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



PRIMUS Frizzle Fry (Caroline, 114 W. 26th St., New York, NY 10001)—San Francisco has had a fertile popular music scene

of one type or another for at least three decades, and with the ascension of both funk and thrash, there has been a spawning ground for many hybrid bands, with Primus being the pick of the litter. Primus sports a clever, unorthodox style that may take a few listens (and live experiences) to fully get, but once it hits home, it's like finally figuring out the meaning of that joke your brother used to tell that you never got, or realizing the meaning of a more obscure Far Side comic after coming back to it a second time. Led by the highly animated style of bassist/vocalist Les Claypool, whose vocals come close to matching Stan Ridgway or Jerry Lewis in the nasal register, Primus is a power trio that combines heavy head-banging riffing, high-voltage, acid-blues guitar, thumpasaurean bass stomps, tumultuous turn-on-a-dime crossrhythms, with comically absurd lyrics that ride some of the strangest but sturdiest grooves to ever rock your world. Primus is a musical Tarzan swinging from vine to vine in a jungle inhabited by such primal soulmates as Fishbone, Faith No More, Bad Brains and Soundgarden. While you're banging your head or shaking what your mama gave you to songs like ''John The Fisherman,'' ''Groundhog's Day,'' ''Pudding Time,'' ''As The Toys Go Winding Down,'' ''Too Many Puppies'' or ''Mr. Know It All,'' keep in mind that the complexity of the music is often obscured by how easy it is to groove to.


MATERIAL Seven Souls (Virgin, 9247 Alden Dr., Beverly Hills, CA 90210)—

Bill Laswell's revolving-door collective known as Material has been chomping at the musical bit for over 10 years now in various formations and with various missions. Material circa 1990 shows the Laswell posse—including Shankar on violin, Sly Dunbar on drums, Aiyb Dieng on percussion and Nicky Skopelitis on a vast array of exotic stringed instruments—creating soundscapes where otherworldly atmospheric conditions prevail and the rhythm meets the groove. And when you add the opiated lyrics of William Burroughs, African vocal choruses, and/or the bend of Middle Eastern string sounds, the dream layers become deeper and more vivid. Whether they're going after spooky, sci-fi funk textures that go from gooey and wind-blown to ritualistic gong and woodflute with Burroughs spliced on top ("The End Of Words," "The Western Lands"), or "I Zimbra"-styled beats with horns riffs, violin and found sounds pasted up in the mix ("Ineffect"), or simply laying out a murky, creeping bass line, bongo and kitdrum rhythms for Burroughs to deliver his sermon over, Material fixes you as if you're under a spell or on a secret voyage, taking you hostage but promising to bring you back safely.

ANTIETAM Burgoo (Triple X, 6715 Hollywood Blvd., Suite 284, Hollywood, CA 90028)—Antietam aren't the types to make a big to-do about their doingstheir music stands independently on the strength of its uncostumed, natural beauty and unpatronizing wit. This third album's been a massively long time in coming (not unlike Mazzy Star's), and to appease our impatience, we're treated to a doozy of a rock album, played at its most sensitive and sensible, coring straight to a non-reptilian center of emotion and holding the throbbing result up for everyone to admire. Tara Key's musical powers have taken on Amazonian proportions; both her vocals and guitar playing manage the trick of delicacy, subtlety and insight without a trace of fragility—the clarity and fine-eared detail of her guitar having more thunder than most heavier-handed rock efforts. The whole songbird-inflight simplicity and elegant strength of the album jets along too freely to box in, with no excesses and songs that're neither predictable or grabbing indiscriminately at ideas, and this LP isn't the easy sort that hits immediately. Antietam doesn't reinvent music, but they remain distant from the familiar and furthermore prove that you can make broad and lasting artistic statements without being fucked-up and immature. Cuts: "After The Tide," "Hesitation," "Eaten Up By Hate," "Imagining Green" and "Something's Happening."

MAZZY STAR She Hangs Brightly (Rough Trade, 611 Broadway, New York, NY 10012)—The Mazzy Star/Opal saga is a sordid and protracted one: It's responsible for dismay and frustration for Opal fans and one which we won't really get into because we've waited long enough to review this as it is. Hope Sandoval is the new brooding chanteuse who's been with the L.A.-relocatedto-Bay-Area band for a couple years and makes her vocal debut here; her laconic, lux-uriously slurred vocals make her sound like a nightclub gypsy rumpled and worn from a long night of 10-cent dances—in other words, a different shade than Kendra Smith, but the two characters grew up on the same side of the tracks. Dave Roback and the rest of the band lean back and provide the velvet cushion for Hope to do her stuff, with hazy slide guitars and tambourine just as langourous and hypnotic as before, but now with an even more detached, haunted air and not a tendril of psychedelia. Mazzy Star secretes opium-saturated splendor—this is music for lolling around with an ostrich plume in one hand and a glass of cheap red wine in the other, the trance-ability of their sorta-debut stronger than that of any other band this side of the Atlantic.

Dose up with "Blue Flower," "Give You My
Lovin'," "Ride It On" and "Be My Angel."

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FAMILY STAND Chain (Atlantic, 75 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10019)—It is not often that a group can fuse so many different musical styles on a debut LP as successfully and tastefully as this. While many artists have come to rely heavily on the beat to grab the attention dance programmers and record buyers, the Family Stand rhythm is much more subtle, without sacrificing power, one which incorporates everything from rock to clubfare to jazz, all revolving around some of the most soulful vocal solos and harmonies to come around in a while. The lyrics often deal with urban realities and hopes with more than a bit of humor, while the music has the relaxed attitude reminiscent of late '70s Earth, Wind & Fire, and builds upon the genre style-bent path laid by Prince, along with the slow-groove energy of recent dance music prophets Soul II Soul. For a trio to produce music this savvy proves this is a group about to bust loose, getting clubplay, carplay, and airplay on all types of radio formats simply because it's great music. After guesting on many other artists' albums, the individual members of the Family Stand—Peter Lord, V. Jeffrey Smith and Sandra St. Victor—have now spread their own wings, and with **Chain** will undoubtedly be considered an important group in the revitalization of contempor-ary R&B. Fave raves: "Ghetto Heaven," "Only," "In Summer I Fall," "Sweet Liberation" and the title track.



HOTHOUSE FLOWERS Home (London, clo PolyGram, 825 Eighth Ave., New York, NY 10019)—What was to eventually become the Hothouse Flowers began as Liam O'Maonlai (vo-

was to eventually become the Hothouse Flowers began as Liam O'Maonlai (vo-calist) and Fiachna O'Braonain (guitarist), who were street musicians in Dublin, playing an array of traditional trish instruments of which each has since award-winningly mastered. From these humble beginnings, Hothouse Flowers has gone on to establish a large and loyal following worldwide behind their 1988 debut **People**. This quintet's sophomore effort builds on the path of that work, and the result is a powerfully emotional album that keeps its Irish roots while convincingly exploring jazz, gospel, country, blues and rock 'n roll, creating a Gaelic hybrid of all these different styles. O'Maonlai's spirited vocals conjure up a smoother Van Morrison, but it is the diversity and soul of these songs that sets them apart from those of their more veteran countrymen or women. For starters, check out "Give It Up" (leading off Certain Damage Vol. 28),

"Hardstone City," "Christchurch Bells,"
"Movies," "I Can See Clearly Now" (an
uplifting cover of the Johnny Nash classic
which is also featured on the U.K.-only '70s
cover compilation, **Guilty Pleasures**)
and "Seoladh Na Ngamhna" for the more
traditional folks.



JOHN DOE Meet John Doe (DGC, 9130 Sunset Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90069)—Say, who's that tall, lanky guy over there with the guitar? Though you might not recognize him right away, John Doe's had no trouble keeping occupied since the untimely demise of X, in which he was one-quarter of one of the most dangerous bands to ever stroll the strip in early-'80s L.A. Now, after a handful of movies (Great Balls Of Fire, Road House and Salvador), he's finally found time to embark upon a long-awaited and duly deserved solo career. Aided and abetted by such henchmen as Richard Lloyd (best known for his shimmering guitar solos with Television), Jon Dee Graham (from Austin's True Believers), Tony Marsico (ex-Cruzados) and drummer Jeff Donovan (lately of country-rocker Dwight Yoakam's band), Doe borrows the old echo chamber from Sam Phillips' Sun Studios and the untamed guitar ferocity of **Wild Gift**, combining the twain in a fashious host lays to rest Doe's notorious past without abandoning it completely. Unfortunately for the faithful, that's not Exene on "Let's Be Mad," but Julie Christenson providing the he-and-she-wolf interplay that X fans know and love so well. John Doe proves on this introductory LP that he can still rock just as hard—in fact, a good bit harder in some ways—than he did in latter-day X. Sling your lariat around these cuts: "Let's Be Mad," "D To Get Home," "The Real One" or 'Dyin Touch Me Baby.



HARRY CREWS Naked In Garden Hills (Widowspeak, P.O. Box 800, Rockville Centre, NY 11571-0800/516-764-6200)—Harry Crews is a one-shot project that kept Lydia Lunch, Kim Gordon and Sadie Mae busy performing in Europe for a while (this LP was taken from a couple of those dates). The three pooled together for this labor of love, essentially a musical Cliff's Notes of 10 Harry Crews novels (he's not only a fine writer, but his works are about as hip to tote around town nowadays as Bukowski's were seven or eight years ago). There's lots of ways this concept could go wrong, but the three work and write well together, and both Kim's and Lydia's musical approaches suit

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ne abnormality-obsessed cynicism of Crews' work. Also, they let the strings fly where they may—which won't surprise of displease any fan of 1313 or Confusion Is Sex-for a slight return to old form that probably won't be glimpsed again from Lunch or Gordon anytime soon. The stream-of-ramble captures the kernel of Crews' writings with a mix of desperation and callousness, with the bits of remembered story rising clearly above the knelling, no-waving morass. All the story synopses are effectively off-putting in their own right, and there's versions of a couple oldies (Teenage Jesus' "Orphans" and the Youth's "She's In A Bad Mood") for extra fun. Oh, and this features plenty of fine Lydia live vignettes, like her berating the audience for their herd mentality, only to have them break into the customary applause when her harangue is finished.



O-POSITIVE ToyboatToyboat-Toyboat (Epic, P.O. Box 4450, New York, NY 10101-4450)—If you aren't familiar with the Arco billboard, Quincy Market or the "Combat Zone," chances are you don't know about Bos-ton's O-Positive—that is unless you recall the band's swell debut, 1985's Only Breathing FP on Throbbing Lobster, or **Breathing** EP on Throbbing Lobster, or their LP on Link. However, don't let the first single, "Back Of My Mind," confuse you—O-Positive really doesn't belong in the same boat with fellow Beantown barburners like the Del Fuegos or Treat Her Right, as that track would lead you to believe. With Boston College/WZBC alumnus Dave Herlihy at the helm, O-Positive's forte is moody, shadowy music with guitars that swirl like the wind before an impending storm. O+ signature tracks feature dark, brooding bass lines, somber piano coloration and stop-start drumming, contrasted by Herlihy's hearty, soaring vocals which can be likened to **Reckoning**-era Stipe or Miracle Legion's Mark Mulcahy. Draw blood with the lovely "Imagine That," featuring warm E-bow tones and accordion—it's as radio-ready as the less representative single. Also play these 10 times fast: "Overflow," "Kamikaze Dove" and "On To Something."



MARK STEWART Metatron (Mute, c/o Restless, 11264 Playa Ct.,
P.O. Box 3628, Culver City, CA
90231-3628)—Ever since that fateful
day at a New Music Seminar when the two
masters of Armageddon dub, Mark Stewart

and Adrian Sherwood, kidnapped the baddest beats in da bizness—the Sugar Hill Gang rhythm section of Doug Wimbish and Keith LeBlanc—and took them under cover of darkness to record in London, they've become known as the most notorious dub terrorists to ever hijack a studio. On beatheavy rants like the Ministry-esque "Colli-(an Alain Jourgensen/Mafia pairing would be a dream come true!), or through the eerie electro-crackle of "These Things Happen," Stewart's crew kicks some of the heaviest dub terrorism around, hitting hard like a cap in the knees, and they come down heavy like sinking your feet into fresh cement blocks. Like one of the garbled samples weaving its way in and out of the mix keeps mechanically repeating, Mark Stewart and his henchmen are "A walking time bomb/An accident waiting to occur." Look out, world, the Mob are about to go nova.



URGE OVERKILL Americruiser (Touch And Go, P.O. Box 25520, Chicago, IL 60625)—The Urge three decided to become a monstrous furry rock beast, the likes of which they've never held for a whole LP, looking to stir up trouble and trash as many road motels as their touring itinerary allows. While not of the lumberjackin', meat-eatin' Tad-imitatin' stripe, the brutish indelicate roar that trundles on song after song captures its own stubbly, unwashed revelry and distorts it to DWI levels. Urge Overkill is a good deal stouter this go-round in impenetrable, unslowable distorted thud, and while the gruff, whiskery bray of the vocals (Nate's) and bucking, fuzzballed guitar (Nate's again) are indicative of that Minneapolis Soul Asylum method, Urge won't stand still under anyone's shadow. An encapsulation of what it means to live the plaid-shirted, road-traveling dusty life of a rock conquistador hasn't had such a rough appeal since replaced-Replacement Bob Stinson took a shit in the ice bucket for the last time. Urge Overkill wrestles with exultant, amplified clutter that is impressively loud and barely coherent; what emerges is a heroic update of American band mythology. Play these in your van: 'Ticket To L.A.,'' ''Smokehouse,'' ''Blow Chopper'' and ''Empire Builder.''

