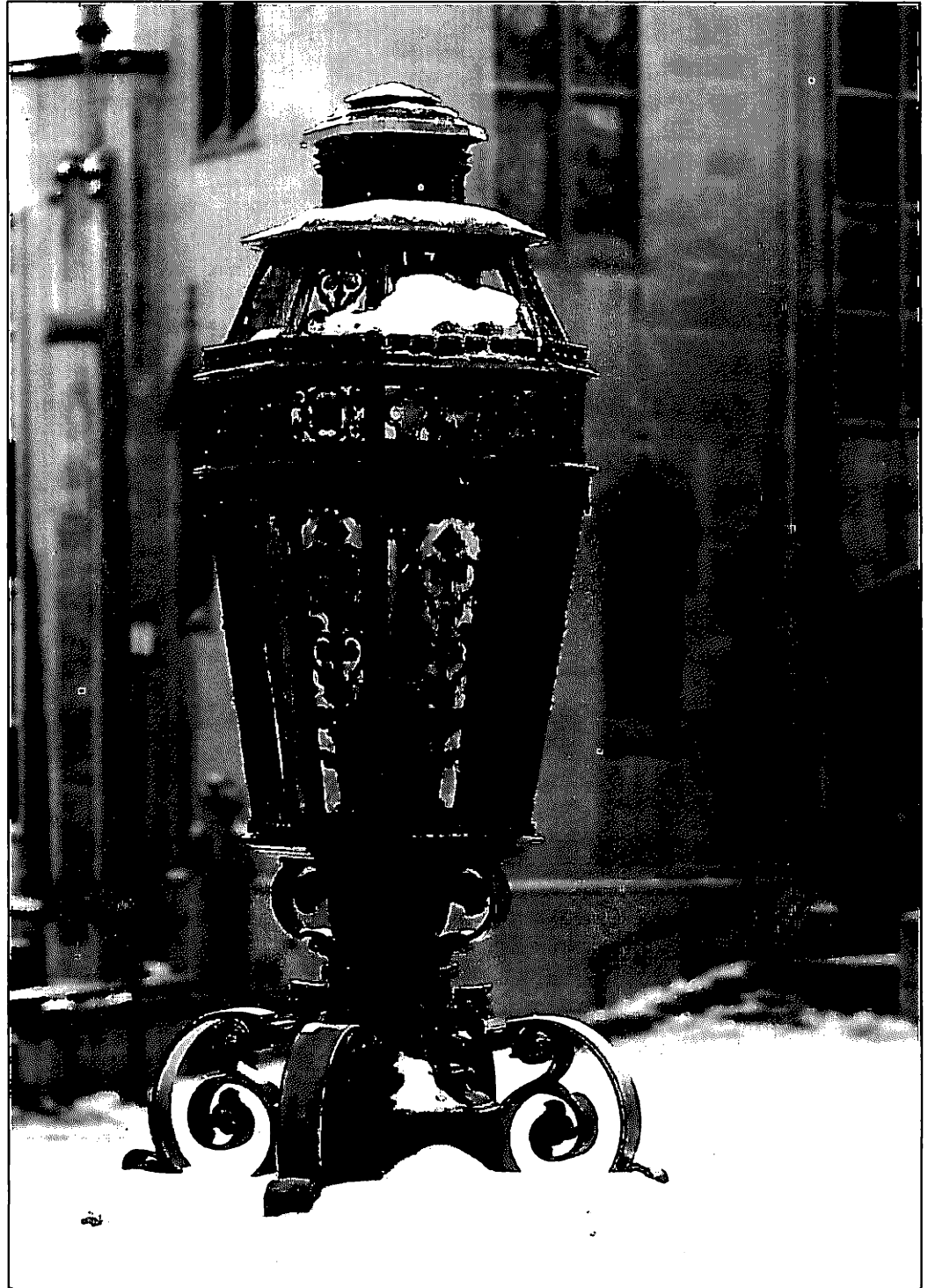

All announcements in the Time Schedule are subject to change without notice and do not constitute an agreement between the University of Washington and the students.

What's New for Winter Quarter 1996 and Other Important Information

DECLARATION OF A MINOR

Students who are declaring a minor must declare the minor on two separate forms. The first step is to complete the Change of College/School and Major/Minor form. These forms are available from your advising office. The code section will be completed by your department and forwarded to the Registration Office to update your record.

In addition, you must also declare your minor when you submit your application to graduate. Your adviser will discuss any remaining course requirements with you and add those requirements to your application.

If you have declared a minor but it does not appear on your application to graduate, the Graduation and Academic Records Office will drop it from your record. On the other hand, if you list a minor on your application to graduate, but fail to complete that minor or drop it officially, you will not graduate as scheduled. This protects you from being graduated when your actual intent is to continue on in order to complete the minor.

If you wish to complete a minor after submitting your application for graduation, consult with your adviser to update your application with the Graduation and Academic Records Office.

SAFEGUARDING YOUR REGISTRATION AND GRADE RECORDS

After you have selected your Private Access Code (PAC) on STAR, protect the security of your records and do not give your PAC to anyone. The only way that you can register, hear your grades, make optional charge selections, or change any selections on STAR is by using your student number with your PAC. If you suspect that someone has your Private Access Code, call STAR and select a new 4 - 6 digit code.

AN INCOMPLETE GRADE OR "I"

Instructors may assign an "I" or incomplete grade for a course provided you have been doing satisfactory work within the final 2 weeks of the end of the quarter and, due to extenuating circumstances and with the instructor's approval, you have made arrangements to submit a final paper or take the final exam after the close of the quarter. If you receive an "I", do not register for the course for the next quarter since this will create a new registration record for a different quarter and a separate grade would then be submitted for the additional registration. See page 9 for more details.

Registration Eligibility, Periods, & Confirmations

REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY

ALL STUDENTS

All students at the University who remain in good standing and in compliance with other rules and regulations, with no outstanding financial obligations, are guaranteed the opportunity to register each quarter as long as they maintain continuous enrollment (summer quarter excepted). Continuation must be in the same classification, e.g., undergraduate, post-baccalaureate (fifth-year), graduate, etc. Once a student earns a baccalaureate degree, he or she must apply for admission as a post baccalaureate (fifth year), nonmatriculated, or graduate student. Exceptions to the guarantee are: (1) students under disciplinary action, (2) students with a registration hold, (3) students not meeting their departmental continuation policies, or (4) students not meeting the University's satisfactory progress policy (see General Catalog).

You will not be eligible to register for winter quarter 1996 if you have an outstanding debit on your tuition and fee account. Contact the Student Account and Cashiers Office and pay any fees due, in order to register.

UNDERGRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL STUDENTS (QUARTER OFF ELIGIBILITY)

Subject to college, school and departmental enrollment policies, undergraduate and professional students who have completed a quarter at the University of Washington may take the following quarter off and remain eligible to register in Registration Period I for the subsequent quarter without submitting applications as returning students. For example, a student completing winter quarter may, without registering for or completing spring quarter, register during Registration Period I for autumn quarter without reapplying. Any quarter from which a student has completely withdrawn, or from which he/she is canceled, does not constitute a completed quarter. Summer quarter enrollment is not required to maintain continuous registration eligibility.

Returning students who do not meet the criteria described in the above paragraph must submit a Returning Student Reenrollment Application by the published deadline.

GRADUATE STUDENTS

The Quarter-Off Eligibility Policy is not available to graduate students. Graduate students who do not maintain continuous enrollment (summer quarter excepted) must file a Petition for On-Leave Status with the Graduate School. Students who are registered for any portion of a quarter may not go on-leave for that quarter unless they officially withdraw at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall prior to the first day of the quarter. On-leave graduate students returning to the University on or before the termination of their authorized periods of leave must apply as returning former students (through the Registration

Office by the published deadlines). If you withdraw after the quarter begins, you may register for the next quarter during Registration Period I. See Grading, Withdrawal & On-Leave section for more information.

REGISTRATION PERIODS

REGISTER EARLY

You may call STAR during Registration Periods I or II before your registration eligibility date and complete sections I and II of the STAR Worksheet. A \$25 late registration fee is charged students who have not completed sections I and II of the STAR Worksheet by the first day of the quarter (January 2).

STAR HOURS

STAR is available for registration Monday through Friday, 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight, Saturday, 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight, and Sunday 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight.

PERIOD I - NOVEMBER 15 - DECEMBER 3

This period is open only for continuing students currently enrolled autumn or for students who completed spring quarter 1995.

Priority registration dates are based on your completed credits, your autumn quarter 1995 credits as of November 13, and the last digit of your student number. The student number priority will be changed each quarter so that all students will have the earliest possible priority every other quarter. One half of the available spaces in each course are reserved for day two of each priority period. If a STAR message states that the first day spaces are filled, then the other half will be released on day two of that priority period. You may call STAR on, or after, your registration date

to register and make changes to your schedule.

GRADUATING SENIOR PRIORITY

If you are a graduating senior or post-baccalaureate student with a degree application on file in the Graduation and Academic Records Office, you may register on the first day of Period I for your final two quarters. If you must postpone your graduation, you may save your priority quarters by not registering before your regular senior priority day. When you have used your Graduating Senior Priority for two quarters, you will revert to regular senior priority.

PERIOD II - DECEMBER 4 - JANUARY 1

This period is primarily for newly admitted students and returning former students. Advising / registration notices of dates are mailed to newly admitted or readmitted students. You may register on, or after, your date. Continuing students may call STAR any day during this period.

PERIOD III - JANUARY 2 - JANUARY 12

This period is open to all students for course adds and drops.

STAR closes at 6 p.m., Friday, January 12. STAR will be closed on Saturday, January 13. The Registration Office, 225 Schmitz will be open for transactions not available on STAR: Monday-Friday: January 2 - January 12 8 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The deadline to add courses is 6 p.m. Friday, January 12.

PERIOD IV - JANUARY 16 - FEBRUARY 19

This period is open for dropping courses on STAR and to elect audit grade option only. Changing to audit grade is only available at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, Tuesday, January 16 through Friday, February 16, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION

Registration confirmations for students who registered by December 1 will be mailed on December 4. If you register after December 1, your Registration Confirmation will be mailed in two working days. Call 543-3868 to record your correct address. Confirmations will not be mailed outside the United States during Registration Period II and III and will not be mailed to addresses outside of the state of Washington during the last week of Period II and during Period III. If you are using an out-of-state address, you may claim your confirmation at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, within two working days.

You may also confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule Transaction (L #). This listing includes building and classroom locations.

STAR Registration

STAR

STAR (Student Telephone Assisted Registration) is the University of Washington's touchtone telephone registration system. You may call STAR from any touchtone phone to register. Touch-tone phones are conveniently located in the Registration lobby, 225 Schmitz Hall, the T-Wing lobby in Health Sciences, 9 Communications, and the ground floor level of the HUB.

STAR is available all weekdays and most holidays and weekends. Weekend hours not specifically scheduled are not guaranteed and may be subject to equipment and software maintenance requirements. STAR weekend hours are 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight on Saturdays and 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight on Sundays. Weekday hours are 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight.

STAR FEATURES

ADDING COURSES

Courses may be added during Periods I, II, and III. An add code is required to add a course and a \$20 change fee is charged beginning January 9. This is in addition to any tuition. Always check your balance after adding a course. See Changes in Registration for additional information on adding courses. Friday, January 12, at 6:00 p.m. is the last day to add a course for winter quarter 1996.

ADD CODES

Some courses require Add Codes or Faculty Numbers that are available through the department offering the course. See ENTRY CODES for more information on using Add Codes.

DROPPING COURSES

Courses may be dropped during Periods I, II, III and IV. You may drop courses through January 12 and receive no entry on your transcript. Beginning January 9, a \$20 change fee is charged to drop a course. This is in addition to any tuition forfeiture. Always check your balance after dropping a course. See Changes in Registration for additional information on dropping courses. Monday, February 19 is the last day to drop a course for winter quarter 1996.

DROP CODES

Some courses require drop codes that are available through the department offering the course. See ENTRY CODES for more information on using drop codes.

COURSE AVAILABILITY

Beginning Period I, you may call STAR at any time to complete section II of the Star Worksheet and check course availability.

