What are Credit by Exams?

- Academic credit awarded to students who score well on certain exams.

What Academic Credits can be Awarded?

Additionally:

- Cannot award AP or IB credit off of High School transcripts.
- Credit by Exams are transferable to UWG if listed on USG transcripts.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

Advanced Placement

- Tests taken in high school for college credit
- Students must make a certain score to receive credit
- If a student says they have AP scores, have them submit through College Board to UWG (code 5900)
- AP scores are awarded “K” credit and can fulfill CORE requirements
- Once scores received, Transfer Team processes
- Large number of scores are received in July for processing

College Level Examination Program (CLEP)

- The College Level Examination Program is a rigorous program that allows students to demonstrate their knowledge of introductory college - level material and earn college credit. Students can earn credit for what they already know by getting qualifying scores on any of the accepted examinations
- Students may receive UWG credit by scoring a 50 on *most* exams, with the exception of 3 ENGL exams, which require a score of 60.
- CLEP scores are awarded “K” credit and can fulfill CORE requirements

College Level Examination Program (CLEP)

- If a student has CLEP scores, have them submit them through College Board to UWG (code 5900)

International Baccalaureate (IB)



- The IB Diploma program is a comprehensive and rigorous two -year curriculum for high school juniors and seniors, leading to examinations.
- There are two levels of examinations that are offered, based on the instructional time offered by the high school.
 - Standard Level (SL)
 - Higher Level (HL)
- Students may receive credit by scoring a 4, 5, 6, or 7.
 - A score of 6 or 7 will count towards honors credit at UWG.
- IB scores are awarded “K” credit and can fulfill CORE requirements

International Baccalaureate (IB) cont.

- Official IB Transcripts need to be sent to the Transfer Team for processing. Request: <https://www.ibo.org/>
 - The Team now has the ability to receive an email notification from IB that a student has requested their transcript be sent to UWG and a PDF can be downloaded and processed.
 - Email will be sent to student once IB transcript has been processed.


