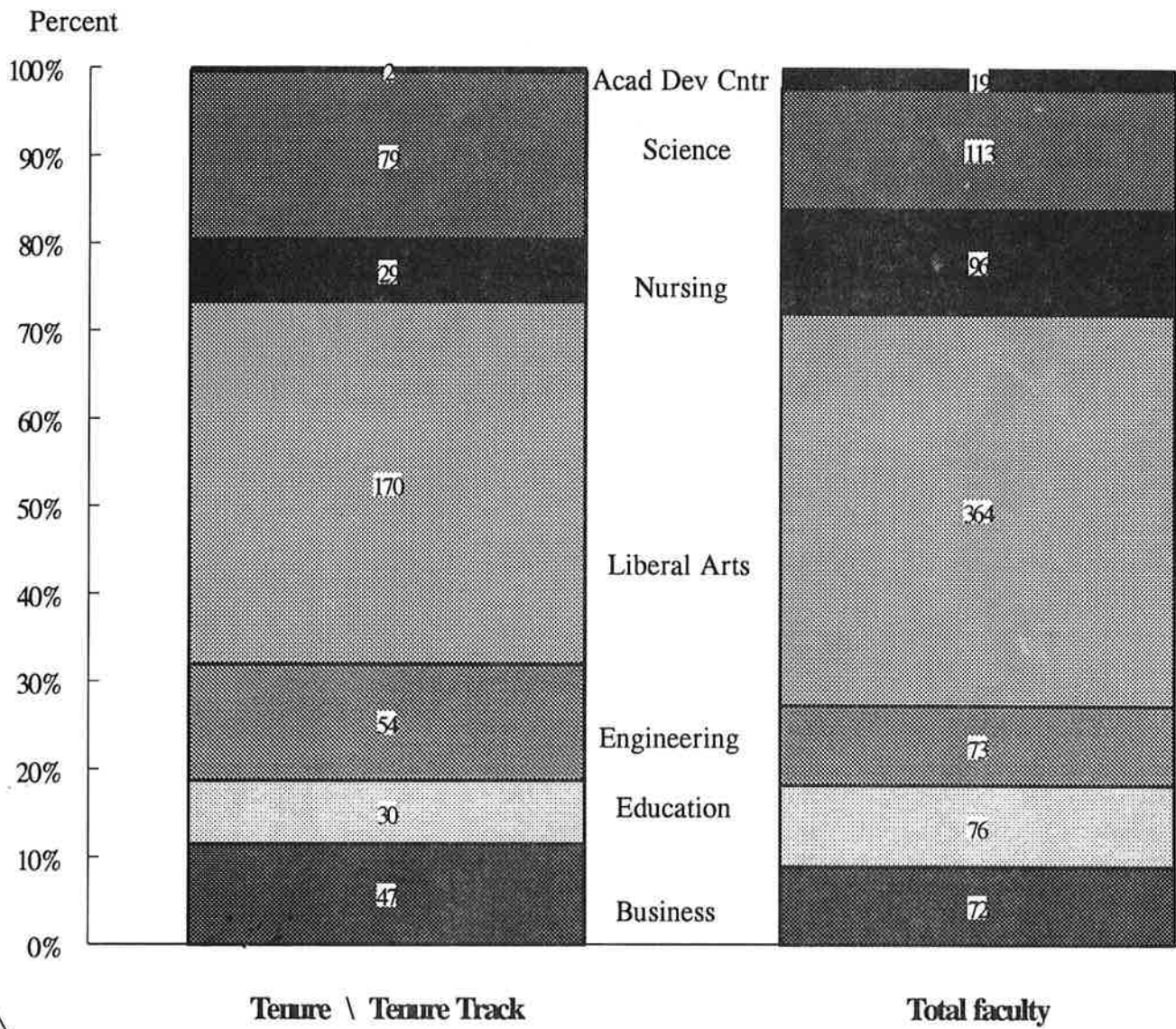

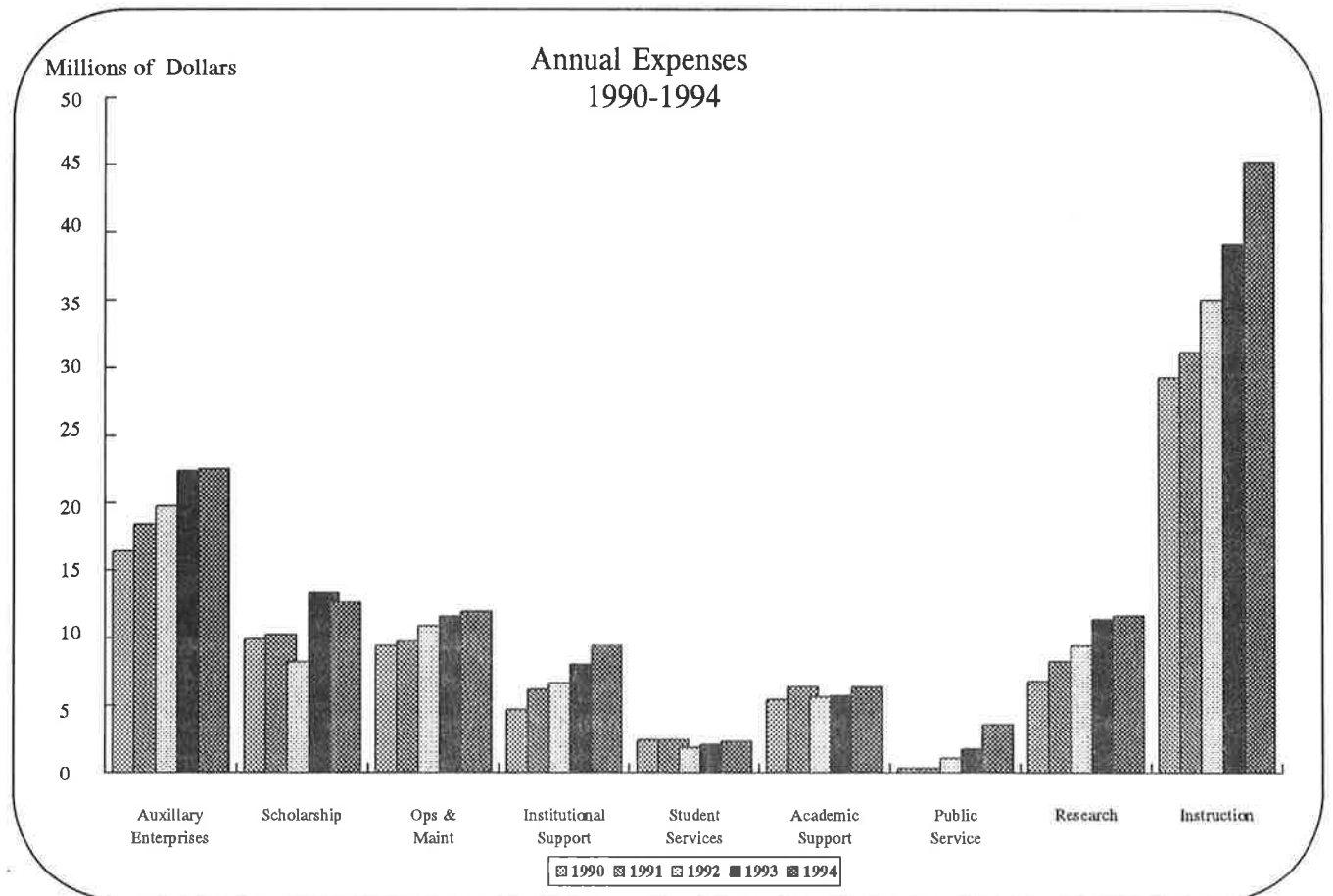

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# Appendix

## APPENDIX DEFINITION OF TERMS USED

### Section II: New Students

Regular Admit Students who graduate in the top quarter of their high school class, students who graduate in the second quarter of their high school class and score a minimum of 700 on the SAT or 18 on the ACT, and students who graduate in the bottom half of their high school class and score a minimum of 800 on the SAT or 20 on the ACT, are eligible for regular admission.

Provisional Texas residents who do not meet the requirements for regular admission may be admitted provisionally. Provisional students must take prescribed courses, attend new student orientation, be advised by a faculty member in the Academic Advising Center, and take a free, noncredit Study Skills course. Students must meet certain academic criteria to clear provisional status within two semesters.

Transient A transient student is a full-time student in good academic standing at another college or university who does not plan to pursue a degree at UTEP, and who enrolls only for the summer.

Full/Part Time Undergraduate students who enroll for at least 12 credit hours and graduate students who enroll for at least nine credit hours are considered full-time students.

TSWE The Test of Standard Written English is required for initial placement into precollege or college-level English courses.

Mexican Students Students listed as 'Mexican' may be defined in two ways: according to their residence, and according to their ethnicity. When Mexican students appear in residency tables, they include all students with a permanent address in Mexico. In ethnicity tables, they include only international (non-US citizen) students whose country of origin is Mexico, usually a slightly smaller number.

### Section III: Students

Academic Development Center Provides precollege English and math courses, usually noted as 'remedial' or 'developmental' courses, to underprepared students. Although not a College, the Academic Development Center often appears on tables with the individual colleges in order to account for precollege courses.

Individual Instruction Includes independent study, private lesson, practicum, student teaching, internship and cooperative education courses.

