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# GENERAL INFORMATION

It is the University's expectation that a student will follow University rules and regulations as they are stated in the *General Catalog*. In instances where no appeal procedure is spelled out and the student is persuaded that a special set of circumstances makes appeal reasonable, he or she may appeal the application of specific rules or regulations to the office of the dean of the school or college in which he or she is enrolled in the case of an academic matter, or to the Office of Student Affairs in the case of a nonacademic matter. These offices will either render a decision on the appeal or refer the student to the proper office for a decision.

## GUARANTEED REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY

University of Washington students who remain in good scholastic standing are guaranteed the opportunity to register each quarter as long as they maintain continuous enrollment (Summer Quarter excepted). Continuation must be in the same classification, e.g., undergraduate, fifth-year, graduate, etc. Once a student earns a bachelor's degree, he or she must apply for readmission as a fifth-year, nonmatriculated, or graduate student. Exceptions to the guarantee are: (1) students under disciplinary action and (2) students with a financial hold.

If an undergraduate does not enroll for one or more quarters, or if a graduate student goes on-leave, he or she must file an application for readmission with the Registrar's Office. See appropriate readmission closing dates.

## FULL-TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENT

Many students think that because they pay full fees they are considered full-time students. This is not true! To be considered a full-time student, undergraduates must register for 12 credits and graduates must register for 9 credits. Full-time status is required for certain agencies, such as Immigration and Naturalization Service, Veterans Administration, and Social Security Administration. Consult the Registrar's Office for social security requirements, the International Services Office for immigration requirements, and the Veterans Affairs Office for VA benefits.

## NONMATRICULATED STUDENTS

Nonmatriculated students may register only on the last day of in-person registration and may enroll only in courses that have room after reserving a 10 per cent or five-space cushion (whichever is greater) for matriculated student changes. Nonmatriculated students may participate in preregistration for the Summer Quarter.

## AUDITORS

Auditors pay standard tuition and fees and must be regularly admitted and registered in the course.

Attendance in courses as an auditor is by consent of the instructor involved and is conditioned by the extent to which space is available. Permission to audit is ordinarily granted for lecture classes only. An auditor may not participate in class discussion or laboratory work, and his or her registration may be cancelled at the discretion of the instructor.

No entry is made on the permanent record for courses audited. To receive credit for an audited course, the student must register for the class for credit in a subsequent quarter.

Auditors follow registration instructions below.

## PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED STUDENTS

Students with visual, ambulatory, and other severe handicaps will be given the highest registration priority if they identify themselves to the Office of Student Affairs, 466 Schmitz Hall, telephone 543-4893.

# REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

## ACADEMIC ADVISER

See an academic adviser to discuss your educational objectives and to learn the procedures involved in registering at the University. Have an idea of the courses you would like to take before seeing an adviser by reviewing the *General Catalog* and the quarterly *Time Schedule*.

## REGISTRATION FORMS

Obtain a mark-sense registration form from your advisory office and mark the courses you are requesting on the form in accordance with directions on the form. Please note that some courses in the *Time Schedule* have restricted enrollment and you must obtain entry cards for these courses. Undergraduates will not be scheduled for more than 19 credits until the first day of the quarter. This is done to allow all students a chance to develop a basic program.

## ENTRY CARDS

Certain courses and sections require entry cards for registration. Students who request these courses (and/or sections) on their registration request forms will not be registered in the courses unless the requests are accompanied by entry cards. An entry card alone is not sufficient. The course and schedule line number (SLN on entry card) must also be requested on the mark-sense registration form. Obtain course entry cards for courses designated with the symbol >>> in the margin of the *Time Schedule*. Refer to the Entry Card Distribution Points list for information on where to obtain the entry card for a given course.

## SUBMITTING REGISTRATION FORM

1. If you are a continuing matriculated student registering November 15-24 you may deposit your form at any of the following places:

- Registration lobby, second floor, Schmitz Hall
- B10 Padelford Hall
- Fourth floor student lounge, T-wing, Health Sciences Building
- 353 Loew Hall (engineering students only)

See the cover of the *Time Schedule* for registration dates.

2. If you are a continuing matriculated student who did not preregister you must obtain an in-person registration appointment before December 16. Continuing students who request in-person registration appointments after December 16 may be required to register late during the first week of school and to pay the \$15 late registration fee.

3. If you are registering December 16-21, go to the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library, on the date and time indicated on your registration appointment.

4. Nonmatriculated students may register only on December 21. Appointments are available Window 8, 2nd floor Schmitz Hall.

## LATE REGISTRATION

Students who register after the official registration period will be charged a \$15 late registration fee.

## SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

1. If you register November 15-24, your schedule of classes will be mailed to the address you indicate

on the registration form. All students registering during this period are scheduled by computer at one time. The scheduling priority is: freshmen, seniors, graduate students, fifth-year, juniors, and sophomores.

2. If you register December 16-21, you will be scheduled manually and will be given a copy of your completed program when you have finished registering.

### DROPPING AND ADDING COURSES

All changes to a student's program should be completed during the official change periods (see calendar). Changes are made by appointment only. Appointments are available at Window 2, lobby, Schmitz Hall, for all but engineering students; engineering students go to 353 Loew Hall. A student who arrives more than a half-hour late will be required to make a new appointment. Changes made after the change periods cost \$5 and may result in fee forfeiture (see item 4 of this section).

#### 1. Grades in Dropped Courses and Drop Restrictions

a) *Undergraduates.* Undergraduate students who drop courses after the change periods receive no entry on their academic record if the drop is made during the first two weeks of the quarter. Drops made during the third and fourth weeks of the quarter will be recorded with a "W." No drops are permitted after the fourth week except for a limited number determined by the number of credits earned at the University. While completing the first 44 credits at the University, the student has three drops permitted after the fourth week, but, before the last day of instruction. After 45 credits have been completed at the University, the student earns one late drop for each 45 credits earned. All but the first three late drops may be accumulated and used as necessary. The first three late drops must be used prior to earning 45 credits or they are forfeited. *No drops of any kind are permitted after the last day of instruction.*

b) *Graduate Students.* Graduate students who drop courses after the first two weeks of the quarter receive a grade of "W." No drops are permitted after the seventh week of instruction.

c) Students may petition the Registrar to drop a course after the regular drop deadline if: (1) the student is unable to complete the course in question because of a severe mental or physical disability, or (2) unusual or extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control prevented the student from dropping the course by the regular drop deadline. Petitions must be filed promptly after the occurrence of the event that gave rise to the need for dropping the course.