ALTERNATE SECTIONS

STAR lists alternative sections if the requested sections are closed or canceled.

CONFIRMED REGISTRATION

You may confirm your registration schedule by calling STAR and using the List Schedule Transaction (L#). This listing includes building and classroom locations.

STUDENT ACCOUNT AND LOAN STATUS

Call STAR to: list your current student account balance; list a summary of disbursed financial aid and aid check availability; and list the latest recorded student account payment. Review the STAR Work Sheet for the transaction codes.

GRADES ON STAR

STAR lists all officially recorded grades for the most recently completed quarter. Winter quarter 1996 grades become available on STAR beginning March 20.

CHANGING YOUR INSURANCE PLAN AND OPTIONAL CHARGES

If you wish to change your insurance plan or optional charges for WashPIRG and WSL after your initial selection, you may do so on STAR by the tuition due date. Please refer to the STAR Worksheet in this Time Schedule for instructions.

PRIVATE ACCESS CODE (PAC)

The first time you ever call STAR, enter your date of birth when STAR asks you to enter a Private Access Code. STAR will then prompt you to select a Private Access Code or PAC of 4 to 6 digits that you can easily remember. Enter the PAC you select when prompted by STAR. You will then use your PAC for all future calls to STAR. If you wish to change your PAC, you may do so at any time using transaction code 9. Please refer to the STAR Worksheet in this Time Schedule for instructions. If you forget your PAC, you will need to contact the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall or call 543-8580 to obtain your code or select a new PAC.

IF YOU MAKE A MISTAKE

If you make a mistake before finishing an entry, press the star key and the number sign key (*#), and your entry will be discarded.

MERLIN TELEPHONE

If you are using an AT&T Merlin telephone to call STAR, press the # sign key twice to send transactions.

TIME AND CALL LIMITS WHEN CALLING STAR

Time limits are built into the system, so if you are holding on the STAR line for an extended period of time, you will be disconnected. Error limits are also a part of the STAR system, so if you do not enter the correct information after the second try, STAR will disconnect. If you are disconnected you may immediately call back to STAR. You may call STAR up to 100 times a day. No transactions will be permitted when your calls exceed 100 on that day.

CLOSED COURSE SECTIONS

If the section requested is closed, you will be informed by STAR of open section alternates (including new sections added after the publication of the quarterly Time Schedule). You may then select an alternate section to be added to your schedule. To overload a closed section see OVERLOAD GUIDELINES.

STAR QUESTIONS

If you have questions regarding registration, please call the Registration Office, (206) 543-4000; Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The audiolibrary system has complete recorded instructions. If you need additional assistance, press "0" and a staff member will help you during business hours.

STAR TRANSACTION CODES

The transactions you enter on your touch-tone telephone communicates to the computer the action to take (such as add a course, drop a course, etc.) and data you want considered. The transaction code legend follows:

- A = Add a course
- D = Drop a course
- L = List class schedule
- S = Course Status
- T = Terminate your call and receive registration confirmation information
- G = List your grades
- 11 = Account balance
- 12 = Financial Aid Summary
- 14 = Last received payment
- 15 = Optional charges
- * = Star key, used to

separate data

= Number sign key, used to complete transactions that you enter

FOLLOW THESE STEPS BEFORE CALLING STAR

- Read the Registration Eligibility, Periods, and Confirmation; STAR Registration, and the STAR Work Sheet sections.
- Academic advising is highly recommended, and it is suggested that you make an appointment with your adviser before selecting your courses.
- Obtain an Entry Code or Faculty Number from department for courses requiring entry codes.
- Organize your registration materials (Time Schedule, STAR Work Sheet). Use the winter quarter 1996 TIME SCHEDULE to obtain the schedule line number (SLN) for each course section. SLN's change every quarter. Prepare an alternate course section list because some sections may be full.
- Take care of all University financial obligations before calling STAR, since STAR will not permit you to register if there is a "hold" on your registration.
- Call STAR from a touch-tone telephone and begin with Section I on the STAR Work Sheet. You will be asked to provide information in Section II during your first telephone call to STAR each quarter. Always exit STAR using the "T" transaction following by the number sign key (#) so that you can find out how to obtain your Registration Confirmation.
- Beginning with Registration Period I, you may call STAR as often as you want to check the status of sections, confirm schedule listed, add/drop courses, check your account balance, etc.

You may call (206) 543-3868 at any time to change your address information.

CHANGES IN REGISTRATION

A \$20 change-of-registration fee is assessed for any number of add, drop or change transactions (including change of grading option) made during a given day beginning January 9. The \$20 fee is a service charge and is in addition to any change in tuition or forfeiture as a result of adds, drops or changes.

There is no charge for changes made in Registration Periods I, II and the first week of Period III.

Fee waivers are rarely approved. If you think your change is necessitated by a University error or is at the University's request, you must pay the fee and submit a petition for a refund to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. You will be notified of the decision by the Office of the Registrar. The fee will be waived only if the change is necessitated by a University error or is at the University's request.

CLASS ATTENDANCE GUIDELINES

If you do not attend regularly scheduled class meetings during the first week of the quarter, you are subject to being dropped at the discretion of the teaching department to allow enrollment space for other students. Affected courses should be identified in the Time Schedule and/or posted in departmental offices. Please do not assume that departments will automatically initiate a drop for nonclass attendees. If you are not going to go to class, you should drop the course through STAR since the instructor will assign a failing grade. You may not attend a University course in which you have not been officially registered.

An instructor may allow you to attend his or her class only if your name appears on the official class list from Office of the Registrar. A faculty member may attend informally with the approval of the instructor.

CREDIT LIMITATIONS

Undergraduates will be limited to 19 credits during Registration Periods I and II to allow all students a chance to develop a basic schedule. Additional credits may be added during Registration Period III. Thirty credits is the limit per quarter.

ENTRY CODES

Entry codes are five digit random numbers issued to you by academic departments as authorization to add or drop in restricted course sections. Entry Codes are not transferable. All courses require add codes to add beginning January 9.

Courses requiring add codes are designated with the symbol > to the left of the schedule line number (SLN) in the Time Schedule.

Please note that departments reserve the right to require entry codes whether the course is so designated in the Time Schedule or not. Usually information on where to obtain an entry code is found in the body of the Time Schedule, either as a comment before the course listing or following the title of the course. Contact the department offering the course if STAR advises you an entry code is required and the location for obtaining one is not identified in the Time Schedule.

Instructors may issue add codes to students when a class is full. (See OVERLOAD GUIDELINES for additional information on using add codes to overload closed courses.)

Once you have used an entry code, the computer removes it from the list of viable codes and will not

accept it again. If you drop a section that required an entry code to add, then you must obtain another entry code from the department if you wish to re-add the section.

Some courses require a drop code to drop. Obtain the code from the department offering the course. Perform the drop transaction on STAR and enter the drop code when prompted by STAR.

FACULTY NUMBERS

If you are enrolling in independent study courses such as 499, 600, 700, or 800, you will first need to obtain a Faculty Number from the instructor or department. The Faculty Number is used instead of the entry code to register for the courses on STAR.

FULL-TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENT

You should register for 12 or more credits to be considered full-time if you are an undergraduate or professional student. If you are a graduate student, you should register for 9 or more credits. It is important to note that differing criteria and standards for full-time enrollment exist for eligibility in certain programs. Consult the Financial Aid Office for its requirements on satisfactory student progress. The tuition schedule does not reflect full-time credit requirements for loan deferments, teaching assistantships or other programs.

OVERLOAD GUIDELINES

For reasons of public safety and instructional quality, course enrollment in each section will be limited to the approved classroom capacity. The Office of the Registrar monitors course enrollments throughout the quarter according to the following guidelines:

- Through January 8, a student may add a section without permission unless the class is full or requires permission; then an add code is required. Beginning January 9, add codes are required to add any course. STAR will accept course overloads only up to 115% of classroom capacity to compensate for expected course drops.
- No course adds are accepted after January 12. STAR closes at 6:00 p.m. on that day.

REGISTRATION ASSISTANCE

If you work during the day or are incapacitated and need assistance with non-STAR transactions, please call the supervisor of the Registration Office at 543-5723 to make arrangements for assistance. If you are having problems using STAR, call the Registration Office at 543-8580 and a staff member will assist you.

REGISTRATION HOLDS

If you have a hold on your registration, you will not be permitted to register, add courses or obtain a replacement U-Pass until the hold has been released by the initiating office. If you attempt to register on STAR before your hold has been released, the voice response will indicate which office has placed the hold and where to go to get it released. However, you may make other transactions on STAR.

REGISTRATION IN SEQUENCE COURSES

Departments may establish a registration priority for students enrolled in sequence courses. For example, students enrolled in a foreign language 101 course may have priority to register in the next course sequence (102) for the succeeding quarter.

REGISTRATION TAMPERING

A student who tampers or attempts to tamper with the registration records of another student, including but not limited to dropping courses and adding courses, may be subject to disciplinary sanctions as defined in the Student Conduct Code (WAC 478-120).

TIME CONFLICT

You may not register on STAR for two courses that meet at the same time or for courses with overlapping meeting times. If you want the second course instead of the one you are registered for, you must drop the first one before adding the second course on STAR.

If you want to add a course that conflicts with another, you must add the second course, in person, at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. Students must obtain the approval of both instructors to add a course that conflicts one hour a week or less; instructor signatures on an Authorization for Non-Star Transactions form are required for courses that conflict more than one hour a week.

UNDERGRADUATE SATISFACTORY PROGRESS

If you are pursuing a baccalaureate degree, you are expected to make satisfactory progress toward the attainment of that degree and are expected to enter a major and graduate after completion of a reasonable number of credits. Refer to the General Catalog for additional information.

VARIABLE CREDITS

Some courses are offered for a variable number of credits. See the department to obtain the appropriate number of credits for a variable credit course and be prepared to enter the number of credits when requested to do so by the voice response on STAR. Changes in variable credits are made only at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. Beginning January 16, all changes to variable credits require the signature of the instructor on departmental stationary or the Non-STAR Transaction Form (available in 225 Schmitz). A \$20 change-of-registration fee will be assessed.

Grading, Withdrawal & On-leave Information

GRADING

AUDITORS

You must first register on STAR and then go in person to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall to select the audit grade option. You may select the audit option through February 16. A \$20 change fee is charged beginning January 9. Attendance in courses as an auditor is based on the consent of the instructor and space availability. Permission to audit is ordinarily granted for lecture classes only. You may not participate in class discussion or laboratory work and your registration may be canceled at the discretion of the instructor. No entry is made on the permanent record for audited courses. However, registered courses changed to audit after January 12 will be recorded on undergraduate academic transcripts with a "W" and a number designating the week of the quarter in which the course change occurred; for graduates and professional students only a "W" will be recorded. To receive credit for an audited course, you must register for the class for credit in a subsequent quarter.

Auditors, except ACCESS program students, pay standard tuition and fees and must be regularly admitted and registered in the course. Although credits for audited courses will not be listed on your transcript, they will be included in the billing on the fee statement. Such credits count in the calculation of fees.

Courses audited may not be changed to credit registrations after January 12.

CREDIT/NO CREDIT COURSES

Some courses are offered on a credit/no credit (CR/NC) basis. It is not possible to register S/NS for these courses. Neither CR nor NC is included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal, a "W" is recorded.

GRADE APPEAL PROCEDURE

See the General Catalog for appeal procedure.

INCOMPLETE GRADE

Incomplete grades may only be awarded if you are doing satisfactory work up until the last two weeks of the quarter. Undergraduate students must not reregister for courses in which they have received an Incomplete, since a grade earned in a repeat course will not be recorded as an Incomplete conversion grade. To obtain credit for the course, an undergraduate student must convert an Incomplete into a passing grade no later than the last day of the next quarter. An Incomplete not made up by the end of the next quarter (summer excluded) will be converted to the grade of 0.0 by the Registrar unless the instructor has indicated, when assigning the Incomplete grade, that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. The original Incomplete grade is not removed from the transcript.

SATISFACTORY/NOT SATISFACTORY

You may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory (S/NS) basis. Your advisers should be consulted and in no case are undergraduate students allowed to register for more than six credits (or for one course, if that course is offered for more than six credits) on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis in a given quarter.

