# Editor's Comment


### CONGRATULATIONS to local Cllr. Keith Bland on his appointment as Chairman of Culcheth & Parish Council – again!



#### New Chairman

At the Parish Council AGM in May, Cllr Paul Campbell handed over the chain of office to the incoming Chairman for 2023/24 Cllr Phil Sharpe.

Planning Application for 98 Homes Deacons Close. No: 2023/00201/FULM

The Parish Council are objecting to a recent planning application for 98 homes taking in the area Heathcroft Stud Deacons Close. The objection that some of this building will be on Green Belt land which the Parish Council has objected to for the last five years. The Parish Council alongside our three Borough Councillors held a Drop-In session for residents at the Memorial Hall at which around 70 people attended to receive information about the application and advised on how to put in objections to the Planning Department at Warrington Borough Council.

Coronation of King Charles III

The Coronation of King Charles III took place on Saturday 6th May. The Parish Council supported residents with a Picnic in the Park on Sunday 7th. Great fun was had by all and the weather made it all the better with sunshine all day.

#### Local Issues

- 1. We have installed two new Speed Indicator Units on Heath Lane these provide DATA which we can pass on to the Police highlighting times when the speeding issue is most prevalent allowing them to better use their resources to tackle this serious problem.
- 2. We have started to plant trees on the Croft Playing Field to commemorate the late Queen Elizabeths Jubilee to be a lasting memorial to her 70yrs of service.
- 3. We will be placing a new Defibrillator outside the Plough with the owners blessing.
- 4. Work continues to repair and paint the Benches throughout our village.
- 5. Road Traffic lines have been painted at the Kenyon Lane Junction with the Plough Public House.
- 6. The Parish Council voted to keep the local Parish Precept at the current rate with no increase in the coming year.

## New plan for mobile phone mast at fishery

TELECOMMUNICATIONS giant EE is seeking planning consent for a 20-metre high mobile phone mast on land within Partridge Lakes Fishery in Glaziers Lane, Culcheth.

proposed mast would replace a temporary mast on the fishery car park and is proposed as an alternative to a mast at the fishery which was given planning consent last year.

A report to borough council planners says the proposed lattice mast would be of similar appearance to the temporary mast and mirrors the design of the replacement tower which received planning approval last year.

But the revised location would be more screened and hidden by surrounding vegetation than either the current temporary mast or the previously approved mast.

A number of alternative sites in the Culcheth area have been considered including Leigh Golf Howards Transport Culcheth Linear Park, The Royal British Legion, Culcheth Library, and Taylor Business Park.

All have been discounted for a variety of reasons.

EE say the proposal will form part of a new 4G emergency services network and should be considered critical infrastructure with the UK to support the local community.



## Homes plan for farm site

OUTLINE planning consent is being sought for up to three dwellings on land at Three Acres Farm, East

Existing kennels and a garage building would be demolished as part of the proposals.

The scheme has been submitted to borough council planners who are considering the proposals.

Three Acres Farm consists of bungalow and a number of outbuildings providing storage, kennels, pens and a garage. The site is accessed by a single track road from Lately Common, alongside an area used for caravan storage, belonging to a

neighbouring property.
A report submitted to planners say the scheme would not result in any significant impact on traffic flows, given the previous use of the site for kennels. The new dwellings would be served by the existing driveway and access from Warrington Road.

The proposals are for the existing barn and storage building to be replaced by two dwellings. An additional dwelling would site to the north west of the site in place of the existing kennels building

The amount of development would be limited to ensure safe and practical use of the site

development land without detrimental effect and no greater impact on the openness of the Green Belt and surrounding

properties.
All existing boundaries and hedges would be retained and only two trees would be lost

"Our intention is early July".