#### 2. Fee Forfeitures or Refunds.

a) Students will be billed for the number of credits on their programs at the end of the first week of the quarter. Only partial fee reductions will result for courses dropped after the first week of the quarter.

b) Students dropping courses after the first seven calendar days of the quarter and through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition and fees associated with that course. Example: An undergraduate originally registers for 5 credits. The fee for 5 credits is \$134 (resident). The student then drops a 3-credit course in the second week of the quarter. The total number of credits for which the student remains registered is 2. Tuition and fees for 2 credits are \$53. However, additional fees are due for half the difference between 5 credits and 2 credits, in this case an additional \$40.50. The student has been registered in the dropped course for more than one week and therefore must pay half the fees for the course.

Courses dropped after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund. Example: A student is registered for a 3-credit course. The student drops that course after the thirtieth calendar day. No refund is available. If the student adds a different 3-credit course at the time the original 3-credit course is dropped, he or she will pay tuition and fees for 6 credits.

c) Drops become effective the date received in Sections.

#### 3. Courses Added After the Official Change Periods

a) As a general rule, no courses may be added after the official change period. Exceptional cases may be approved if both the instructor of the course and the Dean of the student's college give their consent.

b) Courses audited may not be changed to a credit registration after the first two weeks of the quarter.

#### FEE PAYMENT

1. A fee statement will be mailed to the address you indicate on your mark-sense registration form. *Fees must be paid by Friday of the fourth week of the quarter.*

2. Mail your fee payment to the Student Accounts Office in the envelope provided before the due date indicated.

3. If you fail to pay by the deadline you may continue to pay your fees, with a \$10 late fee, for three weeks following the due date. If fees are not paid by this time your registration will be cancelled. *Please note: Even if your registration is cancelled you will continue to owe one-half your tuition and fees if you are a continuing student or, if you are a new or returning student, \$50 or one-half your tuition and fees, whichever is greater.*

#### STUDENT INSURANCE

All students who do not specifically request a particular student insurance plan or who do not specifically state they do not wish student insurance, will automatically be enrolled and billed for *student only* medical, surgical, and hospital insurance.

If you are billed for student insurance and decide that you do not want coverage, you may void the policy by completing the appropriate section on the fee payment card and by paying the amount billed less the indicated amount for insurance.

#### WASHPIRG

An optional \$2.00 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Public Interest Research Group, a student research organization. If you do not desire to support this activity, simply pay the required fee. If you want to support WASHPIRG, check the payment card and pay the required fee plus \$2.00.

#### WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY

1. Obtain an approved withdrawal form from your adviser.

2. Present the withdrawal form to the Withdrawal Office, Sections, 264 Schmitz Hall. *Withdrawals are effective the date they are received in the Registrar's Office.* Fees owed will be based upon the date the withdrawal is received in the Registrar's Office.

The fee schedule below will be followed.

#### Continuing Students

a. Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter do not pay tuition or fees.

b. Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe one-half of their tuition and fees.

c. Students withdrawing after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund of tuition or fees.

#### New and Returning Students

a. Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter forfeit their \$50 enrollment service fee.

b. Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter must pay one-half of regular tuition and fees or forfeit the \$50 enrollment service charge, whichever is greater.

c. Students who withdraw officially after the thirtieth calendar day must pay full tuition and fees, which includes the \$50 enrollment service fee.

3. Students who were unable to turn in their withdrawal in time may petition the Comptroller's Office for additional refund. Petition forms are available at the Student Accounts Office, 129 Schmitz Hall.

4. Courses dropped as part of a University withdrawal completed during the first two weeks of a quarter receive no grade and no entry. Withdrawals completed after the first two weeks result in the courses being assigned a grade of "W."

#### GRADING SYSTEM

Beginning Summer Quarter 1976, a numerical grading system will be in effect at the University of Washington, with certain exceptions in the Schools of Dentistry, Law, and Medicine. Instructors may report passing grades from 4.0 to 0.7 in 0.1 increments. The number 0.0 will be assigned for failing work or unofficial withdrawal. Numerical grades may be considered equivalent to letter grades as follows:

#### The Grade of Incomplete

In order to obtain credit for a course in which an Incomplete has been awarded, an undergraduate student must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the following quarter. An Incomplete grade for a Summer Quarter course must be made up by the last day of Autumn Quarter or the Incomplete will be converted to a grade of 0.0 by the Registrar, unless the instructor has indicated when assigning the Incomplete grade that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. This time limitation may be ex-

tended up to one year with instructor approval. Such approval must be received by the Registrar's Office before the end of the next quarter.

A graduate student who receives an Incomplete must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the next quarter *in residence*. An Incomplete received by a graduate student does not automatically convert to 0.0 but remains an Incomplete if the coursework is not completed. This time limitation may be waived by the dean of the college in which the course was offered only if the nature of the uncompleted work is such as to make the fulfillment of this requirement impossible. In no case can an Incomplete received by a graduate student be converted to a passing grade after a lapse of two years.

#### Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory

Students may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis. Advisers should be consulted and in no case are students allowed to register for more than one course or 6 credits on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis in a given quarter. No more than 25 credits will apply to an undergraduate degree. S/NS must be elected or dropped during the official change of program period. Undergraduate students earning grades of 1.7 or above receive a grade of S(Satisfactory) while grades below 1.7 are recorded as NS(Not Satisfactory). Graduate students earning grades of 2.7 or above receive a grade of S(Satisfactory); while 2.6 or below are NS(Not Satisfactory). In cases of withdrawal, the W is recorded. Neither S nor NS are included in the grade-point average. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar. With the approval of his or her Graduate Program Adviser or Supervisory Committee Chairman, a graduate student may elect to take any course for which he or she is eligible outside of his or her major academic unit on the Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory system.

#### Credit/No Credit-Only Courses

Some courses are offered on a CR/NC only basis. These courses may be taken only on this basis and it is not necessary to be in the special Credit/No Credit program to take these courses. It is not necessary to register S/NS to take these courses as the only grades assigned by the instructor are CR (Credit) or NC (No Credit). Neither CR nor NC are included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal a W is recorded. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of Incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

#### Credit/No Credit Program

The University offers an undergraduate grading option called Credit/No Credit. Students entering this program automatically take all courses on a CR/NC basis. This program is not applicable to certain degrees and advisers should be consulted. Students must enter and exit the CR/NC program no later than the last day of the change of program period for the quarter the change is to be effective. Further information is available at the Registration Office, second floor of Schmitz Hall.