Register for the course on STAR, but then you must go in person to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz, to elect the S/NS grading option. You cannot select the S/NS grade option on STAR.

The S/NS grade option can be elected through January 12. A \$20 fee is charged beginning January 9.

As an undergraduate, a course in which an "S" is earned may not be used to satisfy any department, college, or University requirement, except that the credits may be applied to the minimum of 180 credits required for graduation. Each instructor will report numerical grades to the Registrar, who will convert satisfactory grades (2.0 or greater) to "S", and unsatisfactory grades (less than 2.0) to NS for the student's transcript. No more than 25 S/NS credits may apply toward an undergraduate degree.

If you are a graduate student and earn grades of 2.7 or above you will receive a grade of "S" (Satisfactory), while 2.6 or below are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory). With the approval of your graduate program adviser or the Supervisory Committee Chairperson, you may elect to take any course for which you are eligible outside of your major academic unit on an S/NS basis.

In cases of withdrawal, the "W" is recorded. Neither S nor NS is included in the grade-point average.

"W" GRADES

If you are an undergraduate and drop a course during the first two weeks of a quarter, there is no entry on your permanent academic transcript. If all courses are dropped, then a complete withdrawal date is recorded on the transcript. A course drop made January 16 through February 19 is recorded on an undergraduate student's transcript with a "W" grade and a number designating the week of the quarter in which the course drop was transacted. Only a "W" grade is recorded on the transcript of graduate or professional students.

WITHDRAWAL

QUARTER OFF ELIGIBILITY POLICY

If you are an undergraduate or professional student (dental, law, or medical) who has completed the preceding quarter here at the University of Washington, you may take a quarter off under the Quarter Off Eligibility Policy. Review the REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY section for complete details.

WITHDRAWAL FOR THE QUARTER

(Dropping all courses.) It is your responsibility to withdraw if you are unable to attend for the quarter. If you drop your last course on STAR and do not add a course you will be considered withdrawn for the quarter. If you drop your last course on STAR you will be charged the \$20 change fee beginning January 9. You may write to or withdraw in person at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall, Box 355850, University of Washington, Seattle, Washington, 98195-5850. Withdrawals by mail are effective on the date of the postmark. No withdrawals are accepted after March 8.

Tuition owed will be based upon the date the complete withdrawal is recorded at the Registration Office, the date that the last class is dropped on STAR, or the postmark date for withdrawals received by mail. If you withdraw prior to January 9 you will owe a \$75 U-PASS fee unless you return your U-PASS to the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office by the tuition due date (January 19). If you pay the \$75 fee and then lose your U-PASS you are not eligible to purchase a replacement U-PASS sticker.

Review the Registration Eligibility section of the Time Schedule if you are withdrawing before the first

day of the quarter. New students must reapply through the Admissions Office.

Courses dropped as part of a complete withdrawal from the University during the first two weeks of a quarter (through January 12) are not recorded on your UW transcript; however, the date of the complete withdrawal is recorded.

If you withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (summer quarter excepted) you will not be eligible to register as a continuing student for the third quarter. You must reapply as a former student returning to the University and will be required to pay the \$35 application fee and \$100 enrollment deposit. For example, if you withdraw during the first week of winter quarter and spring quarter, you must reapply as a returning former student for autumn quarter.

HARDSHIP WITHDRAWAL

Hardship withdrawals are for dropping individual courses after the seventh week of the quarter (February 19). The \$20 change of registration fee will be assessed.

You may petition the Registrar for a hardship withdrawal if the following apply: 1) you are unable to complete the course in question because of a severe mental or physical disability, or 2) unusual or extenuating circumstances beyond your control prevented you from dropping the course by the drop deadline, or 3) you have not been granted a degree for course work in your current status.

WITHDRAWAL FOR MILITARY SERVICE

If you are conscripted into the Armed Forces or called to active military duty you may withdraw through the end of the seventh week of instruction (February 19) and receive a full refund but no academic credit. If you withdraw after that date you may receive either a full refund or (academic) credit and no refund. Please consult with the Office of the Registrar for complete details.

GRADUATE STUDENTS ON-LEAVE

To go on-leave, have your Department Graduate Program Coordinator sign an On-leave Card, then take it to the Registration Office through January 8. You must pay a \$35 non-refundable fee at the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office, room 129 Schmitz Hall after your On-leave Card is processed at the Registration Office. The cashier will issue you an On-leave Card so you will have access to the libraries. If you have registered for winter quarter 1996 and plan to go on-leave, you must officially withdraw prior to January 2, before the on-leave status will be granted.

Tuition Exemptions & Access Programs

UW FACULTY/STAFF AND WASHINGTON STATE CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES TUITION EXEMPTION PROGRAM

If you have been continuously employed full time (100%) as permanent staff for six months with the University or an agency of the state of Washington prior to the academic quarter in which you are trying to enroll, you may be admitted to the University of Washington and take up to 6 credits per quarter using this exemption. If an employee chooses to register for more than 6 credits, then the employee will be charged for all credits. Once registration occurs it cannot be changed to tuition exempt status in the quarter registered. If an employee has been admitted as a matriculated student and desires earlier priority registration in order to be assured of getting into classes, he/she may do so and pay full tuition as a regular student. According to legislative action, all registration must be on a space available basis after other matriculated students have registered. University Tuition Exemption does not cover Math 101. You must contact the Math department prior to registration. You may not register for graduate-level independent study courses numbered 600, 700, or 800 or any self-sustaining courses. If you are admitted as nonmatriculated in order to use this exemption, you may only register for classes when using the exemption and after the exemption request form has been submitted. Matriculated students will be permitted to register even when they are not using the exemption, however, full tuition and fees will be charged.

If you are enrolling under one of these exemption programs you may attend class with the permission of the instructor, beginning the first class day if space is available. Call STAR to determine the correct classroom location. The building and room number may have been changed by the department since the Time Schedule was printed.

ADMISSION FOR UW FACULTY, STAFF, OR CLASSIFIED STATE EMPLOYEES

A tuition exemption form must be filled out for each quarter of attendance. If you would like to enroll as a new matriculated student or in a new matriculated category, apply to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, 320 Schmitz Hall, by the regular admission closing date; October 15 is the closing date for winter quarter applications. If you are applying to the Graduate School (including Graduate Nonmatriculated status), you should contact the applicable academic department for application information. If you are applying as a new nonmatriculated student, you should go to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

If you are a former student at the UW and are returning in the same classification or as a nonmatriculated student you should apply at the Registration Office, room 225 Schmitz Hall. These applications are normally accepted up to the beginning of the quarter. Graduate Nonmatriculated program participants need to apply through the intended academic department.

REGISTERING

After the tuition exemption request has been received by the Registration Office, you may call STAR on or after the appropriate eligibility dates. Registration continues through Monday, January 8 on STAR without assessment of late fees. Beginning Tuesday, January 9, a \$25.00 late registration fee is billed if you are initially registering for the quarter and a \$20.00 change fee is charged for registration changes. You will be billed these fees, if applicable, plus the registration fee when you register in a course. If you add your course before the tuition exemption program registration date, you will not be permitted to convert to the tuition exemption program and will be required to pay regular tuition for those credits. You will not be entitled to other student services such as those available at the Hall Health Center and the Intramural Activities Building. Faculty/staff identification cards may be used for library services. Washington State employees participating may obtain an ID card to be used for library services from the Student ID Center, 229 Schmitz Hall and a UPASS sticker for \$27.00 from the Registration Office, room 225 Schmitz Hall. Deadlines and registration dates are listed below:

Thursday, January 4 - Registration begins on STAR. Open from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 midnight.

Friday, January 19 - \$5 registration fee due. Fee is billed if a student successfully registers.

WASHINGTON STATE CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES

Friday, December 8 - Tuition exemption request card due to Registration, 225 Schmitz, Box 355850.

Friday, January 5 - Registration begins on STAR. Open from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 midnight.

Friday, January 19 - \$30 registration fee due. Fee is billed if a student successfully registers.

NOTE: You should contact your departmental office, the Registration Office, (206) 543-8580, 225 Schmitz Hall, or UW Training and Development, (206) 543-1957 for a tuition exemption form.

ACCESS PROGRAM FOR OLDER ADULTS

The University of Washington waives tuition for Washington residents sixty years or older who wish to attend classes as auditing students. If you are enrolling as an ACCESS student you may attend class with the permission of the instructor, beginning the first class day if space is available. Courses marked with a greater than sign (>) require an entry code to register. You should contact the offering department to obtain entry codes prior to coming to the Registration Office, room 225 Schmitz Hall. The fee is \$5.00 whether one or two courses are attended and will be billed if registration in a course(s) is completed. The payment will be due by January 19. Since you are auditing the course(s), you do not receive credit and are not expected to do any class work, participate in discussions, or take examinations. Your registration may be cancelled at the discretion of the instructor. You may register for all courses except UW Extension, Distance Learning, studio, laboratory courses, and honors sections. You may register in 500 level graduate courses with the approval of the instructor by obtaining an entry code through the department. A transcript is not maintained.

You will be limited to two courses per quarter. For additional information about this program, you may telephone UW Extension Information, 543-2320, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., weekdays.

TUITION FORFEITURES / REFUNDS

You will be billed for the number of credits, including audit hours, on your course schedule at the beginning of the quarter. Only partial tuition reductions will result for courses dropped after January 8. You will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition associated with any courses dropped beginning January

9 through January 31. Courses dropped after January 31 receive no refund.

The effect of tuition forfeitures on the over 18-credit surcharge is as follows: forfeitures for courses dropped that exceeded 18 credits are charged the same as above. Also, if you drop a course after January 31 and add another, total credit charges will include credits that are added with no reduction for credits dropped.

The University's forfeiture schedule is as follows:

- If you withdraw before January 9, you do not pay tuition. New and returning students forfeit their \$100 Enrollment Confirmation Deposit. If you withdraw before January 8 without returning the U-PASS sticker, you will owe \$75 for the U-PASS. No replacements are allowed for students who pay the \$75 fee and then lose their U-PASS sticker.
- If you withdraw January 9 through January 31 you will continue to owe one-half of your tuition. If you withdraw after January 8, you will be charged the applicable forfeiture and you may retain your U-PASS by paying the quarterly fee or return it no later than January 19 to have the fee waived. There will be no U-PASS refunds after January 19.
- If you withdraw after January 31 you will continue to owe full tuition.
- If your registration is canceled for nonpayment of fees you will continue to owe the University one-half of your tuition and fees.
- If you are an international student who is registered for an English as a Second Language course, you must make a separate request for a refund for that course by contacting the ESL Office, 4909 25th Avenue NE, on the 2nd floor of the King Building, at the same time you withdraw from the University.
- If you drop any classes January 9 through January 31 that results in lower tuition, you will owe one-half of the tuition associated with the reduced credit hours.
- If you are a Title IV aid recipient, attending your first quarter at the University and withdraw after January 8, you must pay a prorated portion of the University charges. Charges are prorated based on the portion of the quarter for which you are enrolled. If you withdraw after the seventh week of the quarter (February 19), you must pay full tuition. The pro rata refund provision applies to tuition, fees, room and board and other charges which would otherwise be assessed by the University. The \$100 Enrollment Confirmation Deposit is applied toward payment of tuition.

Course drops become effective the date received and processed on STAR, in the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz, or through the departmental registration screen used in academic departments.

TUITION/FEE ASSESSMENTS AND DEADLINES

It is your responsibility to see that tuition is paid in full by the tuition due date (January 19). Bills are sent at the beginning of each quarter (January 2) to facilitate payment. However, failure to receive a tuition bill does not nullify your responsibility for payment by the due date. Account balances are available through STAR (transaction 11#).

STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO KNOW

Drops or withdrawals after January 8 will cost you \$20 plus at least half of tuition reduction. (See Tuition Forfeitures or Refunds)

Tuition is due January 19.

Charges incurred after the tuition due date must be paid in 1-3 days.
(See Tuition/Fee Assessments and Deadlines)

Select your permanent or local address on STAR for fee statement mailing. If you have not received a fee statement by January 13, contact the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office, or call STAR for the amount of tuition due.