SOMETHING HAPPENS Stuck Together With God's Glue (Charisma, 1790 Broadway, New York, NY 10019)—Imagine the melding of a southern jangle-pop band—anything that was produced by Don Dixon or Mitch Easter—and a sister band from the British Isles, such as House Of Love, and you can envision a spot on the pop map for Something Happens. Stuck Together With God's Glue, the stateside debut from this Irish quartet, has enough hooks to keep you humming all summer and plenty of vocal harmonies to have you singing along in no time. Witness those invaluable pop characteristics in "Hello, Hello, Hello, Hello, Hello, Hello, Hello (Petrol)" (the first single) and "I Had A Feeling," one of the many tunes with an extremely hummable chorus. Then

dig into "The Patience Business," with a horn bit purchased straight from a shop on Penny Lane, and the anthemic ballad "Kill The Roses." This band is even feisty This band is even feisty enough to name a song after a '70s porn flick, "The Devil In Miss Jones," and make it a love song! Producer Ed Stasium (Living Color, Smithereens, Ramones) gives each song a radio-ready polish without muffling any of the band's youthful energy, making this one of the more accomplished debuts to sail across the Atlantic.



JERRY HARRISON: CASUAL GODS Walk On The Water (Fly/Sire, clo Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91510)—Jerry Harrison staked a claim to new ground on his 1988 solo LP, moving further away from the Heads and delving into his own realms of sound. Welding spiky guitars and teeming, tense keyboard fills on top of obtuse, jagged dance funk, Harrison and his band map out a landscape similar to that of his last LP (apparently that was the name of the band, not the record's title). Adding his thin and wiry vocals on top of the mix—it's amazing at times how much Harrison's voice sounds like David Byrne's—he often supplements these with "Houses In Motion"-style back-up singers to vary the tensions and mood. If Tom Tom Club watched the late night news and all those CBS news exposes and Sunday-night Fox crime specials, they might make an album as dark and sinister in its funk/pop vision: a late night postiche of channel-flipping cutups of grim newscasts, cable talk shows, 970-number commercials and strange PBS documentaries. If your favorite Talking Heads period was the heady atmospherics of Fear Of Music and Remain In
Light, then check out the balmy, tropical
pop of the Tom Tom Club-like "Sleep
Angel" or the dark and unsettling vision
of "I Cry For Iran," "Flying Under Radar" and particularly the eerie and unforget-table "The Doctors Lie."




MARK LANEGAN The Winding Sheet (Sub Pop, P.O. Box 20645, Seattle, WA 98102/206-441-8441)—You know who this is, or rather you thought you did: the Screening Trees vocalist/guitarist sheds the psychotronic paisley-tinted foliage of said rock outfit for a dive into the cold realities of everyday rock-bottom heartbreak. 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




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such is about as stunning in impact as it is in dissimilarity to the Trees. The bounty of instrumentation is about as dense as a Tree LP, but the effect here is much starker and we're going to quit the comparisons right now, since the acoustic guitar-based, electric guitar-augmented, light-on-percussion featherbed of misery is a galaxy wholly removed. The achingly mournful tone of Lanegan's music still has an airy, free-floating expansiveness permeating the doldrums—even when he's singing about drowning his sorrows in liquor and drugs, a chorus comes along that levitates reality better than mere chemicals. Lanegan follows the grievance textbook inscribed in Big Star's **Third** approach, but the songs have a mushy, tender vulnerability that veers away from a cut-and-dried wallow, making this recording suitable for even those who don't get a kick out of lingering depression. Cuts: "Woe," "Mockingbirds," "Down In The Dark," "Eyes Of A Child" and the title



MY LIFE WITH THE THRILL KILL KULT Confessions Of A Knife... (Wax Trax, 1659 N. Damen, Chicago, IL 60647)—Mr. Groovy Mann and Mr. Buzz McCoy are crusading once more with promises of sex, drugs and a disco ball sacrifice to the Beast below. Pollinating leather bar attitude with glitter from an explosion in the Saturday Night Fever wardrobe locker, and occasionally gassing it up with acid-cymbal high in the mix over sound and voice snips, Thrill Kill Kult has bred quite a venus fly trap with Confessions Of A Knife... "A Daisy Chain for Satan" opens the LP, pulsing with death-acid righteousness, and along with "Ride The Mindway" and an edit of last year's hit, "Kooler Than Jesus," should keep quite a few butts-a-go-go this summer. Some very cool samples creep under and over the mixes and often tie songs together, and on "Waiting For Mommie," everything from the freaky Chic classic to messages left on TKK's answering machine by the Wax Trax office are used to produce a shameless good time. Other Kill thrills: "Rivers Of Blood, Years Of Darkness," "The Days Of Swine And Roses" and both themes on the title track.



ALI FARKE TOURE African Blues (Shanochie, 14 E. Clinton St., NJ 07860)—Ali Farke Toure plays acoustic blues, taking an American art form directly back to its African roots, transposing and

translating it back into what must have been its original language. Noting similarities between John Lee Hooker records and traditional Malian music, Toure began in the '50s to unravel the origins of blues by adapting what he heard back to its original African context. Though he was not supposed to be a musician (in Mali, only members of certain familes are expected to become griots), he broke with convention by adopting the griot's life in spite of the social pressures against a man of his stat ure taking such a calling. Toure's mesmerizing vocals and resonant guitar lines are un-fortunately marred here only by a lack of adequate lyrical translations and musical explanations, but the interview segments transcribed in the liner notes do shed light on this mysterious and compelling performer. Sadly, these could be among his last recordings (and his brief U.S. tour last spring could be among his last performances ever), as Toure has now given up music to pursue a life as a holy man dedicated to the study of the Koran. In a world where too many musicians seem only concerned with massive ego-tripping, royalty checks and their next lucrative Pepsi endorsement. Ali Farke Toure's music was and is powerful testimony to the power of music the world over.



CONCRETE BLONDE Bloodletting (I.R.S., 3939 Lankershim Blvd., Universal City, CA 91604)—Trimming back down to a trio for their third album, L.A.'s Concrete Blonde offers another strong recording—one that will further establish vocalist Johnette Napolitano as one of rock's leading female singers. With the power and sass of Chrissie Hynde, and the confidence and charm of Grace Slick in her prime, Johnette Napolitano (also the bassist) leads the band through a variety of moods that are as comfortable in a hard rock setting as they are in a ballad ambiance. Her rhythm-section cohort, former Roxy Music drummer Paul Thompson, keeps the feel taut behind James Mankey's fiery guitar work that at times proves the album's title to be apt. These are three talented musicians who consistently manage to pool their abilities into a unified whole, rather than simply a showcase for their individual powers, producing a set of powerful deviations from standard rock fare. For starters, plug into "Days & Days," "Lullabye," "Bloodletting," "Caroline" and "Darkening Of The Light," which features R.E.M.'s Peter Buck.

KOKO TAYLOR Jump For Joy (Alligator, P.O. Box 60234, Chicago, IL 60660)—Koko Taylor, the queen of the blues, is a big, burly mama with a gruff, tough blues voice that's built to last. Koko's at her best when she's infusing her massive blues-power into solid, churning funk tunes and anchoring creeping, sturdy blues walks and ballads with that powerhouse voice—one that doesn't so much pack a knockout punch as it does slowly unleash its ferocity like a grizzly awaking from winter slumber. Jump For Joy reinforces Koko's stature as one of the

most forceful voices on the blues circuit to-day with her band driving the blues home with authority. When Koko wants an exclamation point she practically freezes the moment with a hushed, low-down growl, keeping the momentum building but preventing the lid from blowing off. She also tells it like it is, whether holding court, warning the ladies on "Stop Watching Your Enemies," ribbing all back-door men with a plain-as-day blues analogy ("Fishing Trip") or revving up the hip-shakin' house party with a blues rocker like "The Eyes Don't Lie" or the funky "I Don't Want No Leftovers." For some added joy, jump into "It's A Dirty Job," in which Koko messes around with Lonnie Brooks on a playful blues romp.

VARIOUS ARTISTS Live At The Knitting Factory Volume 3 (A&M, 1416 N. LaBrea Ave., Hollywood, CA 90028)—It seems that the series of live compilation albums from NYC's Knitting Factory have begun to blossom in much the same way as the club first did some four or five years ago; what started out as just a good, simple idea at its inception slowly but surely has picked up momentum, success and recognition along the way. For those who might not be familiar with the little Lower Manhattan club, it's become a veritable music mecca where bands as diverse and divergent as Negativland, Last Exit, King Missile, the Microscopic Septet and Galaxie 500 might all tread its stage in any given week. Of the three compilations so far, this one probably fits together the best as a whole; while the first may have had bigger names and the second may have challenged more frontiers, this latest installment flows from one song and artist to the next with much the same unexpected logic that holds together many of the venue's more intriguing bills. Starting out with a peppering of the light avant-garde (Doc-tor Nerve, No Safety), it quickly moves through more straight-ahead jazz (Thomas Chapin Trio), and on into the total noise-collage weirdness of Negativland and beyond—don't let a single track slip by. Rarely does one compilation add so many different sounds to one's music library, but **Volume 3** lives up to the rep of all its predecessors, and we dearly hope there are plenty more to come.



HELLCATS Hoodoo Train (New Rose, c/o Lisa McGaughran, P.O. Box 40647, Memphis, TN 38174)—The Hoodoo Train runs 16 coaches long, with "Where The Hell Is Memphis" up at the head, plowing away as its runaway engine, belching black soot and thunder, menacing silver headlights slicing through the darkness down the tracks. For the uninitiated, the Hellcats are sort of a female version of vintage Tav Falco & The Panther Burns, back when his albums used to be murky motorcycle rock swampabilly sessions that mystery guitarist "LX" Chilton doesn't remember too well. Recorded in the humid dank of Memphis in the dead of a moonlit night last year,

Hoodoo Train captures the raucous and gutsy guitars and stray-cat meow of Memphis' greatest-ever all-girl band as they rip, rattle and purr through nine originals and nine mostly obscuro vintage R&B and blues covers. Though things sorta slow down a bit towards the middle, both the top and the bottom of this release (the CD tacks on their must-have 1988 EP, Cherry Mansions) are so hot and steamy, they're sure to wilt even the most creased and starched of collars. There's way too many dig-able tracks here to list them all, but try "Where The Hell Is Memphis," "Hoodoo Train," "Back Door Slam," "Baby Please Don't Go," the tender and smoky ballad "Love Is Dying" and anything off the EP; they're guaranteed to keep you up on those hot, humid nights.



JESUS LIZARD Head (Touch And Go, P.O. Box 25520, Chicago, IL 60625)—This is the first LP from this infamously lewd (David Yow, specifically), cataclysmically punk rock (live, undeniably), impressively pedigreed band. They stay beet-red from start to finish, exhausting various forms of mutant aggression conveyable through a three-piece electric lineup, in a stylee commonly associated with Chicago, though particulars here helped write the textbook in Austin (Scratch Acid). David Yow's task, to a more vaunted extent here than the previous EP, involves screaming garbled epithets with admirable stamina and providing a continuous flow of uncontrollable id to contrast the more refined, sculptured rage of guitar (Duane Denison) and the tension-snapping drums of ex-86'er Mac McNeilly. This venting of the spleen is shared by fuel burners like Tar, Arsenal and Slint on the slower segments, but the Lizard doesn't follow a subgenre—remember these were some of the prime inventors. On this LP, and to a broader and fuller extent live, they define and cement how far an exercise in taut, trebly renditions of repressed anger will strain without splattering. Vein-poppers: "S.D.B.J.," "Pastoral" "One Evening" and "Tight N' Shiny."


LAVA HAY Lava Hay (Nettwerk, clo Polydor, 825 Eighth Ave., New York, NY 10019)—Fans of country-folk and soaring harmonies, prepare to die and go to heaven! Lava Hay is basically Michelle Gould and Susan Little, two Canadian women whose pure, dusky, lilting voices mesh so beautifully that this record is practically trance-inducing. The music is primarily acoustic, embellished throughout by a wide array of traditional instruments and arrangements that often make the record seem like it's from an earlier era; producer Steve Berlin (of Los Lobos) has thankfully opted for a subtle, organic sound where others would have opted for a BIG production, which is why this album succeeds where others have failed. While a duo with harmonies like this could probably

extract melody from a Milli Vanilli composition, they resist the option of relying on their voices and have written some powerful and memorable songs. While the whole album is impressive, the most obvious radio tracks are "Waiting For An Answer" and "Wild Eyes," but also try "Baby," "Won't Matter," "Holding On" the country-ish "My Friend" and the chilling "Midnight Sun."



THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS
One Sided Story (Chrysalis, 645
Madison Ave., New York, NY
10022)—We kind of doubt The Pursuit
Of Happiness songwriter/vocalist/guitarist
Moe Berg donned any Egyptian garb after
Utopia released Ra, switched to futuristic/
new wave clothing circa Adventures In
Utopia or opted for a more conservative
appearance for Swing To The Right,
but we'll bet in an instant that he scribbled
"Todd Is God" on at least one of his
high school notebooks. Fortunately, Todd
Rundgren must believe that imitation is
the sincerest form of flattery, because one
listen to the hollow oil-drum snare on One
Sided Story immediately tells you he
once again produced the Canadian band.
Berg's high voice carries the simple, resonant hooks over a ringing tapestry of guitars with lush harmonies doubling the
songs' power. One Sided Story shows
much greater depth than TPOH's debut,
Love Junk; if the band keeps maturing
at this rate, their third LP should be devastating. Hot pursuits: "New Language,"
"Something Physical," "All I Want"
and "Survival."

TRAGIC MULATTO Chartreuse
Toulouse (Alternative Tentacles,
P.O. Box 11458, San Francisco, CA
94101/415-541-5305)—Tragic Mulato has been slithering around San Francisco and the world-at-large for something approaching a decade now, and are one of a few bands for whom "progression"—development in any one direction or even a change in direction—is a moot point. Asking them to neaten up their sound or to eliminate the butter cubes from their shows is like asking Sinead to grow long flowing locks—you're welcome to ask, but just don't expect it to happen anytime soon. The usual overtones of orgiastic bestiality (actually, TM evokes images of any non-missionary-position sexual act) rise and fall with the usual slow churn, but on Toulouse, Mulatto flashes back to the freakiest and most degenerate '60s counterculture stoner bands—the rhythmic gyrations, voodoo-cult chanting, lugubrious guitars and salacious tuba merge into one inhibition-releasing, consciousness-addling grind. Toulouse is where Squeaky Fromme and Jesus Christ Superstar find common ground, providing slurping accompaniment to the most way-out happenings conceivable in our paranoid times. Cuts: "I Don't Mind," "Rhythm Of Barcelona," "Scabs On Lori's Arm" and "Man With A Tan."