- December 14, 15 **OFFICIAL CHANGE OF REGISTRATION PERIOD** by appointment only, at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (engineering majors at 353 Loew).
- December 16 Change of registration appointments for the January 3-7 change period available at Window 2 or 3, second floor of Schmitz (engineering majors obtain appointments at 353 Loew), for students who have received a program of study.
- December 16-20 **IN-PERSON REGISTRATION** by appointment only, at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (engineering majors at 353 Loew), for matriculated students.
- December 21 **IN-PERSON REGISTRATION FOR NONMATRICULATED STUDENTS** by appointment only, at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library.
- January 3-7 **OFFICIAL CHANGE OF REGISTRATION PERIOD** by appointment only, at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (engineering majors at 353 Loew), for students who have received a program of study.
- January 7 Deadline for: (1) changes to or from S/NS grading or CR/NC program; (2) adding a course without instructor's permission; (3) adding or dropping a course without being assessed a \$5 change fee. Courses dropped after this date will be included in the tuition calculation. (See refund schedule under Dropping and Adding Courses on page IV.)
- January 14 Last day to drop a course without entry on permanent record.
- January 14 Last day to add a course without dean's permission.
- January 17 Fee statements mailed to all registered students.
- January 28 Last day for undergraduate, fifth-year and nonmatriculated students to drop a course.
- January 28 Fee payment deadline for all registered students.
- February 18 Last day for graduate students to drop a course.

## *Academic Period*

- January 3, Monday Instruction begins.
- January 14, Friday Last day to return approved applications to 207 Schmitz for credit by examination.
- January 21, Friday Applications for bachelor's degrees and certificates to be conferred through Winter Quarter 1977 must be submitted to the Graduation Office, 207 Schmitz.

Final examinations should be administered according to the schedule above.

If the final examination is given at a time earlier than that indicated above, the last meeting of the class shall be the examination period. Instructors should check with Room Assignments, 3-1080, if the exam will last more than one hour.

Classes that meet on the hour use the first full hour of instruction to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that meets at 10 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.

Classes in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may use that room at 8:30 or 2:30 for a three-hour examination. All other exams are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.

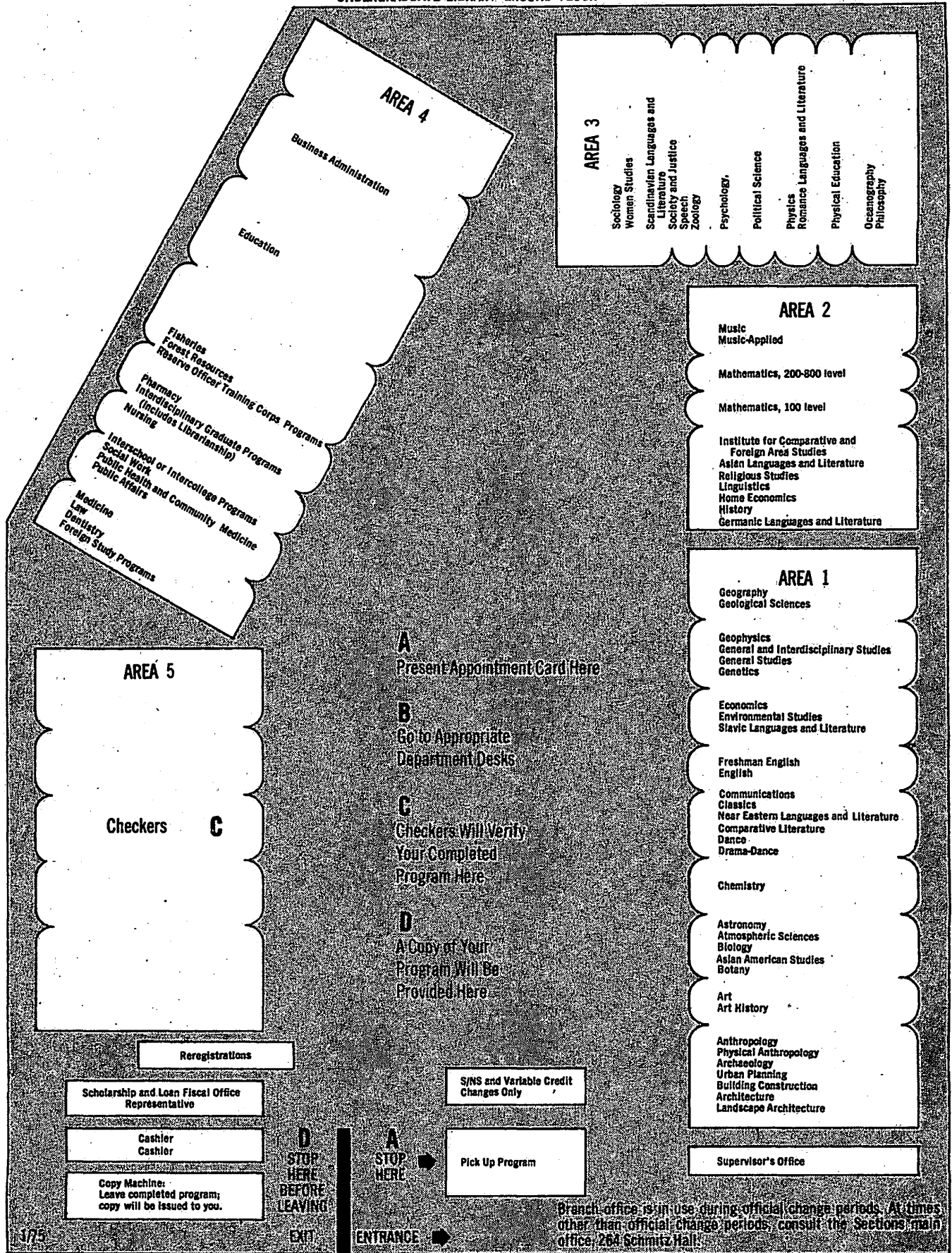
All exams must be scheduled not later than March 18.

If an examination is held at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure that the room is going to be available.