You may pay your fees in person in the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office or mail them to UW,

Student Accounts and Cashiers Office, 129 Schmitz, Box 355870, Seattle, WA 98195-5870, before January 19. Checks and money orders must be in U. S. Dollars and drawn on U. S. or Canadian banks. Payments postmarked on or before January 19 are accepted without a late fee. Mail postmarked after January 19 is subject to penalties as described below.

If you fail to pay by the deadline you will be charged a late fee. For past due balances over \$250 the late fee is \$30; \$30-\$250 balance the late fee is \$10; and if the balance is less than \$30 then there is no late fee.

If payment has not been received in the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office by the end of the late payment period, registration for the current quarter as well as any future quarters will be canceled. Reregistration after cancellation for nonpayment requires a \$75 fee, in addition to tuition.

Tuition and fees incurred after the January 19 must be paid within three working days. Exception: beginning March 8, charges must be paid by the next business day. Always check your account status and balance on STAR when completing a registration transaction.

If you reregister, you must reregister for all of the classes that were on your schedule at the time of registration cancellation. (Fees will include appropriate charges for classes dropped during the forfeiture period.) Please note: Even if your registration is canceled you will continue to owe one-half of your tuition.

Credit cards are not accepted.

Tuition and fees not paid by the end of the academic quarter (March 8) will be subject to an interest charge of 1% per month, or fraction of a month, (12% A.P.R.), beginning with the month following the end of the quarter. Delinquent unpaid accounts may be referred to a collection agency and reported to a credit bureau.

APPLICATION OF PAYMENTS TO A STUDENT'S ACCOUNT

As a rule, payments received for a student's account are applied to charges in order of their due dates. For charges with the same due date, payments are applied first to tuition and related University fees and then to other charges on the account. A payment may be applied to a specific charge by contacting the Student Accounts Office at 129 Schmitz Hall. Financial aid from Federal Title IV programs is applied only to required tuition and fees and to loan and aid repayment obligations. The University may not apply such aid to pay insurance and some other optional charges.

Student Insurance and Optional Fees

STUDENT INSURANCE

The University offers a voluntary accident and sickness insurance plan to supplement the services available at the Hall Health Center. Seattle Campus UW students who remain registered through are eligible to enroll in the plan. **Not eligible** are UW Seattle campus nonmatriculated students and those enrolled in programs administered by UW Extension and UW faculty/staff or Washington State classified employees attending classes under the employee tuition exemption programs.

You may sign up for the plan when you register for classes. The insurance premium will be included on the quarterly tuition statement and must be paid by the quarterly tuition-due date (January 19). In most cases Financial Aid will not pay insurance directly so you must make sure the premium is paid on time. There is no late payment period for the insurance premium.

You may add, cancel, or change your insurance selection on STAR, and remit the correct balance by the tuition due date. Or, you may make changes when paying tuition in person at the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office, by the tuition due date (January 19).

If you are an international student, you must subscribe to the student insurance plan unless you are covered by another plan. Proof of other coverage must be submitted to the International Services Office and a waiver obtained each autumn quarter (or upon initial admission if other than autumn quarter) because waivers are valid only through summer quarter each year. Students holding insurance policies that expire during the academic year are responsible for obtaining new waivers, as necessary.

For those graduate students who are eligible for Graduate Appointee Insurance, please choose the option, "no insurance" when registering on STAR. If you have questions regarding your eligibility for this plan, please contact your department.

International graduate appointees, however, must still choose the quarterly student insurance option when registering. If you are an international RA/TA/SA, the system will automatically make adjustments so that you will not have double coverage. If you are an international fellow or trainee, please contact your department for further instructions.

Brochures describing the plan in more detail are available at the Hall Health Center, the HUB, and the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall. Plan benefits may change each academic year, so students are encouraged to review the brochure carefully.

OPTIONAL FEES

SPECIAL COURSES AND LABORATORY FEES

The amounts charged for tuition and fees normally cover University charges for course registration. Some courses, however, have extraordinary expenses associated with them and in such cases the University may charge additional fees in amounts approximating the added instructional or laboratory costs.

WASHINGTON STUDENT LOBBY (WSL)

The Washington Student Lobby (WSL) is a voluntary, independent organization of university students whose purpose is to influence the Washington State Legislature and others on higher education matters of special interest to students. You may choose to support the WSL by contributing \$1.00 each quarter. Support for the WSL may be indicated during registration and the voluntary contribution will be included on your tuition billing statement for payment with tuition.

WASHINGTON PUBLIC INTEREST RESEARCH GROUP (WASHPIRG)

The Washington Public Interest Research Group (WashPIRG) is a student-directed, non-profit and non-partisan research organization that works on issues affecting the quality of life in Washington State. Students participate in WashPIRG as decision makers, volunteers and credit interns producing research reports, lobbying the legislature and organizing students and citizens around consumer, environmental and governmental issues. You may choose to support WashPIRG by contributing \$3 each quarter. Support of WashPIRG may be indicated during registration and the voluntary contribution will be included on the tuition billing statement for payment with tuition.

UW ID CARD

You should carry your UW ID Card with you at all times since it is required for a variety of services on campus. In some situations, you may be asked to provide additional pieces of identification, including one containing your photo. A quarterly validation sticker is mailed with your registration confirmation. The sticker should be affixed to the permanent ID Card as soon as it is received. Lost ID Cards may be replaced at the Student ID Center, 229 Schmitz. A non-refundable \$5 fee is charged for replacement of non-photo ID cards or \$10 for replacement of photo ID cards. (See also U-PASS information below.)

U-PASS INFORMATION

A U-PASS validation sticker is mailed with your registration confirmation each quarter. The U-PASS is valid on all regular Metro and Community Transit routes at all times and provides parking privileges to car-poolers, riding privileges to van-pool and Night Ride passengers, and merchant discounts. The quarterly fee of \$27 will be included on the tuition bill. If you do not wish to participate in the U-PASS program you must return the validation sticker to the university by the tuition payment deadline (January 19). The sticker can be returned by mail in the return envelope provided, or mailed with your tuition payment, or returned in person at the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office or the Registration Office.

If you withdraw through January 8 without returning the U-PASS sticker, you will owe \$75 for the U-PASS. If you withdraw after, you will be charged the applicable tuition and may retain the pass for \$27 or return it no later than the tuition due date (January 19) to have the \$27 fee waived. There will be no U-PASS refunds after the tuition payment deadline (January 19), and no replacements of lost U-PASS stickers for students who have withdrawn.

If you did not receive your U-PASS in the mail you will be asked to sign a certifying statement and will be issued a replacement sticker at no charge through January 8. Replacement stickers issued after January 8 will cost \$10. Lost ID cards bearing a U-PASS sticker will be replaced for a \$15 fee (\$20 fee with photo), which includes a new U-PASS sticker. Replacement fees are non-refundable. If you are issued a replacement sticker you will not be permitted to cancel the \$27 U-PASS fee by returning a sticker.

Eligible students who have not already purchased a U-PASS sticker may do so at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz, anytime during the quarter. The fee will remain \$27 throughout the quarter.

The U-PASS is the property of the University of Washington and is not transferable. The U-PASS program, replacement policies, and quarterly fee are subject to change without notice.

Notices

ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON (ASUW)

The Associated Students of the University of Washington is a voluntary association of students designated by the University Regents to carry out a variety of student activities. In order to vote in ASUW elections or hold ASUW office, you must be a member. Membership choice will not affect tuition payment in any way. Information about the ASUW can be obtained from the ASUW Office in Room 204L Student Union building. You may join ASUW when registering on STAR.

DISABLED STUDENTS

If you are a student with a disability, various support services, including priority registration, note taking and examination accommodations are available. You may contact Disabled Student Services (DSS), room 448 Schmitz Hall, 543-8925 voice/TDD, for information on academic accommodations designed to meet individual student needs.

The STAR Work Sheet and instructions are available from DSS in alternate media, including large print, tape recording and Braille. If you have a disability that limits your ability to use STAR, you may register through DSS or at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz Hall.

DISCLOSURE OF STUDENT RECORDS

As a general rule the University will not release a student's education records to a third party without written consent of the student. This includes tuition account information. The complete University policy on student education records and the location of such records may be found in the Washington Administrative Code under WAC 478-140. Manuals containing the Code are available at Reference Stations on campus and at the Visitor's Information Center, 4014 University Way NE. The policy covers such items as accessibility, review and expunging of inaccurate records, and costs to be charged for copies of student records. Information release forms for tuition account information only may be obtained from the Student Accounts and Cashiers Office, 129 Schmitz.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

The University of Washington, as a standing policy, does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, age, marital status, disability, or status as a disabled veteran or Vietnam era veteran. Any discriminatory action can be a cause for disciplinary action. This policy applies to all University programs and facilities including, but not limited to, admissions, educational programs, employment, and patient and hospital services. Such discrimination is prohibited by Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Sections 503 and 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Age Discrimination in employment Act Amendments of 1978, Vietnam Era veteran's Readjustment Assistance Act of 1974, Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, State of Washington Gender Equity in Higher Education Act of 1989, other federal and state statutes and regulations, and University policy. Coordination of the compliance efforts of the University of Washington with respect to all of these laws and regulations is under the direction of the Equal Employment Officer, Dr. Helen Remick, University of Washington, Equal Employment and Affirmative Action Office, JA-08, 4045 Brooklyn Ave. NE, Seattle, Washington, 98195, telephone (206) 543-1830, VTDD.

FOLLOWING RULES AND REGULATIONS

It is the University's expectation that you will follow University rules and regulations as they are stated in the General Catalog and the Time Schedule. In instances where no appeal procedure is spelled out and you believe that a special set of circumstances makes appeal reasonable, you may appeal the application of specific rules or regulations to the office of the dean of the school or college in which you are enrolled in the case of an academic matter, or to the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs in the case of a nonacademic matter. These offices will either render a decision on the appeal or refer you to the proper office for a decision.

GRADUATION RATES

The graduation rates of full-time freshmen beginning their studies at the University of Washington either summer or autumn quarter 1988 are 58% in 5 years and 67% in 6 years.

IMMUNIZATION

All new and returning former students, and all students living in University of Washington residence halls or single-student apartments, are required either to provide proof of measles (rubeola) immunity or request that the requirement be waived for religious, personal or medical reasons. Such students will not be allowed to register for any classes until the Hall Health Primary Care Center (the student health center on campus) confirms that they have satisfied this requirement.

Students must complete the student health center's Measles Immunity Verification Form and provide either certifications by their health-care providers or copies of original immunization records as proof of: 1) two live virus measles (rubeola) vaccinations, both given after 1967 with at least one was given after 1980; or 2) positive measles (rubeola) titer (blood test for antibodies against measles); or 3) a history from a health-care provider of measles (rubeola) disease. Students born before 1957 are considered immune to measles.

While continuing students are not required to provide the Hall Health Primary Care Center with proof of measles immunity, they are encouraged to do so. In the event of an outbreak on the campus, all students lacking acceptable documentation of measles immunity, including students with waivers, will be barred from classes, living groups and other campus activities until health officials determine that there is no risk of them transmitting the disease to others. Measles Immunity Verification Forms are available at the Hall Health Primary Care Center and the Registration Office at 225 Schmitz Hall. For more information, students should contact the Hall Health Primary Care Center at (206) 616-4672 and leave voice-mail messages to which members of the nursing staff will respond.

RELEASE OF STUDENT DIRECTORY INFORMATION

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974 protects the privacy of your education records. However, the following information is considered public or "directory" information and may be released to anyone unless you inform the Office of the Registrar that you do not wish any information released: name, address, telephone number, major field of studies, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, full- or part-time enrollment status,

educational institutions attended, and for athletes, date-of-birth, weight and height.

If you do not wish to authorize directory release and do not want your directory information to appear in the published or electronic Student Directory, you may call the address change service at 543-3868 to restrict access to this information. No information will be released on students that have restricted release of directory information including degrees awarded and dates of attendance. If you wish to change your authorization and allow release, you must go to the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz and present photo identification.