VARIOUS ARTISTS Homeland 2: A Collection Of Black South African Music (Rounder, 1 Camp St., Cambridge, MA 02140)—In response to the overwhelming success of Rounder's previous African compilation, Homeland (a Grammy nominee in 1988), Rounder has again assembled a wonderful and enthusiastic compilation of brilliant African pop reflecting a wide range of styles and sounds of African pop's heritage and flavor. Among the highlights here are the bubbling rhythms and trilling hi-hat cymbal work that carries the pulse of South African music, and there's plenty of exuberance in the 16 tracks collected here. Amongst the sea of lively, bouncing pop songs, be sure and check out the Boyoyo Boys' two tracks, Makhweu's contribution and the mellow strumming and harmony singing of the Newcastle Five Roses. Our personal favorite of the bunch, however, would have to be the performance recorded by Molahlehi, a mysteriously anonymous singer who appeared one day at a studio in South Soto, recorded one album's worth of material, told the studio's producer he would return to complete the work and strangely was never heard from again. His name translated means "the lost one," and his identity still remains a mystery some four years later, but now his bright and lilting melody has been carried far beyond the borders of the town from which he came.

MOSE ALLISON My Backyard (Blue Note, c/o Capitol, 1750 N. Vine St., Hollywood, CA 90028)—The idea of Mose Allison recording in New Orleans seems an enticing one—lots of folks have always thought that the modernday king of jazz blues piano might find a sympathetic setting in the relaxed and bluesy atmosphere of the birthplace of jazz itself. Indeed, this proves to be extraordinarily true. Here, the man in the white beard is paired with some of the city's younger (in Mose's case, most of the musicians have a decade or two less experience under their belts!), yet most energetic rising alents playing in support. Drummer John Vidacovich adds a unique second-line-strut feel to several numbers ("Big Brother," "Long Song") while retaining Mose's traditional loose-and-laid-back groove throughout, with Tony Dagradi's echoing, faintly melancholy sax sounding like it could be wafting from an open window in the heart of a French Quarter evening. Other 'Nawlins cats like Steve Masakowski on guitar and bassist Bill Huntington round out a deft and nimble backing quartet, as My Backyard explores that mysterious connection between New York and New Orleans, linking the Big Apple with the Big Tomato through the common bond of the blues. Curl up with some etouffe and check out these Mose gems: the sassy and humorous "Ever Since I Stole The Blues," "You Call It Joggin", ""Stranger In My Hometown," the eloquent "Was," or for the true Crescent City feel, try "Big Brother," "That's Your Red Wagon" or the title track.



CHRIS THOMAS Cry Of The Prophets (Sire, clo Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA

91510)—There's a new prophet crying in the musical wilderness who combines the nose-earring philosophy of Lenny Kravitz with the voodoo-chile-slight-return guitar of Stevie Ray Vaughan and the juiced-up funk of Around The World In A Day-era Prince—and this new seer's name is Chris Thomas. Like Lenny, he knows how to lay down '60s psychedelicisms on top of sweaty testifying soul grooves, deriving influences from Motown and John Lee Hooker to the Plastic Ono Band. But Thomas fills the spaces in those lean grooves with some mean Texas-twister guitar riffs recalling the Stratocasters of Johnny Winter or Stevie Ray. While Kravitz may cover "If 6 Was 9" live in concert, we'd rather hear Chris do a song like
"Voodoo Chile" or "In From The
Storm"—his sound's a little heavier, spunkier, and gutsier than Lenny's, supplemented by bigger, fuller production. Sometimes Thomas tiptoes a wee bit too close for comfort (there's one embarrassing part in "Alpha Omega" where he screams "I'm the original, man!" after copping Hendrix licks for three minutes), but most of on his debut. Our picks: the too-tight-for-anything-but-a-CD-player segue between "Angel Lady" and "Heart And Soul," the Prince-ly soulful ballads "Help Me Some-body" or "I'm Gonna Make It." If cosmic spirituality and hippie headgear are signs o' the times, Thomas could prove to be one of the guiding lights of the Aquarian '90s.

BARKMARKET The Easy Listening Record (Purge, 641 N. Highland Ave., #6, Atlanta, GA 30306/404-892-1132)—While other noisemongers might roll over and play dead, Barkmarket wiggles along with the same sort of scatological frenzy that fueled many of the Butthole Surfers' lysergic dirges and jams in bygone days, with the lead singer crooning and hiccupping through a bullhorn in much the same way Austin's brownest sons did circa Psychic Powerless, Another Man's Sac. Concerned programmers should scan the lyric sheet and might want to double check the untitled songs or the ones which aren't printed (warning: that's usually a sign that they're pretty good, for instance one contains the excellent line "and your ass is in a questionable position!"). The Market is also cutting new technological ground as well, strafing the record with garbled megaphone transmissions a la Mark E. Smith,

warped tape derailment, fiddling with the pitch control and sticking their echoplexes into infinite loops. This album takes on a greater scope of sonic dishevelment than any previous ravings we unearthed, making for excellent and un-easy listening indeed. Sometimes (but by no means a detraction), the grit and gristle of the recording make it sound as if it was pressed from a bootleg tape of a garbled shortwave transmission of a King Biscuit Flour Hour beamed from another planet where people don't necessarily think melody is a beautiful thing. Top Cuts: "Happy," "Sonny," "Untitled," "Buy America."



CONTROLLED BLEEDING Trudge (Wax Trax, 1659 N. Damen, Chicago, IL 60647)—When the term "industrial" was first coined to describe the likes of Throbbing Gristle, Zev, Monte Cazzaza and even Cabaret Voltaire in the early years, the music was a clutter of noise and grind with a highly aggressive beat (if any) that most clubs wouldn't dare touch in the heyday of disco. Controlled Bleeding has evolved from these formative years of the industrial sound, and 10 years after the band's formation and a number of albums later, Trudge provides an idea where the band may be headed. The industrial influence still hovers over the sound, and the screech and samples still work well, but what we're hearing now is a sense of melodicism taking the place of the unstructured assault that seemed to hold this trio back from radio and club success. The recent single, "Words (Of The Dying)," is included here, and along with "The Fodder Song" should soon infiltrate many of the club floors keeping a close ear to new sounds. More than just for industrodance tracks, the LP is meant to be a listening experience, with hilarious samples on "The Front," rapid tribal rhythms and

chimes pushing along "Kiss (The Hand Of Genocide," a sensible pop melody with "Crimes Of The Body," and the screaming funk of "Christ Said..."



HENRY BUTLER Orleans Inspiration (Windham Hill Jazz, 1416 N. LaBrea Ave., Hollywood, CA 90028)—On Orleans Inspiration,

pianist Henry Butler pays homage to his native city, teaming with players like Meters guitarist Leo Nocentelli (hear him burn on "Come Back Jack"), who also knows what it means to miss New Orleans. But Butler, who recorded two jazz records for Impulse!-MCA, was classically trained as a pianist and singer, so it's nearly impossible for him to stick to any one style while doing justice to his craft. And while Butler's musical know-how and fancy fingerwork can often take the music into another dimension, especially when he plays solo piano—"Orleans Inspiration," "Goin" Down Slow" and "Dr. James," his tribute to the inspired piano wizard and fellow New Orleanian James Booker, are all stellar—there are a few curious juxtaposi tions that stand out. Most noticeable is the use of synthesizers, which sounds foreign and clinical in a setting of steamy, organic New Orleans funk, no matter how dazzling the playing is. And while Butler's dignified, sturdy vocals may sound unsettling at first because they combine the bravado of opera and the wail of soul, they add in trigue and presence to the mix, instead of burning the roux. Butler, who can play New Orleans-style piano with the best of em, makes it perfectly clear that while the Crescent City has been a huge inspiration, it's always a little tough going home to that same old used-to-be



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
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

VARIOUS ARTISTS The Last Temptation Of Elvis (NME, IPC Magazines Ltd., King's Reach Tower, Stamford Street, London, SE1 9LS, United Kingdom)—The King continues to be worth as much dead as alive. He now serves as the musical inspiration for this two-CD set compiled by NME magazine, with all proceeds supporting London's Nordoff-Robbins Music Therapy Centre, where mentally or physically disabled children are helped through shared musical activity. This all-star tribute features 26 lovable musical memories from Elvis' innumerable cinematic indiscretions (personal fave: Elvis as a do-gooder inner-city M.D. and Mary Tyler Moore as a nun in Change Of Habit). Tracks most likely to be heard at a supermarket in Michigan: the Pogues' "Got A Lot O' Livin' To Do," Jesus And Mary Chain's "Guitar Man," Cath Carroll And Steve "The Pelvis" Albini's "King

Creole," the Cramps' "Jailhouse Rock," Lemmy & The Upsetters' "Blue Suede Shoes" and the Primitives' "Baby I Don't Care."


INSPIRAL CARPETS Caol As ****
(EP) (Cow, clo Rough Trade,
611 Broadway, New York, NY
10012)—Currently riding high on the
U.K. charts with their Mute LP, Life (due
for a stateside release in September), Inspiral Carpets makes their American debut
with this U.S.-only collection of their wildly
successful independent singles. On first listen, the Carpets cheerfully wheezy, '60sinspired farfisa swirl seems remarkably
simple, even slight, to have inspired such
gushing adulation from the capricious British press. When thought of as individual
singles, though, it's quite obvious what all
the hubbub was about—not since the Buzzcocks' first 45s has there been such an
impetuous batch of amphetamine blasts.
"Joe," "So Far" and "Find Out Why" fly
by in classic two-minute fashion, while the
nearly 17-minute long "Plane Crash" resembles the hallucinogenic freak-outs of
Red Krayola.

ICE CUBE "AmeriKKKa's Most Wanted" (12") (Priority, 6430 Sunset Blvd., Hollywood, CA 90028)—The first battle in the war waged by now ex-N.W.A. member Ice Cube is curiously titled and probably has a good interpretation behind it that only Cube should explain. He is out with a vengeance to expose the authorities' racist policies in American society. His streettough lyrics slice like a razor through the musical assault launched by Chuck D, Hank and Keith Shocklee and Eric "Vietnam"

Sadler of Public Enemy fame; you definitely get the best of both coasts. Look out for the full LP, also entitled **AmeriKKKa's Most Wanted**.

AJAX "One World" (12") (Wax Trax, 1659 N. Damen, Chicago, IL **60647**)—This is a sneaky record that tests your ability to really listen, and although you may have followed the record's instructions to play at 33, 45 rpm is the key—unless of course you actually like to play around with your speed and pitch controls for dirge-like or chipmunk effects. However, we believe this New York combo did not intend to record a dirge, and on 45, this is a great dance single mixing the shift and grind of industrial music with the bells and sirens prevalent in house music. Produced by Mark Kamins (of Madonna and Karen Finley fame), four different mixes are provided, so pick one fitting your mood or favorite soap opera.

LORDS OF ACID "I Sit On Acid" (12") (PolyGram, 825 Eighth Ave., New York, NY 10019)—Available for well over a year now as an Antler/Subway import single and on various new beat compilations—most recently on PolyGram's This Is The New Beat collection—it is no surprise to see this 12" re-emerge once more. "I Sit On Acid" is one of the best of the Belgian beat, with grinding synths plowing over a heavy bass and, like much of this genre, has a number of key phrases and moans lifted from various porn movies. Needless to say, it may be to your advantage to do some crafty overdubbing to keep the FCC off your back, but for clublife, it'll slip in just fine.

CHRIS BURKE Idioglossia (Avant-Mode, P.O. Box 375, Kew Gardens, NY 11415)—This recording af saunds faund and created camprises Burke's first effart under his awn name, his previous brushes with airplay having to do with his **Bam-Bam** project, a series af genre-happing cassettes released under various names. This multiplicity af maod is **Idioglossia**'s most immediately apparent tag—all-encampassing caol ambience is affixed to the electronic, acaustic and sampled U-turns in and out of saciopathic electro-shack dance, subtle perversions of the spoken ward, deceptively mellow woad-nymph lullabies and a slew of other stretches of synthesized consciousness. The gamut af emational aloafness (what Burke can do with a keybaard and a sampler is raughly akin to Adrian Belew and his game-preserve guitar) can roughly be divided between impasitions of severe, compulsive beat nihilistics and gliding, claud-residing drumless keybaard baths; Burke's saphisticated inclusian of keybaard baths; Burke's saphisticated inclusian of only the most integral camponents within the stark arrangements creates a sympathetic mix af mechanical coolness and evacative melodic detail. Same af the synth-space sprees get a bit too wussy far tolerance, but Burke's current vocatian as a camposer is brought to atmospheric nirvana on this disc with a tauch of class inherent in even the most viciaus dub decapitatians. Like we mean: "Lifeless," "Freud," "The Hat Makes The Man," "A Little Yes And A Big No," "Happy In Heaven" and "The Bold One."