All students in undergraduate courses shall be required to take final examinations, provided that in a course for which an examination is not an appropriate test of the work covered, the instructor may dispense with the final examination. Working students are responsible for arranging their work hours to enable them to attend the final examinations.

A student absent from a scheduled final examination, either by permission of his dean or through sickness or other unavoidable cause, shall be given a grade of Incomplete if his work in that course has been satisfactory until the time of his absence. He may remove this Incomplete in the manner provided for the removing of Incomplete grades. In all other cases of absence from the scheduled final examination, a student should be given a grade of 0.0.

## NEW COURSES FOR WINTER QUARTER 1977

The following list includes new courses that will be offered Winter Quarter 1977, which were added to the University curriculum after publication of the 1976-78 General Catalog.

### COLLEGE OF ARCHITECTURE AND URBAN PLANNING

#### ARCHITECTURE

##### ARCH

#### 441 Methods and Techniques of PER Research (3)

Introductory course to ways and means of discovery in person-environment relations. Requires a working knowledge of data summary measures, but is non-quantitative except in application of measures to class projects data. Involves reading and application of research techniques including: unobtrusive measures, direct assessment through interview and survey, simulation and experimental observation, and phenomenological research. Prerequisites: 440 or equivalent, and permission.

### COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

#### AMERICAN INDIAN STUDIES

##### AIS

#### 313 American Indian Language: Salish (5)

The Salish language indigenous to the Seattle area. Objectives are: 1) to have a command of the basic structure and vocabulary to the extent of being able to converse entirely in the language (at a simple and restricted level) and have total command of the sound system; 2) to be able, with the aid of a dictionary, to read the oral literature that has been written and write down stories and other texts that the knowledgeable people of a tribe recount; 3) to understand those aspects of the Indian cultures and traditions not understandable through English. Not open to students who have taken GIS 223 and 224. Prerequisites: upper-division standing and permission.

#### ANTHROPOLOGY

##### ANTH

#### 433 Culture and Homosexuality: U.S.A. (3)

Descriptive and analytical treatment of homosexuality and culture in the United States. Cultural bases for the stigma of homosexuality; heterosexual roles of the "masculine" and "feminine"; cultural definitions of intra- and inter-sexual roles and their relationship to the homosexual stigma. Homosexuality and cultural alienation. Homosexual modes of communicating and expressing the stigmatized preference; institutionalized settings. The symbolism of homosexual ritualized behaviors. Prerequisite: 202 or permission.

##### ANTH

#### 508 Methods of Sociocultural Research (5)

Core-course sequence intended for first-year graduate students in sociocultural anthropology. Survey of major issues, alternative strategies, and selected special topics in the design of anthropological research and the collection, processing, and analysis of anthropological data. Prerequisite: graduate standing in anthropology or permission.

#### ART

##### Art

##### ART

#### 345 Etching (5)

Traditional and contemporary methods of etching as a creative art form. Included are aquatint, hard-soft and lift ground mezzatint, burin, engraving, dry point, niello, crible, and others. Techniques, such as intaglio, relief, stencil, and others. Prerequisites: 107, 110, 129.

##### ART

#### 346 Collagraph (5)

Fundamentals of positive plate build-up with hard, soft, and pliable materials. The inter-relationship of individual graphic ideas, plate making, and various techniques of printing. Prerequisites: 107, 110, 129.

##### ART

#### 347 Lithography (5)

General survey of historical and contemporary lithography. Studio problems using a variety of stone, plates, papers, inks, and presses. Hand-drawn and photo-chemical methods. Prerequisites: 107, 110, 129.

##### ART

#### 348 Woodcut (5)

Basic Eastern and Western approaches to the art of the woodcut. Various wood, tools, papers, inks, color, printing techniques. Prerequisites: 107, 110, 129.

##### ART

#### 450 Advanced Etching (5)

Advanced problems in etching. Photo processes. Combining of techniques. Integration of the individual idea with the plate, printing, and color. Prerequisite: 345.

##### ART

#### 451 Advanced Collagraph (5)

Advanced problems in the art of the collagraph. Individual creativity stressed. Prerequisite: 346.

##### ART

#### 452 Advanced Lithography (5)

Advanced problems in lithography stressing individual creativity. Prerequisite: 347.

##### ART

#### 453 Advanced Woodcut (5)

Advanced problems in the art of the woodcut. Individual creativity stressed. Prerequisite: 348.

##### ART H

#### 311 Chinese Art (5)

Overview of the arts of China with emphasis on a structural approach to the styles found in

the arts of China; a survey of Chinese aesthetics and its relation to the major varieties of Chinese philosophy; and an indication of the larger patterns of development in the arts of China and their relation to the growth of the Chinese cultural nation. Prerequisite: upper-division standing.

ART H  
406 Islamic Art: The Book (3)

Qur'anic calligraphy, illumination, Arab, Persian, Turkish and Indian painting, book binding, and paper making. Prerequisite: upper-division standing or permission of the instructor.

#### ASIAN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

Japanese  
JAPAN

452 Readings in Japanese for China and Korea Specialists (5)

Reading of scholarly prose on China and Korea, especially books and articles of past fifty years, with emphasis on grammar and style. Introduction to reference works useful to China and Korea specialists, and needs of the individual student. Completion of three quarters with B or above fulfills Japanese reading requirement for Department majors in Chinese and Korean. Prerequisites: 113; and (for China specialists) CHN 313 and 453, or (for Korea specialists) KOR 467; or permission.

#### ATMOSPHERIC SCIENCES

ATM S

422 Introduction to Dynamic Climatology (3)

Detailed discussion of the external parameters governing the climatic mode assumed by the planets. The "heat budget" method of climatology is developed and applied to the sensitivities of the lithosphere/hydrosphere/atmosphere/cryosphere system to variations in external parameters and attendant climatic changes. The inadequacies of the heat balance approach, an introduction to dynamic climatology, and the importance of hydrosphere/atmosphere interaction, with examples of interaction and single dynamic systems, are developed. Prerequisites: 301 or 321 or instructor's permission.

#### CHICANO STUDIES

CHSTU

202 Intermediate Chicano Studies (3)

Interdisciplinary course designed to deepen the understanding of the Chicano experience; provides a sequence between 102 and 305; deals primarily with situations affecting present day Chicanos through analysis of problems in education, politics, society, and literature. Not open to students who have taken GIS 304. Prerequisite: 102.