Under the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), you have the right to 1) inspect and review information contained in your education records, 2) challenge the contents of your education records, 3) request a hearing if the outcome of the challenge as unsatisfactory, 4) submit an explanatory statement for inclusion in the education record if the outcome of the hearing is unsatisfactory, 5) prevent disclosure with certain exceptions of personally identifiable information, 6) secure a copy of the institution policy, and 7) file complaints with the Department of Education concerning alleged failures by institutions to comply with the Act. Written complaints should be directed to FERPA, Department of Education, Room 4074, Switzer Building, Washington D.C. 20202.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Students, as well as members of the faculty and staff, who wish to file a complaint regarding sexual harassment may contact either of the two offices listed below:

VETERAN'S INFORMATION

Tuition reductions may be available for Washington residents who served in the Southeast Asian or Persian Gulf combat zones; children of POWs or MIAs; and nonresident active duty military personnel and their dependents stationed in Washington. * Saturday courses may schedule their examination for the first Saturday of the examination week, but must make arrangements with Room Assignments to check on room availability. Dean's office approval is not required for Saturday only courses.

Final Examinations should be administered in accordance with the above examination schedule. The dean may permit an instructor to change the time of a final examination upon prior application demonstrating good cause for such change. In such cases, the following guidelines shall be observed:

- With the dean's permission the final examination may be postponed or moved to an earlier time within the examination period if agreed to by all students and the instructor. Before approving the rescheduling of a final examination, the dean shall obtain assurances that the change will not have an undue adverse impact on the students. The dean shall notify the Registrar of the approval granted for the date of a final examination.
- An instructor shall not schedule a final class examination before the beginning of finals week. An instructor shall not, except in very unusual circumstances, grant permission to individual students for an early examination. If the student is unable to take an examination on the scheduled date, the procedure outlined in the following paragraph should be followed.
- A student absent from any examination through sickness or other cause, judged by the instructor to be unavoidable, shall be given an opportunity to take a rescheduled examination or perform work judged by the instructor to be the equivalent.
- If the instructor determines that neither alternative is feasible during the current quarter, the instructor may exempt the student from the requirement. Examples of unavoidable cause include death or serious illness in the immediate family, illness of the student, and, provided previous notification is given, observance of regularly scheduled religious obligations, and might possibly include attendance at academic conferences or field trips, or participation in university-sponsored activities such as debating contests or athletic competition.
Students are responsible for taking any number of examinations for which they are scheduled on a given day.
- Classes that begin on the half-hour and last longer than one hour use the actual starting time to determine the examination time. For example, a class that begins at 7:30 a.m. and continues until 9:00 a.m. would use the 7:30 a.m. time.
- Classes that begin on the hour use the first following half-hour to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that begins at 10:00 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.
- Day-time classes (7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may extend their final examination period to three hours. All other examinations are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.
- If an examination is held during finals week at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure the room is available.

CHID 496 Focus Groups (1-2, max. 4) Investigation of particular areas of interest in collaboration with fellow students. Involves discussion, research, and project development. Provides an opportunity to apply analytical skills to an area specifically related to academic and career goals. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisite: permission of adviser.

ARCH 210 Design Drawing I (4) VLPA *Ching* Projects, lectures, demonstrations, and exercises to develop skill in freehand drawing and an understanding of drawing as a vital means to see, analyze, and represent essential aspects of the visual environment.

ARCH 562 Regionalism (3) Exploration of design ideas that address the cultivation of regional character by acknowledging the commonplace, including both the landscape and its buildings. The many disruptive forces that threaten the possibilities of local culture are also considered from a political, social, and economic point of view.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

B CON 525 Cost Analysis and Management (3) Study of cost management procedures applicable to the building process from the conceptual phase through owner operations, including conceptual estimating, project cost analysis and control, and value engineering and life-cycle costing.

B CON 555 Construction Firm Management I (3) Management of a construction company including the organization, corporate structure, operating procedures, marketing and human resource management, safety and loss prevention management, insurance and risk management, financing, accounting, marketing and construction services, individual and corporate planning, and strategic and long-range planning for construction firms.

URBAN DESIGN AND PLANNING

URBDP 503 Communications and Analysis (4) *Kasprisin* Development of communication skills understanding within the planning and design process. Presentation of communications as a design process with mental, visual, oral, written, and kinesthetic cognitive actions combined to form communications thinking.

URBDP 587 Preservation and the Vernacular Environment (3) Exploration of theoretical, methodological, and practical issues related to the preservation of vernacular architecture and cultural landscapes in the United States.

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

AMERICAN ETHNIC STUDIES

AES 212 Comparative American Ethnic Literature (5) VLPA/I&S *Butler, Wong* Selected texts from the African American, American Indian, Asian American, Chicano/Latino, and Euro-American traditions of American literature. Examines the American Dream, identity, community, conformity, individualism, and family. Explores themes of assimilation, double consciousness, *meztiza* consciousness and wholeness as an introduction to multiple American voices in literary expression.

ANTHROPOLOGY

ANTH 591 Seminar in Museum Operations (3) Designing hypothetical museums and creating a first year of operations. Design elements include architectural plan, staffing plan, initial and recurring budgets, security system, records system, educational plan, and policy making. Prerequisite: 590 or permission of instructor.

ART

ART 280 Media, Time, and Technology Arts (5) VLPA Develops a "new genre" attitude towards exploration and research in contemporary visual arts, based on computer/ human interface and electronic technology. Includes performance art, environmental art, sound art, light art, video art, interactive installation, kinetic art, conceptual art. Prerequisites: foundation courses and 131.

ART 322 Presentation for Industrial Design I (5) VLPA Introduction to presentation skills, from quick sketching of design concepts to refined representation of the finished design in a two-dimensional format. Emphasis on accuracy and development of an individual style. Prerequisite: industrial design major.

ART 324 Alternative Approaches to Fiber Arts (5, max. 10) VLPA Constructed, patterned, embellished, and found textiles used as a basis for challenging underlying assumptions about cloth. Uses alternative methods of pattern development and surface enhancement to interpret, invent, or discover a vocabulary of visual expression.

ART 345 Intermediate Printmaking (5, max. 15) VLPA Development of mature and personal statement within context of the print form through studio practice and group discussion and critique. Processes and media emphasis varies on a revolving basis. Prerequisites: art major and 247, 248, or 249.

ART 380 Video Art and Video Installation (5) VLPA Exposes students to broad range of high-end video industry equipment, terminology and production/post skills while viewing art works and creating alternative activities and ideas. Work in electronic image gathering, digital A/B roll editing, motion control, video as related to performance and environmental. art. Prerequisite: foundation courses, 131, and 280.

ART 450 Individual Projects in Printmaking (5, max. 15) VLPA Individual media study within the context of group discussion and critique. Prerequisite: art major and 345 or permission of instructor.

ART 461 History of Body Adornment (3) Covers jewelry and other body adornment from Neolithic times to the present, worldwide. Discussion on social and cultural relevance of forms, uses, and materials. Emphasis on today's studio craftspeople who make jewelry as a form of aesthetic expression outside the fashion mainstream.

ART 595 MFA Research Project (2-5, max. 9) An independent research project related to and informed by the MFA student's studio work. Final project form may be a lecture, slide presentation, or paper.

ATMOSPHERIC SCIENCES

ATM S 211 Climate and Climate Change (5) NW The nature of the global climate system. Factors influencing climate including interactions among the atmosphere, oceans, solid earth, and biosphere. Stability and sensitivity of climate system. Global warming, ozone depletion, and other human influences. Intended for non-majors.

BOTANY

BOTANY 496 Peer Teaching Assistantships in Botany (1-5) *Ammirati, del Moral, Haskins* Direct experience in the classroom, typically teaching a lab section of an undergraduate course. Peer TA's attend lectures and weekly preparation meetings and gain in-depth background in the subject material as well as training in teaching techniques and approaches. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

COMPARATIVE LITERATURE

C LIT 322 Studies in Asian and Western Literatures (5) Topics designated by individual instructors.

ECONOMICS

ECON 574 International Macroeconomics (3) Surveys recent developments in international macroeconomics, placing particular emphasis on the dynamic aspects. One sector, multisector, and two-country international models discussed. Fiscal issues treated in depth. Stochastic aspects introduced and related to the literature on international real business cycles. Prerequisite: 509 or equivalent.

ENGLISH

ENGL 497 Honors Senior Seminar (5) Seminar study of special topics in language and literary study. Prerequisite: honors student majoring in English.

GENETICS

GENET 581 Seminar in *Drosophila* Genetics (1) *Berg* Discussions of contemporary research in and novel methods for genetic, cell biological, and molecular biological analysis of *Drosophila* development. Credit/no credit only.

GENET 582 Seminar in Mouse Genetics (1) *Braun* Discussion of contemporary research in and novel methods for genetic, cell biological, and molecular analysis of mammalian development, with utilization of transgenic techniques. Credit/no credit only.

GENET 583 Seminar in Molecular Cytology (1) *Byers* Discussions of contemporary research in and novel methods for genetic, cell biological, and molecular biological analysis of spindle behavior in the mitotic cell cycle of budding yeast. Credit/no credit.

GENET 584 Seminar in DNA Replication (1) *Brewer, Fangman* Discussions of contemporary research in and novel methods for genetic, cell biological, and molecular biological analysis of budding yeast, with emphasis on the mechanisms and control of DNA replication. Credit/no credit only.

GENET 585 Seminar in Bacterial Genetics (1) *Manoil* Discussions of contemporary research in and novel methods for genetic, cell biological, and molecular biological analysis of bacterial assembly mechanisms, with emphasis on the topogenesis of membrane proteins. Credit/no credit only.

GENET 586 Seminar in Mammalian Genetics (1) *Sibley* Discussions of contemporary research in and novel methods for genetic, cell biological, and molecular biological analysis of mammalian genetics, with emphasis on lymphoblast development. Credit/no credit only.

GEOGRAPHY

GEOG 397 Tutorial for Majors (1) *Lawson* Overview of the discipline of geography including faculty research interests, teaching philosophies, and course offerings as well as essential study and research skills and career development strategies. Students meet concurrently with faculty adviser to identify academic interests and devise plan of studies. Credit/no credit only.

GEOPHYSICS

GPHYS 502 Seismology (3) Theoretical and observational seismology. Theory of elastic plane wave propagation through homogeneous and stratified media. Surface waves and eigenvibrations. Ray theory. Structure of earth's mantle and core. Seismicity distributions, earthquake focal mechanisms and relationship to tectonics. Includes advanced, research-oriented problems. Prerequisite: 401 and graduate standing.

GPHYS 505 Geophysics: Space (3) Various phenomena occurring in outer regions of earth's atmosphere, ionosphere, magnetosphere, and Van Allen radiation belts. Applications include plasma thrusters and fusion. Concepts include charged particles in magnetic fields, drift motion, plasma, magnetohydrodynamic waves. Includes advanced, research-oriented problems. Prerequisite: PHYS 321 or equivalent and graduate standing.

GPHYS 518 Introduction to Geophysical Research (1, max. 3) Introduces research of faculty and advanced graduate students to first-year graduate students and provides experience for the formulation, oral presentation, and defense of research proposals and results.

GPHYS 519 Geophysical Research Methods (2, max. 12) Current research methodology and results based on recent literature and on faculty and student research. Designed to develop student perspective on observational and theoretical methods and on relation of specific research to broader developments in geophysics and interdisciplinary aspects of geophysics through faculty-guided presentations and discussion by students.

HISTORY

HIST 590 Topics in History (3, max. 9) Seminar on selected topics in general history, with special emphasis on preparation for field examinations. Topics vary according to interests of students and instructor.

HISTORY OF ASIA

HSTAS 590 Topics in Asian History (3, max. 9) Seminar on selected topics in Asian history, with special emphasis on preparation for field examinations. Topics vary according to interests of students and instructor.

HISTORY OF THE AMERICAS

HSTAA 590 Topics in American History (3, max. 9) Seminar on selected topics in American history, with special emphasis on preparation for field examinations. Topics vary according to interests of students and instructor.