Move over Thurston, here comes Nelson Emanating from some point in the cosmos just outside of Springfield, Virginia, **Sonic Mandala** (804-355-9748) is taking jazz from its zoot-suited, wayfared cool bebop origins, and blasting it out to somewhere on the rim of the galactic cloud, giving jazz a Jandek-like treatment that ends up so fractured, and just plain out there, that it makes Cecil Taylor sound like Scott Joplin and makes Sun Ra look like the pianist on Mr. Rogers' Neighborhood. Sounding like a 1,000-year-old dali lama scatsinging to free jazz played by six-fingered reptiles, this multi-guitared and multi-textured ensemble rips dense and tangled jams through the underbrush of the avant garde—though their attack is less razar-sharp than John Zorn ond Naked City, and not as bellicose as Last Exit. On the flipside of that medallion, later on in this free-flowing tape the Mandala apon in this free-flowing tape the Mandala approaches levels of zen-like quiet not tapped by mortals since the days of King Crimson; the last passages of "Blue Body Of Water" are almost as breathless in their own timid quietness as the first blasts of "Chozhag" are in terms of sheer volume and impact. Alas, when all is said and done, like the pock marks and craters of the lunar surface, Sonic Mandala reflects much light but gives off none of their own, at this point merely refracting the contributions of giants like Ornette Coleman, Peter Brotzmann, Borbetomagus, Sun Ra and Peter Brotzmann, Borbetomagus, Sun Ra and others who have burned the brush away from the road before them... Hey, you dropped your subdivision fiber peanut butter in my coffinl... Led by the bia burly bass of Store Led by the big burly bass of Steve Conn and Joe Lapsley's lippy vocals on their LP Funeral Mountain, Neighborhood Texture Jam (Feralette Records, 2012 West

End Ave., Nashville, TN 37203) piles on layers of toxic-shock sound—heavy, popping bass, hardcore guitars and spunky, Faith No More-esque sarcastic vocals spewed through bullhorns—to create a funky and dense melee where no sleeper-hold is too tight and no punch is too low. Kind of a cross between Gang Of Four and Slovenly, the Texture Jam doesn't seem too concerned with how it all pans out in the final mix, but rather with the actual act of strapping on their fiercely over driven guitars, flailing away on various drums and percussion, blurting through saxophones, bullhorns and microphones with reckless aban-

don. Though they're obviously still young enough to whip themselves into a Dead Kennedys frenzy ("Environmental Song") and to derive great glee from shouting words like "scrotum" really loud ("Torsos Of Murdered "scrotum" really loud ("Torsos Of Murdered People"), and even though some cuts ("Borax Factory," "Bikers") need another 10 or 15 minutes on the grill, others like "Runnin' From Miami," "The Big Johnson," "Looking For Heroin" or "Don't Get Loud With Me, Bitch" are rough, raw and ready to go ... Sweet, tangy and they fizz when you suck on 'em ... Strawberry Zots is happy, bouncy and reeling in paisley potions—somewhere bereeling in paisley potions—somewhere be-tween Yellow Submarine and an Apple Jacks commercial in their unrelentingly chipper buzz. Cars, Flowers, Telephones (Acid Test, c/o the Zots, P.O. Box 21788, Albuquerque, NM 87154/505-899-0826) contains a beach umbrella-load of tambourine-shaking teen beats, creating a sparkling psychedelic sandbox where the sun never clouds over and their Farfisa is never obscured in the mix. The Cyrkle, the Reducers, Slickee Boys and the Cheepskates take similar cues from the Silver Platter Brady Bunch episodes, and the Zots write songs equally as plucky and memorable write songs equally as plucky and memorable as any of the above, scoring extra points for a version of the Troggs' "I Can't Control Myself" as well as originals "And You (Drive Your Pretty Car)," "Waste Of Time," "Pretty Flowers" and "Doin It All For You." ... They've got scales around their waists ... 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

PAUL REVERE AND THE RAIDERS (FEATURING MARK LINDSAY) The Legend Of Paul Revere (Columbia, P.O. Box 4455, New York, NY 10101-4455)—Rock 'n roll memory #1: rushing home from Mrs. Kim's kindergarden class (1965) to watch Dick Clark's Where The Action Is, starring Paul Revere And The Raiders, And if it was more those silly Revolutionary War costumes than the ac-tual music that forms this initial rock remembrance, it just goes to show that even a 4-year-old was smart enough to pick up on the Raiders' manic showmanship and stripped-down, fun-loving r 'n r. This mammoth two-disc set, accompanied by a 32-page booklet, takes us on a magic carpet ride from the Raiders' raw 1960 instrumental single, "Beatnick Sticks," through their glory period in the midto late-'60s and into the more hit 'n miss material of the '70s. The Raiders' greatest strength, like their Northwest compatriots the Sonics and the Wailers, was a color-blind ear for the great music of the '50s, blind ear for the great music of the '50s, whether it was unbridled R&B (Jessie Hill's 'Ooh Poo Pah Doo,' Richard Berry's ''Louie Louie' and ''Have Love, Will Travel, "Huey Smith's ''Don't You Just Know It'') or girl-crazy primal rock (Jerry Lee's ''Whale Lotta Shakin' Goin' On,'' Chuck Berry's ''Maybelline''), and then producing, like the Corvair or the GTO they sing about a product unabashedly they sing about, a product unabashedly and distinctly American. The Raiders' greatest hits, such as "Kicks," "Hungry" and especially "Just Like Me," are absolute classics—so perfect that even "classic rock" formats haven't diluted their urgency and teen lust. Like many American bands popular in the mid-'60s, the Beatles' **Sgt**. Pepper had a huge effect on both the Raiders' own writing and on rock journal-ism's approach to critiquing rock music; two-and-a-half-minute pop songs weren't thought to be good enough anymore, and while later tunes such as "It's Happening" or "Him Or Me" still sound sharp, it's apparent that the Raiders were not in line with this new rock intelligentsia. Luckily, we're not that stupid, and such genuine goodness as complied on **The Legend Of Paul Revere** will surely reestablish the Raiders' place as one of America's premier all-time rock 'n roll bands.

NRBQ Grooves In Orbit (Rhino, 2225 Colorado Ave., Santa Monica, CA 90404)—Originally released in 1983, and sadly unavailable since Bearsville Records and, subsequently, Albert Grossman kicked the bucket, Grooves In Orbit was the Q's last proper studio recording prior to '89's Wild Weekend. The wrong has been nicely righted by Rhino, though, and Grooves just might be NRBQ's most consistently winning LP from start to finish—13 tracks ("Some Kind Of Blues" and "Tonight You Belong To Me" have been added by Rhino for the reissue), and not a blunderbuss in the bunch. HASH BACK

We figured that as long as we're redecorating, this would be a perfect apportunity to introduce a section that's long overdue. As much as all of us at CMJ love "new music," "alternative music," 'post (God help us) modern music," et al ad nauseum, there's plenty of times we get awfully bored with the whole scene (gasp!) and go back into our collections and pull out that Little Richard comp, that Coltrane disc, that Dylan boot, that Nuggets collection or that first Dead Boys LP. Up till now, these forays into the vaults were nothing more than guilty pleasures and much needed diversions from the new wave matters at hand. Luckily for us, record labels everywhere are finding that the meteoric rise in CD sales has afforded them the chance to reissue/repackage/regurgitate (and naturally reprofit from) artists who otherwise might remain slighted by record co. and public alike. As a result, there's been a welcome surge in such archival undertakings, and henceforth, the need for a column such as Flashback. Our goals are: obviously, to help make you better aware of these reissues and the timelessness of the music therein; to try and breathe some life into some very often dull and unnecessarily restrictive alternative radio programming; to demonstrate that alternative radio has interest in such projects; and as always, to turn people on to music we're crazy over.

is, both on record (most of the time) and live (all of the time), one of the swellest rock bands on the planet, a blessed combination of dazzling musicianship, a heartfelt fondness for retarded amateurism (see the Shaggs LPs on Rounder), a third-grade sense of high jinks and, best of all, an encyclopedic knowledge of and profound love for music. **Grooves** features the Q at the top of their game, hitting on all cylinders not unlike the Modern Lovers in their heyday. From the windows-down power pop of "Rain At The Drive-In" and "A Girl Like That," to the full-throttle zoom of "Smackaroo" and "Get Rhythm," and the child-like innocence of "Hit The Hay" and "My Girlfriend's Pretty," NRBQ makes this nearly impossible musical blend seem as right and natural as Jerry Lee and his 13-year-old cousin.

LINK WRAY Missing Links Volume 1-3 (Norton, P.O. Box 646, Cooper Station, New York, NY 10003/718-789-4438)—While the Link Wray releases on the Ace (UK) label cover his best-known sides, the Norton crew, as usual, opt for the collector-scum (that's a compliment, folks) route, and roll out three volumes of heretofore out-of-print guitar whoop from the whoopmeister himself.

Missing Links, starting with Wray's earliest licks and coming full circle with Vol. 3's "Rumble '69," not only reaffirms Wray's place in the six-string lo-fi rumble hall of fame, but shows the Linkster to be equally adept at classic cornball country and driving R&B. At his best, though, Wray wrestles such a hellacious squall out of his gtr, it's as if he possessed both the haunted soul of Pat Hare and the uncontrived naturalness of Scotty Moore. Big City After Dark Vol. 2 is Wray at his insome best; it just doesn't come any leaner and meaner than "Walkin' Down The Street Called Love," "Big City Stomp" and "Big City After Dark." You could line up all the so-called guitar heroes featured in musiciantype mags from here to Memphis, and not a one of 'em would be fit to lick the distortion box of one Link Wray.

VARIOUS ARTISTS Super Hits Of The '70s: Have A Nice Day Volume 6-10 (Rhino, 2225 Colorado Ave., Santa Monica, CA, 90404-3555)—

The heavy metal Z-Rock radio affiliate just made its debut in the New York area on the AM band with their slogan defiantly shouting "FM Sucks." That would've made a nice subtitle for this second set of Top 40 hits compiled by Rhino, dedicated to our collective AM memories. The concept, at times, is better than the result; we defy anyone to sit through the excruciating schmaltz of "Precious And Few," "Candy Man" or, ferchrissakes, Godspell's "Day By Day" more than once (although we're glad we tried). And by willfully ignoring some of the bigger stars of the early '70s, Rhino has chosen to up the one-hit wonder schlockfactor even further. Still, hearing the DeFranco Family's "Heartbeat—It's A Lovebeat," Albert Hammond's "It Never Rains In Southern California," Looking Glass' "Brandy," Stories' "Brother Louie" and, yes, even the dreaded Gilbert O'Sullivan's "Alone Again (Naturally)" gave us ear-to-ear smiley faces just like the ones from the "Me Decade." Super Hits Of The '70s is best used like those Personics machines; light up a friend's life by throwing "Hot Rod Lincoln" or "Nice To Be With You" on a mixed tape, or camp up a radio show with such golden memories as "The Night The Lights Went Out In Georgia" or "Popcorn."

CAPTAIN BEEFHEART AND THE MAGIC BAND Shiny Beast (Bat Chain Puller) (Enigma Retro, 11264 Playa Ct., P.O. Box 3628, Culver City, CA 90231-3628)—His head wreathed in exhaled smoke of tobacco grown in pungent, thousand-year-old soil, the good Cap'n tips his hat and pilots us down a river of gruff and ruddy prosepoems and scratchy barnyard battleneck guitar. Of all his albums, **Shiny Beast** is perhaps the most humid and tropical, with the sounds of lazy, lilting accordions, dem bones marimbas and lonesome, melancholy saxophones wafting into an enclosed courtyard adorned with hanging plants and pon-tabla arches. This 1978 recording finds the Captain (backed by a rejuvenated and immensely talented Magic Band) using not just arrangements but lyrical imagery and words themselves to evoke images of tropical sprawl, foreshadowing his eventual adoption of the visual arts as his primary medium for expression. By this latter part of Beefheart's career, it's certain that any record company that signed him (the LP's original label was Warner Bros.) pretty much knew what a dismal commercial fate they were in for and just kept their hands to themselves, letting the Cap'n steer the ship of artistic expression wherever he may, and that's Shiny Beast's joy: It's a master painter spreading words and sounds on a canvas to paint atmospheres so vivid in detail, you can almost feel the weight of the humidity on your body.


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



Hi kiddies, and welcome to this first day at class. We'll be learning all about charts today. I know you've all read your CMJ texts, so you're familiar with the Top 100, Commercial chart, Imports and so on. Well, it seems that the good folks at CMJ have changed things around. First, they've done away with the College/Non-Commercial and Commercial charts in favor of one grand Top 150 which is an expanded version of the old Top 100. Then, they decided to create their Import chart by culling imports from reporters' Top 35 lists rather than counting on the programmers to make separate import charts. Any questions?... What's that Joey? You have to go #1?

Well, I'm glad you mentioned #1, because a young, principled Irish lady named **Sinead O'Connor** is still holding down the coveted spot (fourth straight issue), despite the fact that she *isn't* #1 in any of the regionals. The **Chills**, however, are breathing down her neck at #2. And glory be, DGC's **Sundays** are only a hair behind the Chills, with #1 showings in both the South and East. If that isn't enough excitement for you, the much ballyhooed **Lou Reed/John Cale** tribute to pop-art hero Andy Warhol leaped up from 48 to 4. Rounding out Top 10 bullets is **Public Enemy**— its rap landmark goes where no other rap record (excepting the Beasties) has gone before: #8 on the CMJ Top 150.

Now Joey, you'll have to hold it in just a bit longer while I tell everyone how the independent labels have fared this week. **Scatterbrain** continues to climb the chart (24-21) as the highest indie, followed by Bad Brains, with the highest indie debut at #34; Dischord's Fugazi (71-38); Twin\Tone's Babes In Toyland (65-41); Mammoth's Dash Rip Rock (80-67); and Alias' Harm Farm (#74 debut). There's a serious indie logiam from 76 through 83 comprised of the Revolting Cocks' 12", Grinning Plowman, Sneetches, Miracle Room (EP), Tragic Mulatto, In The Nursery, Hetch Hetchy and Didjits. I know you children will love this issue's Indie Tally (brought to you by Valvoline, Official Sponsor of the Indy... forget it), a count of all the releases that each particular label has on the Top 150: Rough Trade—6; Wax Trax—5; Twin\Tone, Shimmy-Disc, Alias, TVT, Touch And Go and Caroline—3 apiece.