CHSTU

391 Independent Study (1-6, max. 10)

Students engage in a variety of Chicano Studies topics and develop projects of their choosing under direction of Chicano Studies faculty in various disciplines. Students may work individually or in teams, depending on project and scope. Prerequisite: permission of course instructor.

CHSTU

491 Special Topics in Chicano Studies (3-5, max. 10)

Interdisciplinary course that provides the opportunity to concentrate on one specific aspect of the Chicano experience, and to gain

full mastery of the same at the undergraduate level. Prerequisites: a reading and understanding knowledge of Spanish, and the completion of two Chicano Studies courses.

#### CLASSICS

CLAS

420 Roman Politics: The Rise and Fall of Political Freedom (3)

The political theory of the Romans, the realities of Republican power politics, and the tensions and conflicts which brought about the loss of political freedom. Special attention is given to contrasts and comparisons with our own political institutions as they were conceived by the framers of the Constitution and as they function today. Prerequisite: upper-division standing or permission.

#### COMMUNICATIONS

CMU

347 Advertising Internship (2-5, max. 6)

Internships are assigned to qualified students through the cooperation of the advertising industry working with the School. Internships may be specialized in that the student remains in one functional area (e.g., copywriting, media, advertising research) or they may be varied to permit the student to acquire experience throughout the organization. Prerequisites: 340 and either 341 or 342, depending upon the nature of the internship; a major in communications with 120 University credits completed.

CMU

399 Editorial Practicum Seminar (2-6, max. 6)

Supervised academic work done in connection with editorial internship, in setting designed to extend the student's knowledge of the field and professional perspectives. Prerequisites: 320, 321, 322, and permission of instructor.

CMU

410 Policy Research in Communications (5)

Course stresses an evaluational approach to utilizing communication research and raises questions about how the effectiveness of communication can be evaluated. These questions include first how an adequate basis for evaluating communication can be established for different communication contexts. Other questions consider the research design and measurement options that can be used in conducting evaluations. These basic course purposes are implemented by selecting a communication system for evaluation, analyzing the system, defining the evaluation criteria, and then designing and implementing an applied communication project. Prerequisites: an appropriate course in research methodology and instructor's permission.

#### COMPARATIVE AND FOREIGN AREA STUDIES

Latin American Studies

LATAM

493 Senior Thesis (5)

Research and writing of an original thesis on a specialized topic in Latin American studies. Each student is required to work in consultation with one member of the faculty of the Latin American Studies program. Prerequisite: 492.

LATAM

499 Undergraduate Independent Study or Research (3-5, max. 15)

Prerequisite: permission.

## COMPARATIVE LITERATURE

### C LIT

- 551 The Symbolist Movement (3-5, max. 10)

The Symbolist Movement from its beginnings in nineteenth century French poetry through later developments in European poetry, fiction, and drama. Attention also given to related developments in philosophy, critical theory, and the other arts. Reading knowledge of French required.

### DRAMA

#### DRAMA

- 433 Children's Theatre Workshop (2, max. 6)

Exploratory experiences in a variety of children's theatre forms through in-class and in-production participation. Prerequisites: 153 and 230, junior standing, and permission.

#### DRAMA

- 537 Seminar in Children's Drama (4)

Critical study of philosophies and practices--past and present--of the children's drama movement in the United States; examination of current problems in children's drama education. Prerequisite: permission.

#### DRAMA

- 539 Professional Problems in Children's Drama (2, max. 12)

Observation and critical investigation and discussion of the artistic principles and practices of selected children's drama programs and related arts projects in the greater Seattle area. Prerequisites: graduate standing and permission.

## ECONOMICS

### ECON

- 347 Introduction to Population and Economic Dynamics (5)

The dynamic interrelations of population and economics. Analysis of the problems of modeling population and economic dynamics with a discussion of the major approaches. A look at the historical record, focusing upon Japan and Europe and upon developing countries in the post-World War II era. Consideration of the prospects for modern rapid population growth and control and of the possible consequences. Prerequisites: 200 and 201.

### ECON

- 518 Seminar on the Economics of Social Welfare (3).

Offered jointly with B ECN 531 and SOC W 565. See B ECN 531 for course description and prerequisite.

## ENGLISH

### ENGL

- 301 English Literature: Chaucer to Dr. Johnson (5)

English literature from the end of the Middle Ages to the end of the eighteenth century. Lyric narrative, and dramatic literature will be included.

### ENGL

- 302 English Literature: Blake to Yeats (5)

English literature from the end of the eighteenth to the beginning of the twentieth century, with special emphasis on the Romantic tradition.

## GEOGRAPHY

### GEOG

- 343 Population Geography (3)

Spatial distribution and mobility of population. Regional variation in mortality, fertility, growth, and in characteristics of the population. Population migration. Prerequisite: 100 or 200.

## GEOLOGICAL SCIENCES

### GEOL

- 313 Environmental Geology (4)

Analysis of geologic constraints upon human activity and the environmental consequences of such activity. Topics are hillslope processes, fluvial processes, earthquake and volcanic hazard, and environmental aspects of the development of water, energy, and mineral resources. The laboratory/discussion section will often be replaced by an afternoon or weekend field trip. Prerequisites: 101, 205, or permission of instructor.

### GEOL

- 490 Special Topics (2-5, max. 10)

### GEOL

- 590 Special Topics (2-5, max. 10)

## GERMANICS

### GERM

- 493 Proctoring of First-Year German Film Course (1-2, max. 6)

Restricted to upper-division students of German who have demonstrated sufficient proficiency in speaking German to lead discussion groups of participants in GERM 150, "Conversational German Through Films." Discussion group leaders (proctors) may participate in this program one or two hours per week and receive one credit for each hour in class. A total of 6 credits may be earned by proctors for participating in three quarters of GERM 150 which runs the entire year under a different format each quarter. Entry card required. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only.

### GERM

- 494 Proctoring of Second-Year German Film Course (1-2, max. 6)

Restricted to upper-division students of German who have demonstrated sufficient proficiency in speaking German to lead discussion groups of participants in GERM 250, "Advanced Conversational German Through Films." Discussion group leaders (proctors) may participate in this program one or two hours per week and receive one credit for each hour in class. A total of 6 credits may be earned by proctors for participating in three quarters of GERM 250 which runs the entire year under a different format each quarter. Entry card required. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only.