MODERN EUROPEAN HISTORY

HSTEU 273 Women and Gender in Modern Europe (5) I&S Examines European women's changing social role and competing views of femininity from the Enlightenment to the end of the cold war. Special focus on the relationship of gender and politics and on the female body in bourgeois society, industrialization, imperialism, the welfare state, fascism, and the cold war.

JACKSON SCHOOL OF INTERNATIONAL STUDIES**EUROPEAN STUDIES**

EURO 490 Senior Seminar I (5) I&S Introduction to bibliographical resources for research into European topics and to the analysis of problems.

EURO 499 Undergraduate Research (1-5) Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

SIS 406 Political Islam and Islamic Fundamentalism (5) I&S Study of resurgence, since mid-1970's of political Islam and what has come to be called Islamic fundamentalism, especially in the Middle East. Topics include the nature and variety of political Islam today, causes and implications of the current resurgence, and comparison with previous resurgences.

MATHEMATICS

MATH 327, 328 Introductory Real Analysis I, II (3, 3) Limits and continuity of functions, sequences, series tests, absolute convergence, uniform convergence. Power series, improper integrals, uniform continuity, fundamental theorems on continuous functions, theory of the Riemann integral. Prerequisites: 126 and 304 for 327, 327 for 328.

MATH 354, 355 Special Topics in Math for Teachers (5, 5) NW Map and graph coloring, spanning trees, dominating sets, cryptography, interpretation of graphs, circular motion, statistics that mislead, other topics. Focus on middle school level, with sixth or seventh grade classroom visits lasting all Tuesday morning in alternate weeks. Discussion of readings on math education reform.

MATH 554, 555, 556 Linear Analysis (5, 5, 5) Advanced linear algebra, ordinary differential equations (existence and uniqueness theory, linear systems, numerical approximations), Fourier analysis, introductions to functional analysis and partial differential equations, distribution theory. Prerequisites: MATH 426 and familiarity with complex analysis at the level of MATH 427 which may be taken concurrently.

MATH 597 Seminar on Teaching Math (1, max. 3) Issues in the teaching and learning of college mathematics, such as discovering and working with student background and expectations, increasing student engagement with course material, and evaluating student achievement. For graduate students who are, or soon will be, teaching mathematics courses on their own. Credit/no credit only.

MUSIC

MUSIC 201, 202, 203 First-Year Theory I, II, III (3, 3, 3) VLPA *Durand, Karpen, Larson* Core theory sequence for majors. 201: introduction to modal counterpoint and 16th-century polyphony through the species. 202: instruction in tonal harmony and counterpoint. 203: further instruction in total harmony and counterpoint; introduction to canon, modulation, and classical dance forms. Concurrent enrollment in 204 for 201, 205 for 202, 206 and MUHST 210 for 203. Prerequisites: 119 or equivalent and placement by examination for 201.

MUSIC 204, 205, 206 (1, 1, 1) VLPA *Durand, Karpen, Larson* Core ear-training sequence for majors. Concurrent enrollment in 201 for 204, 202 for 205, 203 and MUHST 210 for 206. Prerequisite: placement by examination.

MUSIC EDUCATION

MUSED 464 Classroom Management (2) VLPA *Demorest* Provides future teachers with strategies and techniques for classroom management and discipline, and an opportunity to observe their usage in actual teaching and learning settings. Minimum 12 hours observation in public school music classrooms before student teaching.

PHILOSOPHY

PHIL 505 Seminar in Teaching Philosophy (1, max. 3) *Baker, Clatterbaugh* Autumn quarter focus on topics of importance to a graduate student teaching two quiz sections a week for a larger lecture course. Winter quarter focus on assessment options. Spring quarter focus on helping student prepare to teach own course.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

POL S 363 Law in Society (5) I&S Inquiry into how law matters in social practice. Examines general theories of law, the workings of legal institutions, and the character of legally constituted practices and relationships in diverse terrains of social life.

POL S 403 Advanced Special Topics in International Relations (5, max. 10) I&S Examination of contemporary developments in the field of international relations. Content varies according to the nature of developments and research interests of the instructor.

POL S 432 Political Islam and Islamic Fundamentalism (5) I&S Study of resurgence, since mid-1970's of political Islam and what has come to be called Islamic fundamentalism, especially in the Middle East. Topics include the nature and variety of political Islam today, causes and implications of the current resurgence, and comparison with previous resurgences.

SOCIETY AND JUSTICE

SO JU 363 Law in Society (5) I&S Inquiry into how law matters in social practice. Examines general theories of law, the workings of legal institutions, and the character of legally constituted practices and relationships in diverse terrains of social life.

PSYCHOLOGY

PSYCH 575 Minority Mental Health (3) *Barrett, George* Surveys topics on mental health and treatment of racial and ethnic minorities. Theory emphases include: models addressing ethnic identity, cross-cultural differences, models of culturally sensitive intervention. Practices emphases include unique psychotherapy strategies for: African-, Asian-, and Latino-Americans, and American Indians. Prerequisite: graduate clinical major standing in psychology or permission of instructor.

PSYCH 599 Directed Research in Psychology (1-3, max. 24) Supervised participation in research. Prerequisite: permission of a supervising psychology faculty member.

ROMANCE LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

FRENCH

FRENCH 420 Interdisciplinary Approaches to Literature (5) *Sugano* Interdisciplinary studies in French literature and culture, focusing on the complex interactions of literature and other disciplines, i.e. philosophy, psychoanalysis, anthropology, architecture. Prerequisite: 303, 304, and 306.

SCANDINAVIAN LANGUAGES & LITERATURE

DANISH

DANISH 201, 202, 203 Second Year Danish (5, 5, 5) Intensive practice in speaking, reading, and writing. Review of grammar. Introduction of modern literary texts. Discussion of culture and current events in Denmark. Prerequisite: 103 or equivalent.

DANISH 312 The Danish Novel (5) VLPA Selected Danish novels since the Modern Breakthrough. Works by Jacobsen, Bang, Jensen, Kirk, Blixen, Scherfig, Ditlevsen, and Riffbjerg. Prerequisite: 203 or equivalent.

SLAVIC LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

SLAV 423 East European Film (5) VLPA *Crnkovic* East European film from the 1950's to the present. Directors include Waged, Forman, Szabo, Kusturica, Makavejev, Pintilie, Polansky. Examines film-making in a non-market-based society, avant-garde cinematography, film in the socialist and post-socialist eras, and East European directors in the West.

WOMEN STUDIES

WOMEN 205 Introduction to Global Perspectives on Women (5) I&S *Sunindyo* Introduction to basic concepts of gender, race-ethnicity, class, nation, and sexuality. Topics include international women's histories, comparative women's movements, activism and resistance, feminists' perspectives of global politics and economy, issues of violence, and consideration of women and human rights.

WOMEN 427 Women and Violence (5) I&S *Glinorio* Multi-disciplinary explorations of the continuum of violence which affects women's lives, ranging from experience in personal settings to cultural or state policies. Violence against women explored in the context of societal, political, and state violence. Prerequisite: 200 or permission of instructor.

WOMEN 458 Motherhood Ideologies and Technologies (5) I&S Examines how gender ideologies, racism, class, sexual orientation, and medical technologies structure the way mothering is experienced and practiced. Topics may include slave mother, unmarried mother, surrogate mothers, lesbian mothers, and trans-racial mothers. Prerequisites: Prerequisites: 200 and any 300-level Women Studies course or permission of instructor.

WOMEN 512 Critical Interdisciplinary Approaches to Women's Health (3) Critical examination of the historical, socio-political, and scientific influences on women's health. Issues of sexism, racism, and heterosexism discussed from the perspective of different disciplines.

ZOOLOGY

ZOOL 580 Environmental Physiology and Behavior (2 max. 14) *Kenagy, Wingfield* Current conceptual issues and research results. Topics vary. Prerequisite: two upper-division courses in physiology or behavior or equivalent. Credit/no credit only.

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

BUSINESS COMMUNICATIONS

B. CMU 499 Research in Business Communications (1-6) Prerequisite: permission of undergraduate office.

FINANCE

FIN 555 Corporate Financing Decisions (4) Framework for analyzing the effects of non-investment decisions on corporate value. Topics include financing policy, compensation policy, hedging, leasing, and dividend policy. Focus on the role of financial contracting. Prerequisite: B A 502.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY

EDPSY 528 Achievement Motivation in Education (3) Critical review of current research and major theories of achievement motivation in schools and other educational settings. Emphasis on the relationship of theories to the contexts and practice of education. Prerequisite: EDPSY 501 or permission of instructor.

TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM

EDTEP 501 First Quarter Field Experience - Elementary (2) Field experience accompanying the first quarter of study in the Elementary Teacher Education Program. Approximately 30 hours per week for two weeks during the quarter in supervised school placements and small group discussions. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisite: Elementary TEP student.

EDTEP 504 Fourth Quarter Field Experience - Elementary (9) Field experience accompanying the fourth quarter of study in the Elementary Teacher Education Program. Full time student teaching in supervised school placements and small group discussion. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisite: Elementary TEP student.

EDTEP 511 School and Society (3) Exploration of issues regarding schooling and society, such as matters of value and value tension in American schools. Consideration of social values such as equality, opportunity, pluralism, and community; historical and contemporary evidence of values in schooling; and how values can conflict in policy and practice. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 521 Topics and Issues in Numeracy (3) Focus on mathematics from the perspective of the learner and on the meaning of understanding a mathematics concept. Examination of cultural aspects of the development of these concepts. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 531 Topics and Issues in Literacy (3) Investigation of the multiple natures of literacy development. Students study the impact of culture and family on literacy development by reading and discussing a variety of texts while also experiencing the development of their own learning through literature study, the writing process, and oral presentations. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 541 Dilemmas of Teaching and Learning in Elementary School (3) Covers human learning in the elementary school setting with emphasis on discipline-specific cognition and cognitive development. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 551 Introduction to Multicultural Education (2) Concepts, theories, and strategies that constitute major dimensions of multicultural education. Focus on racial and ethnic groups, social class, and gender. Dimensions of multicultural education examined include content integration, knowledge construction process, prejudice reduction, equity pedagogy, and empowering school culture and social structure. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 562-563 Adolescent Development and Education (3-3) Overview of trends and issues of adolescent development and behavior in relation to contemporary secondary schooling. Psychological perspectives on adolescent identity, interpersonal relationships, academic engagement, and social deviancy in schools examined with special attention to classroom management and accommodating differences. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 565 Planning and Teaching an Integrated Curriculum (3) Introduction of models for integrating curriculum, congruent instructional and assessment strategies, and team planning skills. Provides direct and experiential learning activities resulting in production of team-planned curricular units based on two different models of curriculum integration. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 573 Assessment in Secondary Education (3) Strong emphasis on methods of assessment that reinforce understanding of a discipline, including performance assessments, assessments of student projects and papers, traditional exams, and observational exams. Prerequisite: Secondary TEP student.

EDTEP 580-581 Teaching English and Language Arts in Secondary School I-II (5-3) Teaching of English and Language Arts in middle, junior, or high school. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 582-583 Teaching Mathematics in the Secondary School I-II (5-3) Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 584-585 Teaching Social Studies in the Secondary School I-II (5-3) Developing, teaching, and evaluating social studies courses on the middle, junior, and senior high school levels. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 586-587 Teaching Science in the Secondary School I-II (5-3) Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 588-589 Teaching World Languages I-II (5-3) Introduction to currently used foreign language teaching methods and approaches, including learning and teaching strategies and techniques for the four skills – reading, writing, speaking, listening – and culture. Current and future trends in pedagogy and technology. Prerequisite: TEP student.

EDTEP 592 Second Quarter Field Experience - Secondary (3) Field experience accompanying the second quarter of study in the Secondary Teacher Education Program. Approximately 2 days per week in supervised school placements and small group discussions. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisite: Secondary TEP student.

EDTEP 595 Fifth Quarter Field Experience - Secondary (3) Field experience accompany the fifth quarter of study in the Secondary Teacher Education Program. Supervised school placements and small group discussions. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisite: Secondary TEP student.

COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

COMPUTER SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

CSE 467 Advanced Digital Design (3) Advanced techniques in the design of digital systems. Hardware description languages, combinational and sequential logic synthesis and optimization methods, partitioning, mapping to regular structures. Emphasis on reconfigurable logic as an implementation medium. Memory system design. Digital communication including serial/parallel and synchronous/asynchronous methods. Prerequisites: 326 and 370.

ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

E E 476 Digital Integrated Circuit Design (5) *Sechen* A comprehensive view of digital integrated circuit design. Topics to be covered include the design of inverters, static logic circuits, switch logic, and synchronous logic. Students design, simulate, and layout a complete digital IC using modern computer-aided design tools. Prerequisites 331 and 371.

MECHANICAL ENGINEERING

M E 522 Thermodynamics (3) *Corlett, Emery, Malte* Topics from statistical thermodynamics, including the Boltzmann, Bose-Einstein, and Fermi-Dirac statistics. Solutions of the Schrodinger wave equation and evaluation of the partition function for translation, rotation, and vibration. Prerequisite: 521 or permission of instructor.

M E 555 Thermoelasticity (3) *Emery* Basic equations of thermoelasticity for isotropic elastic solids. Analysis of disks, cylinders, spheres, beams, and plates under steady temperature and sudden and slow heating and cooling. Introduction to thermoelastic stability. Prerequisite: 551 or permission of instructor.

TECHNICAL COMMUNICATIONS

T C 493 Senior Study (5) Integration of knowledge and skills acquired during major program into one paper or project. Prerequisite: senior standing and approval of proposal by faculty advisor.

COLLEGE OF FOREST RESOURCES

COLLEGE OF FOREST RESOURCES

CFR 400 Conflict Management (2) *I&S/NW Bradley, Lippke, Shannon* Emphasis on importance of personal styles of communication, common vision and goals, team building, performance analysis, bottom-line impacts, empowering of employees and of special interest groups, role of stakeholders and mediators. Regional experts from forestry-related companies as well as issues managers from various industries participate with team of instructors.

ECOSYSTEM SCIENCE & CONSERVATION

ESC 512 Biogeochemical Cycling in Soils and Forest Ecosystems (3) *Zabowski* Elemental cycles in forests and soils. Fundamentals of processes involved in cycling are addressed along with alterations resulting from environment, vegetation, and soil types. Consideration of cycles of nutrients, metals, and other elements. Weekly discussion section reviews literature on biogeochemical cycling. Prerequisites: one soils course or permission of instructor.

FOREST ENGINEERING

F E 404 Forest Engineering Field Seminar (1) Forest engineering activities examined and discussed during three all-day site visits. Opportunity for forest engineering practitioners, faculty, and students to interact in an informal, content-rich environment. Prerequisite: forest engineering student or permission of instructor.

FOREST MANAGEMENT

F M 574 Seminar in Forest Products Marketing (1-5) *Eastin, Paun* Evaluate and discuss current research topics in the area of marketing, marketing research, and international marketing of forest products. Presentation of a critical review of a published research paper based on research interests.

F M 589 Current Topics in International Forest Products Trade: Forest Economics (2, max. 6) *Perez-Garcia* Current research topics in forest economics as related to forest products sector. Presented by faculty and invited professionals, supplemented by student presentations.

PAPER SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

PSE 200 Wood Products and the Environment (5) *NW Briggs* Designed to provide better understanding of wood as a material. Study of the processes involved in production of major types of wood products, levels of product use, and comparisons of non-wood alternatives. Information and methods designed to aid student in understanding complex resource issues.

INTERDISCIPLINARY GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAM

MOLECULAR AND CELLULAR BIOLOGY

MCB 517, 518 Topics in Molecular and Cellular Biology (1-5, max. 12, 1-5, max. 12) Advanced in-depth coverage of specific areas of molecular and cellular biology of current interest. Lectures by University of Washington faculty involved in research in this area and lectures by invited speakers. A basic knowledge of principles of molecular and cellular biology assumed.

MCB 580 Teaching Practicum in Molecular and Cellular Biology (3, max. 6) Supervised training in the teaching of molecular and cellular biology. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

MUSEOLOGY

MUSEUM 483 Museum Operations Practicum (3, max. 9) Provides students with the opportunity to apply their general museological training in one or more areas of supervised museum operation areas, e.g., registration, education, or exhibition through project-oriented work in the Burke Museum. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

MUSEUM 490 Museum Curation Practicum (1-5, max. 15) The application of museological training in the curation of ethnographic, archeological, geological, or zoological collection materials in the Burke Museum. Work under the supervision of faculty curators ranges from fundamental collection documentation and research to preventive conservation, storage, and other special curation projects. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

MUSEUM 498 Museum Internship (3-5) Faculty supervised off-campus internships in museums and allied institutions. Each internship is individually established and provides students with practical experience and the opportunity to apply and learn new professional skills. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

MUSEUM 598 Museum Internship (3-5) Faculty supervised off-campus internships in museums and allied institutions. Each internship is individually established and provides students with practical experience and the opportunity to apply and learn new professional skills. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

UNIVERSITY CONJOINT

UCONJ 500- Seminar in Interprofessional Collaboration (1-5), max. 8) Emphasizes experiential learning, involving a collaborative project with students from Social Work, Nursing, Public Health, Education, and Public Affairs. Seminars focus on interprofessional collaborative practice, intrapersonal understanding, interpersonal group process skills, organizational ability, community awareness, and sociocultural sensitivity. Students encouraged to participate concurrently in disciplinary specific field placements. Credit/no credit.

BIOC 517 Protein Structure (1, max. 30) *Baker* Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

BIOC 518 Signaling in Development (1, max. 30) *Ruohola-Baker* Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

BIOC 525 Phytoremediation (1, max. 4) *Gordon* Literature survey of phytoremediation topics. Discussion of latest techniques for the use of plants to concentrate heavy metals in the soil and of plants and plant-bacteria combinations to detoxify various organic contaminants. Credit/no credit only.

BIOC 533 Topics In Biochemistry (1-3) *Palmiter* Provides in-depth examination of current topics in biochemistry, molecular biology, and structural biology. Designed to help participants in basic science departments become acquainted with latest ideas on topics being covered. Emphasis on analysis of key concepts in the field with reference to classical papers and recent literature. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

BIOC 534 Topics In Molecular Biophysics (1-2) *Parson* Emphasis on methods used to study macromolecular structure and dynamics, including x-ray crystallography, NMR, optical spectroscopy, computer modeling, protein folding and ligand binding. Two topics covered each quarter; students may register for one or both. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

BIOC 560 Protein Folding (1) *Baker* Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

BIOC 561 Origin of Polarity (1) *Ruohola-Baker* Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

IMMUN 566 T Cell Development and Recognition (1, max. 30) *Pullen* Credit/no credit.

IMMUN 567 Antigen Processing and Presentation (1, max. 30) *Rudensky* Credit/no credit.

PHARMACOLOGY

PHCOL 560 Regulation of Cell Function by Cyclic Nucleotide Phosphodiesterases (1) Discussion of research strategies, methodologies, and literature relating to regulation of cyclic nucleotide levels in the cell. Emphasis on practical problem solving, data analysis, and presentation of methods important to understanding published data and designing new experiments. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

PHCOL 561 Molecular Properties of Ion Channels (1) Discussion of research strategies, methodologies, and literature concerning the structure, function, and regulation of sodium and calcium channels and the mechanism of action of drugs on them. Emphasis on experimental problem solving, data analysis, and presentation. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

PHCOL 562 Regulation of Synaptic Physiology (1) Discussion of research strategies and methodologies involved in the regulation of signal transduction and synaptic physiology. Emphasis on practical problem solving, data analysis, and presentation methods. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

PHCOL 563 Developmental Toxicology (1) Presentation of theory and techniques with highest priority given to current literature and research advances. Emphasis on mechanisms whereby drugs and other foreign organic chemicals affect dysmorphogenesis, functional abnormalities, and other types of permanent and semi-permanent embryotoxic effects. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

PHCOL 564 Cellular Regulation by Protein Kinases (1) Analysis of research problems, techniques, and emerging concepts in study of the function of protein kinases. Emphasis on critical evaluation of research and development of presentation skills. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

PHCOL 565 Intercellular Signaling in Development (1) Molecular genetic approaches to dissecting the roles and mechanisms of intracellular signaling during development. Emphasis on vertebrate genes related to *Drosophila* segment polarity genes. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

PHCOL 566 Molecular Pharmacology of Neurotransmitter and Neurokinin Receptors (1) Discussion of research strategies and methodologies in the areas of molecular neurobiology and signal transduction of muscarinic receptors, G-proteins, and neurokinin receptors. Emphasis on practical problem solving, data analysis, and presentation methods important to modern scientific work. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

PHCOL 567 Signal Transduction Mechanisms in Neuroplasticity and Neuron Growth (1) Discussion of research strategies, methodologies, and literature relating to signal transduction mechanisms important for neuroplasticity and regulation of neuron growth in the central nervous system. Emphasis on practical problem solving, data analysis, and presentation methods important to modern scientific work. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

PHCOL 568 Pharmacology of Free Radicals (1) Advanced considerations of current literature and of experimental design, implementation and interpretation of research dealing with the effects of reactive oxygen species and free radicals on cell membranes and cells. Discussion of relationships of such phenomena to human disease and the effects of drugs thereon. Prerequisite: permission of instructor. Credit/no credit only.

PHCOL 569 Molecular Genetics of Potassium Channel Function (1) Discussion of research strategies, methodologies, and literature concerning the structure, function, and regulation of potassium channel genes and their role in behavior as studied in mutant mice. Emphasis on experimental problem solving, data analysis, and presentation. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

PHCOL 570 Molecular Pharmacology of Neurotransmission (1) Discussion of research strategies, methodologies, and literature concerning the structure, function, and regulation of neurotransmitter genes and the mechanism of action of drugs and hormones on their expression. Emphasis on experimental problem solving, data analysis, and presentation. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

REHABILITATION MEDICINE

REHAB 514 Effective Service Delivery in Educational Settings (2) Development of knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary for optimizing service delivery in educational settings to children with disabilities. Public laws, service delivery models, best practice issues, ethical decision making, cross-cultural competence, and interagency relationships addressed. For occupational and physical therapists, speech and hearing pathologist, and other related services personnel.

REHAB 547 Application of Biomechanics to Clinical Problems (2) Application of biomechanical and kinematic principles to the analysis and management of clinical problems. Applicable to a variety of clinical problems including evaluation of gait and prescription of braces and prostheses. Prerequisites: knowledge of basic kinesiology and biomechanics or permission of instructor.

SCHOOL OF NURSING

NURS 512 Critical Interdisciplinary Approaches to Women's Health (3) Critical examination of the historical, socio-political, and scientific influences on women's health. Issues of sexism, racism, and heterosexism discussed from the perspective of different disciplines.

PHYSIOLOGICAL NURSING

PN 555 Internship in Advanced Practice Nursing of Adults and Older Adults (6-9) Capstone clinical experience with opportunities to synthesize theoretical knowledge and clinical skills in care of adults and older adults. Planning, implementing, documenting, and evaluating therapeutic processes and outcomes under supervision of advanced practice clinical preceptor. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisites: CHCS 501, NURS 541, PN 541 and 544, and PHARM 415.

PN 560 Biological Aspects of Cancer: Implications for Care (3) *Gallucci, Wilkie* Survey of major concepts from tumor biology and implications for advanced oncology nursing practice. Areas covered include carcinogenesis, cancer epidemiology, pathology, metastasis, treatments (chemotherapy, radiation, surgery, immunotherapy), and cancer detection and prevention. Discussion of role of advance nurse clinician and complex patient responses are incorporated into discussion of basic biological concepts.

FISH 499 Undergraduate Research (1-5, max. 9) NW Individual research within the School of Fisheries. Each project supervised by an individual faculty member. Written reports required. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

SCHOOL OF MARINE AFFAIRS

SMA 519 Marine Policy Analysis (3) *Leschine* Goal is appreciation for and basic working knowledge of techniques used in policy analysis. Techniques are explored in both quasi-realistic settings and in application to real world problems of marine policy.

SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

MEDICINAL CHEMISTRY

MEDCH 495 Special Studies in Medicinal Chemistry (* max 6) Opportunity to expand the breadth and depth of understanding in specific areas. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

PHARMACY

PHARM 445 Public Health Applications in Pharmacy I. (3) *Ellsworth, Gardner* Provides skills and knowledge required to administer immunizations and administer and interpret tuberculin skin tests in ambulatory pharmacy practice and to initiate outreach activities in response to assessed community needs for medication-related information and services. Prerequisite: MEDCH 401; recommended UCONJ 422.

PHARM 468 Case Studies in Pharmaceutical Care (3, max. 9) Small groups of students work with an instructor to review cases illustrating various aspects of specific diseases: pathophysiology, clinical features, psychosocial factors, therapeutic interventions with emphasis on drug therapies, and community resources. analytic reasoning, self-study skills, and knowledge are emphasized.

SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND COMMUNITY MEDICINE

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

ENV H 417 Non-Ionizing Radiation and Electrical Safety (2) *Yost* Introduction to health hazards from UV, optical laser hazards, infrared radiation, radio-frequency radiation, heat stress, electrical shock, electric and magnetic fields. Application of current standards for these physical agents. Emphasis on occupational hazards with additional discussion of environmental exposures where appropriate.

ENV H 568 Molecular Epidemiology of Infectious Diseases (2) Application of molecular typing techniques to study of microbial pathogens to increase understanding of epidemiology of infectious diseases. Brief review of molecular biology. Evaluation of methods used in outbreaks and epidemics reported in literature. Prerequisites: 511 or 512 or permission of instructor.

ENV H 573 Methods and Issues in Using Biological Measurements in Epidemiologic Research (2) *Nazar-Stewart* Introduction to use of measurement from biological specimens in epidemiologic studies. Prepares epidemiology and laboratory science students for conduct of interdisciplinary human studies. Evaluation of biomarkers, preliminary studies, methodologic issues, quality control. Brief review of molecular biology. Applications and current literature discussed. Prerequisites: 511 or 512.

EPIDEMIOLOGY

EPI 523 Injury Epidemiology (3) *Cummings, Mueller, Rivara* Overview of the field of injury epidemiology and injury prevention. Topics include the Haddon matrix, injury scoring systems, drowning, bicycle injuries, fires, poisoning motor vehicle crashes, firearm injuries, social and financial costs of injuries, and prevention strategies. Includes discussion on the use of computer databases to study injuries.

EPI 568 Molecular Epidemiology of Infectious Diseases (2) Application of molecular typing techniques to study of microbial pathogens to increase understanding of epidemiology of infectious diseases. Brief review of molecular biology. Evaluation of methods used in outbreaks and epidemics reported in literature. Prerequisites: 511 or 512 or permission of instructor.

EPI 573 Methods and Issues in Using Biological Measurements in Epidemiologic Research (2) *Nazar-Stewart* Introduction to use of measurement from biological specimens in epidemiologic studies. Prepares epidemiology and laboratory science students for conduct of interdisciplinary human studies. Evaluation of biomarkers, preliminary studies, methodologic issues, quality control. Brief review of molecular biology. Applications and current literature discussed. Prerequisites: 511 or 512.

HSERV 536 Emerging Infections of International Public Health Importance (3) *Kimball* Overview of current emerging infections worldwide and contributing factors. Design of a surveillance and prevention strategy required.

PATHOBIOLOGY

PABIO 568 Molecular Epidemiology of Infectious Diseases (2) Application of molecular typing techniques to study of microbial pathogens to increase understanding of epidemiology of infectious diseases. Brief review of molecular biology. Evaluation of methods used in outbreaks and epidemics reported in literature. Prerequisites: 511 or 512 or permission of instructor.

GRADUATE SCHOOL OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS

PB AF 526 Program Evaluation (3) *Martin* Theory, practice, and politics of evaluation, from simple feedback mechanisms to evaluation of large-scale ongoing programs and social experiments. Emphasis on applications of experimental and quasi-experimental evaluation. Case studies drawn from health field illustrate various types of evaluation. Prerequisite: background in quantitative methods.

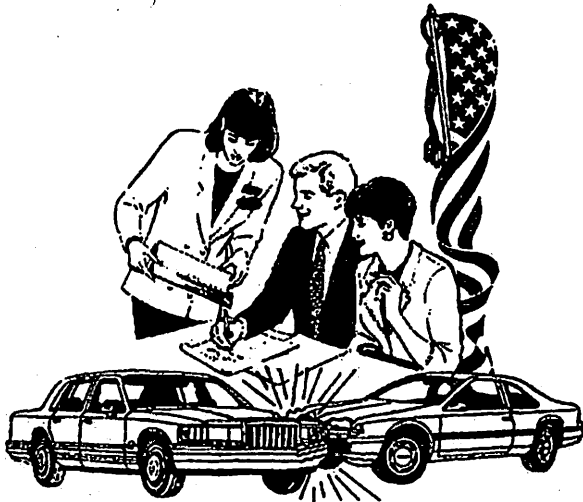

Bikes

Unless you're one of the chosen few lucky enough to own a car (although some people don't consider car payments, insurance, gas, maintenance and parking fees lucky), your basic mode of transportation is probably a bicycle.

There's a lot to be said for bicycle ownership. Biking is great for the environment and for your body; parking's never a hassle; you don't need expensive insurance; and you never have to buy gas. Even maintenance is affordable, especially if you do some of it yourself.

Below are some basic maintenance tips that every bike owner should know and follow:

CLEANING: On a monthly basis, wipe down the frame with a damp cloth to get rid of built up dirt and grime that can erode the paint job or rust a steel frame. At the same time, clean tire rims and brake pads with rubbing alcohol. Excess grit reduces the effectiveness of your brakes. **TOOLS:** cloth, rubbing alcohol, water

TIRE PRESSURE: Proper inflation increases the life of your tires, helps avoid rim damage and provides a better ride. Check your tire pressure regularly to catch slow leaks that could leave you stranded. Correct pressure for your particular tires can be found on the side of each tire. Also cup your hand around the tire (preferably while wearing a glove) and spin the tire to remove small bits of glass and detritus that could cause a flat. **TOOLS:** tire pump, glove (optional)

BRAKE ADJUSTMENT: You're speeding down the hill on your way to class when all of a sudden a car darts out in front of you. You quickly apply your brakes but nothing happens... Don't let this happen to you. Brake pads should be checked regularly for any wear and tear. Remove any dirt or grime embedded in your pads with rubbing alcohol and a piece of fine-grit sandpaper. Replace badly worn or deteriorated pads immediately. **TOOLS:** cloth, rubbing alcohol, fine-grit sandpaper

DRIVE TRAIN: What can be more irritating than a noisy chain? Well, actually quite a few things, but this article is about bikes, so the answer is a noisy chain. A noisy chain may not appear to be a big deal, but it could actually be symptomatic of a poorly maintained drive train. A drive train consists of derailleurs, chain, free wheel and the crank set. Regular cleaning of these parts with a good degreaser and lubricating of the chain with a good non-dirt collecting lubricant will improve and increase your pedaling efficiency. A noisy drive train and/or difficulty in shifting could indicate poorly aligned derailleurs. Since this could be a tricky thing to fix, it's best left to your mechanic. **TOOLS:** biodegradable degreaser, lubricant, cloth, old toothbrush

BOLT TIGHTENING: When giving your bike a good cleaning, check to see that all bolts are snug. Losing a wheel or other bike parts while racing to take your Psychology final is no fun. **TOOLS:** allen wrench

Always remember that major repairs should be left to a trained mechanic, but if you follow the basic preventive maintenance tips outlined above, your bike and your wallet will thank you.

From one who's been hit through no fault of his own, always remember to ride defensively and wear a helmet.

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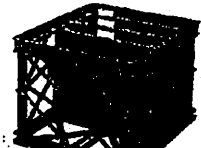

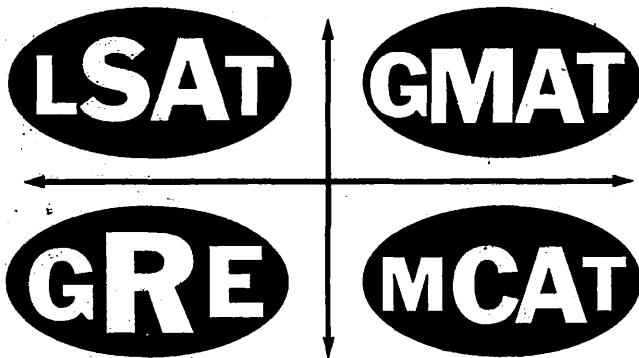

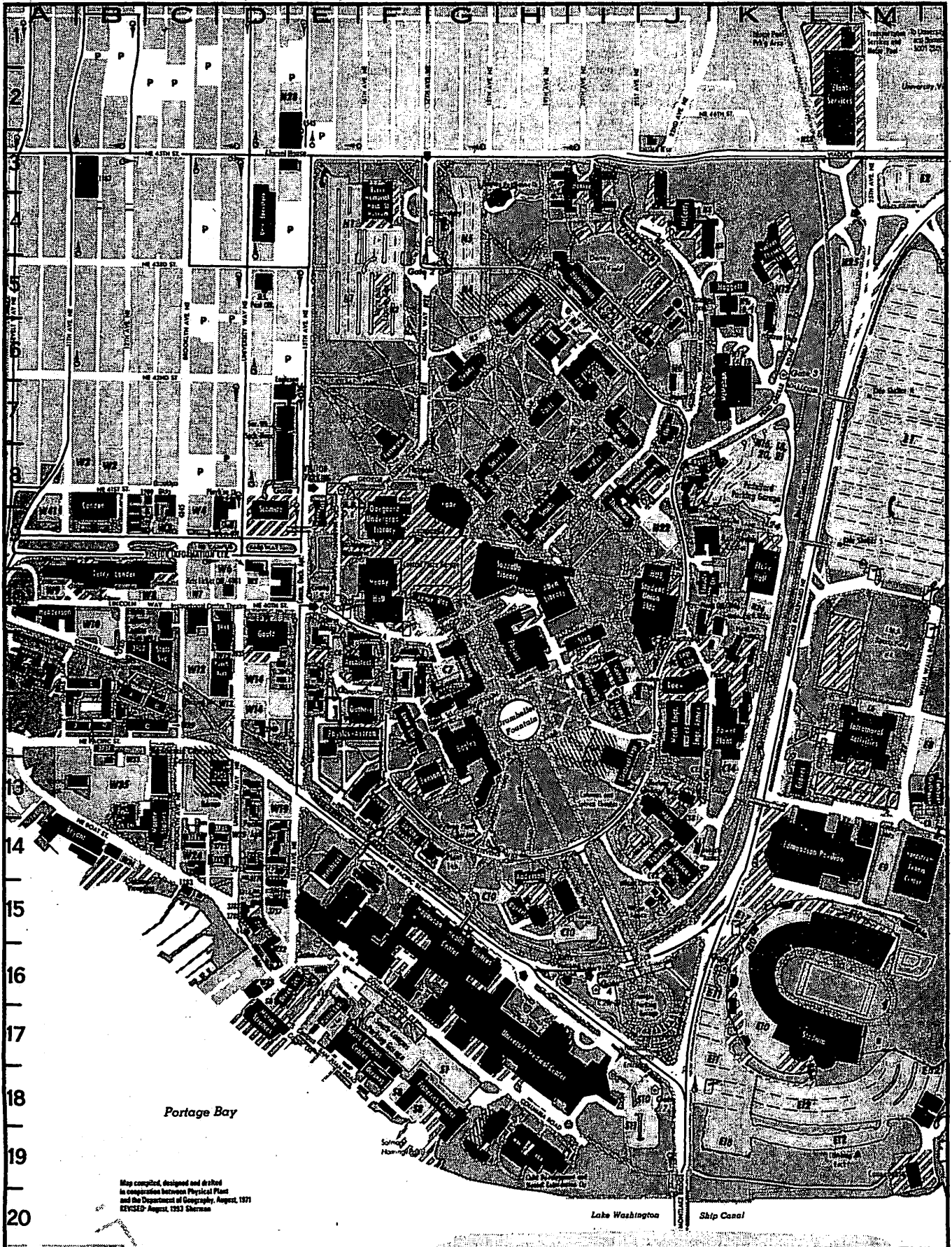