What's that Joey? You want to know about the up-and-comers near the bottom of the chart? Well, there's a great album by The Clean (#96 debut) followed by Jody Grind (#97 debut) and Arsenal's EP (#99 debut). And even further down, there's the Borghesia LP (#137 debut), the Pretenders' new single (#138 debut), Band Of Holy Joy (#139 debut) and The Pursuit Of Happiness (#144 debut). Along with those, you should expect to see LPs from Strawberry Zots, Beats International, Jesus Lizard, Tooba Blooze, Concrete Blonde and Lori Carson making their way upwards.





PATTY LOVELESS On Down The Line (MCA, 1514 South St., Nashville, TN 37212)—Patty Loveless had five mojor hits from her last record, Honky Tonk Angel, but I'd be curious to know how mony reoders of this magazine recognize her nome. On Down The Line, her fourth olbum for MCA, continues where that one left off; it's jommed with Potty's special talent, mixing the traditional sounds of country music with the edge of the pop and rock of today. She's not a writer, but the songs she chooses are perfect vehicles for her sweet, flexible vocals; and the musicians which she and producer Tony Brown surround themselves give each tune more than proper treatment. The rockers—"Overtime," "I'm That Kind of Girl," "Blue Memories"—flat out burn, while the bollads—"Feelings Of Love," "Some Morning Soon"—are done with heartfelt tenderness. Be sure to check out Loveless' stirring version of Lucinda Williams' (now we know Potty's hip) "The Night's Too Long," also on Certain Damage Vol. 28, as well as the bluesy bounce of the title track. On Down The Line shows the considerable talents of Patty Loveless and the songs found here will sound great on the rodio, no matter what the

JOHN DOE Meet John Doe (DCG, 9130 Sunset Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90069)—
The trick here is to forget about X. Apparently, John Doe has. Meet John Doe is a lot slicker than anything his ald band ever did—this ain't no punk rock record. But, of course, it does have

traces of what we've come to know him for: interesting wordplay; his peculiar view on the relationship between a man and woman; the really big guitars, this time courtesy of Richard Lloyd (ex-Television) and Jon Dee Graham (ex-True Believers); and the wallop of the drums provided by Jeff Donovan from Dwight Yoakam's band. There's even a couple of songs with Julie Christenson from the Divine Horsemen, suggestive of his days with Exene. Overall, Meet John Doe has a smoother approach with producer Davitt Sigerson adding his touch without removing too much of the edge you'd expect. Vocally, Doe shows his emotions extremely well, whether ranting away on "Let's Be Mad," screaming about "Worldwide Brotherhood," (not recommended for airplay because of a few too many "F" words, but a great song anyway) or demonstrating passion on the serene "My Offering."

GAIL DAVIES The Other Side Of Love (Capitol, 1111 16th Avenue South, Nashville, TN 37212)—While no newcomer to country music—she's been recording since 1979—Gail Davies sounds as fresh and exciting as any of the slew of new artists coming out of Nashville. Surely an artist to reckon with, Davies has a distinctive, smoky voice and a talent for writing songs with owesame power and simple grace. Besides, she can stake claim to the impressive feat of being the first woman out of Nashville to sing, write, lead a band and produce her own records—reason enough to respect her considerable tolents. In addition to Davies' stimulating vacals, The Other Side Of Love is full of guitars, some twang, some jongle, some screech but not one is out of place. The songs move from a Southern rock feel on "With A Boy Like You" and "I'm A Little Bit Lonely" to the almost Patsy Cline mood on ballads like "Remember" and "Someone Like Me" and each shows a different side of a delightful musician at the height of her skillful creativity.

SHORT SHOTS

First up is singer Kris McKay, formerly of Austin's Wild Seeds. On her debut, What Love Endures (Aristo, 6 W. 57th St., New York, NY 10019) she mosterfully interprets songs from some of todoy's top writers, like John Hiatt, Kye Fleming ond fellow Austinite David Holley. Barry Beckett, who's been pretty octive lately, hoving recently made records with Delbert McClinton and Lee Roy Pornell, mokes his production talents evident, filling some of the R&B flovored tracks with horns and adding some tosty keyboard work. There are times when McKoy reminds me of Bonnie Roitt—Kris' vocols are effective whether belting out a rocker like "One Moment To Another" or steamily laying into slow

blues like "Too Cool"... That Old Mill (Northeastern, P.O. Box 3589, Saxonville, MA 01701/508-820-4440) from Boston's John Lincoln Wright, undeniably brings to mind nostalgic visions of New England. This is acoustic music as it's been made for a long time—just guitar, fiddle, mandolin and a rich, melancholy voice. Wright's been around since the '60s; he was a member of the almost forgotten Beacon Street Union, and the songs are a thoughtful, mature look at where we're going and where we've been. Suggested cuts: "One Who Cares," "Mount Katahdin Sunrise" and the title track.

DEMO-RAMA

Three pretty interesting tapes have crossed my desk recently. Each is different stylistically, all showing there's a great deal of new talent out there, if we only take the time to listen. Julie Adler (362 3rd Ave., #2C, New York, NY 10016/212-779-9728) is a relative newcomer on the NYC scene with a great, big voice. Her songs and stories are an enchanting brew of pop and traditional folk with dark undercurrents. On the bluesy "Those Dangerous Waters," she moves from a whisper to a wail, backed with a great guitar lick, while "Walk On" is a pensive mood piece in the style of Shown Colvin or Suzonne Vega. A soulful combination of blues and country roots with uncommon harmonies may best describe Stump The Host (Steve Dawson, clo Sock Mankey Productions, 2022 W. Crystal, Chicago, IL 60622/312-342-7338). The song titles ("Your Drunk Tongue," "Vacation In Des Moines") are not the only intriguing thing here. The vocals of Stephen Dawson and Diane Christiansen can slide together eosily and give a twinge of that down-home feeling or but up against each other and remind you of John Doe and Exene at their on-the-edge best. Lyrically, the songs are generally cynical and witty, working remarkably well within their simple musical framework. Clearly a band to watch. From the wilds of Hoboken, NJ, comes a delicate voice with a charming sense of storytelling in the person of Kate Jacobs (1038 Garden St., Hoboken, NJ 07030/201-659-2835). The coupling of pedal steel and cello add a unique flavor to her tales, while Jocob's high and pretty vocals fit in well with the country picking and strumming of the guitors. I don't really know what Nonci Griffith sounded like when she first storted moking music, but I've got a feeling Kate Jocobs, with songs like "Indiana," "Safe As Houses" and "Just Like You," hos come mighty close.

As I write this, I'm off to Nashville and Austin for a few days. I'll let you know how it went next time.



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Jackpot!



KASSE MADY Fode (Stern's, 500 Broadway, New York, NY 10012/ 800-564-0112)—How do you go about favorably comparing a record to one of your all-time favorites? That's the dilemma facing me with Fode. The comparison to Salif Keita's ''Soro'' is obvious—both are Malian griot-style pop singers, with a soaring range and lots of vocal pyrotechnics, and both albums are produced by Paris-based Ibrahima Sylla, king of Afro-synth sounds, and feature the same rhythm sec tion of guitarist Yves Ndock and astounding bassist Hilaire Penda. Keita featured soar-ing and technical lead guitar; Kasse Mady has the equally proficient Mama Sissokho, and this is where the identities of these records diverge. Sissokho's playing is a little folksier, rootsier or whatever term you are more comfortable with. A number of cuts feature his skillful playing of acoustic guitar and nkoni—a lute with a fat gut and wood sound. And underneath the entire high-tech production of drum machines, keyboards and flashy horn lines lies a real feel for folk music, exemplified but not limited to the nkoni. Maybe the producer feels the world is ready for the more natural beats, un-familiar though they may sometimes be; whatever the reason, the cross rhythms are more upfront, the acoustic instruments ride on the crest of the production, instead of under the wave. No small extra: Kasse Mady is a wonderful singer—searing at times, but never reaching for the screech so many other west African vocalists seek. One of my favorites is the romantic sound of "Laban Djoro," full of soul and a little of "Laban Djoro," till of soul and a little twang of country—it's the richest acoustic sound in the set. At the other end of the spectrum is the pounding "Fode," as exciting a piece of techno-pop as you are likely to hear this year. If this is what we have in store from Stern's as they settle into New York, it could prove to be an interesting year ahead! interesting year ahead!

HASSAN ERRAJI AND ARABESQUE

Nikriz (Riverboat (UK), c/o Stern's, address above)—What makes this record so great is its simplicity. The trio is Hassan Erraji, vocalist, composer and multi-instrumentalist; bass player Ralph Mizraki; and percussionist Pierre Narcisse. With few exceptions, they play their instruments as a trio without overdubs and noodling—the results are some of the most refreshing music since the first American jazz record was played in Morocco. Erraji's main vehicle is the oud, an Arabic lute, and he is an exceptional player. His music is rooted in his home of Morocco, but alludes to Euro-pean classical, Asian religious and American jazz in equal measures. Although he is a scholar of many different types of world music, this is not a studious look at genres; in its purest sense, it is jazz—improvisational, thoughtful and exciting. What brings this recording to fruition is the ensemble approach that Arabesque takes. Mizraki is a stunning, flashy and fast player, and the twisting sound of the fretless bass is perfect

ON THE CHART

Welcome to the new CMJ New World Music Chart. Since interest in music from sources other than the West (i.e. reggae, African pop and traditional music, Latin American grooves and European folk traditions) has increased so markedly in the last few years, we have decided to reflect that change in a new chart that expands our previous *Reggae Route* chart to include this shift in consciousness and the broader range of styles and sounds happening in radio today. Naturally, these first few weeks the chart will predominantly feature our reggae reporters, but hopefully as more stations include more world music in their reports, we'll be able to provide an accurate reflection of all the new and exciting music under the sun

Narcisse is creative, unusual, but never overpowers the feel; the three work magic together. Listen to the layers of sound created by the group on "Thikrait Al Andalous." With just drums, violin (played by Erraji) and oud, they build from a simple solo into a thunderous rage, underpinned by an elusive bass line that comes in and out. Even the occasional throb of a synthesizer seems thoroughly in place and time with the songs they create. There are not enough superlatives for this collection of new songs from the past. Ignore this record at you own peril!

VARIOUS ARTISTS Heartbeats Native Sounds From The Hearts Of Europe (Topic, 50 Stroud Green Road, London N4 3EF, United **Kingdom)**—How's this for a twisted look at the world's music? Brit roots rockers Oyster Band joins up with a Turkish band from Cologne, Germany, to do "I Fought The Law." Rockabilly bagpipes? You bet! This is just one of the recordings made in 1988 in Berlin during the Heimatklange, a seven-week festival, which translates as "homeland noise." The Mustaphas jam with a Yugoslavian brass band; Flaco Jimenez takes his accordion to the roots of the polka; England's Accordions Go Crazy rock out on ''Sidewalk Surfin''' (and the Beach Boys better clear the pavement!); and New York klezmer meets French brass on the plains of eastern Europe. From very traditional Hungarian gypsy music to absolute lunacy, this recording gives a taste of what happens when musicians decide the fate of their music. They throw out the formulas and formats, steal each other's roots shamelessly and create new music. Shock ing? Let's hope it happens more often, because the results here are as exciting as it aets.

BUMPER CROP

You are probably familiar with the African kora by now, and the unique, loping sound it makes. **Ali Farka Toure** is famous for adapting the music of the harp to six-string guitar, fusing jali to juke in a way that is, at its best, right up there with Fred McDowell and Robert Johnson on the soul scale. His second U.S. release, **African Guitar**, is on Shanachie (37 Clinton St., Newton, NJ 07860). Without the benefit of a hot band or a mega-watt power source, Toure cranks out enough rhythm and blues feel to keep up with James Brown, all on an acoustic guitar and some small percussion in-struments. And if that isn't enough, he threatens in the notes on the sleeve (which, I warn you, are confusing and horribly edited) that he is giving up music; he says the love affair is over. Judging from how much of his heart is in music, I doubt he can do it. And I hope not!...Get in harm's way. **Harm Farm** is the lastest entry in the celto-delic rock race, and they stand a good chance of placing in the finals. Their debut LP, **Spawn**, is in the same lane as the Pogues or Oysters, trading rock for reel, but their more percussive, trashy sound makes them a prime candidate for a "Camper Van" award. They roll in the mud, kick sand in your face and play the fiddle like a hacksaw. If you are a folk or rock fan, get it from Alias, 374 Brannan St., San Francisco, CA 94107. It'll hurt you...And if you think the Pogues have a bad attitude and a—shall we say—"casual" approach to vocalizing, then wait till you hear the **Whiskey Priests**. This band of celtic rogues from the North of England takes a raw, acoustic approach to pub rock. Their album, **Nee Gud Luck** (Whippet, 6 Hallgarth Villas, Sherburn, Durham DH6 1HF, United Kingdom), has no rural pretenses-in fact, no pretense at all. Both original songs and traditional tunes are given the same thrashing with bagpipes, strings of every description, harmonica, guitars and drums. More fun than a barrel of colliers!...If you are a fan of Pentangle, Ginsberg and Chadbourne, you might get a charge out of **Erin Kenny And Ethan** James. Mixing French hurdy-gurdy, blues and celtic music with some very twisted and celtic music with some very twisted poetry, their self-titled album on Troy (P.O. Box 2103, Venice, CA 90294/213-305-1643) is a strange and sardonic gothic novel. I could fill the page with their dark images, but the titles alone can tell the tale: "Kill What You Don't Understand," "The Absinthe Drinker" and the amazing story of "Death Comes To Club Med," a Bergman movie song with a Woody Allen purchmovie song with a Woody Allen punch-line...Those who live near the Mexican border are familiar with radio rancheras good and bad. The music that crossed the border has been emulated, revered and trashed in equal measure, but when it's really good, it's irresistible. Los Pinguinos (Arhoolie, 10341 San Pablo Ave., El Cerrito, CA 94530) is a CD release of two great border bands, recorded in the '70s. Fred Zimmerle's Trio San Antonio and Los Pinguinos Del Norte are wonderful "conjunto nortenos" that play the music of southern Texas and northern Mexico. Bajo sexto, guitars and accordion stroll along under songs that tell stories of love, work and life (and occasional philosophy) in the towns of the region. "If I don't fear death, how can I fear life?" is the motto of Los Pinguinos (The Penguins) and it lives in this music. Ùrban Ăfrica—Jive Hits Of The **Townships**, another collection of Azanian pop, is on the Urban Africa/Polydor label (c/o PolyGram, 810 Seventh Ave., New York, NY 10019). Among the well-known stars like Mahlathini, Lucky Dube and Miriam Makeba, there are scattered some lesser known (at least in the U.S.) stars of


the African music scene. One of the notable tracks is the driving "Umqombothi" by Yvonne Chaka Chaka—it's a good blend of high-profile technology and rootsy touches, and she is a great, pulsing singer. Be warned that a lot of the cuts here represent the most "American-sounding" artists like Stimela and Teaspoon, both of whom sound pretty average next to the Mahotella Queens or Makeba. And if you ever wondered where the groove for "Call Me Al"

came from, listen closely to this set to hear the un-Simonized version.