## HISTORY

### Ancient and Medieval History

#### HSTAM

- 335 Medieval English Culture (5)

The fusion of cultures that occurred in medieval England. The first half considers the inhabitants of Britain from the Celts through the Normans and the cultural confrontations that resulted from successive invasions. The second part examines several topics representative of this cultural fusion.

**HSTAM****592 Advanced Medieval and Renaissance Seminar**  
(3-6)

A continuing seminar, running three quarters of every year. Provides a forum in which all students of Medieval and Renaissance history who are writing their theses, dissertations, or any research projects may submit their work in progress to peer and faculty evaluation.

**Modern European History**  
**HSTEU****470 The Jacobethan Age: England, 1580-1630** (5)

With emphasis on arts and society instead of the traditional kings, battles, and politics, the course deals with the way people at all levels of society lived, in towns and in the countryside, within the bounds of the royal court or outside in the political wilderness. Classes on poetry, drama, and music, on architecture, painting, interior decoration, on some of the minor arts, as well as on demography and on some of the traditional historical subjects. Not open for credit to students who have taken 471 and/or 472.

**HOME ECONOMICS****H EC****417 Food Safety and Quality in Food Processing and Handling** (4)

Study of food science as it relates to food quality, food safety and food laws; the microbiological aspects of food spoilage, food borne illnesses, and food processing; effects of food handling on nutrient retention. Offered jointly with FD SC 417. Prerequisite: senior standing in Coordinated Undergraduate Program in Clinical Dietetics or permission.

**H EC****418 Laboratory for Food Safety and Quality in Food Processing and Handling** (1)

Laboratory experiences emphasizing the microbiological aspects of food spoilage and food processing techniques. Field trips to food service establishments and food processing plants. Offered jointly with FD SC 418. Prerequisites: concurrent or previous registration in H EC or FD SC 417, and permission.

**H EC****504 Vitamin Nutrition** (3)

The dietary compounds presently considered to be essential for humans and called vitamins. General topics are whether the vitamin is fat-soluble or water-soluble; reviewing basic material and seeking increasing depth of understanding; relation of vitamins to other nutrients and to varying physiological conditions. Prerequisite: permission.

**H EC****599 Current Topics in Human Nutrition, Dietetics, and Foods** (1, max. 3)

Current literature and recent symposiums in the field of human nutrition, dietetics, and foods will be reviewed. Faculty and graduate students will participate.

**HONORS****H A&S****-201 Language and Culture** (-3)

Examines relationships of language and various aspects of culture and thought, society, psychology, and literature. Limited to Honors students.

**H A&S****300 Introduction to the Professions** (5, max. 15)

Pre-professional course with variable content such as law, medicine, public affairs, etc. Prerequisite: 200- or permission.

**H A&S****398 Interdisciplinary Special Topics**  
(1-5, max. 10)

Special interdisciplinary course for Honors students. Prerequisite: 200- or permission.

**MATHEMATICS****MATH****103 Introduction to Elementary Functions** (3)

Analytic geometry, functions, and trigonometry, with an emphasis on the concrete aspects of these subjects. Registration limited to EOP students and students admitted to the University with a mathematics deficiency. An EOP student who has completed high school trigonometry with a C or better grade may register for the class, but will not receive credit for it. All other students eligible to register are eligible to receive credit. Prerequisite: 102.

**MUSIC****MUSIC****471 Contemporary Theories II: Non-Tonal Music, 1900-1950** (3)

Continuation of 470. Includes both "Free Atonal" and "Classical Serial" music. Systematic analysis of works of Schoenberg, Webern, Berg, and others, written both before 1923 (Free Atonal) and after (Classical Serial). Prerequisite: standard CORE courses through 215 and 312, or instructor's permission.

**NEAR EASTERN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE****Hebrew****HEBR****462 Mishnah and Talmud** (3)

From the literatures of the Mishnah and Talmud is derived a corpus of Jewish philosophical and literary work principally in law, history, and ethics. Winter Quarter: the Talmud. Prerequisite: 203 or permission.

**PHILOSOPHY****PHIL****345 Moral Issues of Life and Death** (4)

Focus on concrete moral problems concerning matters of general interest and of current importance. Many will be selected from the area of medical ethics. Some problems to be examined are: euthanasia, abortion, war and murder, animal experimentation, famine relief, allocation of scarce and exotic medical lifesaving therapy, capital punishment, population control policy, high-risk technologies. Prerequisite: one course in philosophy or junior standing.

**PHYSICAL EDUCATION****PE****303 Sport in American Education: A Socio-Historical Perspective** (4)

The installation of sport and physical culture in the American schools and colleges in the socio-historical perspective. Ideas, trends, and societal factors which influenced the development of sport and physical activity in the

larger society and which led to the inclusion of these forms in schools and colleges. The origins and subsequent development of physical educators as an occupational group. Prerequisite: junior standing.

PE

426 Motor Control and Memory (3)

Survey of current theory and research in human performance, attention, and motor control processes, as viewed from a cognitive perspective. Topics include short-term-motor-memory, motor program operation, attention demands during movement, coordination of internal codes, spatial systems, and hemispheric specialization. Not open for credit to students who have taken 468. Prerequisite: 350 or equivalent.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

POL S

406 Marxian Political Economy (5)

Explores the relationship between social classes, the state, and political power in advanced capitalist societies. Investigates this relationship primarily by means of the tools of marxian political economy and, in the process, evaluates these tools. Emphasis is on theoretical perspectives although there are a few empirical applications on the reading list as well. Requirements include reading, participating in class sessions, completing a short mid-term paper, and a longer paper at the end of the quarter. Prerequisite: 201.

General considerations are combined with monographic considerations. Playwrights studied include: Sánchez, Cuzzani, Nino, and other major figures of the modern period. Prerequisites: any three of the following, 304, 305, 306, 350, 351, 352.

430 The Police (5)

Examination of conceptual and empirical issues concerning the multi-faceted and changing roles of the American police. Prerequisites: POL S 101, 202, or 204; or SOC 110.

499 Readings in Society and Justice (1-5)

Individual readings in society and justice. Prerequisite: majors only.