#### **PARISH NEWS**

### Here are some of the achievements of Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council in the year May 2022 to 2023

- Cllr Neil Johnson as Chair of the Parish Council engaged with members of the local community to support the environment of the villages by litter picking at several sites on a weekly basis.
- As Chair, Cllr Johnson represented the Parish Council at several community events across the villages. He also ensured that the Post Office installed a new Post Box at Chatburn Close. Cllr Johnson read the proclamation of the Monarch's death at several sites across the villages.
- The Parish Council celebrated the Coronation of King Charles III by financially supporting celebrations in Primary Schools in Culcheth & Glazebury.
- Parish Councillors advised & supported residents to successfully appeal parking fines imposed by the owners of the CPS centre.
- Corresponded with Cheshire Police and Crime Commissioner to enquire about the progress of the installation of average speed cameras on the A574 in Glazebury village.
- Successfully planned and ran 'Community Day' on the village green which was enjoyed by thousands of local residents on the 1st May 2023. There is a Gallery of photographs of the event on the Parish Council website.
- Held a public meeting to support residents with regard to the planning application (2022/42633) for the car park at the CPS centre. The Parish Council also commissioned a report from an environmental consultant which addressed residents concerns about this planning application.
- Supported many residents and businesses with planning concerns.
- Christmas lights switch on was celebrated by the Parish Council with the help of Culcheth Primary School choir.
- Successfully renegotiated the cost of the Parish Page in Culcheth Life after discussion with Gary Skentelbery.
- Continued to develop the Parish Council website so that it is a community resource for all residents.
- Completed the installation of two new defibrillators cabinets and defibrillators at locations in Culcheth and Glazebury, as well as the refurbishment of an existing defibrillator. These are available for use in emergency situations 24 hours a day to all members of the local community.
- The Parish Council supported Cheshire Police & Warrington Borough Council in the aftermath of the murder of Brianna Ghey.
- Continued commitment to keep the Parish Council Office in the library. This was vacated for several months due to the redevelopment and refurbishment of the Library building
- Parish Councillors attended Remembrance services at Churches in Glazebury and Newchurch, wreathes of remembrance were laid at the war memorials at these Churches.
- Individual councillors have supported 'Friends of Culcheth
- Liaised with PCSO to ensure road speed checks are completed in Culcheth and Glazebury.
- Successfully completed the Annual Internal and External Audit of the Parish Council.


## Croft council and residents celebrate Coronation

UP to six weeks of phased road closures have been confirmed at the Birchwood Park roundabouts this month (June) for carriageway resurfacing.

The closures will be in the

evenings from 7pm to 1am as and when signed on site.

Warrington Borough Council has made an Order under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of which will be to introduce a prohibition of driving & clearway as follows: Daten Avenue from the roundabout at Faraday Street/Trident Way to the junction at Birchwood Way; From the roundabout at Daten Avenue for 50 metres along the following lengths of road: Clayton Road; Leacroft Road; Risley Road; Ordnance Avenue from the roundabout at Oakwood Gate/Dewhurst Road to the junction at Redshank Lane; From the roundabout at Ordnance Avenue for 50 metres along the following lengths of road: Admirals Road (South); Fire Station Access Road.

The Order will be effective from 5th June 2023 for 6 weeks, as and when signed on site.

when signed on site.

The works will be undertaken in phases as follows: Phase 1 – 10pm to 5am – Roundabout at Daten Avenue, Clayton Road, Leacroft Road, Risley Road; Phase 2 – 7pm to 1am – Roundabout at Birchwood Park Avenue/Kelvin Close. Access will be under the control of the relevant Contractor for the duration of the works. The alternative routes will be as follows: Phase 1 via Birchwood Park Avenue, Birchwood Way and vice versa; Phase 2 via Dewhurst Road, Admirals Road and vice versa. The closure is required for carriageway closure is required for carriageway resurfacing.

He is against chemicals and aims to encourage small creatures by planting flowers, trees and shrubs to provide pollen and nectar and by maintaining garden ponds. He now has a website and designs bee hotels, wormeries and hedgehog gates.

Members saw many kinds of bee, hoverflies and some of the 9,000 types of wasp in the UK. Bumble bees and their clever queens are favourites and headmires the wasp as a pest killer. He showed his "hedgehog gates" between gardens, with videos of hedgehogs feeding and hoglets on their first outings. His aim is to spread wildflower lawns in his own garden (and his pointhour's)