Signing off. The charts are happening, so get involved so they'll make some sense and have some value and impact. If you are playing any international music in your show, make sure it's included in the reports. Don't let this get to be a ghetto of specialization!

Reggae Route

Crucial!



ADIOA Soweto Man (Mango, 14 E. 4th St., New York, NY 10012)—

Hailing from Senegal and currently based in the metropolis of Paris, Adioa is a sixstrong reggae band who combines beguiling, captivating reggae with their own unique lyrical message of hope and courage in spite of adversity. Pronounced "Ahdee-oh-ah," the name loosely stands for "Africa Dimension Of I & I Soul" and translates as "progress" or "advance" in the Sononka dialect. One finds many traces of their multi-national (Sengalese and Malian, nurtured in France) heritage creeping into the broad reggae base of Adioa's music, particularly in the percussion, the language and the call-and-response interplay between lead and background vocalists. From the brisk walking pace of "Reggae Musik" to the soulful organ on the title track, the harmonies on "Toubab Bile" or the Toure Kunda-esque "Jiggen Bul Nul," Adioa's music displays a considerable African flair and influence, as felt through the contributions of the various members' musical roles. Sengalese vocalists and bassist, and Antillean drummer, guitarist and keyboardists combine their various styles and sounds to produce their alluring and invigorating music. Other African musicians have claimed reggae as their own (Alpha Blondy, Toure Kunda and Lucky Dube), and now groups like Adioa are continuing to expand upon the groundwork of African reggae laid down in the early '80s, III.

The compilation is open to any reggae artists residing in the U.S., Canada or Mexico that are not signed to a major label. CONTROLLED BLEEDING Trudge (Wax Trax, 1659 N. Damen Ave., Chicago, IL 60647)—A new decade and a new release fram a tria from Massapequa, NY, who have given birth to a release which is a brew of past warks and new influences. Spanning back to 1978, the group's earlier recordings (**Knees And Bones** and **Body** Samples) were mare experimental releases which focused on and dealt with raw, aggressive saunds and volume. As their saund developed, Cantralled Bleeding began utilizing textures and musical structure. On Trudge, their past and present come tagether in their saund. The dark, heavy industrial crunches, which at times become hypnotizing as heard in "Healing Time, remain as a foundation, but there is also a pop awareness (as on "Crimes Of The Bady") seeping between the cracks af their musical arrangements. It's hard to their musical arrangements. It's hard to imagine the medieval vacals, which are savage an "Christ Said...," becoming meladic and atmospheric on "Words (Of The Dying Body)," with complex keyboards and Paul Lemos' power-driven guitar work thrown in. Controlled Bleeding is a mood not tailored to the meek; their sound is evolving by the minute and could dominate a club or dancefloor if given the opportunity. Selected cuts: "Words," "Crimes Of The Body," "The Fodder Song" and "Kiss (The Hand Of Genocide)

CHIMES Chimes (Columbia, P.O. Box 4450, New York, NY 10101-4450)—Washing in on the shores of America is yet another British group that has a very progressive, soulful individuality. Soul II Saul attracted a huge audience with musical variety, style and image, while Lisa Stansfield recently has made a large impact with her R&B/pop vacal style—now here comes the Chimes. Unlike the others, the Chimes are more of a band rather than a DJ-based conglomerate. Pauline Henry leads this threesome with a soaring, calorful vocal range that possesses mare genuine heartfelt soul than many R&B singers around the States taday. Highlighting this LP are the cuts "1-2-3," with its hip-hop bass line and production by Jazzie B and Nellee Hooper, and an incredibly soulful cover of U2's '1 Still Haven't Found What I'm Looking For" that is nothing like the original. The mellaw Chimes groove carries thick bass and tribal background vocals while Pauline's lead vocals are simply extraordinary. Other smooth cuts: "Love So Tender," "Heaven," "Under-estimate," "Don't Make Me Wait" and estimate, 'Stay.



DC FINDINGS

If you have any interest in rap music at all, you must attend the Music Business Forum/Convention in Washington, DC. The latest one was at the Marion Barry Crack Bust Memorial Vista Hotel on April 28 and 29. Rap music was the main focus of many of the panels while a considerable amount of topics were covered. A few faces that were in attendance: Kool Moe Dee, who gave a fine keynote address; Marley Marl, who spoke on a panel as a producer; and Chubb Rock and Daddy-O, who both spoke on panels, and more. Here's a couple of the 12"s I received while attending to give a small sample of some of the talent brewing down there... **DOUBLE DOSE**'s "In The House"/
"Say-N-Nothin" [128/104 BPM] (Deep Concept Recordings, P.O. Box 939, Lanham, MD 20703/301-552-4604) is exactly what their name states—a double dose of two of the most popular styles of rap: hip-house and hip-hop, straight up. "In The House" is a universal-sounding hip-house jam that does boast an excellent rhythm track while "Say-N-Nothin" is a deep hip-hop groove that has great party rhymes and a perfectly cut musical track of addictive samples... CHUCK BROWN & THE SOUL SEARCHERS' "Hoochie Coochie Man'' [96 BPM] (Liason, 11330 Cherry Hill Rd., Suite 303, Beltsville, MD 20705) is an amazing cover of a standard blues tune with a wild go-go groove. The vocals, which are reminiscent of John Lee Hooker, are mean and bluesy while the guitar is fat and dis-torted. The go-go groove is incredibly heavy and hyped up with the addition of a conga track.

LEW TABACKIN Desert Lady (Concord, P.O. Box 845, Concord, CA 94522)—It's hard to justify calling Lew Tobackin underrated. After all, this woodwind ace, after a quartercentury as a prafessional (he just turned 50), is certainly experienced enough, What's more, he has copped top-flutist hanars from the down beat critics and made 14 albums under his own page. critics and made 14 albums under his own name to go with the batch he's cut with the remarkable big band he ca-leads with his wife, the acclaimed arranger-composer-pianist Toshika Akiyoshi.

Nanetheless, os a small-comba leader, Tabackin is underexposed and, to my way of thinking, underrated. Be that as it may, the bearded, bespectacled tenor saxist and flutist is likely to enlarge his audience with this, his exceptional 15th recording. Permitted to pick his awn players (pianist Hank Jones, cantrabossist Dave Holland and drummer Victor Lewis) and his awn material (a pair of ariginals and a layely faur-song suite incritics and made 14 albums under his own nam drummer Victor Lewis) and his awn material (a pair of ariginals and a lovely faur-song suite inspired by Duke Ellingtan), Tobackin displays his world-class stuff. After bopping through Tadd Dameron's "Hot Hause" at a lively clip, he unleashes concentric circles of gloriously imagistic flute lines on "Pyramid," the first tune in the Ellington segment; interestingly, the leader has transformed this one-time baritone-sax feature for Harry Crapsy into a tays do force for flute. His Harry Carney into a taur de force far flute. His ather original an **Desert Lady**, "A Bit Byas'd," finds him switching to tenor for an ade to another underrated saxman, the late Dan Byas. Overall, **Desert Lady** is an A-1 effort that should appeal to all jazz-oriented formats. Straight-ahead sto-tions will dig it straight away, and wave stations should seriously consider adding "Pyramid" ar the title track. This is one classy **Lady**.

NICK BRIGNOLA On A Different Level (Reservoir, 276 Pearl St., Kingston, NY 12401)—It's a wonder that Nick Brignala didn't get a hernia tating araund all the horns he blew so canvincingly on his Reservoir debut, Raincheck. Thankfully, Raincheck wasn't a ane-aff recording. This time out, he forsakes the tenar and soprano saxes and clarinet and concentrates on his accustamed baritone sax, and, as before, the results are splendid. This 62-minute disc finds the leader's bari, gruff yet ever so agile, tearing things up in the campany af bassist Dave Holland, drummer Jack DeJohnette and pianist Kenny Barron. Barron's piano, in particular, acts Holland, drummer Jack DeJohnette and pianist Kenny Barron. Barron's piano, in particular, acts as the perfect camplement, rhythmically and tonally, to the leader's impassioned blawing. Brignala has wisely chosen as his accampanists players who are at once idiamatically versatile and lyrically well-versed. As such, the quartet steers a steady, progressive course fram the jazz mainstream (Duke Ellingtan's "Sophisticated Lady" and Benny Carter's "Key Largo," handled as a samba) through the bebap riptide (Tadd Dameran's "Hot Hause") and into the avant-gorde maelstrom (Ornette Coleman's "Tears Inside"). Well done.

Nothing compares 2 Marcus? After debuting at #1 on 4/13, Marcus Roberts has easily held down our top spot for six straight weeks. Novus-RCA continues to dominate the playlists, taking the gold, silver and bronze medals with Roberts, Carmen Sings Monk and Roy Hargrove. Columbia's momentous Mingus set moves up to #4, while the Crescent City's favorite sons (and *Tonight Show* stars) the Dirty Dozen Brass Band debut at #6. Other notable performances: Cassandra Wilson leaps 17-10; Mose Allison debuts at #17; and the Cos starts its climb at #19. One interesting note: a few labels seem to be enjoying the majority of the success on the jazz chart, much more so with jazz than other formats. Porquoi? Let us know how you feel

IVO PERELMAN Ivo (K2B2, 3112 Barry Ave., Los Angeles, CA 90066)—Don't let the names an the cover (John Patitucci, Peter Erre names an the cover (John Patitucci, Peter Erskine, Eliane Elias, Flara Purim and Airta) cause you ta pass this one up. This isn't more of the Brazilian prefab mersh music that gluts the CD bins in your neighborhood stare. Granted, most of the players assembled here are typically associated with fusian (contrabassist Buell Neighborn being the metable passociated). Neidlinger being the most obvious exception), but the exploratory bent of Brazilian tenorman but the exploratory bent of Brazilian tenorman Ivo Perelman expunges any trace of commercial intent. On his debut, the tenorman unveils five Brazilian children's sangs amang seven selections, and displays a Rollins-esque rhythmic sure-footedness as he blows across bar lines while maintaining narrative continuity. Perelman is clearly a progressive soloist who, while acutely conscious af melody, isn't averse to unraveling the chords and shuffling them like a deck of cards. Like the best improvisars, he sets aut. the chords and shuffling them like a deck or cards. Like the best improvisars, he sets out, destination unknown, to make discoveries and not to recite a litany of rote phrases like some jaded tour-bus guide. Brazilian rhythms, including the somba and the less-well-known Frevo strains from the Nartheast, abound here, as does a smidgen of south courtery of Don Preston, but artistic the Nartheast, abound here, as does a smidgen of synth courtesy of Don Preston, but artistic adventure, as opposed to commercial aspiration, predominates. Among the key tracks are "El Dia En Que Me Quieras (The Day You Will Want Me)"—a lovely ballad reminiscent of "There Will Never Be Another You"—and "Ciranda Cirandinha (Circle Dance)." Exceptional.

CHRISTOPHER HOLLYDAY On Course (Novus, clo RCA, 1133 Ave. of the Americas, New York, NY 10036)—The last time out on his eponymaus debut for RCA, the now-20-year-old alto saxman Christopher

Hollyday satisfied a Big Jackie Mac Attack by sinking his teeth into faur tunes by his preeminent influence, Jackie McLean, in a round-table setting with trumpeter Wallace Roney and Cedar Walton's all-star irio. This time, on his fifth album overall, he totally eradicates any notion of derivativness by presenting eight of his own overall, he totally eradicates any notion of derivativeness by presenting eight of his own compositions in a shawcase far himself and his working band: Larry Goldings, piano; Jahn Lockwoad, bass; Ron Savage, drums (each takes a turn dueting with the precocious leader). Hollyday presents himself as a camplete package, an impassioned player flustered neither by a furious tempa nar by a lilting ballad. Choice Cuts: "West Side Winds," "In A Love Affair" and "The 6th Warld."