SOC

425 Applied Social Statistics (-3)

Applications of social statistics in sociology and related social sciences, with emphasis on

problems of analysis with imperfect data, measurement errors, theory construction, and write-up of data analysis; emphasis on use of probability in statistical inference; comparisons among means and proportions and applications of analysis of variance; contingency table analysis, applied non-parametric procedures; use of correlation, multiple regression analysis in social research. Prerequisites: 223 or 423; 424--.

498 Special Topics in Speech Communication (2-5, max. 10)

Lecture, seminar, and/or team study with topics varying from quarter to quarter. Prerequisite: permission.

SPEECH AND HEARING SCIENCES

SPHSC

104 Human Speech and Hearing Behavior (3)

Survey of the problems and possibilities of man's most clearly human endowment: his capacity for speech production and perception. Speech and hearing mechanisms will be considered from the point of view of their development, structure, and function, with special reference to current and significant problems and issues, such as the nature of speech learning, the speech and hearing pathologies, and the significance of diversity in patterns of speech production and reception. Not open to majors beyond the sophomore level except by permission.

531 Seminar on the Economics of Social Welfare (3)

Analysis of social welfare economics as affecting the environment of the business firm. Prerequisite: 500 or ECON 500 or permission.

599 Doctoral Seminar in Business Policy (3)

Study and research in advanced topics of business policy. The seminar is generally concerned with unpublished areas of research and is conducted by visiting professors and departmental faculty. May be repeated for credit. Prerequisite: permission.

Supervision by staff members of the College of Education and appropriate administrators in the selected school district. Prerequisites: completion of all other requirements for administrator's credential and permission.

#### 542 Seminar in Bilingual Education: Instructional Foundations and Issues (4)

Study of the theoretical foundations and instructional implications of psychology and linguistics as they apply to bilingual education. Assists graduate students in exploring learning styles of bilingual children and becoming familiar with the crucial issues in bilingual education.

#### EDSPE

#### 436 Manual Communication for the Hearing Impaired (3)

Intermediate course in manual conversation stressing fluency in both receptive and expressive Manual English. The grammatical system of Ameslan will be introduced and practiced. Prerequisite: 435 or instructor's permission.

#### EDSPE

#### 532 Aural-Oral Communication for the Hearing Impaired Part II (3)

Techniques of developing oral communication in hearing impaired children. Emphasis on the synthetic approach, utilizing residual hearing whenever possible. Analytic speech correction techniques and traditional orthographic systems. Prerequisites: 531 and entry card.

#### EDSPE

#### 533 Teaching Language to the Hearing Impaired (3)

Methods for instructing hearing impaired students with language acquisition problems. Analysis of currently available curriculum and instructional materials. Skills in diagnosis, evaluation, and program development.

#### EDSPE

#### 534 Teaching the Hearing Impaired (3)

Methods for instructing hearing impaired students in regular school subjects. Skills in educational diagnosis, construction of instructional materials, and program development.

#### 344 Electric Power Engineering (4)

Introduction to the theory and methods of analysis involved in the use of typical apparatus

to generate, transmit, and utilize energy in electrical form. Includes conventions of circuit description, balanced polyphase circuits, the complex power concept, the transformer, transmission lines, the per-unit system, fundamentals of electromechanical energy conversion and practical synchronous, induction, and commutator machines. Prerequisites: 333 and 381.

#### E E

#### 355 Electronics I: Introduction to Digital and Analog Electronics (4)

Characteristics of bipolar and MOS transistors, basic logic design, digital applications including flip-flops and multivibrators; small signal analysis of amplifiers, differential amplifier design. Prerequisites: 231 and 310, which must be taken previously or concurrently, and ENGR 251.

#### E E

#### 356 Electronics II: Analog Electronic Circuit Analysis (3)

Analog circuit analysis including gain at high and low frequencies, feedback analysis, frequency response in circuits with feedback, oscillators, noise and power regulation. Prerequisites: 333, 355.

#### E E

#### 440 Linear Systems Analysis II (3)

Analysis of linear systems using transform methods. One-sided and two-sided Laplace transforms, inverse Laplace transform. Discrete time linear systems, solution of difference equations, the z-transform and its inverse, digital filters. State variable analysis of linear systems, assignment of state variables, state equations, time domain solution of state equations, state transition matrix, impulse response matrix, frequency domain solution of state equations. Selected applications of the Fourier integral, multidimensional transforms. Prerequisite: 335 or permission.

#### 551 Ocean Engineering Systems Design I (3)

Offered jointly with IMS 551. See IMS 551 for course description and prerequisite.

Study of the possible changes in genetic characteristics and response of populations with the current types and levels of fisheries resource manipulation. Prerequisites: 444, 451, Q SCI 382, 383, and upper-division or graduate standing.

Interdisciplinary ocean systems design, choice of system motivated by problems of current interest; participation by students and faculty from engineering, law, oceanography, business, etc., in order to study complete system; preliminary design and analysis of engineering hardware; direct interaction with government and industry concerned with chosen problem. Offered jointly with O ENG 551. Prerequisite: graduate standing.

IMS

-562- Ocean Resources Seminar (-2-)

Study and research into selected problems relating law, international organizations, and marine affairs. Special attention is devoted to global and regional problems involving decision processes and structures that are under particular stress due to social, including technological, change. Problems examined will change from year to year. Offered jointly with LAW -651-. Prerequisites: 506, 507, or permission.

599 Independent Study (1, max. 9)

Advanced independent study in the interdisciplinary SMT program. Prerequisite: permission of the instructor.

511P Selected Topics in Biomedical Ethics (1)

Designed for first- and second-year medical students, sections A & B, respectively. Each section is limited to twelve students and a seminar format is followed. The topics described in the course outline are investigated, with the instructor giving brief presentations, utilizing guest resource persons, and a variety of audio-visual aids, followed by group discussion. Seminar participants are provided with a recommended reading list and a variety of reprints related to topics.

690P Clinical Oncology Outpatient Elective (\*)

One to five half-day oncology clinics, including surgical neoplasia, radiation oncology, head and neck tumor, GYN tumor, and medical oncology (Clinic 4). The student will work with new patients and follow them through their evaluation and treatment and post-treatment followup. Emphasis is on multidisciplinary evaluation and care to provide as broad an exposure to clinical oncology as possible. The student works closely with clinical faculty and arranges the number and combination of clinics desired. Prerequisite: permission. Coordinator: Department of Radiology.