Undeclared/Unclassified Students Unless otherwise noted, undeclared students are undergraduates with a major of 'General Studies.' At the graduate level, they include

students who are not enrolled in a degree, certificate or endorsement program, and are usually denoted 'unclassified.'

Full Time Equivalent (FTE) Numerous methods are available to calculate FTE students, but only two are used here. The 15-12-9 method divides the total of all undergraduate credit hours by 15, all masters' credit hours by 12, and all doctoral credit hours by 9. The 12-9-9 method counts the number of students taking a full-time load (12 for undergraduate, 9 for graduate) and adds the full-time equivalent of part-time students, which is determined by dividing the credit hours taken by each part-time student by the full-time load at that level.

Success Rate The proportion of students from an entering first-time freshman cohort who, at a given point in time, have either graduated or are still enrolled at UTEP.

#### **Section IV: Programs**

Organized Classes Lectures, laboratories, seminars, or any combination of these types of instruction.

Grades In addition to the usual A - F: I=incomplete; S=satisfactory in a pass/fail course; U=Unsatisfactory in a pass/fail course; P=in progress, course must be repeated; W=withdrawal; N=temporary administrative notation intended to be replaced with another grade.

Semester Credit Hour (SCH) A unit of measurement assigned to a course. Total SCH are computed by multiplying the number of credit hours assigned to a course by the number of students enrolled in the course.

#### **Section V: Faculty**

Tenured/Tenure-track faculty All faculty with one of the following ranks: Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor or Instructor.

Nontenure-track faculty All faculty with a rank of Lecturer, Clinical Instructor, Visiting Faculty, Academic Specialist, Assistant Instructor, Teaching Assistant, or Adjunct Faculty. They can be full- or part-time.

Full Time Equivalent (FTE) FTE faculty are usually defined by the percent of their time that they are responsible for credit hour courses; i.e., a Dean who spends one-third of her time teaching is considered 0.33 FTE.

Terminal Degree Highest degree awarded in a particular field. The Master of Fine Arts (MFA) is considered the terminal degree in Fine Arts, for example.