CANDID RETURNS

After 28 years of inactivity, the Candid label (c/o PPI, 88 St. Francis St., Newark, NJ 07105) has returned to the straight-ahead fray with new releases from tenor saxophanists **Ricky Ford** and **Erica Lindsay**. Under new owner Alan Bates, the label that once boasted Bud Pawell,



Charles Mingus and Baoker Little is aff ta a commendable start with issues fram tenar saxists Ford (Manhattan Blues, a quartet date with the dream rhythm section af Jaki Byard, Milt Hinton and Ben Riley) and Lindsoy (Dreamer, a quintet affair featuring Haward Jahnsan on the frant line in a program of six of her ariginals). Mark Morganelli, wha praduced the Ford sessian, alsa figures in a batch of interesting projects awaiting release. An accomplished trumpeter with several albums under his belt, Marganelli is a musician's producer nat only because he's a ployer, but because he's paid his dues in the biz as a club awner (remember the Jazz Farum, a mid-'B0s loft in the Big Apple?) and booking agent (he's been caordinating the sounds at Birdland the past few years). Morganelli's experience an both sides of the stage will wark to Candid's advantage. Due far release are twa thematic live performances he conceived as producer of the Riverside Park Arts Festival. On the same day last summer, he praduced al fresca concerts featuring the tough twin tenors of David "Fathead" Newman and Clifford Jardan, fleshed out by four rhythm, as well as a quartet fronted by Kenny Barron and Jahn Hicks an two nine-foat Steinway pianas. In the future, expect Morganelli-produced, live-from-Birdland recordings by the Louis Hayes Sextet and a small combo led by saxist Gary Bartz sharing the stage with the feisty brassman Claudio Roditi. As part of Birdland's second anniversary, April 26-2B, Marganelli supervised a session in tribute to Caunt Basie. Swingsters Harry "Sweets" Edison, Frank Wess and Buddy Tate, bolstered by Hugh Lawson and Bobby Durham in the rhythm section, saluted their late, great bass. In between supervising these sessions and introducing his baby san to the jazz life, Morganelli will find time to recard his own date for Candid, a quartet affair with Kenny Barron, Jimmy Cobb and Rob Carter. Candid and Black Saint (also owned by Alan Bates) products are distributed through PPI (address above).



The other titles are Cool Blues by Jimmy Smith; The Soothsayer by Wayne Shorter; Clubhouse by Dexter Gordon; and Tom Cet by Lee Morgan. In late May, Capital/Blue Nate will begin dipping into its Roulette holdings. Scheduled for release are: Complete

whatever previausly unissued gems Masaic has unearthed. Masaic's Michael Cuscuna and Charlie Lourie, whose exquisitely tasteful packages are savared by callectars, have earned their rightful place in the label's staried histary alangside faunders Albert Lian and Francis Walff and recording engineer Rudy Van Gelder. If yau're unfamiliar with Mosaic's mail-order baxed sets (great saund, great boaklets), do yaurself a favar and write far a free catalague: 35 Melrase Pl., Stamfard, CT 06902... Thase who enjayed Superblue 2 shauld seek out trumpeter/arranger Don Sickler's earlier repertary praject, The Music Of Kenny Dorham (Reservair, address above), naw available an CD. This 1983 session fram Rudy Van Gelder's studio (where else?) presents seven K.D. classics perfarmed by a crack band consisting af Jimmy Heath an tenor, Ron Carter on bass, Cedar Walton on piona and Sickler on trumpet... Art Blakey and Miles Davis deserve their reputatians as incubators of talent. Though he has recarded far less prolifically as o leader, Chica Hamilton has made his fair share affinds, too. One of the more prominent ones was guitorist Larry Coryell, wham the drummer/leader intraduced to the jazz warld in 1967 on The Dealer (Impulse!), which MCA (70 Universal City Plaza, Universal City, CA 9160B) has just re-released on CD. Coryell, 23 at the time, jains the care group af Hamiltan, alto saxist Arnie Lawrence and bassist Richard Davis on seven tracks, mastly penned by the leader alone ar in tandem with (the non-performing) trombanist Jimmy Cheotham. Ernie Hayes contributes bluesy organ swirls to two tunes, one being the Coryell-penned "Larry Of Arabia," and Archie Shepp makes a camea appearance (on piano no less) on his own composition, "For Mods Only." Hamiltan, o player as adept with hard East Coast swing as he is with cool, chamber-like West Coast jazz, made vital contributions to the jazz canon of the '50s and '60s, and his cerebral brand af swing has last none of its appeal in the '90s. BRUCE DICKINSON'S METAL MARATHON KEYNOTE ADDRESS

PART 1: THE INDUSTRY

Truly gifted public speakers are rare in every corner of humanity, but they're exceptionally rare in rock 'n roll, and even more so in the field of heavy metal. Bruce Dickinson had been our first choice for a keynote speaker since the first Metal Marathon in 1986, and last October, we finally got him to do it. We knew he'd be amazing; he's long been a master of interviews, and his music, lyrics and public profile have always shown him to be unusually well-spoken and perceptive. But we—and everyone else in the room—were floored by the speech we heard. It was a brutally honest but ultimately uplifting perspective on the careers and the music we've all dedicated our lives to

This speech occured on October 27 of last year, and you might be wondering why it's taken so long for us to print it. Well, Bruce actually read from a written speech, and when we asked him if we could print it, he said, "Sure, just let me touch it up a bit." Weeks passed. Months passed. After nagging his management countless times, we were informed that he'd lost it! So we dug out a tape of the speech, and Kevin spent about ten hours transcribing it.

We saw Bruce last week at a record release party for **Tattooed Millionaire**, his superb new solo LP. "Bruce, did you really lose the speech?", we just had to ask. "No! I found i!!" he said. "I found it when I was looking for a screenplay I'd lost. You didn't print a screenplay by accident, did you?"

Such is life for a renaissance man. Read on: If this speech were given to all of us before we'd started our careers, we'd have made far fewer mistakes.

So I guess you know by now that I play in a heavy metal band. Twelve years ago it wasn't called a heavy metal band—I'm 31 now, so I almost qualify as a dinosaur—it was just a rock band. The heaviest you ever got was Rory Gallagher, I don't know if anybody knows who Rory Gallagher is—(applause) Yeah? Oh shit, you do know your stuff here!

So 10 years later I'm wandering around.

So 10 years later I'm wandering around a multimillion dollar stage set dressed like Robocop with flashing lights and [a laser gun]. I almost didn't have a good time doing it, because—I don't know if any of you saw the interview panel, I said the first half of a band's bio always contains the most interesting stuff, because they have the best time when there is nothing to gain and nothing to lose, when they just have an idea and it doesn't matter if they screw up or if it's crazy, they just go out and do it. If it works it's brilliant and original, and if doesn't, well, hey, nobody noticed anyway.

I suppose the best way to describe heavy metal now is a subculture, and there's loads of subcultures in music now. It used to be—Hm! I keep saying used to be! Makes me sound like I'm living in the past! But I'm thinking of a sort of golden age, when all music was equal, and people were prepared to tolerate a big spectrum of music. Now the media has focused things to sell newspapers, to sell videos and sell this video channel and that video channel, and "We're going to play this one 'cause he's black and we're going to put that one back 'cause he's too loud." Now, these subcultures are very good for business—business can use our music to target advertising and make shitloads of money trying to tell people to buy things that they don't really



need. That's the way it is. Now, metal is still surviving in this day and age because of the sincerity and commitment of metal fans—you know as well as I do that metal fans are the most loyal fans of virtually any kind of music on the planet. Now in the modern American metal sceneartists in the top ten and all of the sudden everybody is going out and buying a denim vaist coat and sticking fake Hell's Angels things on the back of it— they're trying to make heavy metal into a mainstream thing. You can't make heavy metal into a mainstream thing! You can take the style of heavy metal—the jeans, the leather jacket the studs—and stick pop songs onto it and have success with a facsimile of it, but heavy metal exists for its fans, and it exists for its fans on a roots level, and if you lose sight of that, then the whole thing will disappear up its own ass. You can't tell me that when an artist sells five or six million albums, that all those five or six million people care equally and care as passionately as the people who bought his records before he was flavor of the month.

So, as the convention that you've all been wandering around this week has very capably demonstrated, record companies are in the business of manipulating and infiltrating the public consciousness, and their word for it is "marketing." Now marketing is something that everybody's gotten very, very much better at in the last twenty years. So by scientific analysis and corporate conglomeration we have arrived on the verge of the '90s at a sort of brave new world, where radio is dominated by

demographics and listeners' response figures and market shares—you know, kind of like the McDonalds of the airwaves. When was the last time you really had to listen to a commercial radio station? Like when was the last time you had to chew anything seriously in a fast food restaurant? Of course, behind all these predictions and the backstage crystal ball-gazing that goes on—formats here and formats there—lies the mighty dollar. And while back in '60s it was very fashionable and hip to knock anybody who made any money, I think that nowadays you can all see that Jane Fonda [who was quite a radical in the late '60s—ed.] hasn't done too badly with her videotapes and workouts. Actually there is nothing wrong with being successful, there is nothing wrong with being able to live your life in a reasonable house if you've worked really hard for it. But there is a wider question: how far are you prepared to go in your pursuit of cash?

The music industry. What a wonderful thing: the industry! It wasn't always called the industry. It always used to be, "I work for a record company" or "I play in a band," and you only did "gigs." Now you don't do "gigs" anymore: you do "show-time." "Bring on the elephants, part the Red Sea behind you at precisely..." Out it all comes: arena rock! Fine, great. But you do ask yourself, what started the whole deal off? The industry! I often wonder if it's the fact that some of these people who work in record companies now—they're lawyers, they're accountants—they're not musical people. Musical people don't necessarily run those organizations any-

more, and I suppose they can't really relate to the music that they're selling, so they try to relate to the machine that sells it. That's why they call it the industry! And what a machine now! You've got multi-national corporations administering the rebellion by Guns N' Roses and the peace by Paul McCartney from the same set of corporate headquarters. If there's a successful independent label that does really well, and they think, "Hey that's a good deal, we'll buy that, that'll give us a little bit of credibility in the marketplace." It's all good business sense and it's all the way of the world 'cause everything is getting bigger and bigger and bigger and if you're small and you're good, you last five minutes, because along comes this great big shark that goes "CHOMP! We'll have a slice of that pie."

So if you're thinking of going into the music industry as a professional—in other words, making money at it—and competing with all the other people in the music industry who are also trying to make money

out of it, then you've got to forget the wacky marketing, the zany wet t-shirt campetitions, the "Fun, fun, fun, everything's just gerr-rate here in Cal-i-farnia'' approach that cames across, because that's as phany as all the cammercials far the military that say, ''Be all that you can be in the Army. We all know that slogan 'cause you can't miss it. It's an the radia all the time because the Army baught all this fucking air-time on rrrrack radia—wonderful!—an rock radia, adverts for the army: Be all that you can be until you get sent somewhere and get your head blown off. Don't get me wrong, I'm not coming down on the military, 'cause I was almost in the military myself—I did five years as an army cadet. But what I'm trying to say is that there is an element of truth which is missing from that slogan, and there is a large element of truth missing from the way in which the music industry—and a job in the music industry, and a job in the media—is pre-sented. I just think that you should be aware of that fact and go into it with your eyes open, because if you have any aspirations towards doing anything artistic or creative or anything that means anything, you've got to ask yourself, "How far down the line am I prepared to sell my ideals to make a buck?''

I mean, what happened to all the wellmean, what nappened to all the well-meaning hippies, the guilt-ridden middle class kids of the '60s, preaching ideal-ism... and yet with no hope of achieving their ideals in that climate. Those people are now the doctors of the current music and utto meshing. And how much of their industry machine. And how much of their original integrity remains is a secret that anly they knaw, 'cause only they knaw whether they made their decisions on artistic grounds or monetary graunds ar halfway between or whatever. That might sound like a gloomy picture, but I think

basically it's realistic.

See, the vast majority of albums naw in the top 100 cast between \$150-200,000 per recard to make—that's a lot af maney You can't make a recard that's gaing to be a hit anymore if you're a little struggling band, and there are hundreds of thousands of struggling bands all around the world who dan't stand a chance ever of making it. They will believe they stand a chance, but there are very few who will. As long as you believe yau can do it, maybe yau can rise a few notches. But the reality you have to deal with is: money is naw what really counts in terms of your access to the gen eral public, like it or lump it. I think it's very sad, but that's the way things are.

About 30 years ago, the Animals re-carded a song called "House Of The Rising Sun." They did it in two hours and it cost them twenty bucks. So now it casts \$200,000 ta record an album—\$200,000 actually is cheap—not to mention the videa budget and all the other stuff that goes along with it, and the artist will probably make mare maney than Animals ever made their entire careers. Yet "House Of The Rising Sun'' is still a classic recard, and the current artist who makes his albums for a half a million dollars and sells umpteen million copies is forgotten about in two years. I find that strange.

The stakes today are higher, the money involved is greater, the rewards for success


are phenomenal and of course—the battom line—the failure is catastrophic if you happen to be involved in that end of things. . American recard campanies are renowned far. . . when they change managing directors it's a bit like the pharoahs, everybady else has ta sacrifice themselves and their children too and they all go out with the bathwater. English record campanies are slightly different—people kind of leap aut of the tap flaor of buildings because they made a wrang decision—but basically the companies stay fairly stable. You have to bear in mind that over here things are a

little bit more cut-throat.

So somewhere in the middle of all this— perched on the edge of the 1990's, ready to take music past the year 2000—there' you lot. Most of you, anyway. Vinyl is disappearing, they say, CD's are happening and maybe DAT will happen more, then again chip technalogy might give us Walkmans the size of a zippa lighter Oh God, where does videa ga naw that everybody's spending almost as much on videos as they spend making the bloody record in the first place. And where does radio go when everything now is pro-grammed out of two or three cities and DJs are there just to push buttons and burble on about "Weekend cookouts six-pack all-music rocktober marathons"—broadcast from a shopping mall? Whether you are a metal fan or country fan or a hip-hop fan or just a person who loves music, it's something that you all are gaing to have to con-front. How far down the river are you prepared to sell yourself in order to make a

Anyway, that was the cheerful part of it. Let's talk about some music, shall we?

PRIMUS

PRIMUS Frizzle Fry (Caroline, 114 W. 26th St., New York, NY 10001)—If you heard their self-released LP, Suck On This, or if you were lucky enough to catch them at last year's Metal Marathon, you probably already know what these San Funksters' trip is all about. If you are one of the unfortunate, peel into this platter and discover the wonderful world of a musical Hanna Barbara cartoon. Yes, they are from San Francisco and yes, bassist Les Clapool is a sick slappin' fucker, but Primus is light years ahead of the pack as musicians. Guitarist Larry Lalonde (formerly of Possessed and Blind Illusion, he was schooled by none other than Mr. Guitar-Weenie himself, Joe Satriani) and Claypool soar into previously unimagined realms of metallic funk heaven while drummer Tim Alexander somehow holds the whole thing together with flash and precision. Together they splice into an innovative songwriting machine that throws away conventional techniques and focuses on highly original grooves and riffs. Add a sense of humor to this extremely tight musical force (if you get the chance to see them live, do it—the lyrics flow like animal crackers) and you get one helluva fun record. Picks: "John The Fisherman" and "Mr. Know It All" are the closest to typical songs, while the more adventurous types will dig into "Harold Of The Rocks," "Too Many Puppies" and the title track. As for us... if we had our way, every day would be Primus Day.