OTOLARYNGOLOGY

OTOL

686P Otolaryngology--Medical and Surgical Aspects (\*, max. 12)

Clinical in-depth study of otolaryngology which may be taken in a six-week clerkship. For the student whose interest lies in pathology of the head and neck. Reasonable flexibility to arrange the content of the course, which will provide exposure to all aspects of patient care in the outpatient clinic, operating room, and ward care activities. The student pursues a topic of current interest in otolaryngology by review of the literature and presents a paper.

542 Motor Systems II: Brainstem Mechanisms (3)

Critical discussion of research papers and resulting concepts regarding the role of various brainstem systems in controlling somatic and ocular movements. Each student is responsible for leading the discussion of one topic. Prerequisites: 511 or equivalent, and permission.

**SCHOOL OF NURSING**

NURS

350 Advanced Nursing Process (5)

Advanced course for registered nurses on the decision making process used in management of nursing problems and selected skills used in the assessment and implementation phases. Stu-



dents will analyze and test in clinical practice: the manner in which value systems impact on the nursing process; the theoretic rational as a basis for the nursing process; a conceptual system for organizing the knowledge base for effective use in the nursing process; and the systematic use of all steps of the nursing process. Prerequisites: admission to the upper-division registered nurse major and CONJ 317-318 (or taken concurrently).

#### NURS

551 Advanced Primary Health Care I: Children and Women of the Childbearing Age (4)

Critical analysis of physiological, developmental, psycho-social, and anthropological theories related to women and children in the context of the childbearing and child rearing family for the purpose of developing a framework for advanced nursing intervention. Application of the theoretical framework developed will facilitate the independent and interdisciplinary clinical decision-making skills of the nurse practitioner within the boundaries of Primary Health Care. Articulates with Advanced Field Work Seminar I.

#### NURS

552 Advanced Field Work Seminar in Primary Health Care I: Children and Women of the Childbearing Age (4)

Supervised field work within selected Primary Health Care settings. Focus on relating nursing theory, recent research, and scientific rationale to field work experience and the evaluative analysis of selected nursing interventions.

#### NURS

559 Helping Relationships with Individuals, With Groups, and with Families (3)

Basic foundation for synthesizing differing philosophies, theories, and beliefs about the nature of human action. Students relate appropriate theories to specific health related goals from which to practice, facilitate, and evaluate therapeutic encounters with individuals, families, and other groups.

### SCHOOL OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS

#### PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

##### PB AD

506 The Law of Citizen Participation (3)

The relationship of the administrative agency to the general citizenry including citizen control through taxpayer's suits; constitutional guarantees of citizen control; and statutory guarantees of citizen control, with an emphasis on this third area, i.e., laws requiring citizen participation, open meetings, public hearings, impact statements, and freedom of information. Proposed legislation and relevant social science research is also read and discussed, as a guide to understanding the policy behind the legal requirements and to provide a framework for analysis of the efficiency of these laws.

#### PUBLIC POLICY

##### PB PL

568 Policy Issues in Urban Law Enforcement (3)

The current volatility in American law enforcement revolves around a number of policy issues

which have emerged in the past decade and which are considered crucial to the future role, organization, and function of urban policing. Nine of these issues are explored, with emphasis on their historic settings, the "actors" who shape their articulation, and the parameters of the debate, legal constraints on and socio-political considerations in the development of policy alternatives, and emerging patterns of resolution. Prerequisite: 567 or equivalent.

### SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND COMMUNITY MEDICINE

#### EPIDEMIOLOGY

##### EPI

524 Epidemiologic Studies of Cancer Etiology and Prevention (3)

Current knowledge of the role chemicals, radiation, viruses, familial factors, immunodeficiencies, and benign diseases play in the etiology of various cancers, as determined from studies in human populations; the epidemiologic characteristics of most major types of cancer; applications of epidemiologic principles to planning and evaluating programs of primary, secondary, and tertiary cancer prevention. Prerequisite: 511.

#### HEALTH SERVICES

##### HSERV

555 Ambulatory Care Organization and Management (3)

Organizational and managerial aspects of ambulatory medical services. The organizational focus relates to the ambulatory services provided within the structure of the United States health services system. The managerial aspect relates to specific administrative issues involved in the operation of health services facilities including financial control, marketing, personnel, evaluation, and regulation. Prerequisites: 511, 512.

### SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK

#### SOCIAL WELFARE

##### SOCWL

600 Independent Study or Research (\*)

Independent study for the development of the doctoral dissertation.

#### SOCIAL WORK

##### SOC W

425 Direct Services in the Chicano Community (3)

Brief review of culturally important values, attitudes, behaviors, and responses. Health care, public assistance, psychiatric care, and/or mental health services are explored. Provides social workers with a working knowledge of the Chicano individual, family, and community.

##### SOC W

502 Social Services and Social Policy (3)

Provides the student with in-depth knowledge of social welfare policies and services that meet societal problems, the needs of specific client groups, and analytic tools for evaluating various policies. The understanding of the

network of institutions that employ social workers to better serve their clientele is a prerequisite if needed changes and improvements are to be made by professional social workers in these institutions and if feasible options are to be selected to rectify inadequacies at the policy level.

SOC W

532 Additive Human Service Methods (3)

Focus either on various methodologies employed in work with clients with specific presenting problems (physical disability, chemical dependency) or on a specific counseling practice stance (behavioral therapy, group treatment). Prerequisites: 529 or 310, 311, and 312.

SOC W

543 Problem Focused Human Development (3)

Focus on the social and developmental determinants of specific human problems and their impact on individual development, families, and social institutions. Some time will be given to examining the nature of organized social responses which are designed to deal with the specified human problem. Prerequisite: graduate standing.

SOC W

565 Seminar on the Economics of Social Welfare (3)

Offered jointly with B ECN 531 and ECON 518. See B ECN 531 for course description and prerequisite.

## INDEPENDENT STUDY THROUGH CORRESPONDENCE

The Office of Independent Study provides University courses for extension credit primarily by correspondence instruction to persons who wish individual instruction. Fees for Independent Study courses are separate from residence tuition and are \$17 per credit. Enrollment is not based on the quarter system but is continuous throughout the year, with one calendar year allowed to complete a course.

A regularly enrolled student who wishes to register for additional courses for Independent Study credit should consult his or her departmental adviser prior to enrolling in an Independent Study course. Applications and additional information on enrollment procedures may be obtained from the Independent Study office, 222 Lewis Hall, or by telephoning 543-2350.