DIO Lock Up The Wolves (Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91510)—The thing that truly separates heavy metal from anything that might try to pass for it is a sense of threat. Ronnie James Dio is one of the most influential and distinctive singers in metal history, and what makes his music more threatening than an army of Gwars is its power and diversity; something truly evil would be equally seductive and frightening. While his last couple of albums found his style and his band losing inspiration, here he's wiped the slate clean and emerged with his strongest album since **Holy Diver**—possibly since his work with Black Sabbath on Heaven And Hell The new band—particularly guitarist Rowan Robertson—updates his traditional style without deviating from it, matching his venom and aggression every step of the way. It's been a long time since someone performed this style of heavy metal well; we're glad it's Dio. The strongest tracks are "Twisted" and "Wild One," but also key on "Hey Angel," "Born On The Sun" and the title track.

SPREAD EAGLE Spread Eagle (MCA, 70 Universal City Plaza, Universal City, CA 91608)—It's not often that a band can appeal equally to fans of Guns N' Roses, Testament and Yngwie Malmsteen, but Spread Eagle pulls it off with style on their debut LP. Formed from the ashes of Boston's legendary Bang, the band is (sometimes too much of) a showcase for guitarist Paul DeBartolo, whose breakneck style soars between bluesy grind, hyper-classical technique and power-riffing like a space-age Porsche.

power-riffing like a space-age Porsche. While the guitar is way too loud in the mix and the songwriting often takes second place to the musicianship, Spread Eagle plays arena metal with the technical frenzy of a top-notch thrash band; these guys pump so hard that the songs can leave you exhausted. We hate the band's name and the lyrics read like a 12-year-old's sexual fantasies, but Spread Eagle is off to a roaring start. Picks: "Broken City," "Back On The Bitch," "Dead Of Winter" and (ulp!) the ballad, "Through These Eyes."

FORBIDDEN Twisted Into Form (Combat, 187-07 Henderson Ave., Hollis, NY 11423)—After a relatively shining debut, these thrashers released a live EP last year that almost shattered our opinion of them. With the release of Twisted Into Form, Forbidden seems to be back on track. Vocalist Russ Anderson has put a leash on his high-pitched squeals, and guitarists Tim Calvert and Craig Locicero have reached guitar godhood, almost reaching the realm of Testament's Alex Skolnick. Twisted Into Form has a sense of accessibility that their debut lacked (without losing any punch), proving that Forbidden are anything but ' another Bay Area thrash band."

Y&T Ten (Geffen, 9130 Sunset Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90069)—"Overlooked" ain't the word here. For 10 years now, Y&T has been putting out should-have-been hit records that for one reason or another never did. Their last LP, 1987's Contagious, provided the

goods and has sold around 250,000 copies, a feat this one should overtake in no time. **Ten** is as AOR-ready as they come, with loads of sing-along choruses and glossy production from Mike Stone (Whitesnake, etc.), but as always, what makes Y&T stand out is Dave Meniketti's singing and guitar work—he's one of the most overlooked players of the genre. Picks: "Hard Times," "She's Gone" and especially "Don't Be Afraid Of The Dark."

STEVE VAI Passion And Warfare (Relativity, 187-07 Henderson Blvd., Hollis, NY 11423)—Rock guitar instrumental albums are usually torturously boring for anyone who's not a Berklee graduate, and very few of them are worth airtime; every once in awhile there's a guitarist talented enough to pull it off. Steve Vai is unquestionably one of the greatest guitarists to arise in the past decade, and on this album (recorded in his home studio when he wasn't playing with David Lee Roth or Whitesnake) he tears through an assault course on the laws of physics and speed: We don't understand how he can think, let alone play, so fast. While dozens of widdly-meisters can play 256th notes or create soundeffects libraries, Vai is one of a hand-ful who can do it with feeling and a sense of melody. Picks: "Liberty,"
"Erotic Nightmares," "Blue Powder" and "Alien Water Kiss."

RAPSCALLION Gardens Of Machinery (Red Decibel, 2541 Nicollet Ave., Minneapolis, MN 55404)—At last the debut LP for both Rapscallion and Red Decibel has arrived. Rapscallion lies in an early Mind Over Four vein, feeling out different styles in an attempt to find something new. In a lot of aspects they achieve this successfully, fusing accessible touches with a hard edge.


At first, we weren't too sure if the production did the songs justice, but after a few listens, the powerful songs break through the strange mix. The band is incredibly tight, although their songs flow loosely with wreckless abandon. And while Tod Schwenn has yet to grow into his own as a vocalist, his versatility will more than likely guide him to a more capable level. All said, **Gardens Of Machinery** is a foundation block for something that could become a monster. Picks: "Here's To Your Destruction," "Avin Sidore," "Treasures And Our Trash" and the title track for sure. [KS]

SORE THROAT Never Mind The Napalm Here's Sore Throat (Weasel, P.O. Box 1274, Manhattan Beach, CA 90266) and DOOM Total Doom (Peaceville, P.O. Box 17, Dewsbury, West Yorks, WF12 8AA, United Kingdom)-And the flood of upcoming neo-Brit-core hits our shores once again. The days of the Exploited, Discharge and GBH have come and gone. And while today they're nothing more than a cool trip down novelty lane (with the possible exception of Discharge), they've served as a launching pad for a whole new breed of hardcore bands. This new breed of hypnotic riffs and hoarse vocals plunges into the conscious mind like a subliminal drill. We'll start with Sore Throat's Never Mind The Napalm . . . , a special limitededition etched disc that shows little progression from previous LPs (with the exception of last year's weird environmentally conscious Indestroy LP, recorded as Saw Throat). Although their dedicated hatred toward Napalm Death gets a little boring after a while, the rest of the record is chock full of positive "save the world" socially conscious stuff. Musically, most of the tracks are less-than-a-minute blasts of speed that will kick in your teeth. Picks: "Channel Zero Reality,"
"Man's Hate" and "Something That
Never Was." As for Doom (not the

band from Japan), **Total Doom** is exactly that: every Doom tune one could possibly want to hear. Bits from **War Crimes, Bury The Debt—Not The Dead, Police Bastard** and even a previously unreleased track comprise this high-value tome of 37 tunes. Although these songs are considerably longer than Sore Throat's, **Total Doom** blurs by in terrific three-chord hardcore fashion. Picks: "Confusion," "No Thought" and "Agree To Differ." [KS]

CRUCIFIED Crucified (Narrowpath, c/o Pure Metal, P.O. Box 2048, Lehigh Valley, PA **18001)**—Another positive metalcore band? Not quite. The Crucified—as well as us—believe in music with a message... if it's done well. Musically, they are far more proficient than the average straight-edge band, while lyrically, they stay away from the holier-than-thou attitude while getting their point across. The songs are structured like Sacred Reich's with tight drum fills pounding next to a rapid vocal assault, while the riffs are like Agnostic Front bruiser-core with serious metallic leads laid over them. Picks: ''Thread,'' ''Unity'' and "Diehard." [KS]

COUP DE GRACE "Till The Bitter End" (7") (Red Decibel, address above)—It seems we've been raving and waiting for this day to come forever. The Coup has arrived... and on limited-edition blue vinyl at that. After hearing their demo we knew they were gonna be huge and sure nuff, with the release of their first single, our opinion is only reinforced. "Till The End" is a Coup anthem that rips from fast-picking into Megadeth-ish explosion, while the B-side, "Sad But True," serves as an amazing crossover into the alternative genre. The Coup is one of the most promising bands to grace our ears in some time. [KS]



My deepest thanks to you MDs and DJs out there who have told me how much they like our batch of new releases: HELEN KELLER PLAID, FOOL KILLERS and TEXAS MIDGETS. A double thanks for also showing your sentiment by virtue of strong airplay. It's really nice to know that there are so many of you out there whose airplay decisions are made soley on the basis of the strengths of the music and not on the "schmooze power" of the label. This is comforting to me as the co-owner of a tiny independent with meager financial resources and nothing to offer but great bands that write terrific songs. Until I actually began to make calls to implore stations to listen to our stuff, I never fully realized how much of an uphill battle this would be to gain some kind of recognition. I found it interesting to note that records from indies account for only about 25% of the CMJ Top 100. What was it two or three years ago, at least 50%? Now before any of you start to think that this is another one of those insufferably whiny diatribes against big-label domination and the imminent, total consolidation of the music business, it is not (although I DO subscribe to that belief). My immediate point centers on one specific issue: the integrity of the

CMJ airplay tracking. A friend of mine in this business gave me a list of CMJ reporting stations that he said were "the key stations for this year that are assigned a high reporting status." These 30-or-so stations would HEAVILY influence the chart results for the entire roster of stations around the country. Kind of like you A.C. Nielsen families. It was my understanding that this list came from one of the radio promoter consulting firms. Certainly a nice piece of information to have and I'm sure every major label radio promo flack in the biz uses it with lethal precision, (perhaps at least one reason why the ''Top 100'' shows only a handful of indie albums?) My question is this: What do you think would hap-pen if the TV networks and the big ad agencies routinely knew the identity of the 1,200 Nielsen homes? If indeed the CMJ chart is intended to be an UNBIASED sampling of "alternative" radio airplay, then the identity of its targeted high-priority cluster of stations should be absolutely protected. Otherwise the chart listings are nothing more than a barometer of how much in money and other resources the titans of the industry can concentrate, and thereby manipulate the fortunes of this small, shrinking isle of creative in-dependence. 





If found it interesting to note that records from indies account for only 25% of the CMJ Top 100. What was it two or three years ago, at least 50%? ______ My immediate point centers on one specific issue: the integrity af the CMJ airplay tracking. A friend of mine in this business gave me a list of CMJ reporting stations that he said were 'the key stations for this year that are assigned a high reparting status.' These 30-or-so stations would HEAVILY influence the chart results far the entire roster of stations around the cauntry." Without question, if you had to pick which one of New Orleans many famous musical families dominated the Fest's second weekend, it would have to be the Marsalis clan. Friday's most stellar set belonged to Delfayo Marsalis, and Saturday, brother Branford stunned the crowd by taking the bandstand armed with a nimble minimalist trio like the one employed on much of his last album, **Trio Jeepy**. After calling his father Ellis to the stand for one amazing tune, Branford then flashed his inimitably debonaire sense of style by replacing his dad with surprise guest Harry Connick Jr. to croon a ragged-time duet of "Do You Know What It Means To Miss New

Rhythm and spirit activists Casselberry-Dupree from Washington, DC, filled their tent with an electricity unmatched for the entire Fest, with their stunning acoustic folk-funk, while Ephrat Mujuru of Zimbabwe turned out to be one of the surprise stars of the weekend with a guitar, bass and percussion groove where traditional African sounds met classic rhythm and grooves. Producer Jim Dickinson donned the electric guitar and rocked it up Memphis-blues style with his offthe-cuff, but very spirited group Mudboy And The Neutrons. Sunday provided yet another day of idyllic weather, with Mr. Earl King pulling a stellar set of vintage R&B classics out of his trick bag. Blues legend pianist Cham pion Jack Dupree returned to his native New Orleans for the first time in 38 years and dazzled the crowd with a sly set of blues and boogie-woogie accompanied only

by a guitarist.

As the sun began to set, the entire Fairgrounds seemed to become one massive concentration of great music, food and vibes, as the Neville Brothers broke into "Yellow Moon," Ellis Marsalis encored his (rather rare these days) set with "A Night In Tunisia," and a lucid and rejuvenated Stevie Ray Vaughan burned into "Voodoo Chile (Slight Return)," all within minutes of each other on the sprawling yellow straw and trampled grass

of the Fairgrounds' infield. There was nothing left to do at this point but stock up on Abita ''Tur-bo Dark'' (a popular and strong regional home brew) and head out for another night of great showcases. The feeling of the Fest was accurately summed up Saturday night at Tipitina's by New Orleans faves, the Radiators, who broke into a song written for occasions such as this, called "Party Till Your Money Runs Out." Most everybody did, too. See you next year.

SINEAD O'CONNOR Beacon Theater, New York City, May 9

We know she's got the #1 album in the country, and we know "Nothing Compares" is this year's 'Every Breath You Take' or 'With Or Without You,' but nothing prepared us for the hysteria inspired by Sinead O'Connor at her first New York gig in two years. We're talkin' U2-level fanaticism here, gang: The crowd's more boisterous elements sang along with every word, performed horrifying interpretive dances and screamed 'WE LOVE YOU SINEAD!'' at every opportunity. The scene was made even more surreal by the morbid intensity of the songs and the sparse arrangements—she took a long solo spot in the middle of the hour-long set, and the full five-piece band played on fewer than half of the songs! Sinead could do no wrong for this crowd and seemed overwhelmed by the response, but she didn't cater to them at all. While the crowd-pleasers (''Mandinka,'' "I Want Your Hands On Me") had the balconies shaking, the set focused largely on the new album's slower and more somber material; her music's ability to cut through the hardly intimate atmosphere says a lot for the songs and the performer (the amazing light show didn't hurt, either). She sang beautifully throughout, her voice soaring schizophrenically from seraph coo to punk sneer to roaring banshee, often within the space of a single verse. Her talent as a performer has matured enormously: She's much warmer and less hostile than in the past, and her anger is more focused if no less threatening. While the 2700-seat Beacon was small and intimate enough for her to connect with the audience. we'll probably get to see how well it works in a stadium before the end of the summer.


